

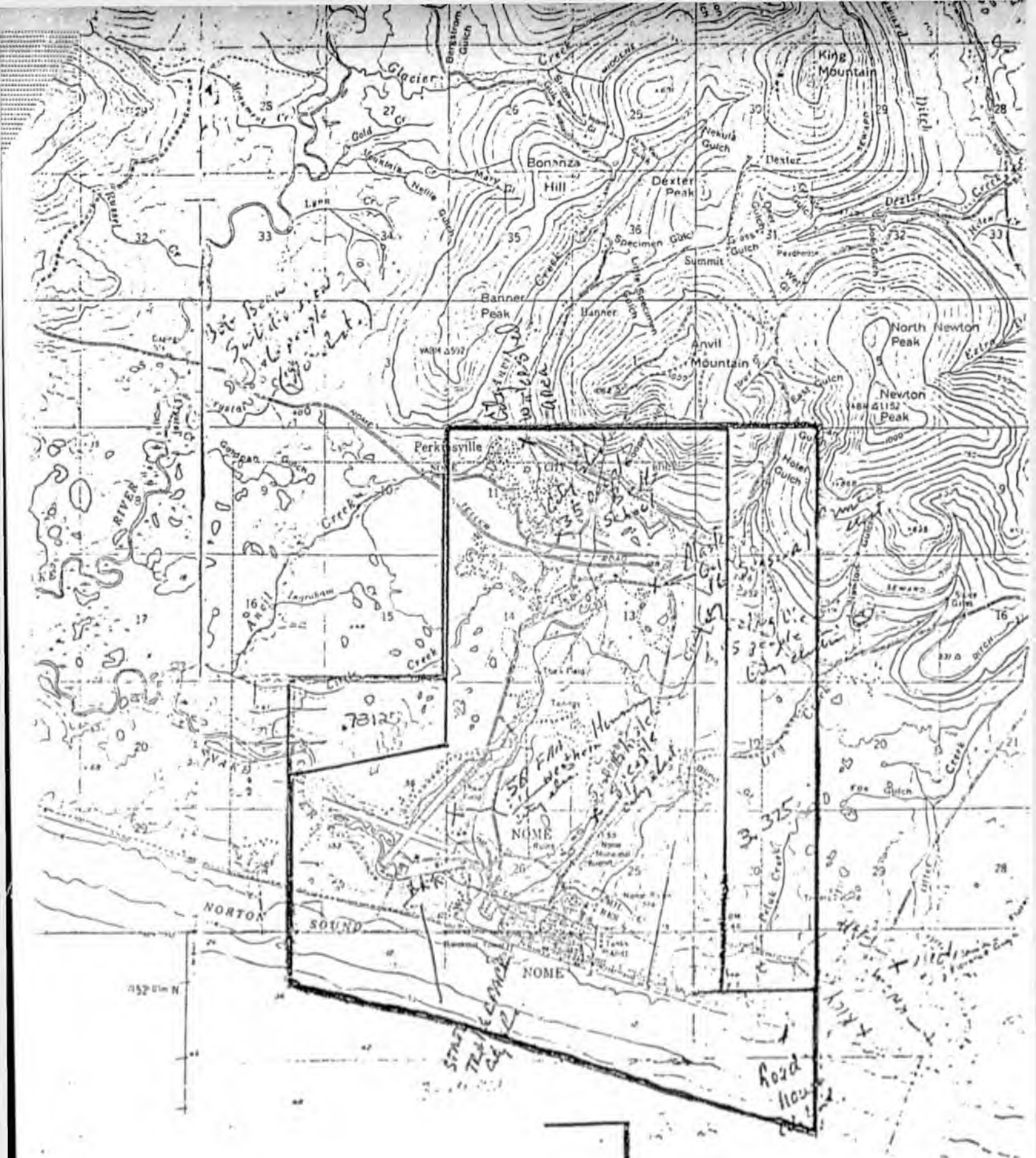

Statement to Legislative Teleconference
Hearing Regarding Nome Annexation

IV. - L. Widom - City Manager

I must apologize for not being able to appear before you in person today, but I had a trip scheduled outside for over a month now and couldn't change my plans. The City of Nome is fortunate to have the opportunity to discuss our annexation request once again. In fact, we are excited by the fact that we can tell the tale of annexation to someone who is interested in our situation.

