Section 17 LAPSING \$1,139.0 in FY84 Building and Equipment Services funds and insuring that these funds cannot be encumbered.

Section 18 \$78.0 to DOA for lease of new office space for Public Defender's Office. Old lease expired and lessor did not desire to renew lease with P.D.

Section 19 \$975.0 to DOA for increased operating costs of Pioneers' homes for current fiscal year. Shortfall is at Anchorage home. Without supplemental staff and contractual services would have to be reduced.

Section 20 \$11.0 to DOA for Automated Personnel Applicant Tracking System, FY84, repairs. Without repairs applicant waiting time would increase.

Section 21 \$75.0 to DOA for additional attorneys fees for proceedings before FCC concerning telephone rates in Alaska.

Section 22 \$520.6 to Dept. of Law for judgements against the state. State must repay federal government for non-allowable costs for CETA program during fed. FY78.

Section 23 \$990,000 to C&RA for increase benefit payments for the homeowner's property tax exemption program. Increase in property taxes has resulted in greater exemption payments for qualifying senior citizens.

Section 24 \$2,667.5 in remaining FY84 school debt retirement funds may not be obligated or expended and lapse at end of current fiscal year.

Section 25 \$5,677.7 to fully reimburse school districts for costs incurred for pupil transportation (\$2,854.8) and reimburse school districts for operating schools on military reservations (\$2,822.9) FY84.

Section 26 \$750,000 to DOE for the Fairbanks North Star Borough School District as reimbursement for on-base programs for FY83.

Section 27 \$208,561 appropriated to pay miscellaneous claims and old warrants among a

variety of state agencies: Departments of Administration, \$39,636 Revenue \$207; Education \$8,550; Health and Social Services \$23,749; Commerce and Economic Development \$444; Fish and Game \$6,356; Public Safety \$5,087; Community and Regional Affairs \$736; Corrections \$4,681; Transportation and Public Facilities \$118,311; Court System \$804.

Section 28 \$480,402 is appropriated to fund collective bargaining agreements with the General Government and the Supervisory Units.

Section 29 Appropriates \$171,500 to pay for additional costs of reapportionment.

Section 30 This makes available an additional \$1,761,200 from the International Airports Construction Fund for completion of the Anchorage International Airport Domestic Terminal Renovation Project.

Section 31 AMENDS 1984 appropriation for Fairbanks Water Quality Study by adding the words "Environmental Conservation Projects" to make it clear the appropriation is NOT a village safe water project for which Fairbanks is ineligible.

Section 32 AMENDS 1984 appropriation of \$300,000 by changing the funding from West Ridge Natural Science Building to DUCKERING BUILDING COMPLETION at UAF. \$300.0 does not add to the Science Building completion.

Section 33 AMENDS 1984 appropriation for Palmer Pioneer Home to include Sitka Pioneer Home. Gov. originally recommended \$2,797.2 for Palmer home. An error was made in final appropriation increasing the amount to \$3,043.2 but failing to add the Sitka home in the description.

Section 37 Same correction as Sec. 35.

Section 38 AMENDS 1984 appropriation of \$3.4 million to Wastewater Disposal Facility Construction in DEC by reducing to \$1.4 (\$2 million deduction)

Section 39 ADDS \$2 million (from Sec. 39) to Village Safe Water Construction bringing 1984 total to \$4 million.

Section 40 AMENDS 1983 budget Act (Sec. 31, lapse date for projects listed in \$20 million appropriation, Sec. 30 of Ch. 107, SLA 1983) by naming the projects capital projects or projects not of a one-year duration - hence the funds do not lapse.

Section 41 AMENDS 1983 budget act by adding "replacement" to Youth Corrections facility account to allow for repair and replacement in the Ketchikan Youth Facility which has been closed down as unsafe.

Section 45 AMENDS 1981 appropriation for dock construction at Sitka and Ketchikan to include Juneau. This is to conform to 1980 appropriation for same purpose which included Juneau in th descriptive language. Both the 1980 and 1981 funds were to have included Juneau dock construction.

Section 46 ADDS \$20.0 to 1978 appropriation to Div. of Parks to cover costs associated with Rika's Landing Roadhouse Project.

