(d) The department shall permit entry within the Redoubt Bay Critical Habitat Area for the exploration and development of oil and gas resources when compatible with the purposes for which the critical habitat area was established. An oil and gas lease of state land within the critical habitat area is valid and continues in full force according to its terms.

(e) The department shall permit uses of the Redoubt Bay Critical Habitat Area in a manner compatible with the purpose for which the area is established. The department shall permit the following public uses to continue without further approval by the department unless the department determines in a management plan adopted for the Redoubt Bay Critical Habitat Area that the use is incompatible with the purposes for which the Redoubt Bay Critical Habitat Area is established:

(1) hunting, trapping, and commercial and sport fishing, including the continued use of cabins for the purpose of hunting, trapping, and fishing;

(2) hiking, backpacking, and camping, including the use of



Dear Senator Faiks:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 18, of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill making appropriations designed to provide immediate economic benefit throughout the State of Alaska. The specific projects are explained in detail in material furnished by my division of budget review to the finance committees and in material assembled by the staffs of the finance committees.

The bill is unusual in that it is the product of extensive legislative/executive cooperation as to both purpose and content before introduction. This cooperative spirit had to precede introduction to assure completion of public hearings, legislative deliberations, and passage timed to put a "jobs bill" on my desk for signature by the end of the month.

As is the case with all appropriation bills, I must mention that I retain my line-item veto authority to strike or reduce items I believe unacceptable in the bill as passed by the legislature. But my staff and the staffs of all departments of the state government have been instructed to work closely with the finance committees to suggest any appropriate specific project modification or replacement. By this method, I hope to eliminate the need for line-item vetoes or reductions.

PRIORITY #1 - \$1000.0

The projects to be accomplished under this request will include restoration and improvement of fish habitat in Southeast and Southcentral, construction of boat launch ramps in Ketchikan and Kasilof, improved access for anglers on Prince of Wales Island, and clam diggers on the Kenai Peninsula.

Jordan Creek and Duck Creek Fish Habitat Restoration (Juneau) \$ 90.0 25 man-months  
Remove all non-natural debris, such as tires, plastics and scrap lumber, and excavate sediment from channels and pools to improve spawning and rearing habitat in these two streams.

Both of these streams once produced significant numbers of coho and pink salmon; Dolly Varden and cutthroat trout. Habitat abuses brought on by valley development have greatly reduced the ability of the streams to produce fish. The proposed work will restore fish production in these streams to the benefit of both sport and commercial users.

Montana Creek Rearing Pond (Juneau) \$ 75.0 16 man-months  
Construct a rearing pond adjacent to Montana Creek in the area of the lower Montana Creek Road. This pond would be used to imprint and rear juvenile salmonoids, primarily steelhead, for subsequent release into Montana Creek.

Prince of Wales Island Access Improvements (Klawock) \$120.0 30 man-months  
Construct a trail along Klawock River and boat launch ramps on Klawock Lake, Sarkar Lake, and Neck Lake. Defined access points will eliminate conflicts with private landowners.

Mountain Point Boat Launch (Ketchikan) \$400.0 60 man-months  
Construct two-lane ramp and expand parking area of existing ramp site. This is a popular access point for both recreational and commercial fishermen on the south end of Tongass Narrows.

Lucille Lake Outlet Control Structure Repair (Wasilla) \$ 25.0 5 man-months  
This is a control structure at the outlet of Lucille Lake that maintains the water level in Lucille Lake and prevents fish migration into and out of the lake. The structure is some 20 years old and is in poor condition. Should the outlet fail, it will wash out a secondary road and result in a substantial drop in the lake level. The lake is lined with residential homes.

Kasilof River Boat Ramp (Soldotna) \$ 70.0 11 man-months  
Construct boat ramp at existing public facility on Kasilof River. Would be used primarily by anglers. There is a growing demand for a launch site for drift boats in this area.

Clam Gulch Road Improvement (Soldotna) \$ 90.0 15 man-months  
Road provides beach access to the heavily used clam digging areas and a state campground facility. Road is badly in need of improvements and no agency has accepted responsibility for the road.

Fish Cleaning Stations (Southeast Alaska) \$100.0 16 man-months  
Construct fish cleaning stations on public docks in communities throughout southeast Alaska. These stations, costing approximately \$10.0 each, will greatly improve the safety and aesthetics of the docks.

Harding Lake Boat Channel Reconstruction (Fairbanks) \$ 30.0 4 man-months  
The project would deepen and straighten the existing boat channel off the boat ramp at the Harding Lake State Campground. At present no adequate boat launching facility is available at Harding Lake. The improvements would benefit both the angling public and other recreational users in the Fairbanks area.

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PRIORITY #4 - \$1000.0

The projects to be accomplished under this request will include angler and boater access improvements throughout the state and construction or repair of weirs and other structures needed to manage the fishery resources of Southcentral and the Interior.