I won't go into a long history. However, some of our past is relevant to this hearing. Nome was incorporated in 1901 and we are celebrating our 80th anniversary this year. Since that time, the boundaries of the City have been .85 square miles. No, your eyes and ears are not wrong, we still are today less than 1 square mile in size. This is for a city that once had over 10,000 population during the early years.

Today, our State recognized population is 2,892, the largest and only first-class city in northwest Alaska. Several attempts to annex over the years have ended in failure. One of the most recent ended up leaving the City the same way it has always been. In 1968, the City petitioned the Boundary Commission to annex 15.32 sq. miles. This action was subsequently challenged by what is now Alaska Gold and invalidated by the Court in 1971. The Supreme Court took this action because the Boundary Commission didn't have the required standards.

The current annexation has been in progress for almost 4 years. Numerous public hearings were held to inquire from and inform the public. In August of 1978, the Council passed an ordinance to annex 235.65 sq. mi. While this might seem to be a great deal of territory, there are at least 2 other cities in Alaska much larger that have been approved by the Boundary Commission. Valdez has 274 sq. mi. and Skagway is 443 sq. mi. Other cities in Alaska with much smaller populations include Nightmute, pop. 135 with 102 sq. mi., Togiak, pop. 474 is 42 sq. mi., McGrath, pop. 382 is 48 sq. mi., & Stebbins, pop. 309 is 35 sq. mi. The City was justified in requesting that much land

because the area is under influence of the City and that territory influences Nome as well.

The real issue is why does the City of Nome want to increase its boundaries? In the first place, our airport, our junior & senior high school, a major subdivision and at least 252 people (latest count) live outside the City and are dependent on the City for services in one way or another. Most of these people live within 1.5 miles of the present City limits in a major subdivision, FAA and State housing as well as dormitory housing at the Nome/Beltz complex.

The City of Nome is growing. We want to put a 5,000 foot causeway into Norton Sound and have 7 million bond dollars obligated for that purpose. The proposed land area for the port is not presently inside the City limits. While the problems are not insurmountable, we still have to gain title to the land and tidelands. Not having this area inside the City makes this situation a difficult one. The State of Alaska has \$6,989,000 to build a new jail and would like to do so inside the City. At the present time, all water & sewer is inside the City and we want to keep it that way. This annexation would certainly allow us more flexibility in choosing a site for the State jail.

The junior, senior high school is also outside the City. We feel that it is necessary to have this facility inside City limits because it is City-owned. Our water supply, Moonlight Springs, also should be brought into the City. The State airport should be part of the City of Nome. We are looking at an OCS sale in Sept., 1982. From all indications, the City of Nome and especially the airport, will be impacted by any exploration and development when it occurs. The City should be involved in the planning for this facility, not as a courtesy of the State, but as an integral part of the City's comprehensive plan and future development.

It is also important for you to realize that the City of Nome & the Seward Peninsula will soon be impacted by mineral development. There are 40% of the U.S. known tin reserves located just 210 miles northwest of Nome. Both Anaconda and Kennecott copper are actively discussing development of resources to the north and northeast of Nome. Other known minerals besides gold and silver are uranium, beryllium, fluorite tungsten, lead, zinc & copper. Sizeable coal deposits are also located here.

One of the key issues in this annexation is Alaska Gold's concern over taxation & ability to develop their holdings. All of the land to be annexed (except for the airport and a few hundred other acres) are in privately held mining claims. These undeveloped claims by State law can be taxed at the maximum rate of \$20 per 200 acres. Any development that takes place could be better controlled if it were in the City since the majority of their holdings are currently in the unorganized borough without any planning at all.

