

This letter is in response to your proposed HB0023 relating to traditional means of access for traditional outdoor uses. I wish to thank you for sponsoring this worthwhile legislation. This bill is not only important to me as an individual who uses the outdoors on an ongoing and frequent basis for both recreational uses and as a consumptive user fisher and hunter, but, we know of many cases where the ability to have freely open access is critical to the on going assurance of livelihood for other fellow Alaskan friends and associates.

It is important that the control of access to public lands be placed under the close scrutiny and decision making control of the Legislature. These are the people who make the laws and are responsible for seeing they are properly and fairly enforced. If the decision authority remains in the hands of the state employee bureaucrats all control and effective enforcement can and will become lost to the people who are most affected by those decisions. We, the user and citizen, have no control over these bureaucratic individuals and must bow to the consequences of their arbitrary decisions. If the control is placed into the hands of the legislature, we have control in that we can and do make the decision as to which individuals remain in control every time we step into the election booth. Also, the public opinion process has become a mockery. We have time and time again gone in and testified with overwhelming numbers in support of/or against a specific decision or proposal and the result has been that the agency has gone ahead and effected some decision totally disregarding the testimony. This is a mockery of the system that we have available to us. If this system was working there would be no need for you to be proposing this very legislation and there would be no reason for us spending our time and effort to support you on this matter. The truth is the system is not working and it is time that the citizens of this great state of ours work with the legislature to effect a change.

Access to public lands and waterways should remain open to traditional uses for all citizens of this great state of ours. When it becomes necessary to impose restrictions, for whatever feasible reason, the restriction or reclassification should apply to ALL USERS and not single out single or specific groups of users. And, as stated before, should only be improved if imposed by legislative decision.

Dear Representative Masek,

I am writing in response to your proposed legislation on traditional means of access for traditional outdoor uses, HB0023. I am a 30 year plus resident of Alaska and have used the public lands and waterways for years on an ongoing basis for recreational uses and for consumptive use hunting and fishing.

I strongly urge that continued access to public lands remain open to traditional uses for all citizens. If ever it becomes necessary to impose reclassification of uses or impose restrictions, limited or otherwise, it is important that the reclassification or restriction apply to ALL USERS and not only to singled out groups. This can only be assured if the power to make these decisions is placed into the hands of the Legislature. Too many times we have gone before the state agency representatives in a Public Hearing process and had the decision that finally is made on the issue be made for the convenience of the agency. Time and time again, these decisions have totally gone against the majority of the testifiers. It has become a mockery to the system and the citizen is becoming complacent to even testify, because they know that too often, their view will be ignored...even if it is in the majority view. The legislature is under the control of the citizen voter of this state and we, the users, can and do have control of who makes up that body. Currently we can do nothing about the bureaucratic individuals that control decisions being made for us at the agency level. It is critical that the control of these decisions become a legislative process.

One area of access to public lands that is too often overlooked is concern for the elderly and/or disabled citizen. I myself have limitations due to physical disabilities. Motorized access continues to be attacked. It is all well and good that certain citizens want their "remote experience" free of noise or other distraction. We who are limited certainly feel discriminated against by this thought process. It seems truly discriminatory to restrict an elderly or disabled citizen from access to the same public use area as anyone else, simply because the sound of a motor may infringe upon someone else's "experience". Are these same people traumatized when their neighbor uses a power lawnmower in the summer or a snowblower in the winter? This area too often is not mentioned when access becomes discussed. The limited individuals rights must not be overlooked.

Dear Representative Masek:

I am writing in support of your Access Bill (HB23). I feel that it is imperative to have this bill enacted into law at the earliest possible date. I was appointed to served on the Recreational River advisory council by Governors Hickie and Knowles. I attended almost all of the public meeting during the supposed formulation period for the plan. It became quiet apparent shortly after the public meeting began that the personnel from the Department of Natural Resources had their own ideas and did not want to hear opposing views.

A petition was circulated and submitted with more than 5,500 signatures that opposed the motorized restrictions set forth in the proposed plan. When this petition was presented, the Department of Natural Resources treated it as though it did not exist. Department personnel continue to say that the public supported motorized restrictions.

Mr. Don Sherwood, who was serving on the Rec. Rivers advisory council as the hosting representative, was taken to task by Department of Natural Resources personnel for contacting legislators about the department disregarding the decision of the board. It is quite apparent that the desires of the public ranks second to the desires of those in the Department of Natural Resources. Your bill is need immediately and I hope that you will work with our congregational delegation to get the same type of federal legislation.

Attached please find an Attorney General's opinion rendered for the Alaska Department of Public Safety.

