For a Bill entitled: "An Act relating to services for pregnant women; and providing for an effective date."

This Bill provides for expansion of pregnancy related health and social services and authorizes State funding of the cost of non-medical service for pregnant women experiencing social and economic difficulties during the prenatal and postpartum periods. These services are to include adoption assistance, counseling, transportation, care received in maternity and foster homes and training in parenting skills, as well as birthing centers, midwife services, and postnatal care.

Although the Department offers a wide range of public services, many women experience difficulties and hardships in obtaining timely and adequate pregnancy care. These difficulties are associated with economic barriers to private care and unavailability of many services in rural communities. These gaps in pregnancy related services may be summarized as follows:

1. financial inability of many low income and adolescent women to pay for travel outside of their communities for medically necessary care;
2. fragmentation of the pregnancy care delivery system, that inhibits provision of education, counseling, referral, medical, and follow-up services required by many women;
3. unavailability of many pregnancy-related services in rural communities;
4. lack of appropriate housing near major medical centers, where women from rural communities may stay while obtaining out-patient maternal care services; and
5. insufficient adoption counseling and placement services.

This Bill will expand the types of services available to maternal clients who are experiencing social and economic difficulties associated with childbearing. Medical care services included in this Bill include birthing centers, midwife services, and postnatal care. Since pregnancy related medical services for low income women are already covered by the Division of Public Assistance, the Department assumes the intent of this Bill is to provide the social services related to pregnancy. Therefore, the cost of this program is anticipated to be in the area of social services which come under the Division of Family and Youth Services.

Social services offered will include counseling, placement in a maternity home or foster home, transportation between the client's home and the foster or maternity home, training in parenting skills, and adoption assistance. The Department anticipates that the social services would be contracted out to local community providers, thereby reducing the costs within the Department.

This Bill offers transportation, counseling, adoption assistance, and maternity or foster home care to women experiencing economic and social difficulties associated with childbearing. The Bill at the present time does not include specific definitions of "economic and social difficulties associated with childbearing," but allows the Department to adopt regulations to define those terms. As part of the adoption of regulations process, the Department would plan to conduct public hearings to assist in formulating appropriate standards on which to determine eligibility for services. At this point, it is perceived that draft regulations would define economic need to be up to 200% of the Federal Community Services Administration's Alaska Non-Farm Poverty Guideline (attached), and social needs to include those individuals who are having psychological, emotional, and family problems associated with the pregnancy.

RECOMMENDATION

It is the Department's interpretation that the intent of this Bill is to provide non-medical pregnancy related services to women experiencing social and economic difficulties. Since medical care is available to beneficiaries of the Aid to Families With Dependent Children (AFDC) Program, the Department recommends that reference to medical services (birthing centers, midwife, and postnatal care) be deleted. If the legislative intent is to provide additional medical services beyond the scope of current Public Assistance programs, then the Department recommends that reference to other than medical services be deleted.

If this Bill is not adequately funded, the complete services as described in Section 2 cannot be provided to all of those who need and qualify for these services. With reduced fiscal support, the Department recommends that only counseling services be included in Section 2 until a time when sufficient funds are available.

Dear Dr. Fritz:

I would like this opportunity to respond to the Health Education and Social Services Committee request for additional information concerning House Bill No. 39, "An Act relating to services to pregnant women." At the February 16, 1983 hearing, the committee requested clarification concerning the following items:

1) The committee requested a budgetary estimate for providing pregnancy related medical care to women addressed by this bill.

Assuming that the intent of this service would be to provide medical care to women who do not have access to other resources, (i.e., Medicaid, General Relief Medical, private pay, Public Health Service or other insurance) an estimated cost would be \$1,176,000 for FY 84. This estimate is based upon utilization experience by a similar service provided through a pilot project at the Fairbanks Health Center. During 1981-1982, the project provided medical care financial assistance to approximately 7 percent of the total births in the North Star Borough. Assuming that the total number of births in FY 84 will be approximately 12,000, it is estimated that 840 women would qualify for this service at an average cost of \$1,400 per client. Additional state staff would not be required if the Division of Public Assistance would perform the bill paying, and the Division of Public Health would provide client intake and eligibility certification.

