### HISTORY AND PARTICIPATION RATES IN ALASKA LONGEVITY BONUS PROGRAM

Currently nearly 18,000 Alaskan seniors participate in the Longevity Bonus Program as compared to 3,641 participants when the program was instituted in 1973. During this time the cost rose from \$4 million to \$54 million in FY 89 and continues to grow at a rate of between \$3-\$4 million per year.

Prior to 1984 only those Alaskans who were age 65 or older with 25 years of continuous residency were eligible to receive the bonus. In 1984, the 25 year residency requirement was found unconstitutional and the legislature reduced the requirement to one year. Of the 6,354 people who joined the ALB Program between 1985 and 1987, 27% moved to Alaska during the 1980's. One out of five new applicants has been here only the minimum one year needed to qualify for the program.

### SB 5 - THE LONGEVITY BONUS/ANNUITY PROGRAM

#### The Longevity Bonus Under SB 5

SB 5 creates two categories of persons:

- 1) Those who become 65 on or before January 1, 1991 will qualify for the current Longevity Bonus Program and will continue to receive the FULL \$250 monthly bonus payment for life. They will also receive the full Permanent Fund Dividend. They may NOT participate in the Annuity Program.

Those who become 65 after January 1, 1991 will receive a declining Longevity Bonus payment. They also have the OPTION of participating in the Annuity Program.

#### The Annuity Under SB 5 (for persons turning 65 after 1/1/91)

To participate in the Annuity Program, one must contribute all or a portion of their Permanent Fund Dividend into an annuity account.

Persons who choose to contribute 100% of all Permanent Fund Dividends for the maximum length of time will receive a COMBINED Longevity Bonus payment and annuity payment totaling \$250 ~~per~~ per month. Persons who contribute less than 100% of all their dividends will receive a smaller annuity payment, thus the combined Longevity Bonus and annuity payment will be less than \$250 per month.

*Guaranteed \$250 only through period of declining bonus.*

*Then, purely function of amt in <sup>individual</sup> annuity account - no relation anymore to 250.*

The Annuity Program has the advantage of gradually phasing out the Longevity Bonus Program, and participation is open to all residents. However, it is complicated and costly to administer; it tends to discriminate against persons with low-income; annuity payments may affect eligibility for federal programs; and state savings depend on continued full payment of permanent fund dividends.

