Dear Committee Members:

The Chevak Traditional Council (Council) strongly objects to consideration of Larry Edfeldt's confirmation to the State Board of Fisheries. Mainly because of his actions which indicate lack of understanding and insensitivity to one of the most important subsistence and renewable resources of Alaska. His arrogance to research studies is a threat to conservation efforts and subsistence interests of Alaska.

- There were four different studies in the Dutch Harbor herring food and bait fishery which indicated relationship between Dutch Harbor mixed stock fisheries and decreasing Nelson Island stocks. Edfeldt said that there was not enough conclusive information to close or restrict this fishery.


- In the South Peninsula June fishery that takes chums as bycatch at False Pass, Edfeldt disregarded four previous studies which all showed factual and empirical relationship between June chums in the South Peninsula and Western Alaska. Instead Edfeldt advocated the controversial one year (1987) tag study as being conclusive and purported no direct harm relationship.

- On the North side of the Alaska Peninsula four studies by ADF&G since 1986, indicate that as much as 70 percent of the Sockeye taken by the Area M fleet in this area were of Bristol Bay origin. This information was ignored by Edfeldt.

- Subsistence fishing is a very important source of food to all of the Alaska Native villages. Most villages have very poor economies and rely heavily on subsistence fishing to feed their families. Edfeldt clearly favors sports fishing over subsistence fishing.

His confirmation to the State Fisheries Board will create more controversy and will most likely be harmful to the widely used subsistence and renewable resource of Alaska.

Dear Committee Members:

The Kokechik Fishermen's Association, with over 100 commercial boat captains, is strongly opposed to the consideration of confirmation of Mr. Larry Edfeldt to the State Board of Fisheries.

Our herring fishery stocks are at its lowest point this year to the estimated 2,700 tons from the projected number of 4,500 tons in 1991 by the Department of Fish and Game. In light of this information (Dept. of Fish and Game, Cape Romazof District, 1992 Herring Fishery Management Strategies) the Association wholeheartedly feels that Mr. Edfeldt is unsuitable for appointment to the Board because of his previous actions and decisions that benefit only the few and special interest groups. We can not support a person to the Board of Fish whose views and stance are detrimental to our subsistence and commercial livelihood.


I, as a representative for the Association, have personally testified before the Board of Fish to close the food and bait fishery at Dutch Harbor because of our declining herring stocks in our area. Yet, Mr. Edfeldt has stated that he does not have enough information or data to pressure the restriction or closure of the Dutch Harbor food and bait fishery. When we speak of our herring stocks, we also look at our neighboring villages and/or other areas whose stocks have declined to the point where the Board of Fisheries had to close certain commercial fisheries, i.e., Nelson Island; for the third year in a row.

When one group of fishermen overharvest the fish resources, then this done from the benefit of the other peoples resource of livelihood (of subsistence or commercial fishing). The benefactors are the ones that will hurt in the long run because of the limited fish that they will have to get and feed their families, who rely on the annual migration of fish. This dependence of people on the limited renewable <sup>resources</sup> is something that cannot be dismissed on the basis of insufficient data gathered by the few (Dept. of Fish and Game) for the few ( State Board of Fisheries).

Use a little common sense in your selection for this seat on the Board. The confirmation should be for the benefit for the people who has the support by all those people affected.

On behalf of the Kokechik Fishermen's Association, I earnestly believe that Mr. Larry Edfeldt should not be selected and confirmed to the State Board of Fisheries.

In Nome, Alaska, on March 31, 1992, at a duly called joint meeting of the Ira and Traditional Councils of Bering Straits Region villages, the Norton Sound Health Corporation's Board of Directors, and the Kawerak Board of Director's Executive Committee voted to oppose the nomination of Larry Edfelt to the Board of Fisheries for the following reasons:

1. A bias against subsistence as indicated by his comment about leaving sports fishing open in the Nome subdistrict while subsistence fishing was closed down.
2. As a biologist, Edfelt has consistently voted to sustain mixed stock fisheries even when weak stocks were in peril.
  - a. Dutch Harbor food and bait fishery: four different studies pointed to potential relationship between Dutch Harbor mixed stock food and bait fishery and declining Nelson Island stocks. Edfelt said there was not enough conclusive information for him to vote to close this fishery.
  - b. South Peninsula June sockeye fishery takes chums as by-catch at False Pass: Edfelt disregarded four empirical studies showing a relationship between June chums in False Pass and Western Alaska and sided with the Eggert document as being conclusions on river of spawn & and concluded the lack of a harmful relationship:

Thank you for your letter and for the opportunity to respond to comments circulating about my confirmation to the Alaska Board of Fisheries.

