This is to amend the Department of Law's request of March 28, 1996, for a supplemental appropriation to pay judgments awarded against the state, to include four new judgments that have been awarded since our original request was made. These judgments total \$173,784, which should be paid from the general fund. All of the judgments thus far total \$358,620 for the general fund, \$239,200 for the International Airports Revenue Fund, \$13,586 for general fund/Mental Health Lands, and \$4,012 for the Public Employees Retirement Fund.

Dear Senators Frank and Halford:

The Senate Finance Committee is currently considering CS HB 468 (FIN) am, the FY 96 supplemental appropriations bill. Two sections of that bill relate to the Copper River Highway litigation Consent Decree. The first, section 13 (b), provides for the appropriation of \$720,000 to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities ("ADOT/PF") for training for ADOT/PF personnel, public service announcements, and restoration of natural resources and historical and cultural artifacts damaged by the 1991 road work. This section contains no provision for payment of costs and attorney fees for any party, including the Department of Law.

The second provision, a proposed amendment to section 10, provides for an appropriation of \$40,000 to the Department of Law to pay Trustees for Alaska for costs and attorneys fees arising from the Copper River Highway litigation. As part of the settlement agreement which calls for this payment, Trustees for Alaska agreed that this money will be used to support legal actions directed against the United States concerning contamination on federal facilities. Section 9 of the agreement specifically forbids use of the money in any lawsuits against the State of Alaska. A copy of the agreement is enclosed for your information.

There will be other expenses that arise out of the Consent Decree, but they do not require funding at this time. In order to be sure that you have the entire settlement available for


your consideration, we previously provided a copy of the Consent Decree to you. I am enclosing with this letter a summary of the requirements of the decree and the time frames in which they must be completed.

The Consent Decree provides specific times by which the various requirements must be completed. The money sought through this supplemental appropriation is for requirements that, under the Consent Decree, are to be completed before money could be made available from the Fiscal Year 1998 appropriations. Section 17 of the Consent Decree provides that, if by September 1, 1998 the legislature fails to provide funding to fulfill the settlement requirements, the settlement is null and void and the court will be asked to vacate the Consent Decree and allow the litigation to continue.

Thank you for your consideration of these requests.

SUMMARY OF COPPER RIVER HIGHWAY LITIGATION SETTLEMENT

1. **Scope** – Full settlement of all claims by all parties.
2. **Injunction** – State enjoined from the unpermitted discharge of dredged or fill material into waters of the United States during construction or maintenance work on the Copper River Highway ("CRH") until construction of such projects is completed.
3. **Annual Meetings** – ADOT/PF and the Corps will meet annually to review all anticipated transportation construction and maintenance plans for the year and resolve potential CWA problems.
4. **Wetlands Coordinator** – ADOT/PF will have a wetlands coordinator to review all transportation construction and maintenance projects and ensure CWA compliance. [already in place]
5. **Education** – ADOT/PF will provide biennial training to its employees on CWA requirements and applicable laws intended to protect historical and cultural resources. [already in place]
6. **Public Service Announcements** – ADOT/PF will make a series of public service announcements on the importance of complying with the requirements of the CWA. [June 26, 1996]
7. **Restoration** – ADOT/PF will undertake environmental restoration at specific sites on the northern section of the CRH and specific historical and cultural resource restoration projects, including, at a cost of approximately \$200,000, rehabilitation or stabilization of five historic structures on the northern section of the CRH. [fall of 1997]
8. **Mitigation** – Because restoration of some resources is not feasible, the State will perform one or more sockeye salmon habitat enhancement projects in the Copper River watershed at a cost of not less than \$50,000. [December 31, 1999]
9. **Penalties and Costs** – Civil penalties and litigation expenses will be assumed to be \$200,000. This amount will be offset by the agreement of the United States to pay the State \$200,000 in settlement of potential claims relating to the Toksook Bay site.
10. **Environmental Projects** – ADOT/PF will perform one or more of the following environmental projects at a cost of not less than \$400,000: (1) implementation of a solid waste management plan for the Copper River watershed area, (2) habitat protection in the Copper River watershed, (3) replacement of the Hatchery Creek culverts near Cordova with a bridge, (4) sockeye or coho salmon habitat enhancement projects, or (5) other projects approved by the United States. [December 31, 2003]
11. **Attorney's fees for private plaintiffs** – The State will pay \$40,000 to Trustees for Alaska for attorney's fees, to be used by Trustees for investigation or litigation over contaminated federal facilities. [September 1, 1996]