A concern of the natives was that they desire to control their own land. The Boundary Commission took that concern & others into consideration and cut the City's request from 235 sq. mi. to 17.83 sq. mi. This annexation would enlarge the City from its present .85 sq. mi. and make us a total of 18.68 sq. mi., certainly not a huge entity that many organizations were originally concerned about.

I have already described many of the consequences of our not being allowed to annex. There are more that I will not go into. Hopefully, you will understand our plight and not take action to destroy our opportunity to positively plan for our future. As you are aware, if this annexation is disapproved by the legislature, then the City of Nome will remain .85 sq. mi. in size.

STATEMENT OF DECISION

WHEREAS, on July 14, 1980 the City of Nome submitted a petition to the Local Boundary Commission (hereinafter "Commission") through the Alaska Department of Community and Regional Affairs (hereinafter "Department") in accordance with applicable laws and regulations of the State of Alaska, requesting the annexation of approximately 235.65 square miles; and

WHEREAS, on July 25, 1980 the Department determined the petition to be acceptable as to form and content; and

WHEREAS, the Department caused to be published, proper notice of filing of the petition for annexation; and

WHEREAS, on November 21, 1980 the Commission conducted a physical inspection of the area proposed for annexation and held a public hearing, with prescribed notice, on the petition for annexation; and

WHEREAS, on December 11, 1980 the Commission held, with prescribed notice, a meeting to render a decision on the petition for annexation;

NOW, THEREFORE, based upon the extensive briefings of the Petitioner and the Respondents, the investigation and the report as amended by the Department, the physical inspection of the territory by two members of the Commission, and the information obtained from the public hearing, the Commission makes the following findings of fact and enters its decision pursuant thereto:

Much of the area proposed for annexation by the City of Nome is uninhabited, unlikely to be developed in the foreseeable future, and does not otherwise satisfy the standards for annexation set forth in 19 AAC 05.010. However, the territory described on page six of this Statement of Decision, and outlined, approximately, in red on "Attachment A" to this Statement of Decision, warrants annexation to the present corporate boundaries of the City of Nome for the following reasons:

1. The territory is urban in character. Approximately 246 of the estimated 252 residents of the area proposed for annexation by the Petitioner reside in this territory. Virtually all of the population in the territory stems from actual growth of the City of

Nome beyond its legal boundaries, to the extent that approximately eight percent of the greater-Nome population is now found in the territory. Icy View, a large subdivision, is located in the territory. Most of the land is in private ownership. Much of the property has been mined by dredging, and is appropriately included within the territory to be annexed by reason of its suitability for prospective urban purposes due to the gravel base and melted permafrost. Some of the land in private ownership has been held for sale in the past.

2. The territory is in need of municipal services which the City of Nome can provide most efficiently. There is no other municipality in the region. The City of Nome is providing many services to the territory at the present time, and the City of Nome is capable of, and willing to extend additional services to the territory. The municipal services necessary to the territory include fire protection, law enforcement, schools and education, street maintenance and snow removal, solid waste disposal, water, electricity, animal control and health regulation.
3. The history of Nome and the present trend indicates that future growth and development of the community will likely occur within the territory. Potential development of remaining lots within the existing boundaries of the City

of Nome is hampered by extensive wetland problems, substantial private holdings not for sale during the past decades, and the availability of more attractive lots for development on melted permafrost at such locations as Icy View Subdivision. Annexation of the territory will enable the City of Nome to plan for and control that development which has occurred, and which will continue to occur within the territory.

4. The health and safety of City residents presently is endangered by problems relating to animal control, flood control, fire protection, law enforcement, and solid waste disposal existing in the territory. Annexation will alleviate these conditions by expanding enforcement jurisdiction enabling planning and regulation, and producing a tax base necessary for extending services to the territory.
5. The formal extension of police, fire protection, health, education and planning services to the territory is necessary to enable the City of Nome to provide adequate services to City residents. It is legally impossible and economically impractical for the City of Nome to extend these services effectively unless the territory is within the boundaries of the City.