Comparison of Annual Costs

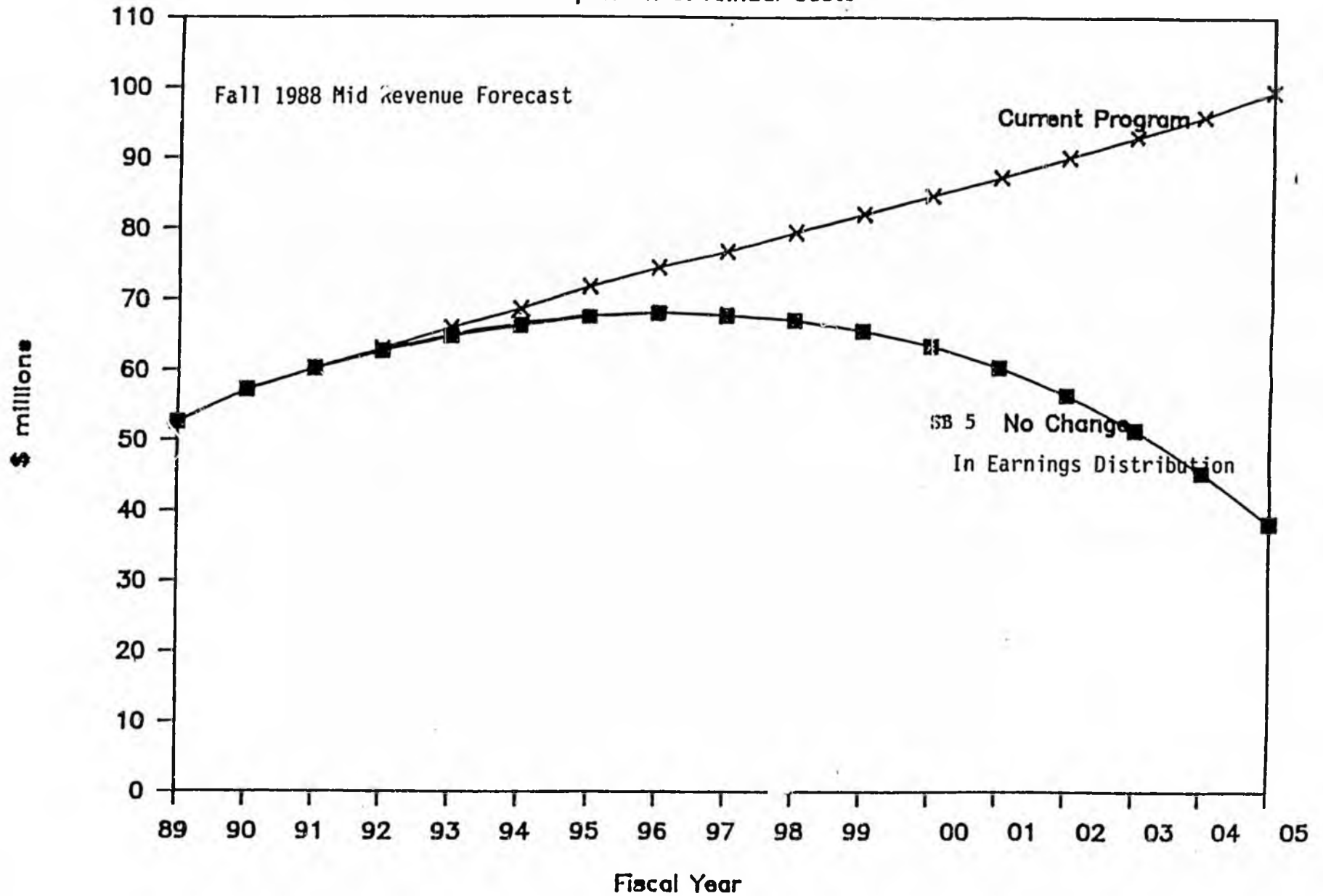


FIGURE 2 Comparison of Proposals to Reduce the Cost of the Alaska Longevity Bonus Program

