Teacher

A valid teaching certificate is required of all elementary and second teachers employed in the public schools of Alaska.

Alaska offers the following types of certificates: 1) Type A regular, 2) Type B administrative, 3) Type C special services, noneducational, including school librarian, psychologist, nurse, and specialists in speech, language, and hearing, 4) Limited certificate, which includes trades, ROTC, and recognized experts in Alaska Native languages and culture, 5) Temporary, and 6) Two year provisional certificate.

Education — Depends upon the type of certificate and endorsement requested. Type A, B and C certificates require the completion of an approved teacher education, administrative or non-education program respectively, from an accredited institution. Six semester hours of recency credit within the last five years immediately preceding the date of application are also required. Limited certificates require experience related to the area of endorsement. Applicants for the temporary certificate must have met all requirements for certification except the recency credits, must have taught for three years on a regular certificate, and have never held an Alaska teaching certificate. The two year provisional certificate is issued to applicants who have not completed three semester hours each of Alaska studies and multicultural education.

Fees/Renewal — All initial certificate applicants must undergo a background clearance through the Department of Public Safety and the FBI. Background fee \$43. Type A, B, C regular certificate, and provisional certificate fee \$125. Limited certificate and temporary certificate fee \$20.

Renewal fees, background clearance not required, are the same as for initial certification. Type A, B and C regular certificates are renewable with proof of six semester hours of continuing education. Three of these hours must be upper division or graduate level. Limited certificates require proof of employment in a local school district and continued experience. Temporary and provisional certificates are nonrenewable.

Underground Storage Tank Worker and Contractor

All individuals who supervise a regulated underground petroleum storage tank (UST) installation or closure, including removal, and those who conduct tank tightness tests or cathodic protection testing must be certified after March 25, 1992. Four types of certification are available: 1) installation, which includes upgrading and repair; 2) closure, which includes removal; 3) tank tightness testing, for existing tanks; and 4) cathodic protection testing, for testing and monitoring previously installed tanks.

Education/Training — Not applicable.

Experience — Applicants must demonstrate, with a current resume and Verification of Work Experience form, successful completion of at least two projects in the past three years in the relevant field. Proof of certification by the particular manufacturer of the tank tightness test is required of applicants for Alaska certification.

Examination — Required is the passing of a certification exam administered by Hartman Management Services, Inc.

Fees/Renewal — Application \$25. Examination \$150. Certificate \$30 (for one or all categories). Exam study guide sets \$30 (available by sending a written request and money order to the Division of Occupational Licensing). License renewal every 5 years requires an application form, examination, and \$200 renewal fee.

Veterinarian

All practitioners must be licensed to work in Alaska.

Education — Graduation from a veterinary school accredited by the American Veterinary Medical Association (AVMA), or a passing score on the exam given by the AVMA's Education Commission for Foreign Veterinary Graduates is required.

Examination — Applicants must successfully complete two exams prepared by the National Board of Veterinary Medical Examiners: the National Board Examination and the Clinical Competency Test. In addition, applicants must pass a written and clinical exam administered by the Alaska State Board of Veterinary Examiners.

Veterinary Technician

All people must obtain a license in order to work as a veterinary technician.

Water and Wastewater Systems Operator

Public or private water supply and wastewater systems with 100 or more service connections (or which are used or are intended for use by 500 or more persons per day) must be supervised by a certified operator.

Education — Contact the Certification Office of the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC).

Experience — There are five levels of experience from the entry-level Operator in Training which requires 3 months experience or completion of a DEC approved course. Levels 1-4 have increasing experience requirements and education.

Examination — Written examinations are conducted twice a year by DEC at approximately 50 locations throughout the state. Contact DEC for dates and places.

Anyone who provides a child care program for seven or more unrelated children within the Municipality of Anchorage must have a license.

Education/Training — The administrator of a child care program must have nine college credits in Early Childhood Development, Child Psychology or an equivalent course. Care givers must have 12 hours of inservice training per year; this can include CPR, first aid, Early Childhood Development, or related subjects.

Examination — A physical examination is required upon employment. The physical facility must demonstrate compliance with municipal regulations prior to opening.

Fees/Renewal — The license fee depends on the size of the facility. There is a plan review fee of \$25-\$100 for the inspection of the facility and an annual license fee of \$100-\$300 which must be renewed annually.

Gaming bill sure to set off fireworks in Juneau

While tryouts continue for starring roles in this year's exciting state Senate production of "Guess Who's Scummier Than I Am?" the curtain has just gone up on what may be the real show of this miserable legislative session.

Son, Drue Pearce — apparently a masochist with more friends than she needs — has introduced Senate Bill 78, a nifty little screamer designed to clean up Alaska's anything-goes, \$205 million-a-year "charitable" gambling industry.

The Anchorage Republican's legislation rightly would bar convicted felons from managing or supervising charitable gambling games in Alaska. Several states — Arizona, Nevada, New Jersey and Iowa — already ban felons.

"I believe very strongly that if you're going to have gaming, you have to keep it clean," she says. "It's just what I think is right."

Anti Pearce's bill also would ban the direct use of gambling proceeds in political campaigns.

The bill's provisions may seem reasonable, but if the recent sorry history of gambling reform in this state is any indication, all hell will break loose.

Mark Higgins, an Alaska Charitable Gaming Association lobbyist, says in a recent news story that he believes the proposed lifetime ban on felons is excessive and expects his group will oppose the legislation.

And she can expect to hear from other legislators. Politicians in 1990-91 socked away for their campaigns about \$600,000 from pull-tabs and bingo through labor unions, political action committees and political parties. They'll be ever-so-pleased with the legislation. Won't they just love the idea of standing up to defend the notion of pumping gambling money into their campaigns?

Legalized pull-tabs, bingo, raffles and other games are a huge business in Alaska.

And the amount wagered has increased in every year but one since 1960, when the total amount bet was a mere \$649,793. It reached \$1 million in 1964 and doubled by 1970.

