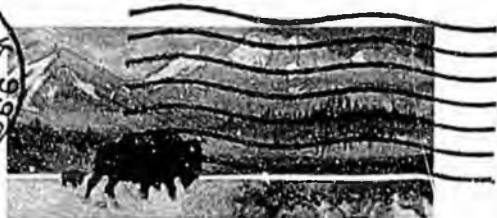


Dear Senator:

Having observed the battle over the modification of ELF for the past two sessions and having been exposed to the enormous amount of public input on both sides during the last elections, it is apparent that this issue is one of substantial importance to the people of Alaska for many reasons, only one of which is economic. Substantial dissatisfaction resulted from the failure of this issue to reach a vote last session.

Now that HB 118 has been passed by the House, it is incumbent upon the Senate to have this issue reach the floor and vote on it so that the people of the State are advised as to the outcome. It is unfair to those who have such a deep interest in this litigation, on both sides of the issue, to allow it to remain unresolved. I personally strongly support the modification of ELF and would urge you to vote consistent with that position. While I hope that the modification does pass, I would rather see a vote that failed than no vote at all.


I wish to express my opinion on two topics; the Exxon spill and the ELF bill. As a 29 year resident I was appalled and sickened by the spill. Not that it happened, but that it was allowed to go as far as it did, with the consequent loss of habitat, fish and wildlife and the way of life for many Alaskans. Pointing fingers at each other is not going to solve the problem. What is done is done. Let's work on making sure that in the future the odds of a catastrophe like this happening again will be lessened, and if it occurs it will then be handled properly and expeditiously. Let's learn by our mistakes.

I am not an environmentalist, I am a realist. I know that the oil companies are here to stay, if I like it or not. The oil companies are going to have to start honoring their promises and stop their rhetoric. I don't want to hear excuses. I want to see results. I admit it is easy to hate the oil companies, but that is anger talking and that is a luxury Alaskans can not afford. However, I know that my eyes are now open and I will not accept the oil companies word alone. I believe that in the future there should be oil spill drills announced by the state with no warnings. Standards of performance should be written out and if Alyeska fails any of the standards, repercussions should be assessed immediately. One standard should be responding to any spill within 5 hours with sufficient containment booms. Repercussions should be at least \$100,000 a day until the standards are met or for serious cases the pipeline should be closed down until Alyeska properly demonstrates their ability to cope with an emergency. No excuses allowed. The USCG should revamp their procedures also.

Regarding the ELF Bill the oil in Alaskan soil belongs to every Alaskan. The oil industry can afford and should pay for the privilege of drilling our oil. The key words being-our oil. Oil firms have been reporting healthy profits. I have heard the rhetoric of the oil companies promising more jobs and more oil drilling if left alone (no more taxing). But, I am sorry to say that I do not honestly believe that the present ELF would bring Alaskans \$150 million dollars worth of benefits a year. As a realist I know that there is a demand for more oil exploration in Alaska. Our U.S. government has been trying for years to become self sufficient in fuel products. Whether our oil is under ground or being pumped it is still our oil and maintains value. I believe the ELF bill should exit the Oil and Gas Committee and come to a vote in the Senate this session. Every Alaskan has a right to know where their Senator stands on the ELF issue. It is time that we stand up to the oil companies and let them know that they are not in charge of Alaska, we Alaskans are.

Re: Oil Industry Taxation, Oil Spill and State Budget

As an Alaskan resident and voter, I am extremely concerned with the "heat" I see generated over the Exxon oil spill and the ELF issue. It seems to me that restraint and common sense have taken a recess -- its unfortunate that the legislature did not also. I fear that the current paralysis will not only result in unwise legislation, but also in an extended session. In hopes of communicating some balance, let me share my perspectives with you.

First of all, the oil spill is extremely unfortunate. It has had a devastating impact on the environment and wildlife. However, we can use this event to either cast stones and reinforce the Lower 48 impression that Alaska's state government is hostile to business, or we can simply insist that those responsible pay for cleanup and for the economic losses to the people affected. It seems to me that the state should be an active watchdog to ensure that Alaskans concerns are being met and that people's losses are compensated. The real issue which should be addressed by the legislature is to determine where the failures that led to this incident did occur and how they can most productively be prevented in the future. Why has Exxon alone had three major tanker incidents in recent months? Many Valdez residents have been keenly aware that some tanker crewmen drink heavily while in port. Why did the Coast Guard not? How can shipboard alcohol and drug abuse problems be reasonably policed by the industry with Coast Guard oversight? As far as that goes, if industry responsibility is being assigned for this tragedy, why not include the liquor industry which profited from incapacitating this ship's captain? This industry extracts money throughout Alaska while giving back social burdens such as increased crime rates, treatment costs, medical and assistance costs, child and newborn abuse problems, and an oil spill. Don't get me wrong, I'm not saying the liquor industry is responsible for this spill, however they profit well from their product and leave a tremendous social cost which the state budget bears. I do believe taxes on this industry to cover the cost of alcohol-related problems is appropriate.

