Thank you for allowing me the time to research the appointment of Martin Krull to the Pharmacy Board. As you know, I have concerns because the confirmation of Martin Krull of Anchorage would leave the Board with 5 members from Anchorage and 1 member from Fairbanks. Additionally, the board would be all male and represent only pharmacists from large "chain" pharmacies, excluding representation from small, locally owned pharmacies.

My staff met with Cindy Smith of Boards and Commissions today. Ms. Smith has proposed that we confirm Martin Krull of Anchorage. There is a vacant "public member" seat, which the Governor intends to fill with a woman from Ketchikan. If Governor Knowles is re-elected, Ms. Smith has promised to fill a seat that will expire on 4/01/99 with a pharmacist from SE Alaska, preferably a person who represents a locally owned pharmacy.

I am satisfied that the board would have a better regional and gender balance as proposed by Ms. Smith. It has always been my understanding the Mr. Krill is highly qualified to serve on the board, and with my region and gender balance concerns satisfied by Ms. Smith, I withdraw my objection to Mr. Krill's confirmation.

My dedication to community service in Alaska goes back a number of years and is somewhat varied. In the mid-50s while living in Ketchikan I was among a number of women who founded the local museum and the Tongass Historical Society. My initial 11-year stay in Alaska was interrupted when I returned to California in 1966.

Returning to Alaska in 1977, I became involved with and later became Chair of the Board for the Gateway Opportunity Center, a non-profit organization advocating for the developmentally disabled. I was instrumental in securing a contract with the Forest Service to provide signs to be used on national forest lands. The sign-making equipment came from Wrangell Institute when the youth employment program, Young Adult Conservation Corps, closed down. The contract provided paid employment for four clients and was making a profit but was forced to close down after the first year because of Forest Service budget cuts.

During the same period I was also a volunteer and Board member for Women in Safe Homes, a non-profit women's shelter dedicated to addressing the issues of domestic violence and sexual assault. My participation in many of the school board meetings was also instrumental in closing down a local "head shop". This group, Families in Action, later evolved into Alaskans for Drug Free Youth.

My Forest Service career was in civil rights, personnel and human resources covering every aspect of those functions. Upon transferring/promoting to Milwaukee, Wisconsin in December of 1984 I worked exclusively in civil rights with responsibility for a geographic area covering 20 states (14 national forests) from Maine to West Virginia, across to Missouri and up through Minnesota. At least 50% of my time was in the field which prevented any great involvement in programs there, however, I did manage to volunteer some time at one of the women's shelters in Milwaukee.

Upon my return to Alaska (Juneau) in 1987, I became an active member of Toastmasters and with several of our members would visit the Lemon Creek facility once a month to work with the inmates helping to improve their communication skills.

In Juneau I was the Assistant Director of Personnel for the Forest Service with responsibility for the civil rights program for the Alaska Region. I retired from the Forest Service in July of 1993 deciding to settle in Ketchikan....convinced that I had

Personal and Professional Profile

Patricia Joan Titus Peirsol was born in Minnesota and spent her early school years in the Twin Cities of Minneapolis and St. Paul. She completed high school in Seattle, Washington, returning to Minnesota to graduate from the University of Minnesota in 1970. She married an architect and lived in England and Italy, interrupted with a year working and traveling in the United States for a seven year period before returning to Seattle in 1978. After four years in Washington State, Patricia moved to Fairbanks where she has remained to the present.

In Minneapolis/St. Paul Patricia was the Director of Design for the Metropolitan Transit Commission. The work consisted of design and selection of both large and small buses as well as the graphics to be installed upon them, signage, schedule formats, bus shelters and other visual and functional requirements of the transportation system.

In London, England Patricia produced renovation projects throughout the London Boroughs. While living in England she traveled extensively in Europe and spent time on small projects for families that she met along the way. For example, she designed and constructed an exterior restaurant for a family in Sardegna and an outside washing station and a produce marketing sign system for a farm community in Corsica. Construction budgets for each of the projects were less than \$5.

In Rome, Italy Patricia worked on the design of Al Batin (later renamed King Kalid City) in Saudi Arabia, a \$14 billion project. She was involved primarily in the design of the housing units and in the paving patterns for the walkways that were to connect the entire city. She spent as much time as possible in Italy taking in the innate Italian sense of small-scale, detailed exterior spaces and structures and while there edited a book on landscape architecture.

Patricia temporarily left Rome in 1975 to travel to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to be a member of the eight-person team that created all of the landscape architectural improvements for the Bicentennial celebrations. This work included painted street intersection graphics, tree planting, walkways, bus shelters, band shells, toilets, portable drinking fountains, paving patterns, benches and tables, children's play equipment, banners and other temporary amenities for both aesthetic and functional purposes.

In Seattle Patricia was involved with HUD housing units developed for the Scattered Site Housing program conducted by the Seattle Development Authority. This work consisted of creating duplex to ten-plex projects that blended into various Seattle neighborhoods without the stereotype image of low income housing.

Patricia is currently licensed to practice architecture in the states of Alaska (A6129) and Washington (4989).

She has recently been elected to serve on the Board of Directors of the Tanana Yukon Historic Preservation Society. She co-started and is current chairperson of The Friends of the Coal Bunkers, a group of concerned citizens trying to save the Fairbanks Coal Bunkers, an historic structure.

She was one of eleven professionals statewide to be selected by the Alaska DOT&PF to conduct Americans with Disabilities Audits on state-owned buildings. She went through a training program and audited facilities in Tanana, Fort Yukon, Galena, Delta Junction, Tok and Fairbanks.

She is a past president and current member of the Alaska Northern Chapter of the International Conference of Building Officials. Presently she is chairperson of the City of Fairbanks Code Review Commission.

She is a proponent of and encourages useful and cooperative communication within the construction industry. She was the charter president of the Fairbanks Chapter of the National Association of Women in Construction and is currently an active member. The firm has been a member of the Association of General Contractors for the past twelve years.
