Added Accomplishments: New course offerings have been developed in all program areas, including a core of course work for each graduate student in the various programs. Expanded out-reach efforts have resulted in doubling the number of off-campus courses made available through school districts, agencies, and private businesses. This produced enough enrollment at the graduate level to help offset a gradual decline in undergraduate enrollment.

We have instituted a systematic review of programs, courses and teachers within the two departments, based upon student and alumni responses, peer reviews of faculty, and systematic, objectives-based conference evaluations by the department chairman. Each of these efforts is the result of initiatives for which I take a major and leading responsibility. During the past two years I have supervised three self-studies that have led to full accreditation of all programs under my direction by the National Association for the Accreditation of Teacher Education and by the Texas Education Agency. The Southern Association of Schools and College continues studies toward accreditation during the coming year.

A review of the academic performance of students in the teacher education programs has led to the development, under my leadership, of a systematic assessment of student performance in reading and writing and the institution of regular courses for all students in the University to improve reading and study skills. These courses now serve about two hundred students annually. In

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addition, I have acted as a member and chairman of the Graduate Council of the University, and on the University Curriculum Committee. Both of these are the principal policy bodies for their respective areas of the University.

I have initiated and carried out the recruitment of new and replacement faculty for regular appointments through nationwide searches.

I have also had the added responsibilities of membership on the Committee on Program Evaluation of the Graduate School and an active role in the Federation of North Texas Area Universities program advisory committees on Bilingual Education (Chairman), Reading and Early Childhood Education.

My current involvements include work with several university-wide, departmental, and Federation-based efforts in faculty development and training in research methodologies. I have also developed new courses and programs in; a) College Teaching, b) Reading for Gifted and Talented, and c) College and Adult Reading.

At Fairbanks Medical and Surgical Clinic during its expansion I assisted in the design of the Physical Therapy Department. During this growth our staff increased to four.

At Pioneer Home I was able to pilot and institute the Physical Therapy program for the residents. I also had the opportunity to act as consultant for the construction of the Physical Therapy Department at the Anchorage Pioneer Home.

At Central Peninsula General Hospital I was able to experience the challenge of developing a full time Physical Therapy Department. In 1976, we started in temporary quarters, housed in a patient room. By 1977, the need for larger housing was pursued. Hence, we were moved to the H & R Block building. Additional staff was required as well, with the increased patient load. By 1979, our staff increased by one and one-half assistants. Also, the desire to be housed once again at the hospital was great. By 1980 that dream became reality. I again was permitted to assist in the design of the space allocated for Physical Therapy. Our staffing increased to two full time assistants and one part-time. As our patient load continued to increase both in-patient and out-patient, the need for another Registered Physical Therapist was seen. By spring of 1982, we had additional staffing of a Registered Physical Therapist. Patient load continued to increase, as did the need to provide more intense weekend coverage, and to increase the hours the department was open. By spring of 1983, we were pursuing both more space and another Registered Physical Therapist on staff. A program with Kenai Central High School was developed, to allow a student (senior) interested in pursuing the field of Physical Therapy to work in Physical Therapy for experience three to four hours a day. We began planning a new department with three times as much space! We moved to our new department in September 1983. But, we had not been successful in locating a third Registered Physical Therapist. Additional aides were hired to help us meet the continued growth in patient numbers. We had eight people under my supervision in Physical Therapy. Growth in patient numbers continues, but more importantly a growth trend is seen in the number of more severely involved patients. These patients require more one on one supervision and are our long term care patients. These patients now are staying in our community for rehabilitation as opposed to going to the "lower forty-eight" for rehabilitation. We are seeing increase in our population both because of people staying and people moving in. One also needs to know that the trend is also toward specialization. We have seen an increase in Physician specialists in our medical community.

In May 1984, I began private practice, Peninsula Physical Therapy, which has grown tremendously in the past fifteen months. We were recently certified as the first Out-patient Rehabilitation Agency in Alaska. In addition to quality long and short term physical therapy, Peninsula Physical Therapy now offers speech and occupational therapy. We also offer the services of a nutritionist and a clinical psychologist. Our department is under contract with Home Health, Kenai Peninsula Borough School District, and the South Peninsula Hospital in order to further serve the Kenai Peninsula.
