CAPITAL PROJECT PROPOSAL

PROJECT: Joy Elementary School: Library Annex and Related Alterations

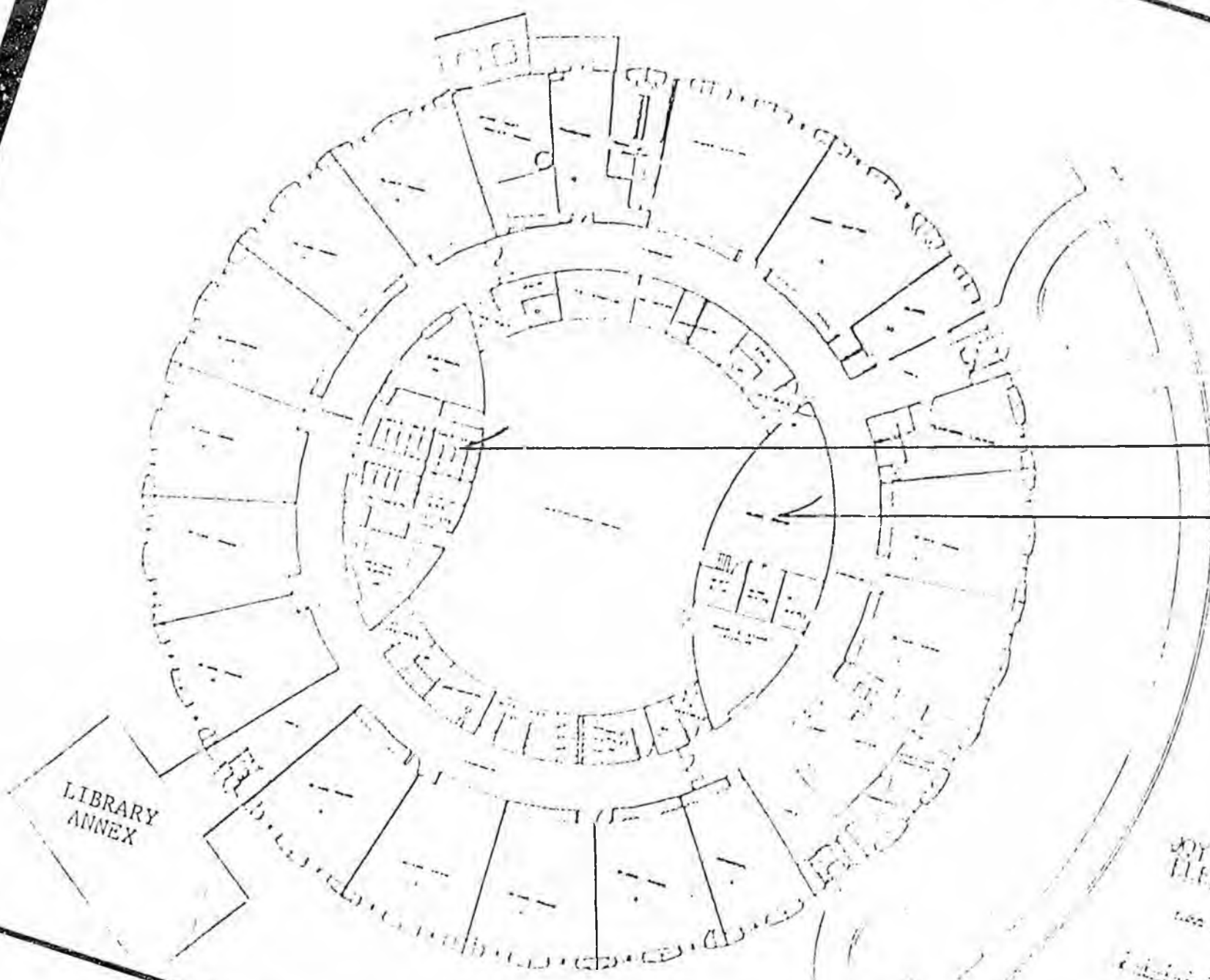
OBJECTIVE: Currently, six elementary program functions, including the library, are housed within 12,528 sq. ft. of temporary portables first constructed in 1972. The functions are: (1) library; (2) G/T Classroom; (3) Reading; (4) Resource; (5) Speech/Language; and (6) The Counselor.