The only objections to my confirmation that I am aware of relate to my vote on the False Pass fishery (a June fishery on the south side of Unimak Island and the Shumagin Islands). The objections are summarized in some draft resolutions from a meeting in St. Mary's, Alaska on January 17, 1992. At the St. Mary's meeting a fisheries coalition was formed (Resolution #1) which sought to block my confirmation (Resolution #2), dissolve the existing Board of Fisheries (Resolution #4) and void all Area M (Alaska Peninsula) salmon fishing permits and move them to Bristol Bay (Area T) (Resolution #5). Several other related resolutions were adopted, and all are enclosed.

For what it's worth, the following is a justification for my vote. Whether that vote should be a deciding factor for my confirmation to the Board of Fisheries or not is a matter for you and your legislative colleagues to decide.

In a very controversial decision, and by a 4-3 vote, the Board voted to retain, but modify, a cap on the chum salmon taken in the False Pass fishery. That fishery targets sockeye salmon under an allocation plan in existence since the mid-1970's. The plan allows the False Pass June fishery to harvest 8.3% of the annual projected Bristol Bay sockeye salmon harvest. Chum salmon, both local stocks and migrating fish, are taken incidentally in the sockeye fishery.

After large harvests of chum salmon occurred in 1982 and 1983, the Board imposed a cap on the number of chum salmon allowed to be taken in the June False Pass fishery. The chum cap was initially set at 400,000 in 1986 and was subsequently raised to 500,000 in 1988, and then to 600,000 fish in 1990.

At the November 1991 meeting, the Board considered and unanimously rejected proposals to close the June False Pass

The decision was certainly one upon which reasonable people may disagree, as exemplified by the 4-3 vote. Since I was on the prevailing side, and because I am the only unconfirmed member on the prevailing side, the resolution to block my confirmation was probably brought forth.


The False Pass fishery has been in place for as long as commercial fisheries in western Alaska have been exploited. Every Fisheries Board in the past 20 years has considered and rejected proposals to do away with it. The False Pass fishery has always been a component in the full utilization of salmon bound for western Alaska and the current regulatory scheme reflects a balance among competing interests that has evolved over many years.

I am not so closed minded as to say that I would always vote to keep the fishery as is. I believe decisions should be based upon the best available scientific evidence. If the evidence changes and shows that the False Pass chum catch is adversely impacting the conservation and subsistence uses of western Alaska chum stocks, then my vote would change accordingly.

I am not aware of any objections to my confirmation to the Board of Fisheries that are not in some way tied to the False Pass deliberations. If I am not confirmed by the legislature, I can easily live with that. If the requirement for confirmation is that a proposed member must vote according to a certain prescribed agenda, then the system itself is undermined and I don't wish to be a part of it.

Thank you for sifting through all this and, again, for the opportunity to respond.

The ASA, the largest sportfishing group in Alaska, strongly urges confirmation of Larry Edfelt of Juneau to the Alaska Board of Fish. Mr. Edfelt is held in highest regard by our members and many groups and individuals. As you know, being a member of the Board of Fish is perhaps the most difficult and demanding of all the boards. Dear Committee Members:

We have been informed that the House Resources Committee will be taking up consideration of Mr. Larry Edfeldt's confirmation to the State Board of Fisheries at it's meeting 3:00 pm meeting on April 1. We strongly urge that your committee do all in it's power to prevent Mr. Edfeldt's confirmation to this Board.

We have had the (un)fortunate priveledge of observing Mr. Edfeldt in action on this Board over the past several months and it has become readily apparent that he is unsuitable for the position. His use of mathematical acrobatics and selective reasoning in the decision making process to the benefit of special/singular interests in the face of weakly supported biological evidence is in itself enough to warrant this action. More to the heart of the matter however, we find that these actions circumvent sound biological management principles regarding conservative action in the face of conservation/sustained yield and subsistence concerns as noted by the following:

- Mr. Edfeldt has consistently voted to sustain mixed stock fisheries even when weak stocks they affected were in peril. His biological justification standards and selective interpretation of information in formulating positions continues to be highly questionable.
- In the Dutch Harbor herring food and bait fishery there were four different studies pointing to potential relationship between Dutch Harbor mixed stock fisheries and declining Nelson Island stocks. Edfeldt said there was not enough conclusive information for him to restrict or close this fishery.
- In the South Peninsula June fishery that takes chums as bycatch at False Pass, Edfeldt disregarded four previous studies (Bureau of Biological Survey - 1925; Intl North Pacific Fisheries Council - 1956-62; U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service 1959-82; Ak. Dept. of Fish & Game, Conrad Scale Pattern Analyses - 1983) which all showed factual and imperical relationship between June chums in the South Peninsula and Western Alaska. Instead Edfeldt advocated the highly questioned and controversial ONE YEAR (1987) tag study as being conclusive and purported a no direct harm relationship.