2) The committee requested information concerning the state expenditures for abortions, the number provided and the criteria for those receiving state assistance.

The number of abortions provided by the General Relief Medical program during calendar year 1982 is estimated to be 276, with an approximate total expenditure of \$269,354. The criteria for General Relief Medical assistance is \$300 monthly income for one adult, plus \$100 for each additional in adult only households; and \$350 for parent plus 1 child with \$50 for each additional child in parent/child households.


3) The committee requested identification of possible budget reductions in the social services fiscal note to be investigated.

Based upon conversations with staff for Representative Miller and Representative Martin, comments of the Booth Memorial Home staff, and Division of Family and Youth Services, the fiscal note could be reduced by a total \$587,700 in FY 84. The suggested modifications are as follows:

Dear Mr. Palmer:

Per your questions of February 18, 1983 pertaining to State-funded abortions, I have obtained the following information from the Division of Public Assistance. Between January 1, 1982 and June 30, 1982, one hundred and fifteen (115) abortions were paid for through the State funded General Relief Medical program for a total cost of \$112,231. In annualizing these figures, the Division of Public Assistance projected 276 State funded abortions in calendar year 1982 for a total estimated cost of \$269,354.

In June, 1982, the Division of Public Assistance converted from a manual to an automated payment system. Because of time lags in processing payments through the new system, Public Assistance felt it would be more accurate to make projections based on the five month period than to use information from the new system which may contain distortions attendant to system start-up.

The Department assumes that the services delineated in this Bill would be utilized mostly by unmarried women. Using this pool as the target group, the Department would further assume that the more youthful unmarried women (ages 13-24) would be more more likely to utilize maternity and foster home care; whereas the older group (ages 25-45) would utilize the community services, such as counseling and adoption assistance.

The younger age group consists of 1,163 women. The Department estimates that approximately 190 of this group would avail themselves of the services of a maternity home or foster home (30 maternity and 160 foster), and a total of 300 would utilize available counseling and adoption assistance.

The Department recommends that the entire range of services be contracted out to local community providers. This would reduce the amount of administrative costs. However, it is recommended that an Associate Coordinator (Range 18) be established to initiate the program on a statewide basis. This individual would be responsible for planning, program development, preparation of requests for proposals and contracts, and contract monitoring and program evaluation for the initial two years only, and would then be phased out with duties being assumed by the regional offices of the Division.

The costs for the Associate Coordinator position includes: Travel - two trips of three days each to perform program reviews; Contractual - telephone rental and long distance of \$678, postage of \$300, copier usage of \$120, printing and advertising of \$500, and office space rent of \$1,002; and Commodities - \$400 for general office supplies.

A 6% inflation rate has been added to future years' estimated costs. Medical costs will be borne by the Division of Public Assistance.

RE: House Bill #56: "An Act relating to scholarship loans."

The committee amendments, reported to me by my aide who was in attendance at the March 25th House HESS meeting, are excellent. They protect the ability of the students to get sufficient funds while going a long way towards making the loans into legitimate income-earning state investments instead of remaining just another expensive give away program.

Specifically, I agree:

- Section 3* → 1. That the interest rate become 8%;
- Section 1 & 2* → 2. That the loan maximums stay at the current \$6000 and \$7000;
- Section 4* → 3. That repayment begin at 120 days;
- Section 5* → 4. That 20% be forgiven if student return to the state;
- Section 2* → 5. That the graduate school limit be left at \$7000 with higher levels if needed to cover tuition and fees.