This project will provide, when completed, 5,500 square feet of new space within an annex connected to the main structure by use of an enclosed corridor and within which will be housed an elementary sized library and a Gifted and Talented Classroom. And, within the main structure, the alteration of approximately 3,700 sq. ft. to house the remaining displaced functions.

BENEFITS: (1) Increased efficiency for the use of existing space within the main building.  
(2) An increased efficiency for the use of existing space within one structure.  
(3) A decrease in the annual M&O costs due to a reduction of 5,300 sq. ft. from levels now existing. Estimated savings: \$31,000/yr.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION ⑧

This project would provide the design and engineering funds for the physical education addition to the existing gym facility at Lathrop High School. Preliminary program requirements are the following:

- 1) Expanded girls locker rooms
- 2) Coach facilities
- 3) Storage space for physical education equipment
- 4) Rifle and archery areas
- 5) Gymnastics program space
- 6) Weight training room
- 7) Wrestling program space

The FNSB currently is constructing a 1,000 student high school in the North Pole area. The program requirements as listed above may change with the opening of this new school and possible subsequent redistricting. It is important that the needs at Lathrop High School be promptly identified in conjunction with completion and occupancy of the new North Pole Senior High School.

Total cost of the proposed addition is estimated to be \$2.9 million.

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**Description, Objectives  
and Public Benefit**

This project would provide for remedial renovations to the Interior's largest performing arts auditorium. The rehabilitation would include the following major repair and fire/life safety elements.

1. Provide code required exiting.
2. Replace auditorium lighting.
3. Provide emergency lighting.
4. Modify fire alarm systems.
5. Modify fire curtain and fire doors at proscenium.
6. Provide for handicapped access and seating.
7. Replace dangerous theater equipment including rigging, dimmer bank, and stage electrics.
8. Expand or improve storage and service areas backstage.
9. Improve acoustics, finishes and stage monitoring facilities in auditorium.
10. Rehabilitate mechanical systems.

The objective of this project would be to make the facility safe for the students and community users. The educational capabilities of the auditorium would be increased as would its capacity for hosting larger community and professional productions.

This renovation project is consistent with the Borough's objective of preserving existing community assets before taking on new commitments.

The Borough Assembly has appropriated design money for this high priority project. Construction is planned for summer 1984.

