The parties to this agreement are the LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS AGENCY, on behalf of the Alaska State Legislature's Interim Committee on the Constitutional Convention, hereinafter referred to as the AGENCY, and Victor Fischer, hereinafter referred to as the "CONSULTANT."

THE PURPOSE OF THIS AGREEMENT is to provide specialized research and consulting services to the Interim Committee on the Constitutional Convention.

IT IS THEREFORE MUTUALLY AGREED THAT:

CLAUSE I STATEMENT OF WORK:

The CONSULTANT shall, as directed by the project director (s), provide the Interim Committee on the Constitutional Convention with specialized research and consulting services relating to the Constitution, Constitutional Convention, and constitutional issues including but not limited to:

- (a) developing major constitutional issues into an introductory report for use at public hearings;
- (b) development of in-depth analysis of several constitutional issues to be determined by the project manager (s);
- (c) attending public hearings and assisting in the analysis of the information gathered at the meetings.
- (d) assisting in the gathering and reproduction of archival materials;
- (e) assisting in the preparation of the final report for the committee;
- (f) coordinating with committee staff and other consultants
- (g) other duties assigned by the project manager (s).

CLAUSE II - PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

- (A) The period of this contract shall be from July 1, 1979, to June 30, 1980, unless extended by written agreement or terminated in accordance with (B) of this clause.

(B) This contract may be terminated by mutual agreement.

CLAUSE III - COMPENSATION AND METHOD OF PAYMENT

- (A) Payment for work performed under this agreement shall be at the rate of \$50.00 per hour or \$250.00 per day, whichever is less, to be paid before the last working day of each month for work carried out between the 15th day of the preceding month and the 15th day of the current month. On or before the 10th day of each month, the CONSULTANT shall submit a statement of time worked to the Project Director (s) for approval. Total compensation for the work performed under Clause I shall not exceed \$15,000.00.
- (B) The AGENCY shall furnish travel (coach fare) and per diem (prevailing state employee rates), long distance telephone charges related to business of the committee, clerical support, and equipment necessary to carry out the work designated in Clause I of this agreement.
- (C) Office space shall be provided by the CONSULTANT
- (D) No other employee benefits are allowed the CONSULTANT.

CLAUSE IV - PROJECT DIRECTORS

The Project Directors for the Constitutional Convention Committee shall be the Honorable George Hohman and the Honorable Brian Rogers.

CLAUSE V - RECORDS

The CONSULTANT shall keep the Project Director informed as to the progress of work performed under this agreement and shall provide written progress reports as specified by him.

CLAUSE VI- RECORDS, DOCUMENTS, AUDIT

The CONSULTANT shall maintain accurate records, including detailed time records, as may be required by the AGENCY. The records are subject to inspection by the AGENCY at all reasonable times. All documents, reports and writings produced in the course of the work performed under this contract are, upon delivery to the AGENCY or at termination of this agreement, the property of the AGENCY, and/or in the public domain; provided that the CONSULTANT will have the right to use any such materials for purposes of writing about or discussing the issues.



The parties to this Agreement are the LEGISLATIVE AFFAIRS AGENCY, hereinafter referred to as the "Agency", and DOUGLAS POPE, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor."

THE PURPOSE OF THIS AGREEMENT is to provide the Interim Committee on a Constitutional Convention, through the Agency, professional services relating to issues studied by the committee.

IT IS THEREFORE MUTUALLY AGREED THAT:

CLAUSE I. STATEMENT OF WORK

- (A) The Contractor shall provide the committee with professional consulting and administrative services with regard to issues relating to any call for a constitutional convention in Alaska and any issues which could arise at any constitutional convention called in Alaska.

CLAUSE I. TERM OF TERMINATION

- (A) The period of this contract shall be retroactive to July 1, 1979, and terminate on June 1, 1980, unless extended, or terminated in accordance with (B) of this Clause.
- (B) This contract may be terminated by either party on written notice to the other.

CLAUSE III. PROJECT DIRECTOR

The project director shall be Representative Brian Rogers, co-chairman of the Interim Committee on a Constitutional Convention.

CLAUSE IV. COMPENSATION AND METHOD OF PAYMENT

- (A) The Contractor shall be compensated at the rate of \$200 per day for his own services, while traveling or otherwise away from his own office in Anchorage, and at the rate of \$50.00 per hour for services performed as an attorney and administrator while in Anchorage.
- (B) The Contractor shall be reimbursed for all expenses incurred which are authorized in advance by the Project Director. The Contractor shall be reimbursed on the basis of coach class airfare and prevailing state employee per diem rates for all travel expenses authorized in advance by the Project Director. Travel expense claims shall be submitted on forms provided by the Agency. Contractor shall be reimbursed for long distance telephone charges incurred in the course of the Contractor's work under this contract.

- (C) Total compensation under this contract, inclusive of all expenses, shall not exceed \$10,000.00.

CLAUSE V. OFFICE SPACE, EQUIPMENT, CLERICAL SUPPORT

Office space, equipment and clerical support necessary to carry out the Contractor's obligations under this contract shall be supplied by the Contractor at no cost to the Agency, unless authorized by the Project Director.

CLAUSE VI. PROGRESS REPORTS

The Contractor shall keep the Project Director informed as to the progress of the work performed under this agreement and shall provide progress reports as specified by him.

CLAUSE VII. RECORDS, DOCUMENTS, AUDIT

The Contractor shall maintain accurate records, including detailed time records as may be required by the Agency. The records are subject to inspection by the Agency at all reasonable times. 




Dear Brian:

Enclosed is a final draft of a contract between myself and the Legislative Affairs Agency for work requested by the Interim Committee on a Constitutional Convention. If it meets your concerns, please sign and forward to the agency. With regard to the one particular concern you voiced, clause IV(a) leaves room for the Committee to be billed at a daily rather than the hourly rate while I'm in Anchorage but attending meetings.

In addition you have advised me that there will be a meeting in Fairbanks on September 19th and have requested that the following issues be researched prior to the meeting in order that I will be prepared to comment. I intend to have a succinct memo for the members of that meeting to accompany my discussion.

- (1) Draft Legislation for a call, including
 - (a) Procedures of a call that may be passed by the legislature relating to a convention and
 - (b) A bill or a resolution calling the convention itself.
- (2) An analysis of apportionment of the convention by the legislature, including
 - (a) Relevant case law and
 - (b) What to expect if someone sues to halt a convention called based upon the apportionment schedule established.

In addition to those issues that you requested be researched prior to the September 19th meeting, you have also asked me to initiate research which I have placed under the general heading of "limitations of state sovereignty." I intend to have enough research done to be able to make general comments with regard to that topic, but will not have a memorandum available at that date. Please advise if you wish to have any other issues researched and commented upon in memoranda form for the September 19th meeting.