6. Residents of, and owners of property in the territory receive the benefit of City services without commensurate tax contributions. These services include education and schools, fire protection and solid waste disposal. Differential pricing of water and electrical utilities, where in effect, does not contribute to the bonding base necessary to replace or upgrade aging capital facilities. No alternative method for offsetting the costs of providing services has been found satisfactory to the Department or this Commission.
7. The annexation is otherwise necessary to accomplish the valid public purpose of enfranchising the residents of the territory who are already receiving substantial services without participation in government. Annexation of the territory is also necessary to accomplish the valid public purpose of unifying the educational jurisdiction of the public school system. More generally, annexation is necessary to accomplish the public purpose of promoting a sense of community in the entire Nome area.
8. The Commission finds as further support for annexation of the territory described below, the statement of facts pertaining thereto by the Petitioner and the Department.

THEREFORE, the Commission hereby approves and will recommend to the First Session of the Twelfth Legislature of the State of Alaska, annexation of the following described territory to the City of Nome:

Beginning at the protracted NW corner of Section 11, T11S, R34W, Kateel River Meridian; thence east to the protracted NE corner of Section 7, T11S, R33W, K.R.M.; thence south to the protracted SE corner of Section 31, T11S, R33W, K.R.M.; thence continuing south along the same line to a point 4,000 feet seaward of the mean high tide line of Norton Sound; thence meandering northwesterly along a line 4,000 feet seaward of and paralleling the mean high tide line of Norton Sound to a point due south of the protracted SW corner of the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 28, T11S, R34W, K.R.M.; thence north to the protracted NW corner of the NE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 21, T11S, R34W, K.R.M.; thence east to the protracted SE corner of Section 15, T11S, R34W, K.R.M.; thence north to the protracted NW corner of Section 11, T11S, R34W, K.R.M., the point of beginning, excluding the existing boundaries of the City of Nome, containing 17.83 square miles, more or less, situated in the Second Judicial District, State of Alaska, as outlined, approximately, in red on "Attachment A" hereto.

A Short History of the Proposed Annexation
of Territory to the City of Nome

1968. Nome annexes approximately 14 square miles of territory.

1971. The Alaska Supreme Court invalidates the annexation on the grounds that the Local Boundary Commission had not promulgated standards for annexation.

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July 14, 1980. City of Nome petitions for the annexation of 235.65 square miles of land.

July 25, 1980. The petition is determined to be sufficient as to form and content and is accepted by the Department of Community and Regional Affairs.

Oct. 29, 1980. A report from the Department to the Local Boundary Commission recommends a smaller area of approximately 14 square miles be annexed.

November, 1980. The City Council passes a resolution to correct a discrepancy between the authorizing ordinance of August 28, 1978, and the petition of July 14, 1980, concerning the description of the land to be annexed.

Nov. 21, 1980. A public hearing is held in Nome. The petition is opposed by the Alaska Gold Company, Bering Straits Native Corp. and Sitnasuak Corp., all of which file extensive briefs stating various procedural and substantive objections.

Dec. 11, 1980. The Local Boundary Commission issues a statement of decision stating that the proposed annexation (235.65 square miles) does not meet the standards set forth in 19 AAC 05.010 (see attachment). However, the LBC decides that a smaller parcel of 17.8 square miles does meet the standards and should be annexed. The LBC notes in its decision that the annexation meets standards 3 through 9. 19 AAC 05.010 requires that one or more of the 9 standards must be met for annexation.

Most of the land belonging to the two Native Corporations is eliminated from annexation by the reduction of territory to the 17.8 square mile parcel. This largely removes the basis for opposition by these two groups.

The Alaska Gold Co., which has substantial holdings of land within the 17.8 square mile annexation, remains adamantly opposed to the annexation. In its post hearing brief, the Gold Co. alleges that:

1. the annexation petition is defective;
2. the LBC misapplied its standards;
3. the LBC made improper contacts with the city;
4. the LBC cannot independently alter an annexation petition; and
5. the only reason the City wishes to annex is to bring the Gold Co. within its taxing jurisdiction and that it has no plans to extend services to the annexed area.