The Legislature, in its infinite wisdom, overrode then-Gov. Jay Hammond's veto of a 1976 bill that added political organizations to the list of groups eligible for chari-



table gaming permits.

The amount bet reached \$9 million in 1977 and hit \$45 million in 1985. In the single year after the Legislature in 1988 enacted what was touted as a major gambling reform bill — it allowed charitable groups and political organizations to hire professionals to use their gambling permits — the amount bet more than doubled, to about \$185 million.

Nowadays, the take is in the neighborhood of \$205 million. But only about 2.25 percent of the gross actually gets to the groups that hold the gambling permits. The rest goes to the operators, for expenses.

You'd think a state with a charitable gambling industry that takes in more than \$200 million — more than Nevada's and several others — would insist on strict controls. Hardly. Alaska has no gaming commission and inadequately funds the Division of Games of Chance and Skill, which is supposed to keep tabs on the industry.

And a lot of people apparently would like it to stay that way.

Last year, gambling reform flopped around like a fish in the Legislature before it was tossed over the side.

In 1991, reform legislation died a messy death in the last minutes of the legislative session, mostly at the hands of then-Rop. Dave Donley, an Anchorage Democrat, and mostly over the issue of felons working in gaming.

Donley, now a senator, was trying to protect Mark Griffin, manager of Alaska Bingo Supply Inc., a political supporter who, according to news accounts, was convicted in 1977 of selling methamphetamines in New Mexico.

Donley, it should be noted, has received thousands of dollars in contributions from Griffin, and Griffin's family and pals, during the course of his political career.

The Senate version of the reform legislation would have given a higher percentage of gambling's take to charities, allowed permittees to directly sell pull-tabs in bars and convenience stores without an operator get all the money, and banned felons from the business for 15 years after completion of their sentences. The Senate bill also applied to the spouse of prohibited criminals.

The Senate adjourned before the House measure, stripped of the spouse provision, could be sent back for consideration. The House, which could have adopted the Senate version, adjourned instead.

"It (the spouse provision) was only put in there to discriminate and target one individual," Donley said at the time. "It's just not good public policy."

Alaska only prohibits gambling license holders from hiring as managers or supervisors anybody with a felony conviction, prison term or parole in the previous five years.

What will happen this year is unclear.

We have Pearce's bill which would keep politicians from directly getting gambling money and ban felons for life from the gaming industry. We have Donley in the Senate and gambling money spread hip-deep all over the Legislature. We also have reapportionment scenarios bouncing around out there that could pit Pearce against Donley in the next election.

All in all, it ought to be a great show.

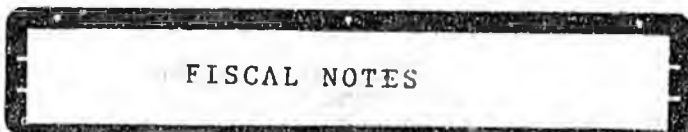

The purpose of this memo and the enclosed legal advice is to make you aware of the effects of discontinuing certain boards without enacting other legislation related to the profession or board duties.

Enclosed is a copy of a legal opinion regarding the effects of certain "sunset" provisions. Four licensing boards are in their "wind down" year. These are: Chiropractic Examiners, Dispensing Opticians, Optometry Examiners, and Mechanical Examiners. These each began their sunset year June 30, 1992 (per AS 08.03.010) and will be required to "cease all activities" June 30, 1993 (per AS 08.03.020).

Pending legislation related to the extension of these boards includes:

Chiropractic Examiners SB 79, HB 110
Dispensing Opticians SB 79, HB 110
Optometry Examiners SB 79, HB 110
Mechanical Examiners SB 79, HB 110
(In addition, HB 249 addresses the licensure of mechanical and electrical tradesmen.)

You have requested our advice on the effect of the termination of certain boards in the event the legislature elects not to extend the life of those boards.

Four occupational licensing boards -- Chiropractic Examiners (AS 08.20.010-.090), Dispensing Opticians (AS 08.71.010-.055), Optometry Examiners (AS 08.72.010-.060), and Mechanical Examiners (AS 08.40.220), -- were terminated on June 30, 1992, and are scheduled to "sunset" on June 20, 1993. AS 08.03.010(7), (10), (13), and (17), respectively. You have specifically inquired as to the legal effect the "sunset" of these boards would have on board functions, including licensing. Unless the legislature takes action* to extend their life, these boards are already terminated and are required to "cease all activities" as of June 30, 1993. AS 08.03.020(a).

Although a particular licensing board may be terminated, the substantive legal requirements for the particular trade or profession typically remain unaltered and in effect. For example, in the past, the legislature terminated the Board of Electrical Examiners (AS 08.04.011) without altering the statutory provision requiring that "a person may not act as an electrical administrator without a license." AS 08.40.090(a). Occupational licenses are "renewed biannually" in Alaska. AS 08.01.100(a). In the absence of a board with power to renew or grant licenses, a situation will develop within three years of board termination in which no one can

* The legislature is required to evaluate a board and either terminate, dissolve, or continue to establish the board according to the procedure in AS 44.66.050. See AS 08.03.020(b).

comply with the licensing requirements. See generally 1992 Inf. Op. Att'y Gen. (June 10; 663-92-0591).

Like the situation with the Board of Electrical Examiners, the substantive statutory requirements governing the chiropractic, optician, optometric, and mechanical occupations will remain in force even if the boards that regulate these activities are terminated. Thus, termination and eventual sunset will inevitably serve to bar new entrants to the occupation and eventually guarantee that no individual holds the license required by statute.

Under these circumstances, it is clear that the legislature should carefully consider whether or not a particular occupational licensing board should be terminated. Mere termination of board activities, without further consideration of the substantive legal requirements governing the particular occupation, will produce uncertainty and some degree of chaos. We recommend that if the legislature wishes to deregulate a particular trade or occupation, it first undertake a comprehensive review of the statutory provisions governing that trade or profession.

