CONSULTATION WITH BOARD OF ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, & LAND SURVEYORS:

For many years (approximately 20 years) I have been a consultant to the Alaska AELS Board. This has varied over the years. At first, I wrote the entire one (later two) day exams for LSIT and LS. Later, when Alaska used the exams as written by Oregon, I prepared and graded the "substitute" questions which related specifically to Alaska, rather than Oregon. When Alaska began using the the national exams, I wrote the one-hour Alaska portion. On some occasions I wrote the entire Alaska portion of the LS exam; other times I coordinated the writing and grading with others (usually in Anchorage.) 

During this time I provided training and information to the Dental Hygiene Program of the Anchorage Community College, as well as various village health aides throughout the state. I provided supervised instruction at ANMC for participants in the Commissioned Officers Students Training Extern Program (COSTEP). The program is designed to orient graduate level students to the Commissioned Officer Service. The major emphasis of this program is to assist the students in experiencing various dental procedures and techniques.

In 1979 through a contract with the State of Alaska I worked with the Division of Corrections providing dental care for juvenile offenders at McLaughlin Youth Center.

I am currently the Director of Clinical Services (includes Dental, Optometry and Women's Health Care Screening Clinic Services) for Southcentral Foundation, the non-profit health corporation of CIRI. Since its inception I have taken a 3 chair dental program with a staff of three and progressed to a 6 operatory clinic with a staff of 12. We are the greatest provider of specialty dental services (eg Crown and Bridge, Dentures,) to the Alaska Native community. The services we commonly provide were previously largely unavallable through the direct IHS dental facilities due to budgeting and personnel constraints. In addition to direct clinical services I provide management for the dental program and share teaching responsibility with the General Practice Residency program at the ANMC. The senior resident in this program is detailed to my clinic to learn advanced prosthodontic techniques. I am on the visiting professional staff at ANMC and am often asked to speak at their local and area dental meetings. My clinic was the first "638" contract dental clinic in the state and it serves as a model to other "638" organizations. I have frequently been called on by similar programs to recommend staff, equipment, and computer systems to help set up new programs. I work with a wide variety of patients many of whom speak little English. I have worked and traveled extensively in Alaska. I have an excellent sense of the importance of dentistry in the State and would be honored to serve on the Board.
