of \$10 to be applied to the Boney Memorial Fund.

- (b) Local bar associations will be formally approached for contributions to the Boney Memorial Fund.
- (c) The Bar Association will investigate the feasibility of passing a rule, to be approved by the Alaska Supreme Court, which will permit the trust monies to be kept in interest-bearing accounts and the interest to be turned over to the Boney Memorial Fund.
- (d) The ABA will offer to provide matching funds out of the Boney Memorial Fund with the Native regional corporations who give grants or loans for the study of law.

Disbursing the Fund

- (a) Structure the Boney Memorial Fund to provide loans to Alaskan students for the study of law. The awards would be based on merit and there would be a partial or complete forgiveness of the loan if the recipient agreed to practice in rural areas for a fixed number of years.
- (b) Allocate a portion of the Boney Fund for use in the newly-created Anchorage School District tutorial program for blacks and Alaskan Natives.

(c) Compile a list of organizations presently giving money to minorities (e.g., BIA, CINA, Alaskan Native Brotherhood, for purposes of coordinating the loans made to minorities and maintaining an accurate count on the number of Alaskan ethnic minorities who are studying law.

(d) Additionally, or alternatively, use the Boney funds to provide loans to take the bar review course and the bar exam. This loan would be repaid.

At the request of the Board of Governors, I appeared at their May meeting to discuss the contents of our report. Here below, follows an update on that report and action taken by the Board of Governors:

I. RESTORATION OF WICHE FUNDS.

The Senate version of the Post Secondary Education Commission budget was passed out of free conference committee. The 42 present recipients of WICHE funds were granted funds for the 1979 - 1980 school year. Twenty-seven new applicants were funded; 27 new applicants were not funded.

The Board of Governors voted to make the Committee on Legal Educational Opportunities a standing committee and directed that one of its responsibilities be that of monitoring the WICHE budget as it winds its way annually through the Governor's Office, the Legislature and the Free Conference Committee.

II. ETHNIC MINORITIES AND THE STUDY OF LAW.

One hundred fifteen candidates for admission to the practice of law took the February bar exam in Alaska. Included in that number were 2 blacks and 5 Alaskan Natives. Sixty-seven per cent of all the candidates were successful; none of the ethnic minorities were. Because the number of ethnic minorities taking the Alaska bar is not statistically significant, I compared the pass-fail rate in Alaska with that in California for whites and blacks, the only two groups for which figures are available in both states. The statistics were almost identical.

The Board of Governors assigned the following responsibilities to the committee: monitor the California study of racial and cultural bias in its bar exam; determine if nationwide evidence of racial and cultural bias exists for the multi-state exam; identify those law schools that are affirmatively interested in minority enrollment and act as a clearing house between those schools and Alaska's minority students; keep abreast of the University of Alaska's efforts to provide in-state legal education.

Several of our recommendations were assigned to other standing committees for action, e.g., the Public Services Committee will be asked to act on our recommendation re providing high school speakers; the paralegal committee will receive our recommendations re paralegals as a profession.

III. BONEY MEMORIAL FUND.

The Board of Governors adopted our recommendation to provide an optional add-on charge on next year's bar dues statements and asked us to be responsible for notifying the local bar associations of the change in the bar dues statement for next year. The Board also directed us to approach local bar associations for contributions. The Board has asked that the Committee present a detailed structure for the scholarship fund and present it at their September meeting. The question of keeping client trust monies in interest-bearing accounts, as a source of fund-raising, is presently being explored in other states and the Bar Office will monitor those efforts. The Committee has also been assigned the responsibility of compiling a list of organizations that have funds available for minority law school scholarships and loans and to maintain a clearinghouse of this information as well as an accurate count of the minorities admitted to practice or studying law. The Board has suggested that an article be written for the Bar Rag describing the minority tutorial program within the Anchorage School District to determine if there are members interested in supporting that program. The Board rejected the recommendation that loans be made to take the bar review course and the bar exam.

I attended the Board of Governors/Committee Chairmen meeting held during the annual convention in Sitka. At my suggestion, the membership of several committees will be more geographically balanced this coming year as some committees attempt to meet through the use of the tele-conference network. This network is available in at least 12 Alaskan cities through the Legislative Information Agency.

I understand that President Willard will be making new committee assignments for the following year. Our committee was not a standing committee at the time that bar members expressed their preferences for committee assignments. Therefore, if you are interested in serving again on this committee or you know someone who would be so interested, please get that information to Donna Willard or me as soon as possible.

