Dear Senator Pearce:

Yesterday Senate Bill 455, related to the cost-of-living allowance (COLA) for state employees, has been referred to your committee for its consideration. The legislation was introduced by the Rules Committee at the request of the Governor in accordance with the requirement the Governor present to the Legislature for its consideration the monetary terms necessary to meet collective bargaining agreements.

SB 455 appropriates the funding necessary to meet the monetary terms of the salary adjustment due employees covered by collective bargaining agreements for the period of January 1, 1992 through June 30, 1992 (or other days as noted below.) In addition, it includes funding to extend the same salary adjustment to employees not covered by an agreement.

Specifically:

Section 1. Executive Branch.

Appropriates \$6,425,200 in general funds and \$4,531,900 in other funds to pay the 3.57 percent COLA to executive-branch covered and non-covered employees;

Section 2. University of Alaska.

Appropriates \$1,897,000 in general funds to the University of Alaska to pay a salary adjustment based on the compensation policy of the Board of Regents (appropriation amount is calculated using the 3.57 percent); these are non-covered employees;

Section 3. Legislative Branch.

Appropriates \$485,200 in general funds to the Legislature to pay the 3.57 salary adjustment to its employees; these are non-covered employees;

Section 4. Court System.

Appropriates \$583,100 in general funds to the Court System to

pay the 3.57 percent salary adjustment to its employees; these are non-covered employees;

Section 5. Marine Highway.

Appropriates \$163,500 from the general fund and \$212,700 in other funds to pay the 3.57 salary adjustment due marine highway maritime bargaining units for the period of April 1, 1992 through June 30, 1992;


Section 6. FY 91 MEBA Agreement.

Appropriates \$90,600 from the general fund to pay monetary terms of an agreement with the Marine Engineers Beneficial Association for fiscal year 1991. (Funding to meet this agreement was appropriated by the Legislature last session. However, MEBA did not reach agreement prior to the end of the fiscal year and the funds lapsed. An agreement has since been reached and as a result, it is necessary to again appropriate these dollars.)

For the committee's reference, I have attached the notification OMB received from the Department of Administration regarding the COLA amount and specific information regarding each bargaining unit and its respective effective date for the salary adjustment.

Should the committee require additional information, please let me know.

We have just been advised by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics that the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) for Anchorage, Alaska, rose by three and fifty seven one-hundredths percent (3.57%) for calendar year 1991. Consequently, Cost of Living Allowances (COLA's) to salaries/wages are contractually due for the bargaining units noted below with respective effective date.

The following groups are due for a 3.57% COLA, on the dates noted.

If negotiations are not concluded within that time, terms will be reported and funding sought in the next session.

CS SB 458 (L&C) Nonretention revision

AASB Position

The Association of Alaska School Boards (AASB) supports CSSB 458 (L&C).

If reductions in workforce are required in Alaska's schools due to fiscal circumstances, layoff provisions must allow the educational program needs of our youth, and not tenure, to be the primary determining factor. **AASB believes the program needs of students should drive the staffing patterns of schools.**

History

Historically, tenure rights were granted primarily to protect academic freedom and prevent arbitrary dismissals. Current law allows a reduction in tenured staff for reasons of incompetence, immorality, substantial noncompliance and a decrease in enrollment. CS SB 458 (L&C) would allow districts to layoff tenured staff for budgetary and fiscal reasons. Under current law, tenured teachers are protected from such layoffs, even if it means a district is facing bankruptcy. This leaves school boards in a position of having to make program cuts and fill the remaining positions with teachers who are less qualified but are guaranteed employment because of tenure.

Bill offers latitude

To ensure that every avenue has been exhausted by school districts in determining a financial "emergency" which would require tenured layoffs, AASB supports the requirement of verification by the Commissioner of Education of a "necessary reduction in staff because of budgetary or fiscal circumstances."

AASB is also supportive of the provision to allow layoff for budgetary circumstances at any time during the calendar year. The lack of a forward funding mechanism coupled with the timing of the Legislature in determining the level of school funding each year puts school districts in a double bind when trying to make staffing decisions. Districts sometimes rely on passage of a supplemental bill to complete their funding. In the absence of that they can discover they are short funded, and the ability to layoff during the school year becomes more critical.

Fairness and balance in bargaining

AASB believes this bill offers a balanced attempt to provide fairness in the collective bargaining process, particularly in light of the recently legislated unlimited right-to-strike by school employees.

To a great degree many school districts are forced to bargain blindly, not knowing the level of funding they will receive until after bargaining is completed. Districts may be placed in the position of making a financial decision to avert a strike, then find out later that district funding is insufficient. Education programs suffer as a result, and other staff may have to be nonretained to pay for the newly bargained agreement. AASB believes this is unfair to school employees who may be nonretained, and to students whose program needs are considered only after other contractual obligations are met.

