PROHIBITIONS: No member may be a candidate for partisan political office while serving; no more than 4 shall be of the same political party as the Governor.

TERM: 5 years

DESCRIPTION: 7 members appointed by governor: with consideration of recommendations made by recognized educational associations in the state; 1 representing each judicial district; 3 at-large; at least 1 representing regional educational attendance areas. Board designates chair. Members serve at pleasure of the Governor. (Non-voting advisory members include: student representative nominated by the Board of Directors of the Alaska Association of Student Governments and selected by the board; and military representative nominated by the ranking General of the Alaska Command and selected by the board.)

FUNCTION: May adopt bylaws for the management of the Department of Education; adopt statewide goals and require each governing body to adopt goals consistent with local needs; appoint the Commissioner of Education with the approval of the governor; adopt bylaws and budget for management of the Department; administer the program of vocational education and serve as the designated Board of Vocational Rehabilitation. Also serve as the state's Chapter 2 Block Grants Advisory Committee, which is required by federal law.

CHAIR: Board selects.

SPECIAL FACTS: Quorum - 4 members. Serve at the pleasure of the governor.

COMPENSATION: Standard Travel and Per Diem. No additional compensation.

MEETINGS: At least quarterly in Juneau unless majority of board members changes site; usually 6-8 mtgs/year.

HOW TO USE THIS PUBLICATION

The table of contents guides the reader to each board or commission fact sheet which is followed by a membership roster.

The Boards and Commissions Office, within the Office of the Governor, responds to inquiries from the public about appointments to state boards and commissions. To assist you, the staff has presented the most commonly asked questions and their answers.

The fact sheets are alphabetically listed for each board and commission. These sheets provide a "quick" profile listing the duties, the legal basis for the board, membership requirements, and the time commitment that board participation requires.

Unless legislation is passed changing the composition or duties of a board or commission, the fact sheets will remain unchanged.

Since there are over 1,400 positions on boards and commissions (most of which were statutorily created), there are constant changes in the membership. For the most up-to-date membership information call the Boards and Commissions Office.

QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS ABOUT
APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS

1. How do I apply for a position on a board or commission?

The process starts with you. Send a letter to the Office of the Governor expressing your desire to serve, along with a brief resume. Many boards have similar names, so be sure to state the full and correct name of your board preference.

Your letter should include your name, address, and telephone number(s). You should specify what board or commission you are interested in and explain why you are qualified or experienced in the area of the board's activity.

After the appointment process for each board is completed, the resumes are purged from the file. Therefore, it is necessary to resubmit a copy of your resume for each new application.

2. Do I need to have other people recommend me?

It is not necessary, but if there are people who would like to express their confidence in you, ask them to send letters of endorsement to the Office of the Governor.

3. What happens after I submit my name to the Governor's Office?

Your letter will be acknowledged, letting you know that it has been received.

The staff reads your letter and places it in a folder with other candidates for the same board. Any additional correspondence we receive from you or on your behalf is also kept in the folder. If we need more information we will call you. Resumes and letters of endorsement/recommendation are public record.

When it is time for the Governor to make an appointment to that particular board, we prepare an analysis that shows geographic, ethnic, and gender composition of the current board. This analysis also includes the statutory restrictions that guide the Governor's appointments. We also provide information on professional or personal experience either necessary or preferable to the board's function.

The Governor reviews this analysis and a summary of the correspondence received on all candidates who have applied. Then the Governor makes his selections. All candidates and endorsers are notified by phone or mail of the Governor's decision.

4. How do I know if I am eligible to be appointed?

Most of the seats on boards and commissions are restricted by statute. Reading the fact sheet on a specific board will give you an idea if you are eligible for a particular position.

Fact sheets on each board or commission are compiled in our annual Boards and Commissions Book. This book is available for review by the public in any of the Governor's offices and at each Legislative Information Office.

5. How do I find out about vacancies on boards and commissions?

There are always vacancies. The Office of the Governor publishes an Action List every month which includes vacancies and impending openings on boards and commissions. This list is available through the regional offices of the Governor.

This list is on computer in the new Alaska Administrative Journal (AAJ), which is on computer in "STAIRS" through the legislative network. The AAJ and the Action List can also be reviewed at Legislative Information Offices.

The list can also be mailed to you upon request, or you may request that one be sent to you on a monthly basis.

6. Do I have to disclose my personal finances if I am appointed to a state board or commission?

In most instances, the answer is no. Only a small number of boards require that appointees comply with state financial disclosure laws. The fact sheets identify which boards have this requirement by noting "Financial Disclosure" under "Requirements".

7. What is "legislative confirmation?"

Certain boards and commissions, by virtue of their duties and as prescribed in the Constitution of the State of Alaska, require that the appointment of a person be a shared responsibility of both the Governor and the Legislature. In this case, the Governor nominates an appointee to be confirmed by a majority vote of the Legislature. Confirmation is generally an easy process and is accomplished during a special joint session between the Alaska Senate and the House of Representatives near the end of each year's legislative session.

The fact sheets identify which boards require this confirmation process. Resumes must be submitted for these positions and are forwarded to both the Senate and the House of Representatives.

8. Do I need to be a registered voter?

YES! All appointees must be registered voters in the state prior to the last general election.

9. Can state employees be appointed to boards and commissions?

The answer is yes. Statutes provide for many state employees to be designated appointees to boards and commissions. It is important for state employees to note AS 39.20.185, which states that members of boards and commissions who are state employees are not entitled to per diem when the meeting or other business takes place in the community or which the member is a resident.

10. Does a member of a board or commission receive any compensation?

Members of very few boards or commissions receive compensation. As a general rule, members are volunteers, but most are entitled to standard travel expenses and/or per diem (AS 39.20.180). For compensation information on a particular board or commission, refer to the appropriate fact sheet.

The state issues 1099s to report certain reimbursements made directly to the member for expenses incurred as a board or commission member. These include such costs as airline fares, mileage, and supplies. Per diem is not reported, nor is the cost of airline tickets if the state purchased the ticket on behalf of a member. In all probability these "revenues" would be offset by actual expenditures incurred and there should be little if any tax liability.

Members should consult a tax accountant as to how these reimbursements must be treated.

11. Can I apply for more than one board?

Yes. It is suggested, however, that you prioritize your choices and submit one resume for each board to which you apply.

12. Who do I contact for further information?

The fact sheets (mentioned in #4 above), most likely will supply all desired information. If not, be sure to utilize the "For Further Information Contact" address and phone number noted at the bottom of each board fact sheet.