You have also inquired about the Board of Parole (AS 33.16.020-33.16.080), a board that will, absent legislative action, begin its "sunset" year on June 30, 1993. AS 44.55.101(a)(3). If terminated on June 30, 1993, the Board of Parole "shall continue in existence until June 30 of the next succeeding year for the purpose of concluding its affairs." AS 44.66.010(b). Absent a major rewrite of the statutory provisions pertaining to parole procedures contained in AS 33.16, termination of the Board of Parole would almost certainly generate problems for the Department of Corrections and the Department of Law, as well as uncertainty for the judiciary and possibly litigation. Attorneys for the Criminal Division within the Department of Law have expressed concern that termination and "sunset" of the Board of Parole may arguably violate prisoners' rights. That is, prisoners sentenced by a court with an expectation of a parole hearing may have a constitutionally protected right to a parole hearing. Any decision to "sunset" the Board of Parole should take place in light of a considered and comprehensive review of the parole statutes.

Finally, you have asked about the effect of termination of the Alaska Public Utilities Commission (AS 42.05), a commission slated to expire on June 30, 1993. AS 44.66.010(a)(4). You specifically asked how the activities of the Alaska Public Utilities Commission would be affected after June 30, 1993, should the Commission's existence not be extended during this legislative session. If terminated on June 30, 1993, the Alaska Public Utilities Commission would have one year to conclude its affairs. AS 44.66.010(b). This one-year period would primarily be for the

You have provided our office with an opinion issued by the Department of Law that suggests that the termination of an occupational licensing board under the sunset provisions of AS 08.03 and AS 44.66 does not affect the underlying substantive provisions of the law. I believe that that result is in error.

The attorney general's opinion essentially states the facts: the legislature has allowed a board to terminate (the Board of Electrical Examiners) but it has not amended or repealed the many substantive provisions related to responsibilities of the board and of persons licensed by the board. Without setting out any legal rationale, the writer concludes that the effect is that persons who are required to have licenses in order to follow an occupation or profession will not be able to do so and that new persons desiring to enter the occupation or profession will be barred from entry. The writer also suggests that the sunset review relates only to the board, not the occupation or the public interest.

The results suggested by the assistant attorney general would be absurd. The legislature's sunset scheme, found primarily in AS 44.62, calls for a thorough review of board activities on a regular basis, which review must include consideration of several factors related to the board and the regulated occupation or profession. The factors are set out in AS 44.66.050(c)(1)-(9), which provide:

- (1) the extent to which the board, commission or program has operated in the public interest;
- (2) the extent to which the operation of the board, commission, or agency program has been impeded or enhanced by existing statutes,

procedures, and practices that it has adopted, and any other matter, including budgetary, resource, and personnel matters;

(3) the extent to which the board, commission or agency has recommended statutory changes that are generally of benefit to the public interest;

(4) the extent to which the board, commission or agency has encouraged interested persons to report to it concerning the effect of its regulations and decisions on the effectiveness of service, economy of service, and availability of service that it has provided;

(5) the extent to which the board, commission or agency has encouraged public participation in the making of its regulations and decisions;

(6) the efficiency with which public inquiries or complaints regarding the activities of the board, commission or agency filed with it, with the department to which a board or commission is administratively assigned, or with the office of the ombudsman have been processed and resolved;

(7) the extent to which a board or commission which regulates entry into an occupation or profession has presented qualified applicants to serve the public;

(8) the extent to which state personnel practices, including affirmative action requirements, have been complied with by the board, commission or agency to its own activities and the area of activity or interest; and

(9) the extent to which statutory, regulatory, budgeting or other changes are necessary to enable the agency, board or commission to better serve the interests of the public and to comply with the factors enumerated in this subsection.

If the legislature, as it has done, allows a board to terminate, but does not provide for a transfer of board responsibilities to another agency, the termination (repeal) of the board has the effect of impliedly repealing, in whole or in part, the laws that are meaningless in the absence of the board. There is a strong presumption against implied repeals, but that doesn't mean it can't happen. In fact, AS 01.05.031(b)(11) acknowledges implied repeals, by providing:

(b) The revisor shall edit and revise the laws for consolidation without changing the meaning of any law in the following manner:

* * *

(11) delete or change sections or parts of sections if a deletion or change is necessary because of other legislative amendments that did not specifically amend or repeal them;

It is not possible at this point in session to do the in-depth research of this issue that it deserves, but I am confident that a court would not enforce a law that could not be fulfilled because of a legal impossibility. Impossibility is a valid defense to any criminal charge, and without a board, there is no administrative mechanism for administrative enforcement.

I would be happy to look into this further during the interim. In the remaining weeks of session, I would urge you to consider a bill that either repeals the offending laws or transfers former board duties to the department, simply to avoid the confusion that will reign as long as we are relying on differing interpretations of the situation.



Committee Substitute for Senate Bill No. 79 (State Affairs) proposes to delete reference to the Board of Electrical Examiners and proposes to extend the Board of Mechanical Examiners until June 30, 1995. The Board of Electrical Examiners sunsetted June 30, 1992 and the Board of Mechanical Examiners is scheduled to sunset June 30, 1993.

The extension of the Board of Mechanical Examiners conflicts with House Bill No. 249 which proposes to transfer the licensing of Mechanical Administrators from the Department of Commerce & Economic Development and to establish the certification and enforcement functions for both Electrical Administrators and Mechanical Administrators in the Department of Labor under the Certificates of Fitness program. With the enactment of House Bill No. 249 the Board of Mechanical Examiners would be unnecessary.

To remove the conflict with House Bill No. 249, the department would propose that CSSB 79(STA) be amended to delete the extension of the Board of Mechanical Examiners and to remove reference to AS 08.18.026(a) and 08.18.026(c) which refer to licensing requirements for contractors.

Senate Bill 79 was introduced by request of the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee to implement, in part, the sunset section of *A Special Report on Selected Boards and Commissions Issues* dated October 30, 1992. We recommended reestablishing the sunset review cycle for boards and commissions over a ten year period as opposed to the four year cycle currently in effect. The average review cycle in other states averages about eight years. The following sectional analysis references the appropriate pages of the audit report for discussion.