I do not believe the State or the Feds should run an oil spill prevention and contingency program. However, the State should have the expertise to oversee such a program. Why did the DEC not adequately review the Alyeska plan and identify inadequacies? Does the DEC not have the expertise or have their priorities been

elsewhere? Why was the DEC not aware that some contingency equipment was inoperable? These are issues which are the responsibility of the industry, however it is the state which should provide the independent oversight which is objectively protecting the concerns of Alaskans.

In the industry's defense, it seemed reasonable to assume this kind of spill could never happen in this area. It's not every day that ships run over reefs while sailing through a ten mile wide channel! In fact, until this, the safety record over 14 years of intense operations has been admirable. But the spill did happen. In addition, the suddenness and the size of the resulting spill rendered available equipment (even had it all been working) nearly useless. I believe it is the legislature's responsibility -- since the governor won't do it -- to identify items that contributed to this spill and to enact responsible measures to correct them; such as eliminating onboard alcohol or drug influence, improving Coast Guard police powers and monitoring of the area, eliminating spill response delays due to DEC approval delays, improving the ability of DEC to oversee and intelligently influence oil spill contingency plans, determining reasonable standards of protection, response, and cleanup for the industry to meet in the future).

In summary, lets stop the witch hunt and get on with the state's business -- reducing state spending to reasonable levels, encouraging local responsibility for communities' own spending levels, encouraging rather than discouraging industry within Alaska, while at the same time protecting the uniqueness of Alaskan lands and waterways.

The press recently quoted a legislator as saying there was no relationship between ELF and the oil spill.


In my opinion the relationship is very apparent, and very direct. It is greed.

Dear Tim:

Thanks for your many messages regarding taxes, the ELF, education endowment, etc. This is going to take up a few pages, but let me respond to each. Some of this may not be news to you, but at least you'll know what I'm telling everyone else.

Reinstatement of the Income Tax? Regarding any new taxes on individuals, surprisingly, you're not the only one who has told me they are willing to bear some financial burden to keep the budget from being cut any further, and these aren't all people who work for government in some form or another. Personally, I'm no fan of taxes. However, our economy is intractably dependent on state spending. Drastic cuts will have a negative effect for both recipients of state services and programs and businesses whose customers benefit directly or indirectly from state spending. A good rule we should all follow is that supporters of a particular program should say where the money would come from to pay for it, and opponents of taxes should say in particular where to cut the budget.

Short History of the Permanent Fund. As you may know, the principal of the Alaska Permanent Fund, now over \$9 billion, is protected from expenditure by the constitutional amendment that created it. At the time of the amendment, authority was given to the legislature to decide how to spend earnings. Subsequently, a law was passed creating the permanent fund dividend program, mandating that one half of twenty one percent over the last five years' earnings be divided among eligible residents and the other small percentage of the earnings, by law, go back into the principal to inflation proof it. The remainder goes into the Earnings Reserve Account. Right now the money in the reserve account, some \$600 million, is just sitting there collecting interest.

To date, the legislature has not spent a penny of these reserve earnings. In past years, the legislature decided to deposit reserves into the fund itself to augment the daily flow into the fund of 25% of all oil royalties, or about \$ per day as mandated by the constitution. In fact, since the inception of the permanent fund, the legislature has voluntarily deposited

excess earnings and other surplus funds, totaling over \$3.9 billion, into the principal of the fund over and above what was required. Fattening the principal made dividends checks grow larger, faster.

Balance the Budget! It's my belief that the shapers of the permanent fund intended that the reserve earnings be made available for appropriation, such as the Governor and some legislators have proposed. As oil production declines, the fall in oil income to the state can be replaced, in part, by this revenue stream. With little exception, I am open to suggestions as to where we could save money in the proposed budget.

Funding for education, for example, should not be cut as far as I am concerned. The same goes for municipal assistance and revenue sharing. Every dime cut in these programs means less money to run the city, borough, school district and the university. Pressure on the local level to make up any decreases would be immense. To the extent our budget would exceed revenues, we must find other sources of income to balance it.

Spend the Earnings Reserve? The Governor has proposed that the legislature consider spending part of the Earnings Reserve Account, NOT THE PERMANENT FUND MONEY ITSELF, to plug the budget gap. In announcing his decision not to run, Governor Cowper has made it known he will press for a long range funding plan for the state, an excellent goal which I support. In forging such a plan, consideration should be given to the role the earnings reserve account should play.

If we spent excess reserves, your dividend check would, in all likelihood, would not grow as fast. For the short term, spending a portion of the earnings may be the most viable option we have, even after cuts and a favorable revenue projection. Contrary to what you may hear from groups or individuals who are misinformed or deliberately engaging in distortions, this would not be a "raid" on the permanent fund.