Section 1 → The only further addition which would seem appropriate and consistent would be to allow undergraduates to get more than the current \$6000 if needed to cover their tuition, fees and room. Since undergraduates traditionally can work in the school cafeterias for their food, this would insure that every student can afford to go to school and, more importantly, let the maximum size of the loans increase enough to cover the most basic costs in the years ahead if there is another inflation. The inflation-proofing feature is important as its absence would eventually put pressure on the future legislatures to increase the top dollar amounts and, depending on who is in control, possibly increase them beyond the basic minimum costs again. This way we can both remove the need to periodically rewrite the legislation as well as insure that the loans will only be granted as needed to cover the basic minimum expenses.

Current law mandates the maximum loan award is \$6,000 with no provisions for raising the limit.
- Section 2. 14.43.115 GRADUATE LOANS repealed and reenacted with provisions of section 1 included. Removes loan maximum with the approval of the financial aid committee.
- Section 3. 14.43.120 CONDITIONS OF LOAN amended to include "other necessary student expenses as determined by committee." Current statutes provide for loan awards to be used only for books & supplies, tuition, required fees, room & board.
- Section 4. 14.43.120 CONDITIONS OF LOAN (f) amended by raising interest rates from 5% to 7%. (see fiscal note for impact).
- Section 5. 14.43.120 CONDITIONS OF LOAN (g) amended by requiring repayment of loan to begin one year after studies are terminated. Removes the [no later than] provision.
- Section 6. 14.43.132 New Section added to encourage the use of the Guaranteed Student Loan program. (Federal student loan program)
- Section 7. 14.43.160 New definition added to clarify the review of loan applications by the student financial aid committee, cited in 14.43.095.

The amounts calculated by the Commission on Postsecondary Education would be an additional expense to the fiscal requests for FY 84. The FY 84 funding level through the Governor's budget is 65million.

Sec. 14.43.090. Scholarship revolving loan fund. (a) There is created a scholarship revolving loan fund. The fund shall be used to make scholarship loans to students selected under AS 14.43.090 — 14.43.160. All repayments of principal and interest on scholarship loans shall be paid into the scholarship revolving fund shall be used to make new scholarship loans. If estimated funds available from scholarship loan repayments are inadequate to fully fund estimated scholarship loans for any fiscal year, additional funding from the general fund may be requested and appropriated for that year.

Sec. 14.43.095. Financial aid committee. (a) The student financial aid committee is composed of the members of the Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education. The commission may delegate its functions under AS 14.43.090 — 14.43.160 to a committee of its members, with augmented membership as the commission considers appropriate. The executive officer of the commission is the executive secretary of the committee. The Alaska Commission on Postsecondary Education shall administer the program established by AS 14.43.090 — 14.43.160.

(b) Members of the committee serve without compensation but are entitled to per diem and travel expenses authorized by law for boards and commissions.

(c) The committee shall make an annual report reviewing the work of the committee to the governor, the legislature and the private colleges and universities where students receiving tuition grants are enrolled.

(d) Scholarship loans may not be made to a student

(1) for more than five years of undergraduate study;

(2) for more than five years of graduate study;

(3) for more than a total of eight years of undergraduate and graduate study.

If the commission and the borrower agree to a different repayment schedule, the borrower shall repay the loan in accordance with the agreement. A borrower may make payments earlier than required by this subsection.

(h) Security may not be required for the loans; however, provision shall be made for payment of attorney fees and costs of court if either or both are incurred in collection of the amount owed on the loan.

(i) If a loan is in default, the commission shall notify the borrower that repayment of the remaining balance is accelerated and due by sending the borrower a notice by registered or certified mail.

(j) A portion of a loan shall be paid on behalf of the borrower by the state if, upon completion of the course of study for which the loan was granted, the borrower is a resident of the state for at least two years. The portion of the loan that shall be paid by the state is the following percentages of the total loan received plus interest up to a total of 50 percent of the total loan:

(1) two — three years residence in the state, 10 percent;
 (2) three — four years residence in the state, an additional 10 percent;

(3) four — five years residence in the state, an additional 10 percent;
 (4) five — six years residence in the state, an additional 10 percent;
 (5) over six years residence in the state, an additional 10 percent.