## Comparison of Annual Costs

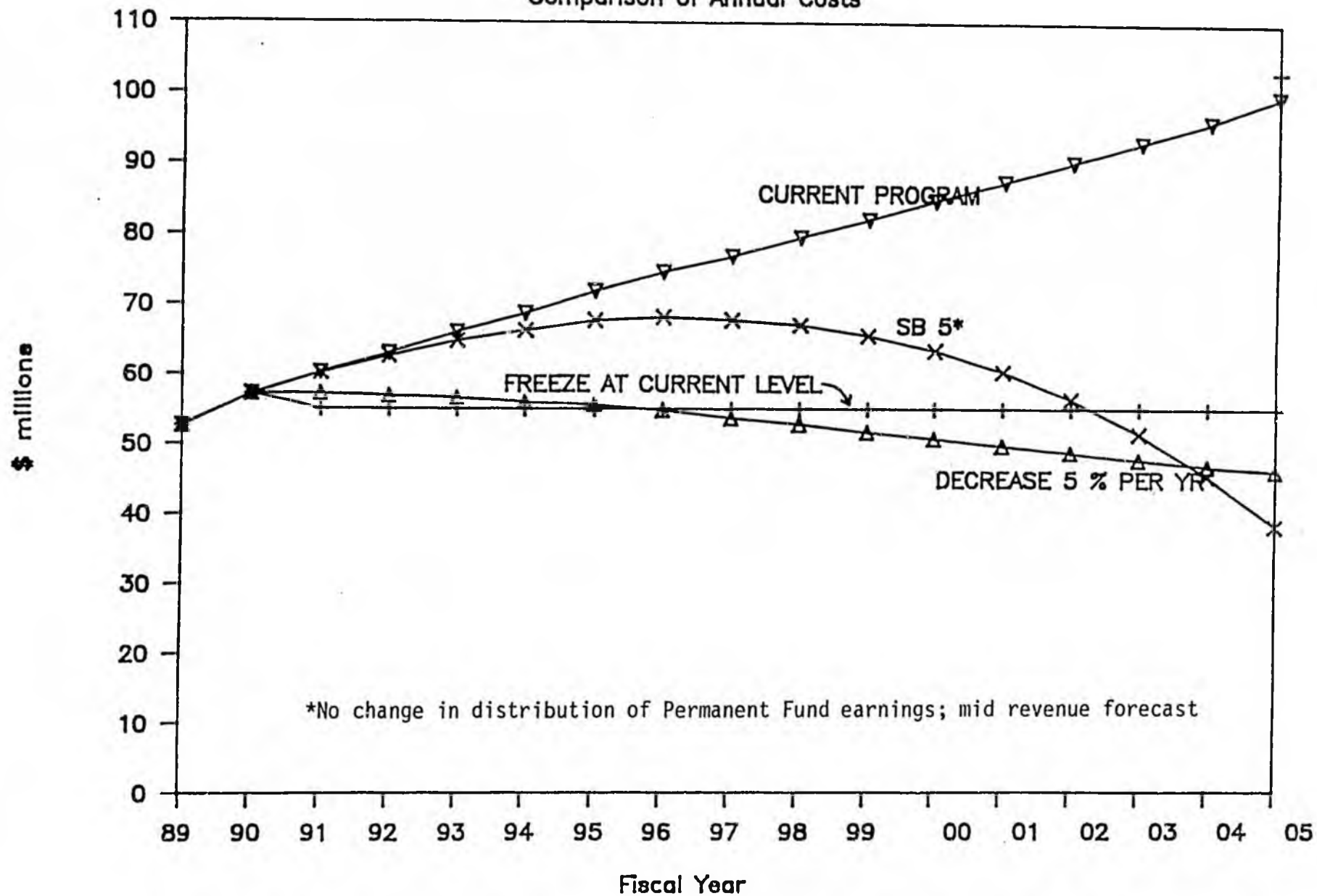


FIGURE 3 Comparison of Proposals to Reduce the Cost of the Alaska Longevity Bonus Program

