At your request, Representative Goll, I am enclosing a copy of my letter to Governor Sheffield dated January 28, 1983, together with a copy of the resume I submitted to the Governor at the time of my original appointment to the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission (CFEC).

I note that the resume badly needs editing and updating. In particular, I would like to add that I obtained extensive instruction in administrative adjudication from the National Judicial College during the fall of 1983.

The following is a brief chronology of my history at the Entry Commission.

- 10/6/82 Former Governor Hammond appointed me to CFEC to complete a term ending 7/1/84
- 3/15/83 Governor Sheffield reappointed me to CFEC
- 6/8/83 The Legislature confirmed my appointment
- 7/1/83 Governor Sheffield appointed me Chairman of the Entry Commission
- 7/2/84 Governor Sheffield reappointed me to a full 4-year term ending 7/1/88

Dear Governor Sheffield:


I was appointed to the Commercial Fisheries Entry Commission on October 6, 1982. If you so decide, I would very much appreciate your support in seeking confirmation of my appointment by the Legislature. I would be very happy to provide you with any information helpful to you in your decision.

Briefly, as a matter of general background, I am a lawyer with ten years of experience in Alaska, largely in the area of administrative law. A substantial portion of my legal work has been conducted in bush villeges of western Alaska. I came to the attention of the past administration only by virtue of having represented a large number of private individuals against various state and federal officials. When asked whether I wished to be considered for an appointment to the CFEC, because of an abiding interest in Alaska commercial fisheries, I readily said yes.

I am now deeply involved in the CFEC's adjudication caseload. As the only lawyer on the CFEC, I feel that my contribution to the CFEC is unique. I believe that my relationship to CFEC staff and the other Commissioners is very good.

I understand that the Governor's office has a file which includes my resume as well as other information pertaining to my appointment. Again, if I can provide your office with any additional information, I would be happy to do so.