Section 47 AMENDS ALLOCATION from Sec. 48 by adding \$20.0 to Rika's Landing Roadhouse project, raising the sum from \$25.0 to \$45.0

Section 48 REDUCES 1981 appropriation to Delta for Rika's Landing Restoration by \$20.0 to accomplish Sec. 48-49. Div. of Parks paid the

\$20.0 which was necessary due to ineligible reimbursement of federal funds.

Section 49 TRANSFERS all outstanding Ag. Action Council accounts to DNR for administrative close-out purposes because the AG. Action Council terminate on July 1, 1984.

Section 50 \$8.0 to Military Affairs for a feasibility study of availability of potential qualified personnel to staff proposed air guard unit in Fairbanks.

Section 51 REDUCES 1980 appropriation for Victory/Eureka electric line by \$250.0

Section 52 \$77.0 to DOE for Perseverance Theatre to pay for costs associated with performing tour of Yup'ik Antigone at Theatre of Nations Festival in France. The cast, and author have been invited to perform in France. Perseverance is raising funds to cover costs but needs assistance due to short period of time before departure. Tour leaves Toksook Bay, to New York City, France and return.

Section 53 \$80.0 to DOT to complete road surfacing of Skyline/Homestretch Road in Fairbanks area.

Section 54 \$50.0 to ISER to augment small village high school study for village school site visits as part of overall review and study of school foundation funding by finance policy committee.

Section 55 \$132,240 to DOE for Craig School. The FY84 funding was miscalculated.

Section 56 \$10.1 to Gateway School District for operating cost overruns in FY84.

Section 57 \$21.5 grant to Bethel for the Bethel Prematernal Home. The home suffered water line damage do to freeze-up and a power outage. The funds will repair water lines and also provide for an emergency generator.

Section 58 \$95.0 to Pribilof School District to offset loss of federal subsidies for fuel and electric costs during FY84.

Section 59 \$285.0 to Court system for cost-of-living pay increase. Pay raise was given

to other agencies but Court system was funded only at 75% of raise during 1983 session.

Section 60 REDUCTION of \$44.0 from SLA 1981 appropriation to Lime Village for Wind Power. Also adding "alternative energy system" rather than Wind Power.

Section 61 \$44.0 as grant to Fortuna Ledge for a wind generator.

Section 62 \$694.0 to Fairbanks for drainage improvements along Hanson and Aspen Streets

Section 63 \$500.0 to DOT for completion of upgrade work on Cartwright Road between Peger Road and University Ave. in Fairbanks.

Section 64 Reappropriating the remaining 1980 funds for Bikeways in Fairbanks to be used for city wide water, sewer drainage needs.

Section 65 An FY 84 supplemental of \$135,000 is requested for the Anchorage Treatment Alternatives to Street Crime (TASC) program. TASC receives funds from the Department of Corrections and the Municipality. Due to an unanticipated increase in clients, the program is shortfunded. TASC screens and monitors referrals as an alternative to incarceration.

Section 66 REPEAL of remaining funds appropriated Latouch harbor construction (1981). DOT has stopped work on the project and reports unexpended unobligated balance of \$2,100.0

Section 67 Amends 1981 Fairbanks appropriation for South Fairbanks drainage improvements changing it to water/sewer drainage improvements in Fairbanks.

Section 68 6.5 to Office of GOVERNOR for per diem and travel expenses for public members of Alaska Bar Association Board of Governors as regulated by law.

Section 69 The City of Goodnews Bay owns and operates several pieces of heavy equipment. There is, however, no facility to house this equipment. The garage will provide much needed storage and maintenance space for city equipment. The City of Goodnews Bay requests a legislative grant in the amount of \$50,000 to construct a heavy equipment garage.

Section 70 Oscarville Erosion Control/Dock Facility: The Village of Oscarville is in need of an erosion control/dock facility. The community proposes to construct a riverbank stabilization structure that would allow for a barge lighterage and freight staging area and a floating dock to facilitate local boat traffic. Oscarville requests a legislative grant in the amount of \$250,000 to construct this facility.

Section 71 AMENDS 1980 appropriation to the Lower Yukon School District providing for school construction AND REPAIRS. The district would like to use the remaining \$36.2 for repairs at Marshall School (Fortuna Ledge)

Section 72 REDUCES 1983 appropriation for water sewer facilities construction grants by \$626,800. (Ketchikan 590.8) (Houston 36.0).

Section 73 Houston allocation reduction of \$36.0 per sec. 72 above.