## Comparison of Monthly Bonus Amounts

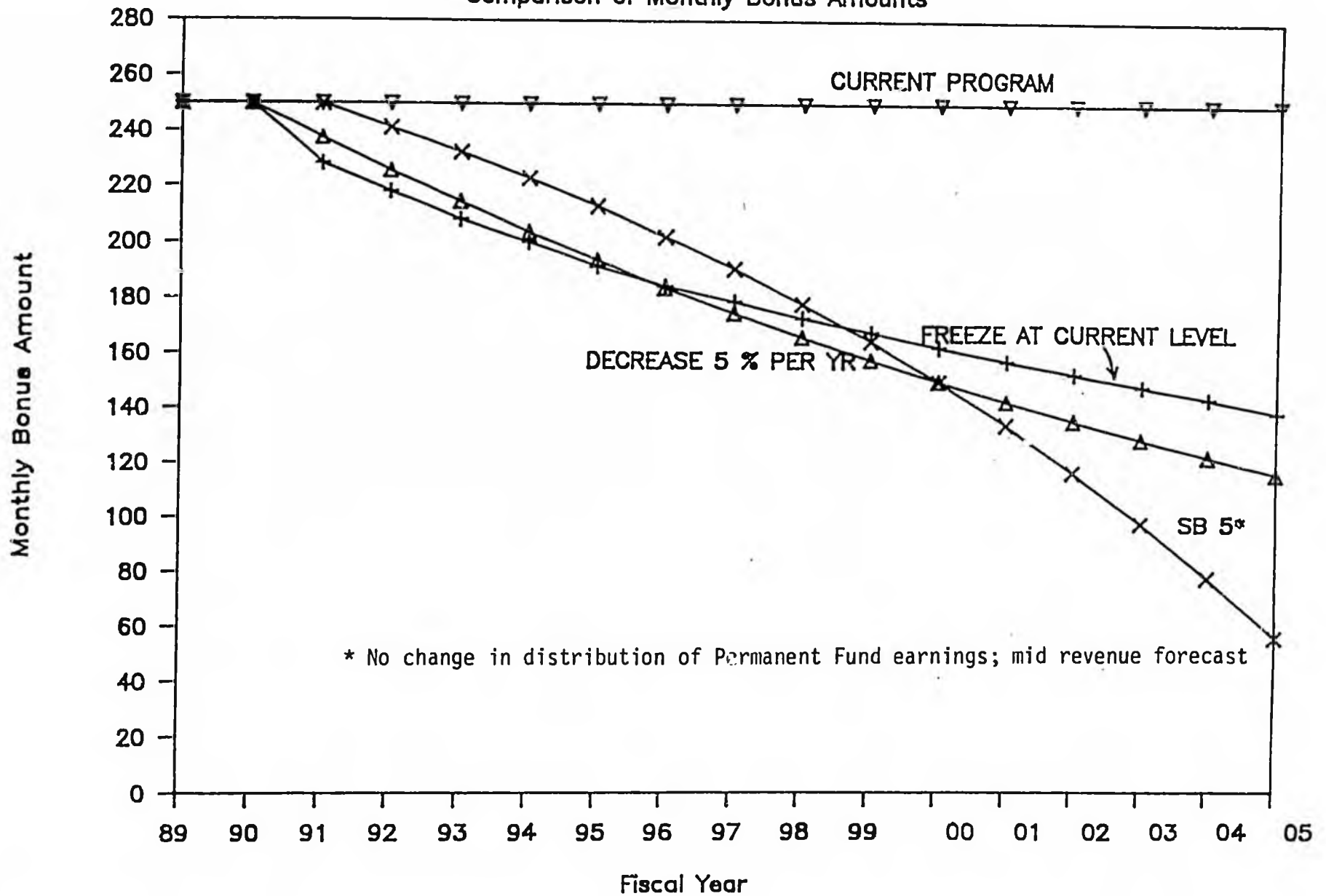

AFN TESTIMONY ON SENATE BILL 5  
BEFORE THE SENATE STATE AFFAIRS COMMITTEE  
FEBRUARY 18, 1989

GOOD MORNING, MY NAME IS JULIE PETRO AND I AM THE PUBLIC AFFAIRS COORDINATOR FOR THE ALASKA FEDERATION OF NATIVES. AFN IS A STATEWIDE NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION WHICH SERVES AS AN ADVOCATE ON BEHALF OF ALASKA NATIVE PEOPLE. OUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS CONSISTS OF A MEMBER FROM EACH OF THE 13 NATIVE REGIONAL CORPORATIONS, 10 REGIONAL NON-PROFIT ASSOCIATIONS WHICH DELIVER HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO THEIR RESPECTIVE REGIONS, AND 13 MEMBERS WHO REPRESENT VILLAGE CORPORATIONS AND TRIBES. ON BEHALF OF OUR TWO CO-CHAIRMEN, HENRY IVANOFF AND MARY JANE FATE, I WOULD LIKE TO THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY THIS MORNING.

AFN WOULD LIKE TO GO ON RECORD IN OPPOSITION TO SENATE BILL 5 - WE FEEL THAT AMONG THOSE WHO WOULD BE MOST SERIOUSLY AFFECTED BY THE PROPOSED ANNUITY PROGRAM ARE NATIVE ELDERS LIVING IN RURAL AREAS WHO ARE NOT FINANCIALLY WELL OFF.

AFN IS VERY CONCERNED ABOUT THE ABILITY OF RURAL RESIDENTS TO MEET THEIR MOST BASIC NEEDS. AFN RECENTLY RELEASED A REPORT ENTITLED "THE AFN REPORT ON THE STATUS OF ALASKA NATIVES: A CALL FOR ACTION." THIS REPORT CONTAINS AN ANALYSIS OF THE ECONOMIC CONDITION IN RURAL ALASKA AND WE URGE YOU TO SERIOUSLY LOOK AT THIS DATA.