SECTIONAL ANALYSIS OF SB 79

An Act setting termination dates for various boards, commissions, councils, agencies, committees, and divisions of state government; repealing obsolete statutes relating to the State Fire Commission and the Board of Electrical Examiners; repealing obsolete statutes relating to termination of agency programs and activities; increasing to 10 years the normal maximum interval for review of boards, commissions, and other entities that are subject to sunset review; and providing for an effective date.

Section 1. Amends the termination date of the occupational licensing boards to reflect a ten year review cycle and eliminates an obsolete provision relating to the Board of Electrical Examiners. (*See table on page 10 of the Boards and Commissions audit report.*) The Senate HESS Committee made certain changes to the original bill.

- Section 9.** Revisor of statute cleanup of statutes relating to Electrical Administrators and the Alaska Fire Commission which expired under normal sunset provisions. Also repeals agency program sunset provisions which are obsolete. *(See attached table for the detail of the repealed sections.)*
- Section 10.** Providing effective date of June 30 as opposed to July 1 to protect from unintended sunset of boards set for termination this June 30.

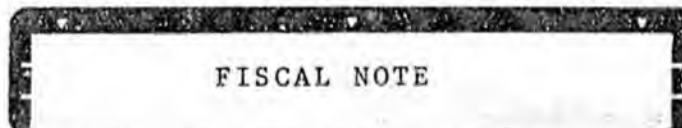

The passage of Senate Bill 478 (SLA 1988, Chapter 78) created the Alaska Tourism Marketing Council which became law, effective July 1, 1988. Legislative findings regarding SB 478 stated:

"The legislature finds that a cooperative effort between the state and private industry to support and expand the visitor industry of the state and to foster expansion of the market for Alaska as a destination throughout the nation and the world is in the public interest and is a valid public purpose. The legislature further finds that this cooperative effort would inure to the benefit of the visitor industry in the state and that some of the costs of maintaining the effort be borne by the industry. The legislature further finds that expansion of the economic benefit of tourism is in the public interest and the state should take an active interest in the ensurance of a quality experience for visitors to the state, cooperate with the private sector in improving the amenities available to visitors to the state, and seek to ensure authentic accessible experience for visitors throughout the state."

RE: CS SB 85 (FIN) am - Extending the termination date of the Alaska Tourism Marketing Council, Establishing the Task Force on Tourism, and Other Changes to the Council's Board of Directors, Requirements for Council Members, and Tourism Marketing Program.

I respectfully request you consider scheduling CS SB 85 (FIN) am for a hearing before the House State Affairs Committee at the committee's earliest convenience.

The Alaska Tourism Marketing Council is a joint public-private partnership created to stimulate economic growth and diversification in the State through the promotion of Alaska as a visitor destination.

The original version of the bill only extended the termination date of the board from June 30, 1993 to June 30, 1996.

The Labor & Commerce Committee substitute broadened the opportunity for those involved in tourism to seek membership on the board by replacing the requirement members be substantially involved to simply involved in a visitor or recreation industry business. It also allowed the board of directors to elect their presiding officer while retaining the director of the Division of Tourism as a board member, and extended the council's existence to June 30, 1997.

The Senate Finance CS amended the Labor & Commerce CS changing the method of selecting the presiding officer of the council from election by

the board of directors to appointment by the governor. In addition, it added a provision requiring the council's tourism marketing program to include both promotion of the State as a destination and all forms of travel to the State. Another provision establishes a Task Force on Tourism to make recommendations to the legislature. Finally, the Senate Finance CS extends the termination date to December 30, 1994.

CS SB 85 (FIN) was amended on the Senate floor to replace the establishment of a Task Force on Tourism with requirements that the council consider methods both to fund tourism marketing using public and private assets and to provide for the financial self-sufficiency of the council.

The Alaska Tourism Marketing Council has made significant contributions to the tourism industry in Alaska, and thus favorably impacted the State's economic infrastructure and employment opportunity. These changes to the council and its mission, the recommendations from the Task Force, and its extension should further assist in maintaining and expanding the tourism industry in Alaska.

CS SB 85 (FIN) am: "An Act Relating to Alaska Tourism Marketing Council

Sectional Analysis

Section 1:

Amends AS 44.33.705(c) to replace the requirement that a member of the board of directors be "substantially involved" in a visitor or recreation industry business with a requirement that a board member be "involved" in a visitor or recreation industry business.

This section also provides that the director of the Division of Tourism is a member of the board of directors, and that the presiding officer is appointed by the governor. Current statute provides that the Director of the Division of Tourism holds that position.

Section 2:

Amends AS 44.33.720(a) to require that the council's tourism marketing program include promotion of the State as a destination and promotion of all forms of travel to the State, including travel by air, highway, and water. In addition, the council would be required to consider methods both to fund tourism marketing using public and private assets, and to provide for the financial self-sufficiency of the ATMC.

Section 3:

Amends AS 44.66.010(a)(15) to extend the Alaska Tourism Marketing Council's sunset date from June 30, 1993 to December 30, 1994.

Section 5: Effective date.

SB 85: "An Act extending the termination date of the Alaska Tourism Marketing Council"

The Alaska Tourism Marketing Council (ATMC) is a public-private partnership that combines the resources and expertise of the state and private industry. It is jointly managed by the Department of Commerce and Economic Development and Alaska Visitors Association. The council consists of ten members appointed by the Governor, ten members appointed by the visitor industry, and the Director of the Division of Tourism who serves as the chair.

The goal of the ATMC is to stimulate statewide economic growth, diversification, and employment through the promotion of Alaska as a visitor destination. To achieve this goal, the ATMC designs and executes a marketing campaign directed at domestic and Canadian markets with the greatest potential for producing new and repeat visitors. Primary elements of the program include media advertising, public relations, and distribution of the State Vacation Planner. These elements are designed to interest people in Alaska and influence their decision to visit. The program also provides the final link between local businesses and consumers on a scale that is possible only through a cooperative effort.

