

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS, (cont'd)

Appropriation
(special)
(Kenai Pioneers' Home) HOUSE BILL NO. 52, by Rep. Navarre. Makes a special appropriation in the amount of \$10,200,000 to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities for construction of a Pioneers' Home in Kenai. Appropriation is for a capital project and does not lapse. Takes effect immediately.

Introduced January 14 and referred to State Affairs, then Finance.

Appropriation
(special)
(Kenai-Soldotna Women's Center) HOUSE BILL NO. 53, by Rep. Navarre. Makes a special appropriation in the amount of \$56,500 to the Department of Public Safety for payment as a grant to the Kenai-Soldotna Women's Resource and Crisis Center for the funding of a district-wide program on the prevention of child sexual abuse. Appropriation to be disbursed in accordance with state law governing grants to named recipients. Takes effect immediately.

Introduced January 14 and referred to Health, Education & Social Services, then Finance.

Drunk Driving
(penalties & education) HOUSE BILL NO. 54, by Rep. Collins. Raises minimum prison term and amount of fine for drunk driving or for refusal to take a breath test. The minimum jail time would be 240 consecutive hours, and the fine would be \$500 for a first offender (currently 72 hours and \$250). The fine for a second offender would go up to \$750 (now \$500). A sentence would be reduced by 72 hours upon certification that the prisoner has completed 24 hours of alcohol and drug abuse education while in custody. The Commissioner of Corrections would be required to set up alcohol and drug abuse education programs. Does not provide for an effective date (takes effect 90 days after Governor signs bill).

Introduced January 16 and referred to Health, Education & Social Services, Judiciary, then Finance.

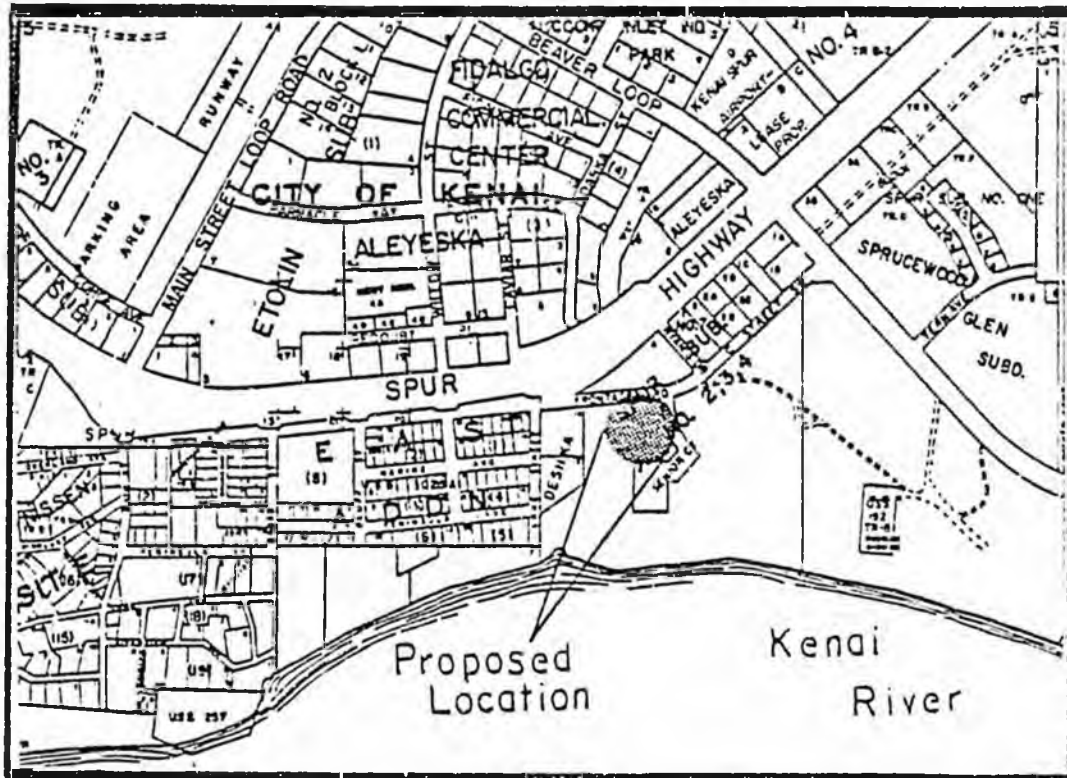
Taxi Rides for Drunks HOUSE BILL NO. 55, by Rep. Collins. Would require a bar owner or employee to make reasonable efforts to call a taxi, where taxi service is available, for any person in the bar who requests a taxi. Bars would also be required to display a sign at doorways that reads: "Intoxicated Drivers Go To Jail, Pay a Fine and Lose Their License - Why Risk It? - Call a Taxi". The sign would also include a prohibitory symbol containing a stylized car and cocktail glass. Requires sign to be 18 inches wide and six inches high, with lettering one and one-fourth inches high. The Dept. of Revenue would be required to furnish signs on request. Does not provide for an effective date (takes effect 90 days after Governor signs bill).