FOR EXAMPLE, THE PER CAPITA INCOME IN WESTERN ALASKA - WHICH IS 85% ALASKA NATIVE - IS SIGNIFICANTLY BELOW THE STATE AND NATIONAL AVERAGES. IN 1986, THE AVERAGE ALASKAN MADE \$17,400 A YEAR, THE AVERAGE AMERICAN \$14,200. BUT, THE AVERAGE

NATIVE LIVING IN WESTERN ALASKA MADE \$11,300. IN ADDITION TO HAVING LESS INCOME, THE MONEY THAT FAMILIES DO HAVE IS WORTH LESS: A FAMILY IN KOTZEBUE, BETHEL OR THE NOME REGION SPENDS 62% MORE PER WEEK ON FOOD, 165% MORE ON ELECTRICITY, AND 46% MORE ON A BARREL OF HEATING OIL THAN DOES A FAMILY OF 4 IN ANCHORAGE.

LOW-INCOME NATIVE ELDERS IN RURAL AREAS WHO RECEIVE THE LONGEVITY BONUS USE THIS MONEY FOR BASIC NEEDS SUCH AS FOOD, ELECTRICITY AND FUEL. AND, BECAUSE ELDERS ARE ALREADY SPENDING ALL OF THEIR MONEY ON NECESSITIES - AND NOT LUXURIES - IT ISN'T LIKELY THAT THEY COULD AFFORD TO PARTICIPATE IN THE ANNUITY PROGRAM. IF THEY WERE ABLE TO GIVE UP PART OF THEIR INCOME NOW FOR THE FUTURE, WHEN THEY DO RECEIVE AN ANNUITY, THEY ARE IN JEOPARDY OF LOSING DOLLAR-FOR-DOLLAR THEIR SUPPLEMENTAL SECURITY INCOME AND OLD AGE ASSISTANCE FUNDS!

AFN SUPPORTS PROVIDING SPECIAL BENEFITS TO ELDERS. HOWEVER, GIVEN OUR STATE'S DECLINING REVENUES AND THE NEED TO BRING THE STATE'S EXPENDITURES INTO CONTROL AND GIVEN THE FACT THAT THE LEGISLATURE IS LOOKING AT THE LONGEVITY PROGRAM AND THE PROPOSED ANNUITY PROGRAM, WE FEEL THAT OUR FIRST RESPONSIBILITY IS TO PROVIDE BENEFITS TO THOSE WHO MOST NEED THEM. AND, RATHER THAN THE PROPOSED ANNUITY PROGRAM, WE WOULD URGE THAT YOU LOOK AT OTHER ALTERNATIVES, INCLUDING A NEEDS-BASED PROGRAM.

IN CLOSING, I WOULD LIKE TO RE-EMPHASIZE THAT AFN OPPOSES SENATE BILL 5 AND URGES YOU TO CONSIDER OTHER ALTERNATIVES TO THE CURRENT PROGRAM, INCLUDING A NEEDS-BASED PROGRAM. THANK YOU.





On Monday, April 3 at 1:30 p.m. in the Beltz Room the Senate State Affairs Committee will conduct a confirmation hearing on Dr. Rodman Wilson's appointment to the Alaska Public Offices Commission. Dr. Wilson will participate from Anchorage via the teleconference network.

In addition, the following bills will be heard:

SB 237, An Act relating to the lapsing of appropriations for capital projects

SB 237 would establish a procedure for the administrative lapse of capital appropriations upon completion or abandonment of a capital project. Current statute authorizes administrative lapse, but does not require that the lapse actually occur. Unused capital funds are generally reappropriated by the legislature. However, in September 1988 OMB lapsed approximately \$1.6 million in unneeded capital funds.

SB 237 would apply only to direct appropriations for capital projects, not to grants to municipalities, unincorporated communities, or named recipients.

A draft committee substitute that changes the reporting dates to align with preparation of the Annual Financial Report is attached. The change was requested by the Department of Administration.

SR 8, Requesting a hiring freeze for state employees

SB 232, An Act relating to certain beverage dispensary licensees

HB 74, An Act relating to the acquisition and financing of the Seward Student Service Center by the Alaska State Building Authority, and relating to the use of a lease-financing agreement for the project

The hearing on these bills was postponed from Friday, March 31. Back-up materials were distributed previously.



Confirmation Hearing: APOC appointee, Winston Burbank. Mr. Burbank's term began on 1/18/90 and expires on 2/1/93. Resume is in your packet.