Section 74 Houston Roads: the unexpended portion of a grant made to the City of Houston in 1983 for Sanitary Landfill will be used by the city of Houston for various road maintenance and upgrade.

The parking lot is dirt and is largely mud. funds could be used to gravel the parking lot to keep the mud problem contained while construction is under way.

Section 82 Commuter Transportation program: Currently Burton Carver and Co. work under a contract with the Mat-Su Borough providing a daily commuter service to and from the Valley and Anchorage. The Borough has cancelled this subsidized contract. The program seems to be approaching a level that will no longer require a subsidy. This appropriation will allow the program another full-year of slightly expanded service.

Section 83 Feasibility study concerning the development of "mine mouth" electric generation in the Sutton area. (\$100.0)

Section 84 10.0 to Yukon Kuskokwim Health Corporation for Emergency Medical Service training.

Section 85 The City of Ruby is in need of a small computer to assist the administration of the city. The city desires to equip the office with a small micro processor, display, disk drive, printer, and software. The City requests \$17,800 to purchase computer and accessories.

Section 86 The City of Ruby is in need of expanding its pedestrian walkway system. The city proposes to construct approximately 3,000 linear feet of boardwalk to connect the major use areas in the community. The City of Ruby is requesting a legislative grant in the amount of \$75,000 to construct boardwalks.

Section 87 The City of Ruby owns and operates several pieces of heavy equipment. There is, however, no facility to house this equipment. This equipment shed will provide much needed storage and maintenance space for city equipment. The City of Ruby requests a legislative grant in the amount of \$30,000 to construct a heavy equipment shed.

Section 88 AMENDS 1984 appropriation to Pilot Station (ED-24) changing it from a headstart

building to a civic center, at the request of the City of Pilot Station.

Section 89 The City of Napaskiak is in need of a four-wheel drive truck. This vehicle is needed for city officials and employees to perform their duties, including emergency rescue, police, ambulance and other services. The city is requesting \$17,500 to purchase a truck.

Section 90 The City of Napaskiak is in need of additional electric generation capacity. A new housing development project is scheduled for the community this spring. A legislative grant in the amount of \$60,900 is requested for the purchase and installation of a diesel-electric generator.

Section 91 Amends 1980 appropriation for a transport study permitting remaining funds to be used towards a wood stave water main replacement in Fairbanks. Original appropriation was to Fairbanks.

Because of a restriction on the maximum amount of funds which DEC can contribute to a local community (50% of the non-Federal share) there is a remaining balance of \$3,542,577 of the original \$9,035,600 which can not be appropriated for the

specified projects. This section reappropriates any remaining balances to the Municipality for the same projects.

Section 105 AMENDS 1983 appropriation to Fortuna Ledge for Water and Sewer Planning by adding the words, "and construction."

Section 106 REDUCES 1977 appropriation to DOT for runway gravel at six airports by \$50.0 (Chefornek Airport did not need gravel).

Section 107 REPEALS unexpended and unobligated funds of appropriation to C&RA for village fisheries education program in Kodiak and reappropriates funds to the Kodiak Island Borough for village Fisheries Education Program.

Section 108 AMENDS 1984 appropriation to Allakaket for a safety fence by striking the fence and inserting DRAINAGE DITCH IMPROVEMENTS.

Section 109 EXTENDS the lapse dates of 1983 fiscal note appropriation to Office of the GOVERNOR for elections regarding Regional Resource Development Authorities.

Section 110 EXTENDS the lapse dates of 1983 fiscal note appropriation to C&RA relating to planning for election for Regional Resource Development Authorities.

Section 111 REPEALS unexpended/unobligated remainder of 1980 funds to Fairbanks for 1st Ave. and Steam Facility and reappropriates to Fairbanks for water main improvements.

Section 112 AMENDS 1981 appropriation to the Lower Yukon School District to allow remaining funds to be used for Pilot Station Elementary School Sewer Installation (by request of school district).

Section 113 AMENDS 1981 appropriation to Lower Yukon School District to allow remaining funds to be used for Pilot Station Elementary School Sewer Installation (by request of school district)

Section 118 \$605.0 grant to Bethel to augment existing funding for the riverbank stabilization project. The project includes both state and federal funding.

Section 119 REPEALS 1982 appropriation for \$200,000 to the City of Elim for a waste heat exchanger.