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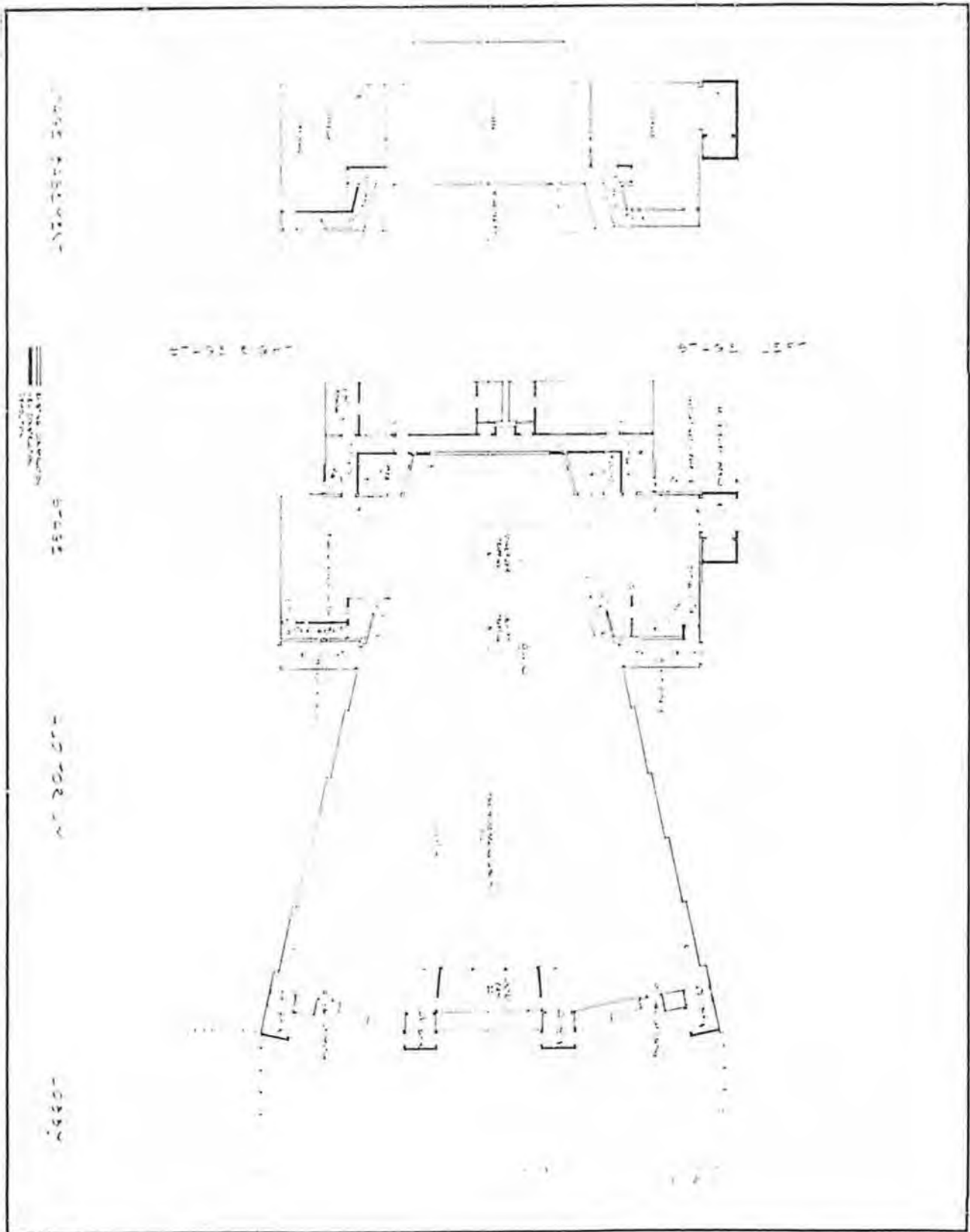

**Description, Objectives  
and Public Benefit**

The objective of this project is to provide for completion of an all weather track facility at West Valley High School. The track was funded in part (\$437,000) with discretionary State Grant funds (SF 168) in 1982. This funding provided for the foundation preparation and the asphalt base for the all weather surface. This base was allowed to sit for a year to stabilize while research was completed on optimum surface treatment for subarctic applications.

The Fairbanks North Star Borough Engineering Department has now identified the synthetic running surface material which will result in least long term maintenance costs.

Funding for surface treatment and striping is requested. The completion of this project will extend the track season by approximately six weeks and encourage the scheduling of State events in the Fairbanks area.

This project would fund a 4,000 square foot storage structure with concrete floors, heating and ventilation, fluorescent lighting, lockable cubicles, overhead doors, outdoor lighting and a chain-link security fence around the entire area. The structure would be separate from the school building and would provide safe storage for flammables and other potentially hazardous materials which currently are stored inside the school building.

This project will also provide suitable storage for the school's supplies, materials, vocational education inventory, and equipment. The spaces within the building where these items currently are stored would then become available for academic programs. Steam heat from the University of Alaska would be used to heat the new structure.

Dear Senator Kerttula:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 18, of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill appropriating a total of \$314,205 to the Alaska Court System.