SB 438, An Act relating to the provision of fire protection services by a municipality outside its boundaries. Sponsored by Senator Coghill, this bill adds "fire protection" to the list of services and facilities that a municipality may provide and regulate outside its boundaries.

CS HJR 85, relating to baseball between teams from Pacific Rim nations. This resolution, sponsored by Representative Foster, requests the assistance of the Governor's Office of International Trade and the US Department of State in allowing baseball teams from the Pacific Rim countries to compete in Alaska and for Alaskan teams to reciprocate.

CS HJR 86, Requesting the US Congress to review all proposals to eradicate opium sources in Burma. Sponsored by Representative Foster, the CS for HJR 86 requests the US Congress review all proposals made to the United States for the eradication of opium in Burma. The CS does not contain the name of General Khun Sa of the Tai Revolutionary Council nor is there any reference to Bo Gritz.

HB 323, An Act authorizing a Big Lake Ice Classic. This bill, sponsored by Representative Menard, would establish the Ice Classic to be operated as a fund raising event for the Houston JR/SR High School Booster Club and the Big Lake Chamber of Commerce.

CS HB 385, An Act relating to eligibility for veterans' death gratuities. Sponsored by Representative Hudson, this bill seeks to eliminate the requirement that an Alaskan veteran be physically buried in Alaska for the surviving spouse to receive the \$750 death gratuity. The Department of Military and Veterans Affairs has recommended that the language be further clarified to allow the \$750 payment to be made for cremation as well as burial, therefore a proposed CS reflecting that change will be available at the hearing.

## COLONEL JERRY F. JONES

Colonel Jerry P. Jones is the Chief of Staff for the Alaska Air National Guard.

Colonel Jones was born October 17, 1939, in Mayfield, Kentucky. After residing for several years in Memphis, Tennessee, and French Morocco, North Africa, he graduated from Wingo High School, Wingo, Kentucky, in 1957. He attended college at the University of Kentucky where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering in 1962. He has completed several Professional Military Education courses, including Air War College.

Upon graduation from college Colonel Jones received his commission through the ROTC program. He began his military career in August, 1962, where he entered Undergraduate Pilot Training at Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas. After graduating he attended Interceptor Pilot Training where he qualified in the F-102 before being assigned to the 317th Fighter Interceptor Squadron at Elmendorf Air Force Base, Alaska. During this tour the 317th twice received the coveted Hughes Trophy given annually to the best interceptor squadron in the Air Force. In 1968 Colonel Jones was assigned to the 64th Fighter Interceptor Squadron at Clark Air Base, Philippines. While serving with the 64th Fighter Interceptor Squadron Colonel Jones flew 124 combat missions in Southeast Asia, including nine over North Vietnam.

Colonel Jones joined the Alaska Air National Guard in October, 1970. Since then he has accumulated nearly 5,000 hours flying a variety of missions throughout the United States, the West Indies, and Central America. He is a command pilot who has logged time in T-37, T-33, F-102, C-123, and C-130 aircraft. Personal decorations include the Distinguished Flying Cross, the Air Medal and six Oak Leaf Clusters, the Air Force Commendation Medal with one Oak Leaf Cluster, the Air Force Achievement Medal, the Combat Readiness Medal with six Oak Leaf Clusters, the National Defense Service Medal, and the Vietnam Service Medal.

After serving as a Flight Commander and as Chief Pilot of the 144 Tactical Airlift Squadron, Kulis Air National Guard Base, Anchorage, Alaska, Colonel Jones was assigned to the headquarters Alaska Air National Guard as Director of Operations in October, 1982. He served in this position twice, as well as serving as Plans and Programs Officer, before being selected for his present position as Chief of Staff on June 29, 1989.

As a civilian Colonel Jones is a Supervisor Air Traffic Controller with the Federal Aviation Administration where he has worked since 1971. Colonel Jones is a member of National Guard Association of the United States, Alaska National Guard Officer's Association, and Air Force Association, and is active in local church activities.

The effective date of promotion to the current rank was 27 June 1984, with same date of rank.

Colonel Jones is married to the former Marilyn J. Henderson of Wingo, Kentucky. They have three sons, Jerry, Robert and Larry, and one daughter, Teresa. Colonel and Mrs. Jones currently reside in Anchorage, Alaska.
