Dear Senator Adams:

We very much appreciate your introducing Senate Bill 135 regarding waivers of the local participating share under CIP grants. The legislation that originally required a local share included a provision that allowed the Commissioner of Education to waive the requirement for good cause. However, the Department of Education's waiver policy is so restrictive that it is virtually impossible to be granted a waiver.

Your bill, which requires waivers of the participating share in school districts of low assessed valuation, low per capita income, and high unemployment, is certainly reasonable. The local governments of such areas are already strained to the limit to provide even the most basic public services. Under such circumstances, the burden of the participating share would have the effect of further reducing these meager services.

In REAA's that meet the requirements of your bill, children are typically educationally disadvantaged, many are underachieving, and a significant percentage are limited English proficient. The only practical source of the required participating share in such districts is the operating budget. Thus, the instructional program for the neediest of children is reduced, exacerbating their educational deficits.

A good example is Kashunamiut School District, an REAA whose project is number one on the FY '98 DOE construction priority list. 98% of the students are Alaska Natives, 84% are limited English proficient, and 79% are below the poverty level. They are housed in an old BIA school that is documented as being an extreme life/safety hazard and educationally inadequate. Furthermore, it is presently at 189% of capacity, and the enrollment is increasing. If this project is funded, the local participating share will be \$484,614, which would have to come from the operating budget. It would indeed be a travesty for the state to require poor, educationally disadvantaged children to pay such a price merely to have a safe and educationally adequate facility.

Dear Senator Adams:

On behalf of the Northwest Arctic Borough, and the eleven communities within our boundaries, we fully support SB 135 which was introduced for consideration and passage during this session.

We are on record that a prior existing match requirement for school construction makes our financial and operational requirements a losing battle for too few dollars to meet the demands of needed new schools. In our close working relationship with the local school district, we find it nearly impossible to contribute to the capital projects just to meet the arcane matching requirements for which there is no tax base to provide for new construction.

We are struggling in just meeting the local match of the school districts annual operating budget, let alone trying to fund replacement of school facilities. We are cognizant of specific instances of the school districts predicament when it cited the difficulties in Selawik and Buckland who needed these improvements without imposing on our limited access to other funds.

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Sponsor Statement

SB 135

"An Act Relating to the participating share for school construction grants, and providing for an effective date"

SB 135 deals with the participating share that school districts are required to contribute as the "local match" for school construction projects.

SB 135 substitutes a three part means test for the existing waiver criteria. Under the provisions of SB 135, a school district must meet all three criteria established in the bill to have their participating share waived. The three part test consists of:

- (1) An assessed valuation per average daily membership of \$200,000 or less;
- (2) An unemployment rate in the district of 10% or more; and
- (3) An average per capita income for residents in the district that is 85% or less of the statewide average per capita income.

Although each of these measurements has it's own specific shortcomings, the combination of criteria provides the Commissioner of Education a pretty good idea of local economic circumstances. School construction projects are badly needed throughout the state. Passage of SB 135 would allow school construction to proceed in an equitable and expeditious manner.

Sec. 14.11.005. School construction grant fund. There is created a school construction grant fund as an account in the general fund. The fund shall be used to make grants for the costs of school construction. Legislative appropriations for school construction shall be deposited in the fund, and the proceeds from the sale of general obligation bonds for school construction may be deposited in the fund. (§ 5 ch 5 SLA 1990)

Sec. 14.11.007. Major maintenance grant fund. There is created a major maintenance grant fund as an account in the general fund. The fund shall be used to make grants for the costs of school major maintenance. Legislative appropriations for school major maintenance shall be deposited in the fund. (§ 4 ch 78 SLA 1993)

Sec. 14.11.008. School district participation in grant program. (a) In order to receive a grant under this chapter or an appropriation under AS 37.05.560, a district must provide a percentage share of the project cost, as determined under (b) or (c) of this section. A district shall provide the required participating share within three years after the date that the appropriation bill funding the grant is passed by the legislature.

(b) The required participating share for a municipal school district is based on the district's full value per ADM, which is calculated by dividing the full and true value of the taxable real and personal property in the district, calculated as described in AS 14.17.025(a)(1), by the district average daily membership (ADM) as defined in AS 14.17.250, for the same fiscal year for which the valuation was made. The municipal district's full value per ADM determines the district's required participating share, as follows:

Full Value Per ADM	District Participating Share
\$1 — \$100,000	5 percent
100,001 — 200,000	10 percent
200,001 — 600,000	30 percent
over 600,000	35 percent.

(c) The required participating share for a regional educational attendance area is two percent. The participating share for any district may be satisfied by money from federal, local, or other sources, or with locally contributed labor, material, or equipment.

(d) If a district with full value per ADM of \$200,000 or less can demonstrate in writing that it is unable to provide the required participating share or that the participating share required under this section will jeopardize receipt of federal assistance, the commissioner may waive all or a portion of the required participating share.