The first section of the bill appropriates \$285,000 from the general fund to offset the deficit created by underfunding the FY 83 cost-of-living pay increase. When funds were appropriated for that increase, the level of funding was set at approximately 75 percent of the estimated cost of the increase for existing employees. In addition, pay increase funds were not provided for the eight new positions received by the trial courts in FY 84. The court system has attempted to reduce the deficit by extending vacancies, eliminating overlaps, and reducing overtime to the extent possible. Through these efforts, the trial courts will have realized a savings of \$400,000 by the end of this fiscal year.

The second section of the bill appropriates \$29,205 from the general fund to pay FY 83 outstanding obligations for library materials. Inadvertently, invoices were not processed in a timely manner, and the court system has actually lapsed sufficient funds to cover these claims.

Section 70 Oscarville Erosion Control/Dock Facility: The Village of Oscarville is in need of an erosion control/dock facility. The community proposes to construct a riverbank stabilization structure that would allow for a barge lighterage and freight staging area and a floating dock to facilitate local boat traffic. Oscarville requests a legislative grant in the amount of \$250,000 to construct this facility.

Section 71 AMENDS 1980 appropriation to the Lower Yukon School District providing for school construction AND REPAIRS. The district would like to use the remaining \$36.2 for repairs at Marshall School (Fortuna Ledge)

Section 72 REDUCES 1983 appropriation for water and sewer facilities construction grants by \$626,800. ( Ketchikan 590.8) ( Houston 36.0).

Section 73 Houston allocation reduction of \$36.0 per sec. 72 above.

Section 74 Houston Roads: the unexpended portion of a grant made to the City of Houston in 1983 for Sanitary Landfill will be used by the city of Houston for various road maintenance and upgrade.

Section 75 This would repeal the unexpended portion of an appropriation made in 1982, for Halibut Cove Airport Improvements.

Section 76 Willow Community Center: The project is not able to be complete with the original appropriation. This addition will allow the Community Center to be complete and equipped for use.

Section 77 Wasilla Senior Center: The Center is being added to. This appropriation would be used to purchase and install a movable wall that will separate the current structure from the addition as it is being build. The parking lot is dirt and is largely mud. funds could be used to gravel the parking lot to keep the mud problem contained while construction is under way.

Section 78 REPEALS \$3,600. (SLA 1983) appropriation for Maximum Security Prison Purchase/or Lease Purchase - South Central.

Section 79 REPEALS \$4,000.0 SLA (1983) appropriation for Anchorage Area Classification Correctional Center Purchase or Lease/Purchase.

Section 80 APPROPRIATES \$6,600.0 to Department of Corrections for statewide renovations, repairs and equipment for correctional facilities.

Section 81 APPROPRIATES \$1,000.0 to Department of Corrections for construction of a pre-trial facility in Palmer.

Section 82 Commuter Transportation program: Currently Burton Carver and Co. work under a contract with the Mat-Su Borough providing a daily commuter service to and from the Valley and Anchorage. The Borough has cancelled this subsidized contract. The program seems to be approaching a level that will no longer require a subsidy. This appropriation will allow the program another full-year of slightly expanded service.

Section 83 Feasibility study concerning the development of "mine mouth" electric generation in the Sutton area. ( \$100.0)

Section 84 10.0 to Yukon Kuskokwim Health Corporation for Emergency Medical Service training.

Section 85 The City of Ruby is in need of a small computer to assist the administration of the city. The city desires to equip the office with a small micro processor, display, disk drive, printer, and software. The City requests \$17,800 to purchase computer and accessories.

Section 86 The City of Ruby is in need of expanding its pedestrian walkway system. The city proposes to construct approximately 3,000 linear feet of boardwalk to connect the major use areas in the community. The City of Ruby is requesting a legislative grant in the amount of \$75,000 to construct boardwalks.

Section 87 The City of Ruby owns and operates several pieces of heavy equipment. There is, however, no facility to house this equipment. This equipment shed will provide much needed storage and maintenance space for city equipment. The City of Ruby requests a legislative grant in the amount of \$30,000 to construct a heavy equipment shed.

Section 88 AMENDS 1984 appropriation to Pilot Station (ED-24) changing it from a headstart building to a civic center, at the request of the City of Pilot Station.