I am enclosing for your information the 1978-1979 final report of this committee. You will note that the Board of Governors has requested that we be responsible for:

- a) Monitoring WICHE funds for the study of law;
- b) monitoring the California study of racial and cultural bias in its bar exam;
- c) monitoring the pass-fail rate of ethnic minorities taking the Alaska bar exam;
- d) identifying law schools affirmatively interested in minority enrollment;
- e) acting as a clearinghouse between those law schools and Alaska's minority students;
- f) monitoring the U of A's efforts to provide in-state legal education;
- g) preparing a detailed statement of how the scholarship fund will operate;
- h) publicizing the scholarship program and soliciting contributions for it;
- i) acting as a clearinghouse regarding scholarships available to Alaskans studying law;

I have already written to the State Bar of California and asked for information regarding its study of racial and cultural bias in its bar exam. I have also been informed of the John Manders Foundation, a Seattle-based foundation created expressly to further the practice of law in Alaska, and I have written for information about the foundation.

Since the Scholarship fund will require the most lead time to implement, I am anxious that we have an outline ready for the Board of Governor's September meeting. I am enclosing a draft of how the scholarship fund could be organized. This draft is for purposes of discussion only and can be amended or totally scrapped if you have some better ideas.

Now that we are a standing committee, our numbers have been officially expanded to nine and we have increased the representation of members outside the Anchorage area. I want to make a real effort to keep the non-Anchorage members fully involved with the Committee and have arranged to hold our first meeting by teleconference hookup through the Legislative Information Offices.

Date of Award - About April 15, after it can be determined how much money was contributed by way of bar dues solicitation

Eligibility - In this order:

1. Any graduate of an Alaska high school who maintained a B average in college academic subjects;
2. Any Alaska resident presently studying law who maintains a C+ average or better;
3. Any Alaska resident who maintained a B average in college academic subjects and who is beginning the study of law.

Type - \$1,000 scholarship(s)

Number - Depending on Funds

Application Deadline - December 15th

Distribution - Applications to be maintained at and returned to ABA office and then turned over to Commission chair on December 16th.

Publication - Notice to be sent to all Alaska high schools; all West Coast law schools, to all WICHE applicants (if their names are available); to as many community and other organizations as is feasible, e.g., churches, clubs, Native corporations, minority associations; press release; Bar Rag.

Scholarship Committee - President of the ABA; Chair of ABA Bar Foundation, Chair of CLEO will make final decision of their respective delegates.

Selection Process - CLEO members will review the applications and recommend to the selection committee at least 3 names for every scholarship to be awarded.

Funding - Boney Memorial Fund, ABA member individual contributions, local bar contributions, corporate contributions.

AGENDA: ABA SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Committee met by teleconference hookup on July 31st. Those in attendance were Chief Justice Rabinowitz, Fairbanks; Carolyn Jones and Pat Anderson, Anchorage. There were two observers in Juneau: James Hanlon and Chuck Borbridge.

The following matters were discussed:

1. ABA Scholarship Fund: The Committee has prepared a draft for your consideration and for presentation at the October Board of Governors' Meeting. See enclosure.

2. Bar exam and ethnic minorities: The Committee agrees that the number of ethnic minorities in Alaska who take the bar exam is too small a sample to be meaningful and that we should continue to monitor the ongoing study by the State Bar of California. To date, that study has concluded that: (a) the pass/fail rates of whites and minorities did not change when the number of ethnic minority graders were increased; (b) the magnitude of difference in average performance levels between racial/ethnic groups remains relatively constant across the essay questions as well as the multiple choice questions; (c) individual questions or subtests do not differentially favor or discriminate against a particular group; (d) controlling for potentially relevant attitudinal and background characteristics of the applicants, e.g., socioeconomic status, did not change the group disparities. (e) CONTROLLING FOR AN APPLICANT'S PERFORMANCE IN LAW SCHOOL AS WELL AS THE OVERALL CALIBER OF THE STUDENTS ATTENDING DIFFERENT SCHOOLS SUBSTANTIALLY REDUCES BETWEEN GROUP DIFFERENCES IN THEIR PASSING RATES.

While the Committee has not reached a decision regarding what responsibility, if any, the ABA should accept with regard to the pass/fail rate of racial/ethnic minorities, the Committee did agree to take the following action:

a. Individually contact minorities who have failed in the past to determine what their problems in taking the exam were.

b. Offer support to unsuccessful candidates in the form of going over their exam with them at the ABA office. The Board of Governors at their September meeting approved the insertion of our offer to help in the announcement letters sent out to unsuccessful candidates.

c. Request that a separate sheet, similar to the one used by the California bar, be distributed with applications to take the exam. This sheet would explain that our Committee is monitoring the impact of the exam on racial/ethnic minorities and ask them to identify their racial/ethnic background and return the sheet under separate mail to this Committee. The information would be kept confidential and would be used only to monitor the pass/fail rate of racial/ethnic minorities. The Board also agreed at its September meeting to distribute this form with the blank applications to take the bar exam.