(e) State funds provided under this chapter may not be a source of the participating share required under (b) or (c) of this section. (§ 4 ch 78 SLA 1993)

Dear Representative Joule;

We support the legislation you are proposing related to participating shares for school construction grants. Our school district has asked for a waiver on our school construction grants and has been denied every time. We seek the waiver because the capital participating share always gets funded from our operating budget, and we have no revenue source or taxing authority.

We believe legislation dealing with ADM full value, unemployment in the district, and average per capita income level are excellent indicators of qualifications for participating share waivers. These indicators are objective, not subject to manipulation, and would serve as an accurate litmus test for qualification.

Our school district thanks you for your continued leadership in education and your advocacy for children.

The Northwest Arctic Borough School District fully supports SB 135, which you introduced this session relating to matching funds for municipal school construction grants. I believe the following information will give you some idea of the problems we had providing the local matching requirement for the Selawik High School Renovation/Addition Project which we currently have under way.

The District submitted an application for funding for the Selawik High School Renovation/Addition Project in August of 1992 in the amount of \$ 14,366,690. The legislature approved funding in the amount of \$ 12,930,000, because this was also the time that the school construction grant program was revised to provide for the local matching requirement. This change in the funding statutes left the District \$ 1,436,669.00 short to provide for the building that was envisioned when our application was submitted. The District has been successful in providing for the local matching requirement through the use of prior years capital expenditure (\$244,131.00) and the use of unrestricted fund balance from the operating fund to provide the remaining balance. While this method met the short term requirements for this project it can not be used as a basis for providing local match funding in any future projects.

If the District was to obtain an appropriation for the Buckland Remediation Project, which was the Northwest Arctic Borough Board of Education's number one priority, this would obligate the District to provide for local match funding for this project. Based upon the request by the District and the amount recommended by the Department of Education this could be anywhere from \$ 1,200,000 to \$ 1,700,000. Since the District has utilized all the available unrestricted fund balance to provide for the continuation of our current educational program and the remaining local match requirement for Selawik, there is not a source of funding available to meet any additional local matching requirements. The Northwest Arctic Borough does not have the resources available to assist the District with this requirement.

As you are aware, the Northwest Arctic area consistently has one of the highest unemployment rates in the state. Because of this situation there is not an available tax base for the Borough to levy taxes upon the residents to allow for the local participation requirements. Representative Long's bill would allow the District to continue to provide the much needed facilities in our District but not burden the residents with a local matching requirement when there are no available resources to meet this requirement.

The draft committee substitute for SB 139 expands the existing state funding program to include Volunteer Fire Departments and EMS groups, subject to being certified or registered with the State; having a service area of less than 2,500 people; and in the case of EMS, providing ambulance services.

I have worked with several offices to provide information on the number of fire departments and EMS groups which would be affected by this CS. Please note, during that contact, we also discussed the most expedient means to provide these funds, without impacting existing offices-keeping down the "administrative" fiscal costs. This CS presents a reasonable process to provide funding to the volunteers without additional agency administrative costs.

The spread sheets for the EMS groups was developed through information provided by the State's Emergency Medical Services Section. The spread sheets for the Fire Departments was developed through information from the Fire Department Directory, compared to a community population list provided by the Department of Community and Regional Affairs.

Based on that preliminary information, the numbers of affected groups are:

1. Total area population of registered Volunteer Fire Depts: 43,080
2. Total area population of certified EMS groups: 33,519

SPONSOR STATEMENT

SB 139 - AID TO VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENTS

Senate Bill 139 revises current statutes which limits funding for volunteer fire departments to those which are not in an organized municipality. This bill, when enacted, would provide for payment to any volunteer fire department and not be restricted to only those in the unorganized area. The payment amount remains the same, \$10.00 per capita for the population served, as determined by the state fire marshal.

It has come to my attention that there are a number of small, volunteer fire departments in Alaska which are not the beneficiary of this existing program. They are within an organized borough, but receive no financial support from either the borough or applicable municipality. There are also some who receive very limited financial support from either source.

I am of the opinion that this support for volunteer fire departments should extend to all areas of the state and not just those in the unorganized areas. Certainly, public safety is a high priority and should encompass all peoples.

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DRAFT CSSB 139 - State aid for volunteer services

This CS removes the current program from under the municipal services account. That account incorporates several state aid programs, all of which are pro-rated depending upon the appropriation each fiscal year. Removing this program from the municipal services account and making it a "stand alone" program means that the funds appropriated each fiscal year will be appropriated to it directly, without any pro-rating among other programs. SB 139 leaves the program under municipal services.

The CS has a new title, reflecting "volunteer services" as opposed to just volunteer fire departments. EMS services are now included, thus the change to "volunteer services".

A volunteer fire department will receive state aid if

- (1) it is registered with the State Fire Marshall
- (2) it is serving an area with a population of less than 2,500.

An EMS will receive state aid if

- (1) it is certified to provide EMS
- (2) it provides ambulance services
- (3) serves an area with a population of less than 2,500.

There are other "revisions", but the rest pertain to the removal of the program from the municipal services account, and subsequent technical revisions due to citations changes, etc. .

The act takes effect July 1, 1997.