Section 89 The City of Napaskiak is in need of a four-wheel drive truck. This vehicle is needed for city officials and employees to perform their duties, including emergency rescue, police, ambulance and other services. The city is requesting \$17,500 to purchase a truck.

Section 90 The City of Napaskiak is in need of additional electric generation capacity. A new housing development project is scheduled for the community this spring. A legislative grant in the amount of \$60,900 is requested for the purchase and installation of a diesel-electric generator.

This section reappropriates any remaining balances to the Municipality for the same projects.

Section 144 The City of Houston ambulance has had problems with the electrical system and the fuel carrying supply. The need for replacement of this vehicle is at times a life and death matter.

Section 145 Sutton Fire Equipment: This appropriation would allow for the purchase of fire fighting equipment in the Sutton area. The area has recently built a fire training facility and equipment for combating fires is needed.

Section 146 APPROPRIATING \$1,000.0 to DHSS for catastrophic illness program for FY 85.

Section 147 This is an appropriation to DEC Village Safe Water program to conduct a wastewater and solid waste disposal feasibility study in Newtok. Currently residents utilize a lake between the community and airport to dispose of their waste. With construction of a water intake structure in an adjacent lake, a new disposal site must be located and developed.

Section 148 This is an appropriation to the Dept. of Administration to replace the existing 10-watt State television service transmitter in Manley Hot Springs with a 100-watt unit and a dual antenna system. These improvements would expand the State television service area to include the community of Eureka and other scattered settlements in the area.

Section 149 APPROPRIATES 25.0 to Kasigluk for drainage improvements. The school sewage lagoon periodically floods, discharging sewage effluent in the community. DEC recommends installing drainage culverts in a nearby lake, which should alleviate the flooding of the lagoon.

Section 150 The city of Tanana requests a legislative grant in the amount of \$150,000 to develop a comprehensive and economic development plan. This plan would enable the city to coordinate efforts in economic development and community expansion. Tanana is the newest first class city in the State, and, as such, the community is in great need of an organized planning approach to future development.

Section 151 The City of Newtok is in need of expanding its pedestrian walkway system. The City proposes to construct boardwalks to connect the major use areas in the community to the airport. The City of Newtok is requesting a legislative grant in the amount of \$25,000 to construct boardwalks.

Section 152 The City of Nulato is in need of upgrading the City Road Equipment Maintenance Shop. The existing facility has a gravel surface, making repairs difficult particularly during the winter. The city proposes to put in a cement floor in the 40' x 60' building.

Section 153 The City of Huslia is in need of a small bulldozer for local construction projects, road maintenance and dump clean-up. The city is requesting a legislative grant in the amount of \$30,000 to purchase a small bulldozer.

Section 154 The City of Eek is in need of a road connecting the airport with the community. Currently, residents must traverse along a dirt path, which becomes virtually impassible at times. The city has received \$700,000 of the estimated \$1,200,000 cost of the entire project. This additional \$150,000 would enable the community to begin phase III of the road project.

Section 155 The City of McGrath is constructing a community water and sewer system. The total cost of Phase II of this project is approximately \$1,900,000. Of this, \$1,500,000 was included for funding in SB-420, and an additional \$89,325 is included in SB-409. This additional funding would enable the city to complete Phase II of this project.

Section 156 This appropriation would enable the City of Galena to acquire the existing power plant and distribution system. Included in the purchase are the power plant building, three diesel-electric generators with switchgear, six miles of distribution equipment and surplus equipment including poles, transformers, vehicles, line, and meters. The Galena power plant has been appraised at \$1,200,000. The legislative appropriation would enable the community to cover the down payment, with the balance to be paid with services charges.

This has resulted in cost estimates that require this additional appropriation.

Section 160 Mat-Su Community College: The campus has a rapidly expanding student body, and is the base for a State-wide agriculture education program that will need to have a specialized and up to date library collection. This appropriation would allow purchase and expansion of the current holdings.