If the ATMC program did not exist, the economic impact of the visitor industry would be significantly reduced and the larger tour companies would gain an even greater share of the remaining market. By conducting a cooperative marketing program, everyone in the state benefits, including other state agencies who receive revenues from visitor spending.

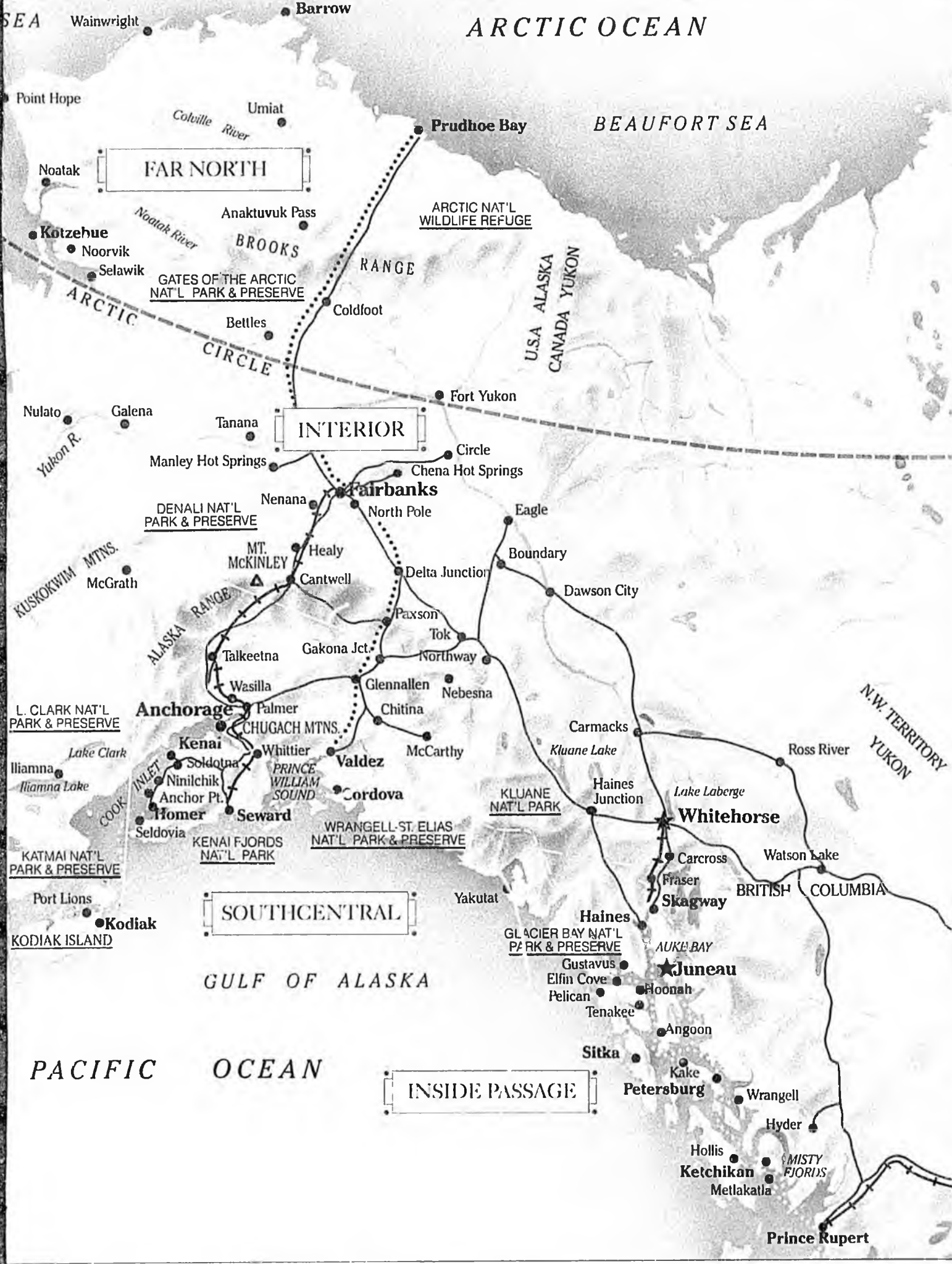

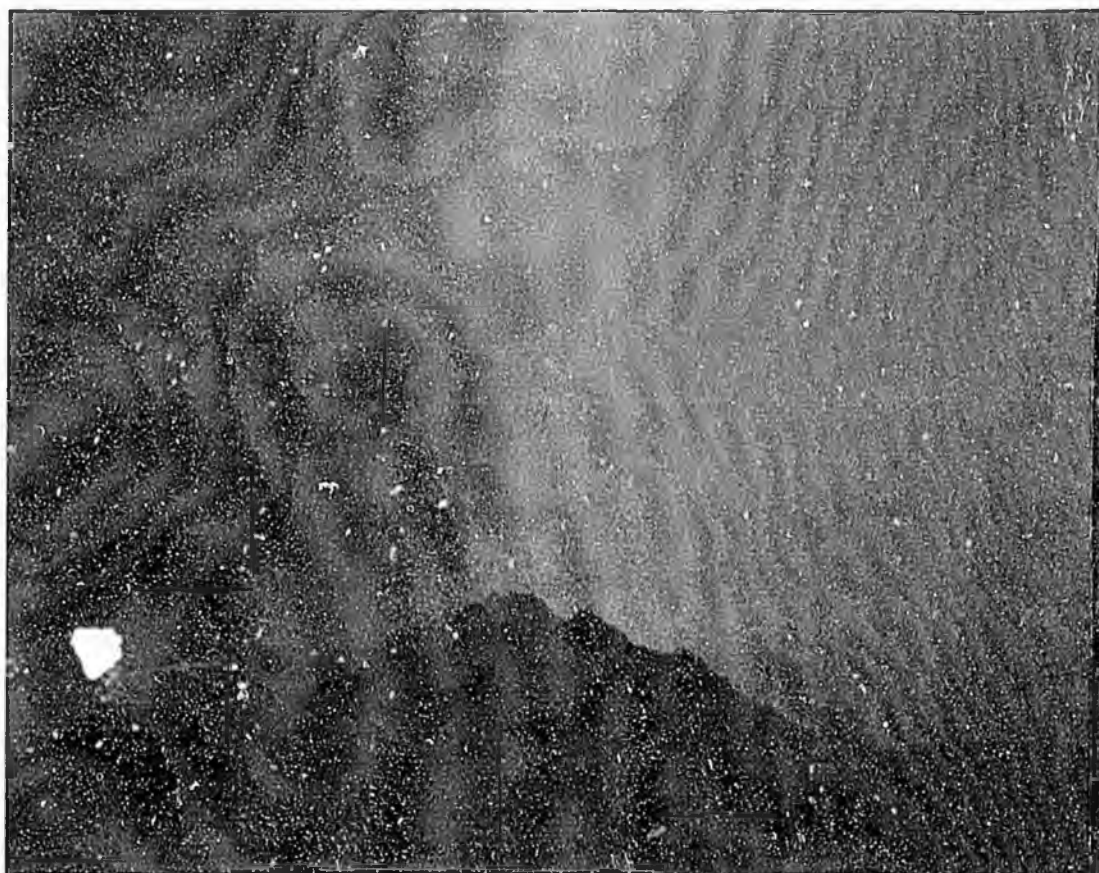
Alaskans love winter and it won't take long for visitors to discover there's plenty to do in the Great Land. Enjoy winter attractions such as the northern lights, festivals, sporting events, cross-country and downhill skiing, snow-machining, sightseeing, bird watching and wildlife viewing, dog mushing, fishing, and hunting. For a state-wide listing of activities, see the Calendar of Events.

NORTHERN LIGHTS VIEWING

The northern lights or aurora borealis dance across Alaska's nighttime skies, as many as 200 nights a year. These mystical, streaming ribbons of color have been the subject of myths for thousands of years.