- On the North side of the Alaska Peninsula four studies by ADF&G since 1986 indicate that as much as 70+ percent of the Sockeye taken by the Area M driftnet fleet in this area were of Bristol Bay origin. Mr. Edfeldt said this information was inconclusive.
- During Board deliberation in February Mr. Edfeldt commented that sports fishing in the Nome subdistrict should be left open even though subsistence fisheries were closed down due to failed escapements.
- On an allocation issue affecting his own interests, (sports charter versus troll fisheries) Mr. Edfeldt argued that the number of sportsmen and economics alone should predictably remove the harvest advantage by an existing fleet. Given the nature of this expanding fishery, the statement constitutes a biologically irresponsible position.

It is painfully obvious that Mr. Edfeldt believes that unless there is overwhelming information to warrant negative action on an existing fishery, he should vote for the status-quo. Given the declining amount of money available to the state for research, the escalating difficulties with depressed stocks, and the many uncertainties associated with fisheries management, funding may never be available to irrefutably prove the full impacts of these cause and effect relationships.

Our fisheries across the state and the people who rely upon them cannot afford to have someone on a Board such as this who does not see the conservative approach to management as an option, and instead compounds the problems by advocating for management actions which end up placing many of these fisheries in a crises response mode. It is in everyone's best interest that Mr. Edfeldt's confirmation be denied.

The Tanana Chiefs Conference, Inc. (TCC) opposes the appointment of Larry Edfelt to the Board of Fish. The recent Fish Board decision to increase the False Pass chum cap has sent a loud and threatening message to the villages of the TCC region.

This decision was made based on inadequate and incomplete biological data and poses a threat to the subsistence fisheries in the Interior. Mr. Edfelt has shown his disregard for the subsistence fishermen in our area by voting in favor of the chum cap increase which benefits a small number of commercial fishermen, many of whom are not even Alaska residents. TCC opposes the appointment of any person that could make such a decision with so little information.

In the big picture, these kinds of decisions, which are clearly discriminatory to the subsistence users, causes a great concern within the TCC villages in light of current efforts to solve the subsistence problem. It is imperative that any solution to the total subsistence issue not ignore the regulatory process since this process has shown itself to be so damaging to the subsistence way of life.

Therefore, if I were officially nominated to the board, I would accept at this time. I have been asked to submit my background and experience as an Alaska resident, etc.

I am a resident of Eagle River, Alaska. I was born April 26, 1946 in Springfield, Mass.

I grew up in Northern California and graduated from Sir Francis Drake High School in Marin County, California.

I moved to Alaska in 1964 after enlisting in the U. S. Army for an Alaskan guaranteed assignment. During my tour in Alaska, I was trained as an army surveyor. I traveled many places throughout Alaska. After being discharged with an honorable discharge, I made my living off the Alaska outdoor resources by hunting, guiding, and trapping.

In 1968, I started Boondock Taxidermy and Outfitters which I operated for 15 years, doing taxidermy work and selling sporting goods until the sporting goods sales over-grew the taxidermy end of the business. In approximately 1982, I sold the taxidermy portion of the business. Boondock Sporting Goods has continued to grow and is said by most to be the largest store dealing with guns, hunting, and fishing supplies in the state.

In the 70's, I continued outfitting as a secondary income. I also owned and operated Alaska Wild Furs and was one of the largest fur buyers in the state. I traveled throughout the state buying fur from trappers and selling it both locally and nationally.

I started and own Sea Hunter Charters and have operated that business for over 20 years in Prince William Sound catering to sport fishermen, hunters, and photographers. I have a very good reference list of clients, including such Corporations as National Geographic, who I worked privately with, chartering and filming the under water portions of the PWS 1989 oil spill.

I have co-owned a commercial boat and was licensed and

fished Halibut commercially from 1975 to 1982. When we sold the boat, I re-invested the money by purchasing the Whittier Harbor Store. We sell marine hardware and supplies to commercial fishermen and pleasure boaters through this store located at the Whittier Harbor. This store is a secondary income to my main business, Goosneck Sporting Goods.

In my business today, I continue to deal with both resident and non-resident hunters, guides, fishermen (both commercial & sport), and fish & game, etc. Over the past 25 years, my business has taken me through travels state wide. I have many friends throughout the state both white and native. I continue to hear all sides of the Fish & Game issues from both rural and urban Alaskans including from my son-in-law, who is a registered guide, and my son who is a commercial salmon seiner in PWS, and the thousands of residents that come to me in my sporting goods store each year. Needless to say any time off from work is usually spent in Alaska's great outdoors hunting and fishing with friends.