Section 120 APPROPRIATES \$71,000 to the Maniilaq Manpower for a municipal officers program.

Section 121 APPROPRIATES \$40,100 to Nunam Kitlusisti for a water fowl project.

Section 122 APPROPRIATES \$51,500 to the City of Savoonga for equipment.

Section 123 APPROPRIATES \$37,300 to the City of Golovin for equipment.

Section 124 APPROPRIATES \$26,200 to the City of Gambell to make emergency repairs to the community freezer.

Section 129 APPROPRIATES \$42,000 to the City of Chevak for continuation of the Youth Work Experience Program.

Section 130 REDUCES 1983 appropriation for Metlakatla water and sewer by \$60.0

Section 131 APPROPRIATES \$60.0 for Metlakatla electric utilities.

Section 132 AMENDS 1981 Fairbanks appropriation for Bjerremark subdivision Drainage changing it to water/sewer drainage upgrade - Fairbanks

Section 133 AMENDS 1978 appropriation to DOT for a site suitable for maintenance of state ferries in Ketchikan by permitting the remaining funds to also be used for construction of a facility for maintenance.

Section 134 150.0 to Dept. of Education Alaska Historical Commission to prepare and distribute comprehensive documentary film on history of the participation of Alaska in World War II.

Section 135 In FY 84 \$40,000 was appropriated for a flashing signal at the Alaska Zoo. The light has been installed and \$14,000 remains which is being reappropriated for a pedestrian signal at Huffman Elementary, School. The need for a safe crossing at the school site has been identified in the Municipality's Pedestrian Safety program.

Section 136 AMENDING 1980 appropriation in Fairbanks for Waterloo serving Van Horn Road and

permitting the remaining funds to be used for drainage upgrades.

Section 137 125.0 to Dept. of Community and Regional Affairs as grant to Village of Northway for purchase of fire truck.

Section 138 APPROPRIATES \$26,225 to Fairbanks-North Star Borough for start up expenses for the Senior Citizens of Interior Alaska Rec. Center.

Section 139 APPROPRIATES \$85.8 to Saxman for a totem renovation project.

Section 140 AMENDS 1980 special session law repealing income tax by removing years 1979 and 1980 for tax credits payable under AS 43.20.013

Section 141 AMENDS 1983 Fairbanks-Denali School Boiler Replacement to read: Denali School Repairs/Replacement.

Section 142 REPEALS unused portion of appropriation to DNR (1978) for a building addition (\$10,225)

Section 143 REPEAL AND REAPPROPRIATION of unexpended and unobligated funds originally appropriated for the Alaska Energy Center (\$89.5)

Section 144 The City of Houston ambulance has had problems with the electrical system and the fuel carrying supply. The need for replacement of this vehicle is at times a life and death matter.

Section 145 Sutton Fire Equipment: This appropriation would allow for the purchase of fire fighting equipment in the Sutton area. The area has recently built a fire training facility and equipment for combating fires is needed.

Section 146 APPROPRIATING \$1,000.0 to DHSS for catastrophic illness program for FY 85. (Anticipated lapse)

Section 147 This is an appropriation to DEC Village Safe Water program to conduct a wastewater and solid waste disposal feasibility study in Newtok. Currently residents utilize a lake between the community and airport to dispose of their waste. With construction of a water intake structure in an adjacent lake, a new disposal site must be located and developed.

Section 148 This is an appropriation to the Dept. of Administration to replace the existing 10-watt State television service transmitter in Manley Hot Springs with a 100-watt unit and a dual antenna system. These improvements would expand the State television service area to include the community of Eureka and other scattered settlements in the area.

Section 149 APPROPRIATES 25.0 to Kasigluk for drainage improvements. The school sewage lagoon periodically floods, discharging sewage effluent in the community. DEC recommends installing drainage culverts in a nearby lake, which should alleviate the flooding of the lagoon.

Section 150 The city of Tanana requests a legislative grant in the amount of \$150,000 to develop a comprehensive and economic development plan. This plan would enable the city to coordinate efforts in economic development and community expansion. Tanana is the newest first class city in the State, and, as such, the community is in great need of an organized planning approach to future development.

Section 151 The City of Newtok is in need of expanding its pedestrian walkway system. The City proposes to construct boardwalks to connect the major use areas in the community to the airport. The City of Newtok is requesting a legislative grant in the amount of \$25,000 to construct boardwalks.