One myth intimates a marriage consummated under the aurora will be rich and fruitful. While another says whistling makes the lights dance closer. And, yet another suggests spirits are playing catch with a walrus skull.

In fact, the northern lights occur when charged electrons and protons strike gas particles in the Earth's upper atmosphere,

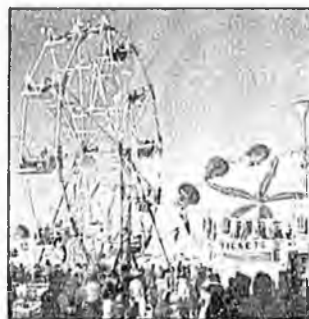
creating great arcs of light.

The northern lights can be seen across much of the state, but the Interior offers the most colorful and intense displays. As a result, a number of businesses in this region cater to aurora watchers.

FESTIVALS & CELEBRATIONS

Throughout the season, communities around the state host winter carnivals. The biggest of them all, however, is the Anchorage Fur Rendezvous.

It began in 1936 as a



The carnival during Fur Rendezvous.

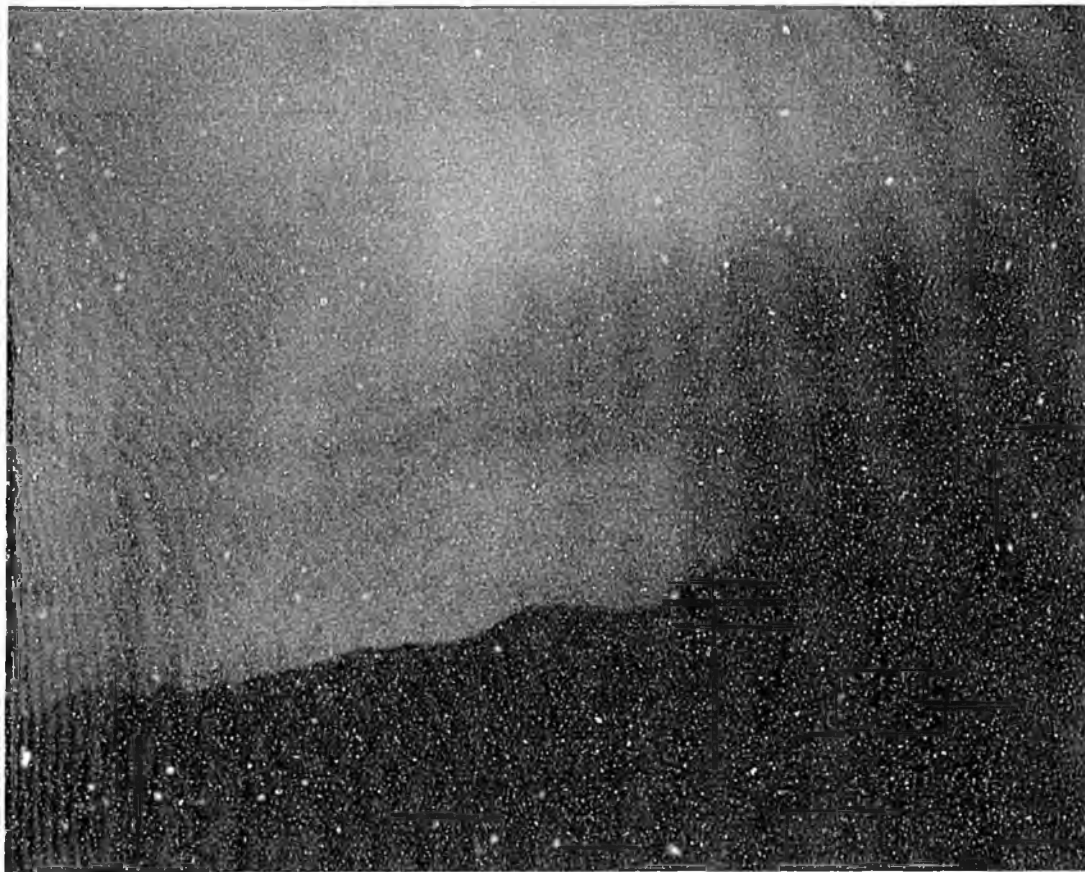
"cabin fever" reliever and has evolved into one of the nation's largest winter festivals. Held each February, this 10-day festival is packed full of activity.