I have a son, Brian, who is presently a First Lieutenant in the United States Marine Corps, stationed at Camp Pendleton, California. Brian was born in Alaska, lived here all of his life, and graduated from the United States Naval Academy, Class of 1994 as the top Marine Corps Officer (12th in his class).

Despite being assigned by the Corps to a billet "Outside", Brian is an Alaskan through and through. He proudly displays Alaskan personalized plates on his car (BAR¹), votes in Alaskan elections via absentee ballot, has retained his Alaskan Driver's license, and comes home to visit the old folks at least once a year. Yet, according to this AG opinion, Brian cannot get a resident hunting license to hunt or fish with his dad, mom, brothers, and sister, even if he is lucky enough to get time off during hunting season.

Our home, I hope, will always be "home" to Brian in Alaska, as long as we are alive. Alaska, itself, will always be "home" to Brian, too, and he intends to return here after his discharge, whenever that occurs. (Brian will probably make the Marine Corps his first career. After that he is talking about teaching history in Alaska.) But since the Marine Corps furnishes lodging to Brian, his place of abode is wherever the Marine Corps tells him to rest his head. He cannot be stationed here as a career, active duty officer, because the Marines don't have an active duty unit in Alaska.

It appears to me to be grossly unfair for Brian, the Roscovius boy (who I know personally), and other similarly situated young people from Alaska, who have chosen to serve their country, to lose their residency for hunting or fishing purposes, because that service must be outside the State.

¹Brian's wife has MRSBAR on her Alaska plates and is looking forward to the day they will settle in Alaska.

May I suggest that you consider amending the current law in one of the following ways:


1. Provide that Alaskan residents' sons and daughters and brothers and sisters, who are in the military service, and who have maintained their Alaska residency status while in service, may hunt or fish as Alaskan residents provided they hunt with members of their family who are Alaskan Residents (Acceptable), or
2. Provide that Alaskan residents' sons and daughters and brothers and sisters, who are in the military service, and who have maintained their Alaska residency status while in service, may hunt or fish as Alaskan residents (Better), or
3. Provide that Alaskan residents, who have lived in Alaska for more than one year immediately prior to their military service, or during their military service, and who have maintained their Alaska residency, may hunt or fish as Alaskan residents (Better Still), or
4. Take out the provision that requires the maintenance of a permanent place of abode in Alaska for persons who are in the military service (Good).

As Alaskan parents, we often see our children leave the State for college or military service. We all hope, however, that our children will eventually choose to return to Alaska to live. Our children's ability to retain their hunting and fishing rights as Alaskan residents, despite their military service, is just another encouragement to them to come home when they can, on a temporary basis, and to return home permanently, when their service is over.

I would appreciate your assistance in making the necessary changes to this law immediately. Brian is due to come home in August for a visit, and I'm getting too old to pack a moose or caribou by myself.

REMARKS:

Under AS 16.50.940(26), if a member of the military service has not been stationed in Alaska the preceding 12 months, then he/she would have to qualify as any other resident by having maintained a permanent place of abode and a voting residence in Alaska the preceding 12 months. If John Roscovius has not maintained his own permanent place of abode in Alaska during the preceding 12 months, he they would not be a resident for fish and game purposes, even though he may well be a resident for other purposes.



Sponsor Statement HB-26

I have introduced HB-26 (HB-313 last session), because the need to provide our wildlife specialists with the proper management tools is extremely important, especially in areas identified as needing intensive management. In light of Ballot Initiative #3 being approved, it is even more important we pass HB-26. Without sufficient latitude, it is difficult for the Department of Fish and Game and Board of Game to meet the requirements of sustained yield management under Article VIII of our State Constitution.

To maintain a healthy population of moose, caribou, and sheep for both human and natural (secondary) harvest the Department and Board of Game have few choices once hunting has been reduced or eliminated. One of the only practical remaining options to further decrease mortality of ungulates is a reduction in natural predation. To assist the Department in meeting their sustained yield goals, HB-26 provides increased incentives for nonresident hunters who consider the purchase of a big game tag to harvest wolves.

These hunters are generally under the supervision of a professional guide which requires a more closely monitored entry into the field. This, together with more stringent reporting requirements of animals both taken and shipped, gives the Department a very well controlled tool in attaining the scientifically established population goals for a given area.

It should be noted, that of the some 10,000 nonresident who typically hunt in Alaska annually, less than 3% purchase tags for harvesting a wolf. The main reason for low tag sales is the opportunity to harvest a wolf is remote at best. Consequently, most hunters are unwilling to pay a large sum of money with such poor odds. By establishing a more reasonable price on tags, the Department should see a significant rise in sales which will in turn put more dollars into the Fish and Game Fund while also increasing the incidental take of wolves.