ALASKA BAR ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Eligibility:

Any individual who at the time of his/her application is (1) a resident of Alaska, (2) has a present intent to practice law in Alaska upon graduation from law school, and (3) at the time of the scholarship award is admitted to an accredited law school.

Criteria For Awards:

Scholarship awards shall be made annually based on funds available and, in the discretion of the awards committee, to applicants in need as measured by tuition costs, living costs, geographic distance between Alaska and applicant's law school, family needs.

Amount of Awards:

The size of scholarships awarded shall depend upon the amount of money in the scholarship fund, and the number and need of the applicants.

Application Deadline:

February 1st.

Time of Award:

Summer preceding law school year for which the award is made.

Application Distribution:

Blank applications will be available at the office of the Alaska Bar Association, and the offices of the clerk of court throughout the state.

Publication Regarding Scholarship Program:

Notice of the ABA Scholarship Fund will be distributed to (1) the nonprofit arms of the Alaskan Native corporations, (2) through the State Postsecondary Education Commission (the WICHE program).

Selection Process:

The Committee on Legal Educational Opportunities will review the applications and present their recommendations in rank order to the selection committee.

Scholarship Committee:

The President of the ABA; one member of the ABA Bar Foundation, and the Chair of CLEO will make the final decision regarding scholarship awards.

Funding: Boney Memorial Fund, ABA member individual contributions via \$10 optional checkoff on annual billing, local bar contributions, corporate contributions.

Re: Report of Administrative
Law Committee

Dear Donna:

As promised in several previous conversations, here is the 1978-1979 report of the Administrative Law Committee.

The Committee held two lengthy meetings during the past year, in addition to numerous contacts and phone conversations that occurred in between and afterward. Most of the Committee's efforts were directed at two items. The first one was a proposed regulation initiated by the Alaska Public Offices Commission (APOC) dealing with "administrative lobbying". Some members of the Committee were disturbed by suggested definitions of "lobbyist" and "administrative action", and what effect those definitions and their related reporting requirements would have on the practice of law before administrative agencies. Over the years the Committee has consistently taken the position that the practice of law before administrative agencies does not constitute "lobbying" under the Purviews of the Alaska Public Offices Commission Act.

In the most recent instance, the Committee was concerned about the breadth of the proposed regulations and whether they met the limits of the enabling statute itself. After our first Committee meeting, an inquiry was made to the Alaska Public Offices Commission, and from that it appeared that the intent of the regulations was not to encompass the bald practice of law before administrative agencies, but was more in terms of regulating other "contacts" made to administrative agencies. After this word came from the APOC it was felt that those particular draft regulations, while they could well be improved, would not necessarily affect the practice of law before administrative agencies as we have always known it.

The other major issue the Committee worked on at great length was a possible adaptation of the Model Administrative Procedure Act to Alaska. For years the Committee has studied the Model APA and urged that a version of it tailored to Alaska be enacted

by the Legislature. This has been the subject of at least one resolution adopted at a Bar Convention. Unfortunately, there was never enough Legislative interest in such a bill, and the model APA that we used then was sorely out of date.

However, at our first Committee meeting this past year a member from the Attorney General's office supplied the Committee with a draft amendment to the Alaska Administrative Procedure Act that was being proposed by the current Administration. The Committee worked over that draft, and in its second meeting spent a great deal of time marking up a new version of that bill to tailor it to Alaska from the standpoints of the business and consuming public. Luckily, as always the composition of the Committee is such that many varied interests are well represented.

Following that second meeting when the draft bill was marked up, the Committee waited to see if the Administration or whoever might ultimately sponsor such a bill would like the assistance of the Committee or any of its members in aiding its passage. However, it now appears that the Administration decided not to pursue this particular bill because the promulgation of a new Model APA is apparently in the works. Hence, no bill was introduced in 1979. The issue is one that I'm sure will be taken up again by the Administrative Law Committee before the next Legislative Session. Hopefully a new Model APA will be along before then.

