

In addition to my employment for the City of Nulato, I have also served on the following organizations:

- Nulato City Council (1979-1985)
- Nulato Community School Board (1979-present)
- Nulato Parish Council (1975-78)
- Nulato Utility Board. (1979-82)

Since leaving the Jesuit Volunteer Corp in 1975, I have performed other volunteer work in Nulato, (including service on the School Board, parish council and utility board, as well as helping with local recreational activities).

I also operate the Nulato Teen Wreck Center - a small "arcade" for local youth - and have sponsored miscellaneous activities such as free movies for kids, and a local talent contest.

I am also the secretary of the Nulato Headstart Parent Committee.

I have attended numerous workshops and training programs, including local government officials training, municipal clerks seminars, finance officers workshop, etc.

Recently I have begun working with other local individuals to try to form a group to address local problems such as alcohol + drug abuse, domestic violence, loss of traditional values, youth guidance, etc. I have also just begun working on a very limited basis (6 hrs. wk) in the Nulato School as instructor for the "Here's looking at you" (alcohol + drug abuse prevention) program.

I was very surprised to learn that I had been nominated to the ABC board. I do not know what the necessary qualifications are, but if my nomination is accepted, I would try to fulfill my obligation conscientiously, fairly and with an open mind. I don't know who nominated me - or why - but if my nomination is approved, I would view my duty on the ABC board as a very serious duty and obligation to the State of Alaska and its people.

I have never attended an ABC board meeting; I do not know very much about the board's procedures, but if my nomination is approved, I am ready to learn quickly and to serve as soon as possible.

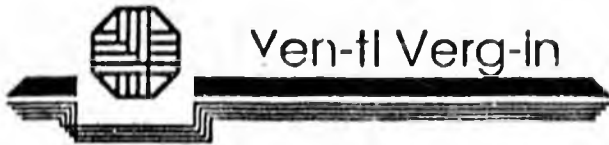

### GRANTSMANSHIP

The following grants were written by Charles Mundorff from the gerontology program of the Psychological Services Department of the Alaska Treatment Center, Inc.

1976 A grant was made to the Alaska Hospital Association through the Alaska Treatment Center to provide training to geriatric long term health care personnel in hospitals located in nine Alaska communities. The grant was awarded from NIMH Regions IX and X. The amount was \$6,700.00

1977 Tax sharing funds from the Municipal Health Department in Anchorage were granted for two purposes:

- A. To determine the nature and extent of the mental health needs of aging persons in the Municipality;
- B. To establish and implement a mental health care delivery model in the Municipality.

The amount of the grant was \$24,000.00.

Pre-retirement training for citizens in the Anchorage area was funded through the State Office On Aging in the amount of \$1,500.00.

A grant was obtained from the State Office on Aging to provide training in social gerontology to the staff members of all the Senior Citizen Centers in the State. The amount of this grant was \$7,00.00

A contract has been negotiated with the Municipality of Anchorage in the amount \$18,000.00 to continue the mental health outreach program for the elderly, 1978.

Grants were written at the A.C.M.H.C. for Elder Abuse Investigation (\$33,000), Title V Senior Citizen Employment, AS 47.65 Social Services (\$58,000), Elderly Day Care (\$101,000), and five years continuing grants from the Older Alaskans Commission.