1 This Settlement Agreement is made and entered into by
 2 all defendants ("State of Alaska" or "State") and all private
 3 plaintiffs ("Trustees for Alaska" or "Trustees") in full
 4 settlement of all claims, as described in paragraph 10 below,
 5 arising out of the State Department of Transportation and Public
 6 Facilities' activities on or in the vicinity of the Copper River
 7 Highway during the summer of 1991 through the date this
 8 Settlement Agreement is signed by the parties.

10 INTRODUCTION

 12 1. On February 19, 1992, Trustees for Alaska filed
 13 this action alleging that the State Department of Transportation
 14 and Public Facilities ("ADOT/PF") violated the Clean Water Act in
 15 the course of its work on the Copper River Highway during the
 16 summer of 1991. One week later, on February 26, 1992, the United
 17 States of America filed a lawsuit against the State based on the
 18 same activities, and seeking similar relief. The two actions
 19 were consolidated for pretrial purposes on May 19, 1992, and on
 20 July 16, 1993, the State filed a counterclaim against the United
 21 States only.

 23 2. The State, Trustees, and the United States have

5 10. Effective upon Final Approval of the Consent

RESERVATION OF RIGHTS

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11. This Settlement Agreement does not constitute an admission of fact or law, or of any liability, by either the State or by Trustees. Except as expressly stated in this Settlement Agreement and in the Consent Decree, the State and Trustees reserve against all persons or entities all rights, claims, or defenses available to them relating to or arising from the work performed by the State on the Copper River Highway between 1991 and the present.

12. Nothing in this Settlement Agreement creates, nor shall it be construed as creating, any claim, admission, or enforcement right in favor of a person not a signatory to this Settlement Agreement.

MISCELLANEOUS

13. Within a reasonable time following Final Approval of the Consent Decree, the parties shall submit a stipulation for Final Judgment to the Court.

14. In the event the Alaska State Legislature fails to provide funding to carry out the provisions of paragraphs 9 through 12 of the Consent Decree, and the State is unable to otherwise provide funding for those provisions, the State will

SUBJECT: FY96 Supplemental - Salary and Benefit Study

Before the Senate Finance Committee completes work on the FY96 supplemental request, HB468, I ask that you consider the addition of funding to pay for a salary and benefit study. The need for such a study was initially pointed out by the Long Range Fiscal Planning Commission which recommended a study be done to:

"Compare salaries and benefits of public employees to appropriate private markets in Alaska and the Pacific Northwest. Use that comparison to move Alaska's pay system for State Employees, local government employees, and school districts to market".

During the House Finance Committee hearings on the new collective bargaining agreements, the Administration argued that state employee salaries have not kept up with inflation and that the new three year agreements will bring state salary in line with the private sector. While the information available does not support these arguments, it is less than perfect. For instance, while the Department of Administration's 1994 Salary Study shows that state worker salaries are 8% above the private sector, the report did not fully compare the cost of benefits.

SUBJECT: Criminal prosecution/defense caseload and budget comparison

You have requested a ten-year comparison of the criminal caseloads between the Department of Law, Criminal Division, and the Department of Administration, Office of Public Advocacy, and Public Defenders Office.

The earliest readily available data for the Department of Law was from FY 89, so all data begins with that year and ends with the projections through the end of FY 96. As noted on the spreadsheet, some cases in the Department of Law's Criminal Division, relevant to probation revocation were excluded due to inavailability of recent data. The exclusion of that data should not materially affect the growth rate, as the number of those cases appears to remain stable from year to year.

We are working on a revised level of supplemental appropriation for the Office of Public Advocacy, and will be advising Senator Phillips of our recommendation.

As you begin your review of HB 468, the Governor's supplemental legislation, please consider the following amendments.

