# Small Single Site School Districts and CSHB 25 (Fin)

---

**F**or the coming school year (1992-93) the DOE reports there will be 22 single site school districts of 800 ADM or less.

CSHB 25(Fin) has 15 single site school districts named in Sec. 1 (b) for additional district support. The allocation amount for these 15 districts is \$2,131,200. The allocation is derived by using the same amount schools received last year in HB 5.

This excludes:

- Four (4) REAA's — Adak, Aleutian Region, Annette Island, and Kashunamiut School Districts
- Nome School District
- Petersburg School District
- Wrangell School District

**T**he inequities with the list are:

1. Title 14 computes K-12 units for REAAs the same as for city/borough school districts. To suggest, as has been done before, that they are left off because of their PL81-874 funding is not defensible. All districts have 90% of their eligible PL81-874 funds deducted when computing basic need. To deny single site REAAs inclusion with the single site districts on such a basis in fact takes their PL81-874 funds into account twice. No other districts are treated this way. Multi-site REAAs are in no way penalized because of their PL81-874 funds. During FY 91 and 92 REAAs were omitted from additional district support. That action is now being challenged through the PL81-874 appeal process.
2. The Wrangell, Petersburg and Nome School Districts are not listed. They were omitted from the first draft as last year's HB 5 (the original list) addressed schools with 500 ADM or less. The list now has a district with over 500 ADM estimated for FY 93:

Dillingham School District estimates	553 ADM
Wrangell School District estimates	527 ADM
Nome School District estimates	773 ADM
Petersburg School District estimates	722 ADM

Wrangell and Petersburg School Districts were funded last year in HB 15. To omit them is to treat them differently than they were treated last year.

**T**he 15 school districts listed in CSHB 25(Fin) can no longer be defined as single sites of a certain enrollment.

**F**ifteen (15) of the twenty-two (22) districts are given allocation based on last years appropriation in HB 5. Seven (7) districts have nothing.

**A**ll of this makes a good case for changing the Foundation Formula in Title 14 thus preventing the need to yearly decide who should be on the list and how much they should receive.

NOTE TO AMENDMENT:

THIS AMENDMENT WOULD INCREASE FUNDING FOR ADDITIONAL OPERATING COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE NOME-BELTZ SCHOOL COMPLEX WHICH WAS FORMERLY OPERATED AS A STATEWIDE BOARDING SCHOOL. THE COMPLEX WAS TURNED OVER TO THE CITY OF NOME FOR LOCAL USE BUT IS EXTRAORDINARILY EXPENSIVE TO OPERATE.

FUNDS WILL ALSO OFFSET COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH AN EXTREMELY HIGH SPECIAL EDUCATION CENSUS--OVER 200 STUDENTS.

LAST YEAR, THE LEGISLATURE APPROPRIATED \$150,000 AS A FY 91 SUPPLEMENTAL WHICH WAS VETOED BY THE GOVERNOR. THE DISTRICT HAS RECEIVED NO FY 92 SINGLE SITE FUNDING NOR IS NOME PRESENTLY INCLUDED IN THE SINGLE SITE ALLOCATION FOR FY 93.

Dear Commissioner Covey:

This letter represents another attempt to draw to your attention a problem that occurred when Governor Hickel vetoed an appropriation to Nome Public Schools in the amount of \$150,000 for operation and maintenance of the Nome Beltz Complex. I apologize for my inability to adequately communicate the issue clearly enough so that you can focus on a remedy or an explanation, but please bear with me one more time.

In May 1991, HB15 carried 2.8M for nineteen single-dual site districts with less than 750 ADM. (Section 131, page 27, line 26, of HB15 - Exhibit #2) (Also see attached Exhibit #1.) Nome was not included in this supplemental appropriation.

However, Nome was included in HB15, Section 156, page 31, line 5, for an appropriation described as FY'91 Nome Beltz School Operation and Maintenance. This is the payment that had been established to defray costs of facilities constructed for former statewide boarding school programs, but now adapted for local use. (See Exhibit #2 and Exhibit #3.)