Section 152 The City of Nulato is in need of upgrading the City Road Equipment Maintenance Shop. The existing facility has a gravel surface, making repairs difficult particularly during the winter. The city proposes to put in a cement floor in the 40' x 60' building.

Section 153 The City of Huslia is in need of a small bulldozer for local construction projects, road maintenance and dump clean-up. The city is requesting a legislative grant in the amount of \$30,000 to purchase a small bulldozer.

Section 154 The City of Eek is in need of a road connecting the airport with the community. Currently, residents must traverse along a dirt path, which becomes virtually impossible at times. The city has received \$700,000 of the estimated \$1,200,000 cost of the entire project. This

additional \$150,000 would enable the community to begin phase III of the road project.

Section 155 The City of McGrath is constructing a community water and sewer system. The total cost of Phase II of this project is approximately \$1,900,000. Of this, \$1,500,000 was included for funding in SB-420, and an additional \$89,325 is included in SB-409. This additional funding would enable the city to complete Phase II of this project.

Section 156 This appropriation would enable the City of Galena to acquire the existing power plant and distribution system. Included in the purchase are the power plant building, three diesel-electric generators with switchgear, six miles of distribution equipment and surplus equipment including poles, transformers, vehicles, line, and meters. The Galena power plant has been appraised at \$1,200,000. The legislative appropriation would enable the community to cover the down payment, with the balance to be paid with services charges.

Section 157 38.6 to Alaska Internship Program for Education and Career Development Internship Program.

Section 158 Crisis Line Information Center: This appropriation would provide continuation funds for the Crisis Line Information Center that provides a service in the Mat-Su Valley. The program is attempting to obtain state grant monies to fund the program on a more permanent basis.

Section 159 King Mountain Receiver: This appropriation would complete the installation and bring into operation the Earth Station Transmitter originally appropriated for in 1980. The Dish itself cost \$5,000 more than cost estimates. There have been time delays in the FCC granting the Chickaloon Pass Improvements Assoc. a license to operate. This has resulted in cost estimates that require this additional appropriation.

Section 160 Mat-Su Community College: The campus has a rapidly expanding student body, and is the base for a State-wide agriculture education program that will need to have a specialized and up to date library collection. This appropriation would allow purchase and expansion of the current holdings.

Section 161 AMENDS 1983 appropriation to Yukon Flats School District by striking "Relocatable" school facilities and adding "planning design and sit preparation for school facilities" (at request of school district)

Section 162 AMENDS 1983 allocation to DEC for water and sewer projects in Ketchikan by reducing amount by \$590.8. (Reduction is shown in Sec. 72, appropriation to DEC, with another reduction of same appropriation of \$36.0 for Houston).

Section 163 APPROPRIATES \$505.0 to Ketchikan for water and sewer projects and allocates the funds for three different projects.

Section 164 REPEALS unexpended/unobligated funds from 1981 appropriation for Fairbanks for snow removal equipment and reappropriates those funds to Fairbanks for sewer and water upgrade.

Section 165 AMENDS 1983 appropriation for Fox Spring Illumination by adding "and improvements."

Section 166 TRANSFERS 1983 appropriation to North Star Borough for Chena Hot Springs Winter Trail to DNR/Parks.

Section 167 TRANSFERS 1983 appropriation for Agriculture Development Vehicles from the UAF to DNR/Dev. of Ag.

Section 168 TRANSFERS 1983 appropriation for Outer Fairbanks waterpoint from North Star Borough to DEC.

Section 169 TRANSFERS 1983 appropriation for Old Nenana Shoulder Widening from DOT to the UAF.

Section 170 REPEALS unexpended and unobligated funds for 1981 appropriation for Naknek runway extension (\$500.0)

Section 171 APPROPRIATES \$420.0 to DEC for sanitary landfill and access road at Koliganek.

Section 172 TRANSFERS 1983 appropriation for Pedro Bay Electricity Distribution from APA to C&RA.

Section 173 REPEAL AND REAPPROPRIATES \$200.0 for Pedro Bay hydroelectric study to Local Service Roads and Trails for Pedro Bay road upgrade.

Section 174 APPROPRIATES \$200.0 to DEC for Nelson Lagoon for burial of water pipe for the community water system.