- Fish Creek Spawning Channel (Hyder) \$ 70.0 16 man-months  
Construct a spawning channel to enhance coho fishery in upper Portland Canal. Also provide an observatory and information kiosk near spawning channels to help attract tourists to the area.
- Cordova Boat Launch (Cordova) \$140.0 23 man-months  
Construct a single-lane launch ramp and mooring float to relieve congestion at existing ramp. Recent increase in the number of trailerized commercial and sport fishing boats in the area has severely taxed the existing facilities.
- Montana Creek Angler Access (Juneau) \$ 60.0 16 man-months  
Construct a trail along Montana Creek from its confluence with the Mendenhall River upstream to the rifle range bridge in order to provide access to recreational fishing waters.
- Little Susitna River Weir (Wasilla) \$ 70.0 18 man-months  
Construct a permanent fish weir on the Little Susitna River to adequately manage the sport fishery. This is one of the largest and most rapidly growing sport fisheries in the state.
- Anchor River Weir Kiosk (Homer) \$ 25.0 4 man-months  
Construct an information kiosk near the end of the spit. This would be an area where the public can view various displays of recreational type information.
- Miller's Landing Road Improvement (Homer) \$100.0 19 man-months  
Improve a ½-mile road which provides access to marine waters of Kachemak Bay for fishing and other recreational uses.
- Birch Lake and Little Harding Outlet Control Structure Improvements (Fairbanks) \$ 30.0 7 man-months  
The proposed improvement to the Birch Lake outlet structure would make essential maintenance possible without the necessity of bringing heavy equipment across private property. This weir maintenance is essential for the continuation of the second largest stocked lake fishery in the Tanana Valley. The outlet work at Little Harding Lake (a stocked roadside lake) would improve angler access and repair and upgrade the existing outlet structure.
- Hawk Inlet Public Float (Juneau) \$ 69.0 9 man-months  
Construct a public mooring float in Hawk Inlet. This float would provide a harbor of refuge for boaters in the upper Chatham Strait and Icy Strait area. This float would increase recreational boating and sport fishing in the area and could also be used by commercial fishermen.
- Deshka River Research Facility Repair (Mat-Su Valley) \$ 25.0 7 man-months  
The main cabin, water tower, and storage buildings at this site are over 20 years old and are in need of renovation. The supporting structures are in various stages of rotting and the roof needs to be replaced.
- Ward Creek Estuary Rehabilitation (Ketchikan) \$100.0 28 man-months

ECONOMIC ASSISTANCE PACKAGE - CAPITAL PROJECTS SELECTION CRITERIA

BASIC CRITERIA:

The following criteria must be substantially met in order for projects to be considered for inclusion. Degree of compliance with the criteria also serves as the basis for prioritizing qualified projects.

- A. Meets Need. Project meets a meaningful need. Generally this does not include non-essential or marginally necessary proposals.
- B. Street-Ready. The significant portion of the project expenditure will occur preferably during calendar year 1988, but not later than 1989. An assumption has been made that project funds will be available for actual expenditure prior to May 1988.
- C. Minimizes Operating Costs. Project results in a reduction or basically neutral impact to ongoing operating costs, particularly those requiring state general fund support. Projects for communities, municipalities, boroughs, and REAA's that increase operating costs may be included if the project satisfies other basic criteria and there is evidence of an ability and commitment to meet the ongoing costs.
- D. Labor Intensive. To the extent practicable, project is labor intensive. For example, a project to purchase equipment will not compete well, particularly if it is likely to be an out-of-state item.
- E. Alaskan Hire. Project is small enough in dollar size to ensure Alaskan vendor or contractor selection to the maximum extent possible. An amount of \$5 million or less for individual projects has been used as an approximate cut-off. This also allows spreading program impact to a maximum number of communities. Included as well for as many projects as legally possible will be application of the 10% Alaska bidder preference.

## ADDITIONAL CRITERIA:

The following are additional criteria to prioritize further relatively equal projects that substantially satisfy the basic criteria.

- A. Immediate Economic Stimulation. Project offers a reasonable potential for stimulating immediate economic activity that will result in some permanent job creation.
- B. Employs the Unemployed. Consider the trend over the last 12 to 18 months in overall unemployment statistics for communities and census areas.
- C. Leverages Other Funds. Leverage of state general funds with federal or local funds can also serve as a basis for selecting between otherwise equal projects.
- D. Balances Work. Some consideration for balancing available work between crafts and trades can be used as well.
- E. Prioritizing by Others. Relative ranking provided by the submitting agency or community is another basis for selecting between otherwise qualified projects.

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act making special appropriations for projects to boost the Alaska economy; and providing for an effective date."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. PURPOSE. The purpose of this appropriation Act is to commit the expenditure of approximately \$75,000,000 from the state general fund to a series of projects selected to put Alaskans throughout the state to work. The projects were selected to:

(1) provide a worthwhile public purpose;

(2) provide immediate employment and begin significant expenditure during calendar year 1988;

(3) be labor intensive; and

(4) ensure to the maximum extent possible the use of Alaskan contractors or vendors.

\* Sec. 2. IMPLEMENTATION. In the expenditure of the money appropriated by this Act, agencies are to be guided by the state Administrative Manual, with emphasis on the following requirements:

(1) there are to be separate solicitations (bids or requests for proposals) for goods or professional services, to accommodate Alaskan vendors if Alaskan vendors would otherwise not be able to respond;

(2) agency officials are to ensure that agency employees secure quotations from Alaskan vendors to make small purchases;

(3) agencies are to specify products grown and manufactured in Alaska when agencies seek wood products, food, or other materials;

1 additionally, agencies are to identify state and federal projects that  
2 support the use of precast concrete made in Alaska; and

3 (4) at least 10 percent of evaluation points for proposals for  
4 services should go to qualified Alaskan vendors.
