MEMORANDUM

SUBJECT: Legislative Teleconferencing

TO : House and Senate Leadership, Chairmen - Standing and Special Committees

FROM : Jack Doyle, Executive Director *J. Doyle*

During the 1978 Session, this Agency will implement a Legislative Teleconferencing Network pursuant to Legislative Resolve 93. This is a closed circuit communication system joining the capital to centrally located teleconferencing centers in Fairbanks, Anchorage, Nome, Bethel and Ketchikan. Its mainstay is a 24-hour dedicated audio circuit which will provide Alaskans able to travel to a teleconferencing center, a way of participating in committee hearings or in less formal meetings such as those arranged by legislators for small groups of constituents.

To assure flexibility in scheduling and seating capacity, the following five rooms have been equipped with wall-mounted terminating jacks to the dedicated circuit:

- House Judiciary - - - - - Room 124
- House State Affairs - - - Room 123-A
- House NESS- - - - - Room 112
- Senate Resources- - - - - Room 126
- Sen. Meland's Office- - - Room 205

Of course, no sound can be transmitted to or from these rooms unless an audioconference is scheduled, in which event the audio terminal will be installed, microphones arranged and electricity supplied the equipment. All such equipment will be kept in the possession of the Legislative Affairs Agency and shall be installed for legislative use by the Teleconferencing Network Coordinator at the request of a legislator.

In addition to the audioconferencing plan, the Legislative Teleconferencing Network Task Force has scheduled three two-way videoconferences for February 16, March 16, and April 13, using the Governor's Conference Room as the Juneau transmission site.

A full description of the teleconference network and a detailed explanation of its use is the subject of a report presented to the Legislative Council by the Legislative Teleconferencing Network Task Force.

The system should be operational by the first week of February. Prior to that time, Peter Fromuth, the Teleconferencing Network Coordinator, will contact you and your staff to discuss its use and methods of operation.

Videoconferences will be televised via the State leased satellite and may be watched in communities receiving television as part of the State Television Demonstration Project.

- *1 Optional date, to be decided based upon anticipated overall work load for coordinator prior to this date; does not require special preparations by RCA; utilizes TV Demo. Project transponder #23
- *2 After March 1, 1978 Eagle River earth station comes on line; previously available odd numbered "occasional use" transponder will no longer be guaranteed available. However, even numbered (opposite polarization) transponders will be available. Only Eagle River, Bartlett and Lena Pt. are equipped to uplink and downlink these even numbered transponders.
- *3 By March 1 RCA will have conducted tests of the feasibility of 1/2 channel video between all participating communities. If results are positive then subsequent videoconferences can be 1/2 channel duplex (March 16 and April 13)
- *4 Equipment necessary for Nome's participation in both one-way and two-way videoconferencing must be installed on a temporary basis by RCA. Some of this will have to be moved from Bethel. One month transportation and installation time has been allowed. The equipment will be left in Nome for approximately 2 weeks during which time one or two additional one-way videoconferences could be held.
- *5 In the event of a negative 1/2 channel duplex test, use of two full channels remains the only means for two-way videoconferencing for Nome. Nome cannot uplink or down link an even numbered transponder for full channel video. Therefore NTS traffic will have to be temporarily rerouted by RCA to free up an odd numbered occasional use transponder; this is an administrative, not a technical matter.