On January 18 Rep. Uehling was added as a co-sponsor.

Introduced January 16 and referred to Labor & Commerce, Judiciary, then Finance.

Mandatory Car Insurance
(registration) HOUSE BILL NO. 56, by Rep. Collins. Would require the Department of Public Safety to revoke the registration of cars not in compliance with mandatory insurance provisions. The

PIONEER HOME



Existing Condition: There is no existing facility in this area for interim elderly care. The only facility on the Peninsula is located in Seward and is full and has a long waiting list. All the other facilities in the State also have long waiting lists.

Proposed Physical Improvement: Establish a Pioneer Home within the City of Kenai so that elderly residents in this area will not have to suffer the stress of leaving their families and friends and will be able to have physical care within their own community.

Project Alternatives: None

Status: New Project. The City of Kenai is willing to purchase the five acres of land which is estimated to cost \$207,000 if the State will place the Pioneer Home at this site. The Kenai Chamber of Commerce has passed a resolution in support of this project.

Next Step Prior to Construction: Design and receipt of State construction funds. The City will purchase the land near the Senior Citizen's Center for the State once the construction funds are appropriated. This would be a State constructed project to be maintained and operated by the State of Alaska.

Factors Affecting Developing: None

Relation to Other Projects: The City of Kenai received State Grant No. 2-209 in 1981-82 for the Community Senior Citizen's Center. The \$1,000,000 building was completed in 1982 and is adjacent to the proposed location of the Pioneer Home. The City's No. 1 priority this year is for a Community Center which would also be located near this proposed Pioneer Home.


WHEREAS, there is now a documented need for nursing beds to keep our senior citizens in this community, and

WHEREAS, the City of Kenai will donate land for construction of a pioneers' home to be located next to the Kenai Senior Citizen Center.



WHEREAS, there is a documented need for a Pioneer Home type facility to keep our senior citizens in this community, and



WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough is one of only four Boroughs in the State without a Pioneer Home, and


WHEREAS, the Kenai Peninsula Borough is the second largest population center of organized boroughs within the State of Alaska.

FISCAL NOTE ANALYSIS
HB 52

1. An analysis of the fiscal impact on existing programs.

The Department feels that capital project funds for items that are not the program responsibility of this department should be appropriated to the department with programmatic responsibility. The DOT&PF will provide the design and construction services to the program agency through an RSA.

The DOT&PF will perform the design and construction responsibilities with existing manpower. The Department of Administration, which administers the program, will supply program costs.

2. An analysis of the fiscal impact on new programs or activities.

If no land costs were required funds would provide space for approximately 60 occupants. The required covered area per occupant is approximately 700 sq. ft. This figure is based on the experience of the Palmer and Anchorage Pioneer Homes and includes kitchen, activity rooms, storage, medical rooms, and other miscellaneous space such as mechanical, electrical, bathrooms, etc.

Construction cost estimate range of reliability - 15% to +30%. To increase the cost estimate accuracy, a detailed schematic would need to be completed at a cost of approximately \$125,000. The schematic would determine the building layout and geometrics, identify construction materials and major structural and mechanical components, perform site investigation, soils sampling, utilities assessment including electrical requirements, and facility access needs.

Construction cost is estimated at \$240 per sq. ft. This is based on Anchorage construction costs (\$195 sq. ft.) and indexed for geographic difference - approximately 22%. Therefore, 700 sq. ft per occupant x 60 occupants x \$240 sq. ft = \$10,080,000.

4. Assumptions:

1. Land costs not included.
2. Utilities are available and accessible.
3. Cost includes architectural and engineering fees, contract administration, etc.
4. No unusual site conditions/no marginal soil conditions.
5. Cost includes all support & staff areas normally found in these facilities.
6. Site is accessible by road.


POSITION PAPER

HB 52

This bill would make a \$10,200,000 special appropriation to the Department of Transportation and Public Facilities for construction of a Pioneers' Home in Kenai, and provides an effective date.