1 "An Act relating to teacher tenure; providing for teacher layoff procedures; and providing
2 for an effective date."

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

4 * Section 1. AS 14.20.175(b) is amended to read:

5 (b) A teacher who has acquired tenure rights is subject to nonretention for the following
6 school year only for the following causes:

7 (1) incompetency, which is defined as the inability or the unintentional or
8 intentional failure to perform the teacher's customary teaching duties in a satisfactory manner;

9 (2) immorality, which is defined as the commission of an act which, under the
10 laws of the state, constitutes a crime involving moral turpitude;

11 (3) substantial noncompliance with the school laws of the state, the regulations
12 or bylaws of the department, the bylaws of the district, or the written rules of the superintendent;

13 [OR]

14 (4) a necessary reduction of staff, as determined by the employer, occasioned

1 by a decrease in school attendance, or a necessary reduction in staff because of budgetary or
2 fiscal circumstances, as determined by the employer and approved by the commissioner.

3 * Sec. 2. AS 14.20 is amended by adding a new section to read:

4 Sec. 14.20.176. LAYOFF AND REHIRE. (a) A teacher is subject to layoff at any time
5 during a calendar year, in a manner determined by the employer, because of budgetary or fiscal
6 circumstances of the municipal school district or regional educational attendance area. Before
7 placing a teacher on layoff status under this subsection, a municipal school district or regional
8 educational attendance area shall demonstrate, to the commissioner's satisfaction, that a budgetary
9 or fiscal circumstance necessitates the layoff.

10 (b) For a period of three years after layoff, a teacher who has been laid off under this
11 section is entitled to a hiring preference, in the district or regional educational attendance area
12 where the teacher had been employed, to fill a vacant teaching position for which the teacher is
13 qualified. If a teacher is offered a teaching position under this subsection and the teacher
14 declines the offer, the teacher is no longer entitled to the hiring preference.

15 (c) Notwithstanding any provision of AS 23.40, the terms of a collective bargaining
16 agreement entered into between a teacher and a school district or regional educational attendance
17 area on or after the effective date of this section may not be inconsistent with the provisions of
18 this section.

19 (d) This section applies to a teacher regardless of whether the teacher has acquired tenure
20 rights.

21 * Sec. 3. Nothing in this Act terminates or modifies a collective bargaining agreement if the
22 agreement is in effect on the effective date of this Act.



The Alaska Municipal League supports the proposed CS SB 458 (L&C) - An Act relating to teacher tenure and providing for teacher layoff procedures (Cramer, 3/27/92. As drafted, the bill would allow school districts, with the permission of the Commissioner of Education, to lay off tenured teachers if necessary because of the fiscal or budgetary circumstances of the municipal school district or regional educational attendance area. The *1992 Alaska Municipal League Policy Statement* includes the following statement: "The League supports legislation that allows local school districts to have a reduction in force of teachers (tenured and non-tenured) when either student enrollment decreases or funding is reduced" (II.A.4).

Current Alaskan law provides that a school district may reduce its tenured teaching staff only in the event of a decline in student enrollment. The proposed CS SB 458 (L&C) would amend that provision to clarify that the employing district has the right to determine whether a reduction in staff is warranted by a decline in enrollment.

In addition, it would give districts essential management authority to determine when a reduction in staff was necessary for fiscal or budgetary reasons. Personnel costs are the largest single element in a school district's budget and one the district may not be able to cut back if the proportion of tenured teachers is high, as it is in many of Alaska's districts.

Municipalities fund approximately 25 percent of the cost of education in Alaska's municipal districts. Because of their major contribution to and responsibility for the costs of running school districts, municipalities strongly support enhancing the ability of school districts to control their costs by reducing teaching staff in cases of financial hardship. While the League supports adequate funding for education if possible to avoid teacher layoffs, AML and its members support passage of CS SB 458, which would give districts that authority, with the approval of the Commissioner of Education.

RE: State of Alaska User Fees
Research Request 92.192

You asked us to identify all program receipts and user fees collected by state agencies (excluding enterprise funds, public corporations and authorities, the Alaska Marine Highway system, the University of Alaska and the vocational schools in Kotzebue and Seward). You also wanted to know whether the current authority to set the amount of these fees resides with the legislature or the department (that is, whether the amount is set in statute, or is set by the department by regulation or policy).

The attached tables contain the requested information. Table A lists fees and charges set in the Alaska Statutes; Table B lists fees and charges set in the Alaska Administrative Code; and Table C lists fees and charges set by agency policy or some other authority. We obtained much of this information by surveying all Alaska state departments. We also performed a computer search of the Alaska Administrative Code for the words "fee" and "fees." Those user fees found in the computer search which were not reported in the departmental surveys are indicated in the notes column of the attached tables.