It was also brought to my attention by a Committee member that the current bill that would create a new intermediate court of Appeals (SB 104) denotes that the new court will handle administrative appeals. However, SB 104 seems to focus the scope of the new court primarily on criminal appeals. While there may well be a need for an appellate court for criminal appeals, it may be troublesome to those who practice administrative law to a great degree to have their appeals heard by a court whose expertise and time is devoted primarily to criminal matters. No doubt the Committee will discuss this further before the 1980 Legislative Session, and it may well be a matter that the Board of Governors itself may wish to consider in its own deliberations in formulating its own position on the new intermediate appellate court.

On another Legislative front, I note that the APOC recently acknowledged that, as presently written, the definition of "administrative action" in AS 24.45.171(1) is overbroad and often would require a person to report normal inquiries of administrative agencies or routine actions required by Alaska law. Hence, House Bill 423 was introduced on March 22nd which deals (again) with administrative "lobbying" under the Alaska Public Offices Act. So it appears that definitions of "lobbyist" and "administrative action" are far from being resolved. I'm sure the Committee


will consider this bill during the coming year. Input from the Administrative Law Committee will be important to any definition of "administrative action".

I apologize for the delay in getting this report to you, and also to Ken Jarvi. Unfortunately, the press of business in closing out my practice with Alaska Legal Services foreclosed getting this report to you when I should have. I now close out five years as Chairman of the Committee and pass the torch on to the new Chairman, Mary Patch. I would like to remain a member of the committee if that is possible. I think the body of knowledge accumulated by long-time members such as Andy Hoge and myself can be helpful to the future deliberations of the Committee. In the past the Committee has been successful in getting many pieces of legislation enacted to improve the practice of administrative law, has had beneficial impact on administrative rule making and continues to be, in my opinion, one of the Bar's best working committees.

Thank you for your patience waiting for this.

REPORT OF ADMINISTRATIVE LAW COMMITTEE
MAY 1978

Formal activities of the Administrative Law Committee over the past year were limited to comment on proposed changes in the State's Lobbying Law, plus a repeated attempt at enactment of a law creating a central corps of hearing examiners to conduct administrative hearings for various State agencies.

At the urging of the Bar's Executive Director, late last summer the undersigned attended and participated in hearings conducted in Anchorage by an Interim Legislative Committee contemplating changes in the State's Lobbying Law. Of prime concern regarding the State's Lobbying Law was-- and is--the Lobbying Act's definition of administrative "lobbying".

"Legislative" lobbying and "administrative" lobbying are completely different, and as I suggested to the Legislative Committee, the lack of clarity in the Lobbying Act is tantamount to a declaration that the very practice of law before State administrative agencies constitutes "lobbying"---and is therefore subject to the strictures of the Lobbying Act. I also pointed out my belief that the Lobbying Act was not intended to apply to the practice of law before State Administrative Agencies, but it did seem reasonable that perhaps certain types of "contacts" with State officials may well need regulation. The ambiguity in the Act with respect to administrative "lobbying" had been recognized by the Alaska Public Offices Commission, and therefore the Commission found no way to enforce it. There was some opposition to this point of view from others present, but even after more discussion the Interim Committee took no action at the meeting. I believe the only bill presently wending its way through the Legislature with regard to Lobbying does not address the concerns I expressed to the Interim Committee.

On another Legislative front, a member of the Administrative Law Committee made a spirited attempt at getting the 1978 Legislature to adopt a bill creating a central corps of hearing examiners to preside at administrative hearings of certain State regulatory agencies. This concept has been a priority of the Administrative Law Committee for years, and has even been the subject of a resolution adopted at an Alaska Bar Convention. Bills to accomplish this objective have been introduced in every

legislature since 1972, but none, of course, have been enacted. Although the 1978 Legislature is still in Session, it appears that the Hearing Examiner bill is again doomed to failure.

Other than these two efforts, the Administrative Law Committee took no other actions. An ill-fated attempt was made to have a joint meeting with the Public Utilities Committee, and other attempts were made to coordinate committee meetings, but schedule conflicts of various committee members made it impossible to meet at those particular times. The fault must be laid at the feet of the Committee Chairman, and it must be acknowledged that some members of the Committee expressed a clear desire that the committee meet and discuss various issues. This did not happen, and schedule conflicts and the press of business on committee members--and the Committee Chairman--were the prime causes.

However, the Committee Chairman is making every effort to convene a meeting of the Committee and re-institute regular meetings as the Committee did in the past when it was acknowledged to be one of the Bar's hardest working committees. The Chairman proposes to continue these efforts to convene a meeting, conduct business, and report to the President-Elect in writing at the earliest possible opportunity on the success of these efforts, assuming the President-Elect chooses to retain the present Chairman for a fifth year.