Repeal the Economic Limit Factor? One source of new revenue is the \$100 million plus per year the state is no longer able to collect from the oil industry because of an unintended tax break. Known as the ELF, or the Economic Limit Factor, it is a formula designed to allow marginal oil fields to continue production by reducing the severance tax. There are strong indications that the formula is not working as originally intended. As of July of last year, the ELF was applied to Prudhoe Bay, which is not a marginal field.

Supporters of repealing the ELF say the proposal would promote economic development and raise state revenues by targeting tax breaks on only truly marginal fields. Opponents to the change argue that the existing formula is working well by creating positive incentives for oil development. Without tax stability, they say, the oil industry will think twice about future investments.

Tax incentives must be carefully constructed to ensure efficiency and fairness. I have reviewed a recent study indicating that oil industry profits in Alaska, after taxes, have exceeded \$42 billion since 1969. This has given them a after tax rate of return on their investment of over 43%.

Was the tax reduction at Prudhoe Bay justified? Are oil industry jobs going to qualified Alaskans? I don't think so. As Chairman of the Senate Resources Committee, I intend to give the proposal full and open consideration if and when it reaches the committee. Before we take actions that may result in individual sacrifice, we must be certain the oil industry is paying its fair share.

Education Endowment. Those of us who believe that funding for elementary and secondary school education should be a top priority have been looking for ways to ensure that local school districts will be able to count on regular state funding. Last year the Legislature provided early and full funding to local districts. The idea behind the endowment is to create a fund, within the Permanent Fund, which could pay the perpetual costs of state education. This proposal, if approved by the Legislature, would come before the voters for final approval. This will give you a chance to directly express your views on the proposal. I've enclosed a report on the subject you might find of interest.

Given all this information, I hope you understand my positions. Again, Tim, thanks for taking the time to take part. Say hello to Debbie for me.



As you know, legislation has again been introduced this session to modify the formula. HB 118 has passed the House and is currently under consideration by the Senate Special Committee on Oil and Gas. It would reduce our projected budget deficit by providing about \$235 million for FY 89 and FY 90. Opponents to the change argue that the existing formula is working well by creating positive incentives for development. Without tax stability, they say, the oil industry will think twice about future investments.

There are strong indications that the formula is not working as originally intended. Severance taxes at Prudhoe Bay were reduced over a year ago. Tax incentives must be carefully constructed to ensure efficiency and fairness. I have reviewed a recent study indicating that oil industry profits in Alaska, after taxes, have exceeded \$42 billion since 1969. This has given them a after tax rate of return on their investment of over 43%.

State oil pays off in big way for Big Oil

Ten days ago, just in time to steal some thunder from the oil companies' announcements of their 1988 financial statements, a state consultant reported that Alaska oil has earned those companies \$42.6 billion.

The report, "Oil Industry Profitability in Alaska 1969 through 1987," was done for the Alaska Department of Revenue by Dr. Edward B. Deakin. It gives a much different picture of the Alaska oil industry's profits than we're getting from the industry's advertisements and speeches.

Since oil company spokesmen have lately been questioning the "credentials" of us benighted Alaskans who dare to comment on their activities, it's appropriate to devote a few lines to Deakin's credentials.

He is Distinguished Enterprise Professor at the University of North Texas, where he also directs the Institute of Petroleum Accounting. He is currently on leave from that position while he serves as Price Waterhouse Centennial Professor of Accounting at the University of Texas.

Deakin has also taught at Stanford University and the University

of Kuwait. He has written more than 50 articles and books, primarily in the field of petroleum accounting. He has been an adviser to the U.S. Departments of Energy, Interior and Treasury on issues relating to oil industry accounting, as well as several state governments and a number of private companies.

He served on two task forces of the Financial Accounting Standards Board which deal with oil industry accounting matters. He holds a Ph.D. from the University of Illinois and C.P.A. certificates from the states of Illinois and Texas.

For the Alaska report Deakin studies oil company annual reports, their 10K reports to the Securities and Exchange Commission, Internal Revenue Service

data, our own state statistics and the work of several private analysts.

He concluded that from 1969 through 1987 the oil industry earned \$131.3 billion in Alaska in enterprises that cost them a total of \$88.7 billion, leaving them with a profit of \$42.6 billion.

Examining the details of his methodology shows that his final figure is on the conservative side. The range of his final profits estimates was from \$41 billion to \$47 billion, so the final figure is definitely among the low side.

For instance, Deakin found figures for Prudhoe Bay oil production varied by 10 or 20 million barrels a year in recent years, depending on which company or government source was cited, so he used the Alaska Oil and Gas Conservation Commission reports, consistently among the lowest numbers.