As stated in my letter to you of March 7, 1996, and Annalee McConnell's letter of March 14, 1996, due to unexpected increases in applicants for the Longevity Bonus Program, we are experiencing a shortage of funds for FY96 and FY97. We anticipate the additional need for FY96 to be as much as \$1.6 million but will not have updated estimates until after warrants are run on March 26. We will provide that updated estimates as soon as they are available.

Section 12 should be amended to add the following subsection to allow the Permanent Fund Dividend Division to use garnishment fees.

(c) The sum of \$150,000 is appropriated from the Permanent Fund dividend fund to the Department of Revenue to cover increased contractual services for the the year ending June 30, 1996.

Section 14 (a) of the bill should be amended to reflect additional stale dated warrants and miscellaneous claims:

Department staff continue to clean up old appropriations that do not have zero balances in the accounting records. We request an appropriation to the Permanent Fund Dividend (PFD) Division in the amount of \$150.0 (thousand) in program receipts be included in the FY 96 Supplemental Appropriation Bill. AS 43.23.071 and 15 AAC 23.263 (b) authorize the PFD division to collect a \$2 fee for processing requests to garnish permanent fund dividend payments. It is these fees that make up the program receipts we are requesting to supplement our budget. The additional funds will be used to pay for unplanned computer mainframe charge back expenses.

In 1994, the department initiated a project to upgrade the PFD data processing system. This project involved converting data for all dividend years to a common format, rewriting the computer code to improve data storage and retrieval, and adding several new features to the PFD system to enhance productivity and provide improved customer service to applicants. The old computer system included a patchwork of data storage formats, some of which were incompatible with one another. The PFD division staff spent much of their time in the slow process of data retrieval, thus increasing the time required to process applications and decreasing the time available to directly assist applicants.

The PFD program software was designed and written in 1981 and 1982. The division's programs run on the Department of Administration's (DOA) mainframe computer in Juneau. As statutes and regulations changed, the PFD division staff patched on the changes needed to the software to accommodate the changes in the law. After 12 years of changes, the software had come to resemble the proverbial Rube Goldberg contraption. The computer system, as it had evolved by 1994 was burdensome to maintain and operate.

Each year, the PFD division staff must add to the computer databases information on more than 500,000 applicants. For the division to do its job well, it needs both

efficient information storage and easy data retrieval. In addition to storing and accessing the information on all applicants for the current dividend year, it must be able to access application information for 19 years because the governing statutes provide that when individuals reach 18 years of age, they may apply for all permanent fund dividends that their parents or guardians neglected to apply for for them. Because of the patchwork of data formats, the division staff were unable to easily look at a single applicant's dividend history. This meant that applicants were sometimes asked unnecessarily to provide information from many years earlier rather than the division staff retrieving the information electronically.

When the division began its current software re-write project in December, 1994, it had no backup system. This meant that the division had to close down its computer operations each time it worked on any major portion of the re-write of the computer code governing the system. This slowed the processing of 1995 dividend applications. Further, in order to distribute dividends in October, 1995, the division was compelled to re-write the computer code in a sequence that was not optimal from a programming perspective. The division is now in the process of completing the final sections of the project. In sum, we have found that the costs of rewriting the program are substantially higher than the division originally anticipated.

Finally, we have found that the division has not been anticipating the increased costs associated with the increasing data storage requirements. We are now in the sixteenth year of the dividend program. Clearly, our data storage requirements will continue to increase over the next three years, when we will have nineteen years of information stored. Then, our database size should remain relatively constant. As we add another year of data, one should also drop out; the only increase in data storage requirements will be from increases in the number of dividend applicants each year.

We ask your approval of this request to enable us to continue PFD division operations through the 1996 dividend application period. We have implemented a much closer monitoring of the division's monthly expenditures. Nanci Jones, the division director, is now working closely with the Division of Information Services in the Department of Administration to monitor and reduce computer charge back expenses wherever possible. As an additional cost savings effort, the division has curtailed its temporary staff by 437 workdays, resulting in a savings of approximately \$43,000.

I will closely monitor the division's budget, and ensure that all possible cost efficiencies are pursued. Further, I will ensure that our future budget requests accurately reflect our true data processing needs.