Fur Rendezvous, Rondy for short, draws visitors

from around the world. And with over 150 events, there is something for everyone. Spectators can enjoy the Snow Sculptures and World Championship Sled Dog Races or try ice bowling and the Eskimo blanket toss. Then, after a long day outside, they can head indoors for exhibits or the Masque Ball.

In March, visitors travel to Fairbanks for the International Ice Carving Competition, where as many as 30 international ice carvers compete for top honors. Later in the

month, visitors can enjoy the week-long Fairbanks Winter Carnival which features sled dog races, a parka parade, ice sculptures, musicals, and more.

SPORTING EVENTS & ACTIVITIES

Alaskans love sports and visitors are often drawn into the revelry. From foot races to hockey games, there's something for everyone.

Held each Thanksgiving in Anchorage, the Great Alaska Shootout is one of the country's premier pre-season college basketball

tournaments, attracting teams from across the nation.

In December, Alaskans turn their attention to hockey, with action-packed games scheduled regularly in Fairbanks and Anchorage.

In Barrow, during the

Christmas Games, visitors watch participants compete in traditional tests of skill and strength. Events include the ear pull, high kick, and knuckle hop.

In April, myriad events occur statewide, including skiing races at the Alyeska Spring Carnival in Girdwood and the World Extreme Skiing Championships in Valdez.

Winter is the ideal time to enjoy a variety of other sporting activities, including snowshoeing, dog mushing, ice skating, ski-joring, and ice climbing.

CROSS-COUNTRY SKIING

Cross-country skiing is a favorite Alaska pastime and excellent conditions exist throughout the state.

Juneau's Eaglecrest Ski Area maintains extensive groomed trails, while the Tongass National Forest offers more challenging terrain. Skiing is also good near Skagway at White Pass Summit.

Skiers in Anchorage enjoy more than 200 miles of groomed, and often lighted, trails or they can break their own trail anywhere from the lower Kenai Peninsula to the base of Mount McKinley. Groomed trails are also maintained at Hatcher Pass, Chugach State Park, Turnagain Pass, and Kincaid Park. Many trails lead to cabins and lodges.

Skiing is also very good

WHITE

near Valdez, which is well-known for its annual record snowfall. In the Fairbanks area, try skiing at the University of Alaska Fairbanks, Birch Hill, Chena Hot Springs, and Chatanika.

DOWNHILL SKIING

Downhill skiing is popular in the Inside Passage, Southcentral, and Interior regions. When compared to other ski destinations, our lift tickets are less expensive and the lines are shorter — so grab your gear and hit the slopes! And if it's untouched powder you want, charter a helicopter and ski down your own mountain.

Alyeska Resort & Ski Area, Alaska's largest ski resort, is just a 40-minute drive from Anchorage and its slopes overlook scenic Turnagain Arm. Five chair lifts whisk skiers up 2,800 vertical feet of challenging slopes with runs for experts and beginners. Other ski areas in Anchorage include Hilltop Ski Area and Alpenglow at Arctic Valley.

In Fairbanks, dry snow makes for outstanding skiing at Cleary Summit or Skiland on the Steese Highway. And 12 miles from Juneau, Eaglecrest

SNOWMACHINING

With miles and miles of back country trails in designated recreation areas statewide, snowmachining is a popular winter sport.

In January, snowmobilers take to the highway during the Alcan 200 Snowmachine Race in Haines. In February, teams travel from Anchorage to Nome and back again over 2,200 miles of grueling terrain

during the Gold Rush Classic.

Throughout the state, weekend races take place regularly.

SIGHTSEEING

Marvel at crystal blue glaciers as you sail through

the Inside Passage or drive across the state and enjoy spectacular scenic views from the roadside. Whether traveling by Alaska state ferry, car, RV, motorcoach, or train, there's plenty to see. Or, for a bird's-eye view, go flightseeing.

Everywhere you look there's something new and different. Along the Inside Passage, stately totems are on display in Ketchikan, Wrangell, Sitka, and Saxman. While in Juneau, visit Mendenhall Glacier, the Shrine of St. Therese,

and the Alaska State Museum. And in Wrangell or Petersburg, take time to search for ancient petroglyphs on local beaches.

Southcentral offers a wide variety of sightseeing opportunities. The stunning blue ice of Portage

Glacier can be viewed from the Begich, Boggs Visitor Center, which is open weekends. Also open on weekends is the Hatcher Pass Independence Mine State Historic Park & Museum. The Anchorage Museum of History and Art showcases Alaska's rich history, and Wasilla's Iditarod headquarters offers a historical look at this world-famous race.

While traveling through the Interior look for the 800-mile trans-Alaska pipeline. Take a relaxing soak at Chena, Circle, or

Manley hot springs. Or head to the University of Alaska Museum to see Alaska wildlife and Native culture exhibits.

Make sure you leave time to browse through the many museums, galleries, and shops or to sample the fare at a variety of excellent restaurants and cafes.

BIRD WATCHING & WILDLIFE VIEWING

Alaska is home to a host of wildlife and its waters shelter one of the world's largest concentrations of marine animals. On land,

sighting birds and wildlife can be done from the comfort of your car or on a guided tour. From the water, you may spot whales, seals, or sea otters. Either way, you're sure to encounter some of Alaska's most notable residents.

Perhaps the most dramatic bird watching encounter occurs near Haines between late October and January. Each year over 3,500 American bald eagles gather in the Alaska Chilkat Bald Eagle Preserve to feed on late-run chum salmon.