He stresses, "Alaska oil producers earn profits from the production, transportation and sale of crude oil." That's important to keep in mind, because many oil company reports and pronouncements focus on production revenue,

as if that's their only action. The current severance tax debate, for instance, ignores many other trends boosting the companies' profits.

Deakin estimates that Alaska's oil companies have earned \$27.8 billion from Prudhoe Bay production, \$1.3 billion from the Kuparuk River field production, \$12.4 billion from their trans-Alaska pipeline (TAPS) business and \$1.1 billion from the Cook Inlet fields.

The most interesting aspects of the report, however, are his breakdowns of what's happened in the past few years.

Overall, Deakin figures the Alaska oil industry's annual profits dropped from a high of \$4.5 billion in 1984 to \$3.4 billion in 1985, \$1.2 billion in 1986 and recovered to \$1.9 billion in 1987.

Alaska state severance taxes peaked in 1985 at \$1.4 billion, dropped to \$647 million in 1986 and recovered to \$871 million in 1987. Our royalties followed much the same path.

Deakin says the oil companies paid \$2.4 billion in federal income taxes in 1985, but probably paid no

federal income taxes in 1986 and paid only \$1 billion in 1987. "Many oil companies, including the Alaska North Slope producers, wrote off substantial amounts from losing operations" in 1986, Deakin reports.

The demise of the federal "windfall profits tax" in 1985 also improved profitability in recent years. It was once as high as \$3.3 billion in 1981, but fell to \$39 million in its last year, 1985.

Deakin also reports that the new federal tax law passed in 1987 also reduces many of the oil industry's tax incentives for new investment.

The figures show that from 1985 to 1987 the oil companies' gross production revenue from Alaska fell 31.5 percent, from \$11.7 billion to \$8 billion, while their total tax and royalty payments to the state and federal governments fell 44.5 percent, from \$5.6 billion to \$3.1 billion.

Through 1987, Deakin concludes, the oil companies made \$42.6 billion from Alaska oil, the state made \$29.3 billion and the federal government made \$25.8 billion.

Dear Senator Fahrenkamp:

It appears, that in the very near future, the State Senate will be acting on the proposed legislation to change the ELF formula in order to enhance revenues paid by the oil industry to the State of Alaska.

I would like to take this opportunity to point out that the consideration of tax increases or new taxes is inappropriate and irresponsible unless such actions are preceded by a major reorganization of the State government and substantive irrevocable reductions in spending (possibly over a period of two to three years with a goal of capping the State's operating budget at the 1980 level).

Regardless of what the final outcome of any Senate decision may be, I would hope that the issues at hand, i.e. taxes and State spending, will be deliberated without regard to the recent oil spill incident in Valdez. These issues are non-related and should be so treated. The oil spill incident was unfortunate, inexcusable and disastrous. However, there is obviously enough blame to go around. In fact, one must seriously question the competence of the State's D.E.C., which surely must have approved the disaster plans of the oil industry participants at Valdez.

I would suggest that this problem does indeed warrant the full and undivided attention of the State Legislature as well as the Administration, but it has nothing to do with the issue at hand.

I submit that the Senate must remain mindful of the fact that the private sector is the engine that drives our economy, not government spending. The proposal to modify the ELF would extract almost \$1 billion from the petroleum industry over the next five years. A draw down of that magnitude could well result in an equal amount or more of reduced capital investment by the petroleum industry, a fact that would seriously compound the negative pressures on the State's economy.



Senators:

I was unable to participate in the public hearings on the ELF tax proposal, but I want you to know that I strongly oppose any tax increase/imposition until the state budget is brought under control. The number of state employees, the extravagant benefits enjoyed by this same group, and the numerous nice but unnecessary state programs such as the Power Cost Equalization program, the monthly economic news magazine and others should be significantly reduced before any new or increased taxes should be considered.

Reducing the state budget significantly, although not an easy task, is a critical issue, and there is a crying need for statesmen to address the problem, not for politicians to scramble for money to push the problem ahead for one more year, as has been done in the past.

The ELF statute was not questioned as being fair until the state required additional income to maintain the boom time spending programs, and you must have the intestinal fortitude to stand up to the special interests and say there ain't no more money, period.

The budget could and should be reduced in stages, to avoid the economic shock accompanying such an action. A target of 25% reduction in real (inflation adjusted) spending could be spread over five years, resulting in only a 5% per year actual decrease, which should be more than adequate to let the economy adjust to the change.

I was in a layoff in 1986 as a result of low oil prices (The equivalent of higher taxes). The private companies act on changing economic conditions much faster than government, and make substantial reductions when they do act.

I work for an oil company, and my job is dependent on the continued development of the North Slope production facilities. Additional taxes will adversely affect this development, and my job could be jeopardized again.

Again I ask you to oppose any change in the ELF, as well as any additional taxes.