Governor Hickel vetoed the HB15 line items that carried the 2.8M for nineteen single-dual site districts with less than 750 ADM and the line item of \$150,000 payment for Nome Beltz, upon the recommendation of the Department of Education. My belief is that the \$150,000 earmarked to be paid to Nome Beltz, a payment which was historically established, was erroneously combined with the nineteen single-dual site assistance appropriations in the Department of Education's recommendation to Governor Hickel for veto. (See Exhibit #4.)

I do not know if the agreement between the Department of Education and Nome Public Schools, that allowed the State of Alaska to help defray costs of adapting a state-wide boarding school to local use, was written or implied, but obviously some authority existed for the appropriation to have been made in years past, in 1988, and in 1991. (See Exhibit #3.)


My questions to you, Mr. Commissioner, are these:

- 1) Was the appropriation for Nome Beltz, HB15 Section 156, page 31, line 5, erroneously included for veto along with Section 131, page 27, line 26, of HB15?
- 2) If the Nome Beltz appropriation was erroneously recommended for veto, can it be restored?
- 3) What can be done to see that if the Nome Beltz appropriation gets through legislation again this year that the Department of Education will not once again recommend it for veto?

In Governor Hickel's correspondence to me he did indicate that he followed the Department of Education recommendations for veto. You have a copy of that letter.

Thank you for once again spending time to help remedy what I believe to be an error or to explain why legislative action on behalf of Nome Beltz was disregarded by the Department of Education.

The intent of this letter is to make a declaratory statement concerning special financial needs of the Nome Public Schools.


Over the past year we have been heavily impacted by students who need special education services. Fetal Alcohol Syndrome, children of single parent families and profoundly handicapped along with learning disability children have caused special education numbers to reach over two hundred students. Our total school population is 773 ADM. This is an extraordinary percentage of special needs children.

A second area of concern is the unusually high cost of maintenance required by the Nome Beltz facility. Although Nome Beltz is undergoing a life/safety code upgrade, the aged heating equipment and air handling equipment is less than efficient. The Nome Beltz campus is made up of several buildings erected in the 50's for a regional trade school.

Nome must be included in the single site formula, single site payment schedule or given an excess space consideration.

Your help is desperately needed and will be appreciated.



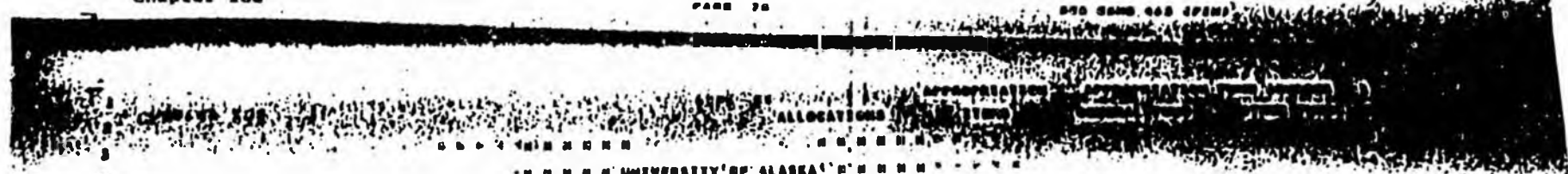

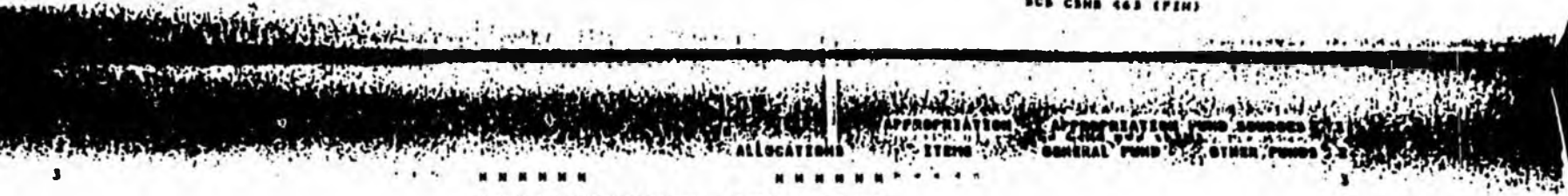