After the first snowfall, Alaska's famed brown bears retreat to their winter dens; however, bears can be seen on Kodiak and Admiralty islands through October and polar bears are active all year in remote areas along the arctic coast.

With 13 distinct herds,

RUSH

caribou in Alaska outnumber people and can be spotted along many of the major highways.

Look for bison all year near Delta Junction and on Kodiak Island.

Moose may be seen year-round across the state and it's not unusual to see one wandering through city parks and streets.

All five species of Pacific salmon can be found in Alaska. Inside Passage and Southcentral hatcheries offer viewing opportunities.

DOG MUSHING

As Alaska's official sport, dog mushing is a thrill whether cheering from the sidelines or trying it yourself. In the winter, both sprint and long-distance sled dog races are a regular occurrence throughout virtually every region of the state.

Two of the sport's premier events occur in February. The World Championship Sled Dog Race is held during the final weekend of Anchorage Fur Rendezvous. Shortly thereafter, Fairbanks and Whitehorse, in the Yukon Territory, host the Yukon Quest International Sled Dog Race.

On the first Saturday in March, up to 75 mushers and their dog teams start the world's richest and longest sled dog race. Racers take off from

Anchorage's Fourth Avenue for the first leg of the 1,049-mile Iditarod Trail Sled Dog Race. Deemed "The Last Great Race On Earth," the arduous race takes mushers anywhere from 10 days to three weeks to complete.

Spectators have several options for viewing the race. Many enjoy being a part of the excitement at the starting line where they can look over the teams and watch the mushers prepare for the journey. Others prefer to see the restart of the race in

Wasilla, a 45-minute drive from Anchorage, which takes place later in the day. Observers can also catch a glimpse of the race from lodges and communities located along the trail. For the ultimate race experi-

world. The race begins in Anchorage and ends in Nome, over 1,000 miles away.

ence, fans fly to Nome for the finish and related festivities.

Another of the state's sled dog races takes place later in March, when Fairbanks hosts the Open North American Championship Sled Dog Race.

After watching a race or two, you may discover you want to try it yourself. Guided tours range from local half-hour rides to week-long excursions in remote areas.

FISHING

Fishing is a year-round sport and even in the win-

ter Alaska offers some of the best fishing in the world. Anglers can reel in late-run silver salmon, winter kings, halibut, and steelhead. Go alone or with a guide; fish along the road system, charter a plane, or try your luck at ice fishing.

The Inside Passage boasts year-round stocks of salmon, halibut, rockfish, and Dolly Varden. Steelhead exceeding 20 pounds have been taken near Yakutat and Ketchikan.

In October, in areas along the Kenai Peninsula and Tanana River, anglers fish

for late-run silvers. Even after freeze-up rainbow trout are abundant in area lakes. And, in Homer, anglers can fish for winter

king salmon from late January through March.

Rainbow trout and burbot can be caught year-round in lakes near Fairbanks and whitefish are plentiful in most area waters.

Contact local guides or the Alaska Department of Fish and Game for more information.

HUNTING

Between October and April Alaska offers hunters a range of big game and waterfowl opportunities. Hunters can stalk moose, caribou, mountain goat, Dall sheep, Sitka black-tailed deer, elk, lynx, red and arctic fox, musk ox, bison, bear, and small game in designated game management units.

Waterfowl, including many species of ducks, Canada geese, cranes, and brant can be hunted between October and mid-December in areas throughout the state, and are particularly plentiful in Southwest Alaska.

A hunting license and the appropriate big game tag or Alaska Waterfowl Conservation tag and federal duck stamp are required. Check with local guides or the Alaska Department of Fish and Game for more information.

PACK YOUR BAGS

Because Alaska is so incredibly large and its regions are so diverse, we have compiled some helpful packing suggestions and weather descriptions that will help you pack for your winter trip to Alaska.

When preparing for your trip, it's best to keep a few simple rules in mind.

For starters, focus less on fashion and more on comfort and practicality. You'll discover that Alaskans are a casual bunch, although for evenings you may want to dress up.

Pack so you can dress in layers, starting with long underwear and adding a sweater, jacket, or heavy coat as needed.

Always pack a hat, warm gloves, extra socks, boots, and sunglasses. Sun screen can also come in handy, especially because the reflection off the snow can be intense.

Weather conditions can change hourly and will vary widely depending upon your location.

Keep these weather conditions in mind as you plan your trip.

INSIDE PASSAGE

Warmed by Pacific currents, communities within the Inside Passage enjoy a temperate, moist, maritime climate that's slightly

cooler than the coastal areas of Oregon and Washington.

January temperatures average 20-40F (-6 to -4C); subzero temperatures are rare. Juneau's average high temperature in January is 38F (3C). Precipitation alternates between periods of rain and snow.

SOUTHCENTRAL

Along the southern coastline, moderate ocean currents keep the climate moist and mild, while in Anchorage and areas farther north, conditions are generally drier and somewhat colder.

In January, the average high temperature in Anchorage is 21F (-6C). In inland areas, snow is deep and remains on the ground from late October through mid-April.

INTERIOR

The dry air of Alaska's Interior makes winter days surprisingly comfortable, though in December and January subzero temperatures are common.

The Brooks Range protects the region from harsh Arctic weather, while the Alaska Range to the south shields it from the maritime conditions of the Gulf of Alaska coast.

The average January temperature in the region is -2F (-17C). Snow generally remains on the ground from October through April.

However, the dry, cold climate doesn't keep people indoors, a testimony to the fact that proper clothing makes all the difference.

FAR NORTH

Alaska's Far North receives light, dry snow from October through May.

The area is characterized by strong winds; long, cold winters; and desert-like precipitation.

Subzero temperatures are commonplace throughout the region. However, in January, Nome's average high temperature is 14F (-9C).

SOUTHWEST

Much of the region lies in a maritime zone, so the weather is unpredictable and susceptible to frequent rain and snow.

The weather will frequently change hourly, especially on the Alaska Peninsula and Aleutian Islands.

In Kodiak, the average temperature in January is 13F (-9C).