We intend to continue our search for additional user fees and will revise these tables if we find that some have been overlooked.

We hope this information is helpful to you. If you require further assistance, please contact this agency.

NOTES TO DECISIONS

Rural residency requirement unconstitutional. — The requirement contained in the 1986 subsistence statute (ch. 52, SLA 1986), that one must reside in a rural area in order to participate in subsistence hunting and fishing, violates Alaska Const., art. VIII, §§ 3, 15, and 17. *McDowell v. State*, 785 P.2d 1 (Alaska 1989).

Sec. 16.05.335. Complimentary licenses. The commissioner shall annually, at the request of the governor, provide the governor with not more than 50 complimentary fishing and hunting licenses and appropriate big game tags which the governor may distribute to distinguished visitors to Alaska for their use in any one season during their visits to the state. The complimentary license for sport fishing or hunting or both shall be inscribed by the governor with the inclusive dates for its authorized use. The governor shall advise the department on any complimentary issuances, which information shall be available to the public. In addition, the commissioner shall issue a permit for the collecting of wild fur animals for improving the genetic stock of fur farm animals. Permits issued under this subsection shall be in accordance with current sustained yield management practices for the species of wild game for which the permit is requested. The annual permit fee for an Alaska resident to collect wild fur animals for fur farming purposes is the same as the fee for resident trappers.

(c) The commissioner may issue a duplicate license or a duplicate tag as a replacement for a license or tag issued under (a) of this section. A fee of \$5 shall be charged for each duplicate license or tag; however, a fee of \$2 shall be charged for each duplicate of reduced fee license issued to an indigent or low income person under (a)(6) of this section. The duplicate license or tag may not be issued unless the commissioner or a delegate is satisfied that the original has been lost or destroyed.

(d) Members of the military service on active duty who are permanently stationed in the state, and their dependents, who do not qualify as residents under AS 16.05.940, may obtain special nonresident military small game and sport fishing licenses at the rates for resident hunting and sport fishing licenses, but may not take a big game animal without previously purchasing a regular nonresident hunting license and a numbered, nontransferable appropriate tag, issued at one-half of the nonresident rate, under (a)(15) of this section.

The Alaska Career Information System (AKCIS) provides computerized and printed occupational and educational information. *AKCIS is self-supporting and must charge fees for services, information, and materials.* Member organizations pay fees and are licensed annually to use the information files and other AKCIS products with their students and clients. Member organizations represent a diverse group including secondary and postsecondary schools, employment and training agencies, vocational rehabilitation and Native agencies.

ALL LICENSED MEMBERS RECEIVE:

INFORMATION FILES

AKCIS provides the most current, accurate and comprehensive national, state, and local occupational and educational information available. Files included are: Occupations, Programs of Study, Alaska and National Postsecondary Schools, Financial Aid, Military, and Working for Yourself. The information is designed for effective use in career development, educational planning and vocational transitions.

SELF-ASSESSMENT INSTRUMENTS

QUEST is a brief interactive career exploration questionnaire included in AKCIS. QUEST matches individuals to occupations based on self-perceived likes, dislikes, interests and abilities. Micro-SKILLS is a separate, stand-alone product not included in, but complimentary to, AKCIS. This in-depth assessment instrument is designed to analyze skills used in past accomplishments and employment. After analyzing an individual's skills, a list is produced which contains the top thirty occupations that have a high frequency use of those skills. This is an effective tool to use with adults making transitions in their careers, or with at-risk youth. *Assessment Link* is included in AKCIS and provides the connection between other self-assessment tools (Holland's Self-Directed Search, Strong Interest Inventory, Career Assessment Inventory, Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery and General Aptitude Test Battery) and the AKCIS occupational information.

CHOICE OF DELIVERY SYSTEMS

There are several options for accessing AKCIS information. The fully computerized version is designed for use on IBM-compatible computers with a hard drive. Our information can also be delivered on a Local Area Network. We provide technical assistance loading our files on Novell Networks. Partially computerized versions include Micro-QUEST and Micro-SCHOOLSORT, the manual EXPLORE deck, or the computerized EXPLORE for Macintosh computers.

TRAINING AND TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

Annual user staff training is provided through regional workshops conducted across the state each fall and spring. Technical assistance by AKCIS staff is always provided upon request. On-site training/consultation is scheduled according to need and availability of funds.

COMPLIMENTARY MATERIALS

Copies of the *User's Handbook* and an *Implementation Handbook* for the site coordinator accompany the information system to assist site coordinators and staff in the most effective use of AKCIS.