The purpose of this bill would be better facilitated if the appropriation were made to the Department of Administration. The Department of Administration is responsible for administering pioneers' homes and is structured to provide the necessary statewide coordination.


A feasibility study authorized by the 1984 Legislature on the subject of a Kenai pioneers' home is nearing conclusion, and the contractor, Laventhol & Horwath of Seattle, will complete its report on February 15, 1985. The Department of Administration recommends that no action be taken on HB 52 until this feasibility study is available.







Under the authority of art. III, sec. 18, of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill relating to the donation of personal or annual leave by state officers and employees.

Section 1 of the bill amends AS 39.20.245(b), concerning the donation of personal or annual leave by one state worker for use as sick leave by another. Currently, the law speaks only to legislative employees. The amendment would allow the same charitable act to be accomplished by executive and judicial branch non-covered workers. State employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement are already allowed to donate leave in this way. The amendment also allows covered and noncovered employees and officers to donate leave to each other for use as sick leave.

Sections 2 and 3 of the bill amend AS 39.20.310(8) and (9), respectively, to clarify that employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement are excluded from AS 39.20.200 -- 39.20.330 "except as expressly provided by law." This provides consistency with the amendment in sec. 1.

Section 4 of this bill provides for an immediate effective date because I know of at least one present situation in which the amended statute would be applied as soon as the amendment is enacted. To make timely provision for this humanitarian act that will cost the state nothing, I strongly urge your immediate passage of this bill.

THE COLLECTIVE BARGINING AGREEMENTS CONTINUE TO USE THE TERMS "ANNUAL LEAVE" AND "SICK LEAVE," WHICH IS THE REASON WHY "OR ANNUAL" APPEARS ON LINE 12, PAGE 1 OF THE BILL."

The earned personal leave of non-covered workers represents an obligation on the part of the employer to provide either paid leave during the period of employment or payment in cash for any unused personal leave when a non-covered worker's employment is terminated. To the extent that this obligation is paid off before a worker's employment is terminated, the financial obligation or cost to the state would actually decrease because, assumably, the hourly rate of pay would be less.

Sections 2 and 3 of the bill amend AS 39.20.310(8) and (9), respectively, to clarify that employees covered by a collective bargaining agreement are excluded from AS 39.20.200 -- 39.20.330 "except as expressly provided by law." This provides consistency with the amendment in sec. 1.

Section 4 of this bill provides for an immediate effective date because I know of at least one present situation in which the amended statute would be applied as soon as the amendment is enacted. To make timely provision for this humanitarian act that will cost the state nothing, I strongly urge your immediate passage of this bill.

HOUSE BILL NO. 71. by the Rules Committee by Request of the Governor. Makes a special appropriation in the amount of \$500,000,000 to the Alaska Permanent Fund (see accompanying letter). Takes effect immediately.

Introduced January 16 and referred to State Affairs, then Finance.

In his letter accompanying the bill Governor Sheffield stated:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 18, of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill making a special appropriation to the principal of the Alaska permanent fund (art. IX, sec. 15, Alaska Const.). The bill provides for the addition of \$500,000,000 to the principal of the permanent fund.

The 1981 legislature, conscious of its responsibilities to future generations of Alaskans and with foresight too rarely seen in government, appropriated \$1.8 billion as a special deposit to the Alaska permanent fund. When my administration took office two years ago, \$700 million of that money remained undeposited. Today, approximately 700 days later, that debt is paid, and it is time that we again consider our obligations to future generations.

The bill is similar to the original appropriation enacted in ch. 61, SLA 1981. The discretion granted by this bill gives me enough flexibility to increase the principal of the permanent fund if an unexpected increase in state revenue occurs because of economic conditions. I share with the legislature a keen interest in protecting and enhancing the principal of the permanent fund so that subsequent generations will benefit from surplus revenues held in the state treasury. Only through generous contributions to the permanent fund can our expectations be realized.

I urge your prompt action on this measure.

HOUSE BILL NO. 72. by the Rules Committee by Request of the Governor. Complete revision of the Municipal Code (Title 29) - see accompanying letter. Effective January 1, 1986.

Introduced January 18 and referred to Community & Regional Affairs, Judiciary, then Finance.

In his letter transmitting the bill Governor Sheffield stated:

Under the authority of art. III, sec. 18, of the Alaska Constitution, I am transmitting a bill revising the municipal code (AS 29). The bill was modeled on the committee substitute prepared last session by the House Finance Co.-