In summary, HB-26 will provide a wider latitude for the Board of Game in making adjustments to meet the needs of both human and secondary utilization of our important ungulate resources while increasing the revenues for better management. I urge your support for this modification as provided in HB-26.

Dear Chairman Halford:

Thank you for this opportunity to comment on amendments proposed for inclusion in the above referenced legislation. In particular I would like to address portions of HB173 which may be offered as amendments to CSHB46.

Changes have been proposed to AS 27.21.120 Small operator assistance program, a section of the Alaska Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act. To maintain primacy from the federal government for the regulation of surface coal mining, the Alaska program has to be changed from time to time, to maintain it's status as being "as effective as" the federal program. The proposed changes are necessary to keep the Alaska program in accord with the federal program.

The currently proposed changes are directed at two aspects of the assistance program. First is a change to the maximum tonnage from 100,000 to 300,000. This would allow a permit applicant who will not exceed a production level of 300,000 tons per annum to apply for monetary assistance. The second major change to the program is the type of work the grant monies can underwrite. The proposed new language allows funding to: determine probable hydrologic consequences, evaluate test borings and core samples, develop cross-section maps and plans, gather archeological and historic information, perform a preblasting survey and provide a report detailing the findings.



The Alaska Department of Natural Resources administers the yearly grant monies provided by the federal government's Office of Surface Mining Reclamation and Enforcement. The amount of the grant for the small operator assistance program currently ranges between 85-100 thousand dollars per year. Unused portions of the grant monies lapse at years end – with no carryover allowed. As of this writing,, no monies have ever been expended from the fund.

The proposed changes are wholeheartedly supported by our company with just two caveats. The proposed legislation does not place a cap on the amount of funding an applicant may receive. At this time the grant level is small enough that concern is really unwarranted. However, grant monies in the future could become a much more significant number. Given this fact – the program could literally become a way for the state to unwillingly act as the underwriter to a sole coal mine operator. This was certainly not the intent of the original program, nor should it be. If a ceiling amount could be set in statute, then multiple small operators could use the fund as it was intended – to aid them in securing the labyrinth of data needed to fulfill their surface coal mining permitting requirements. Secondly, some additional language needs to be added to the currently proposed amendments to insure the Alaska program wholly tracks it's federal counterpart. There is no mechanism suggested for recovery of funds received by an operator who goes into production at a rate higher than the 300,00 tons per year. The new language could read as follows:

"If the commissioner finds that a coal operator has received monies appropriated from the small operator assistance program, and if the coal operators actual and attributed annual production of coal for all locations exceeds 300,000 tons during the 12 months immediately following the date on which the operator is issued the surface coal mining and reclamation permit, the coal operator shall reimburse the regulatory authority for the cost of services rendered including funds drawn from the small operator assistance program."

Dear Senator Halesford:

This is a follow-up to my conversation with Brett Huber and Senator Bert Sharp's office (Tom Williams) regarding the above House Bill. I represent Howard Hayes and his son, Michael Hayes, who are miners and hold a production license under A.S.38.05.207 with respect to the A-J Tailings. In the past they have mined on the subject property pursuant to this production license.

There is and has been a contest with the surface owners regarding their mining claims that has been at issue for over 13 years. It has been to the Alaska Supreme Court twice, and in each instance the Supreme Court held in the Hayeses' favor. The case is again pending in the Supreme Court and it is our position that the production license reflects a property right that protects their right to mine as to their claims.

House Bill 46 would repeal the production licenses granted under A.S.38.05.207. (See Section 11 of H.B. 46 and also Section 2 amending A.S.38.05.035(e)(6)(F).

It may be suggested that the Alaska General Savings Clause would protect the Hayeses' production license rights, and that may be the case; however, so that there is no question about it, may I suggest that language be inserted in House Bill 46 making it clear it is in no way intended to modify the rights that production licensees have, and particularly if House Bill 46 is enacted into law.

I should note that there are some 32 other production licensees, and in contacting two of them (we have no addresses or telephone numbers for the others), they were unaware of House Bill 46 and

one of its intended purposes, i.e., the elimination of production licenses. It is urged that written notice be given to these persons so that their views may be expressed.

Over and above the foregoing statements, I would note that I am sure the surface owners would seize upon House Bill 46 as having some effect on the Hayeses' law suit pending in the Supreme Court; and although it may be forceably argued that it does not, I would appreciate on behalf of the Hayeses that their proccent rights under the production license they hold not be tampered with.

If I can answer any questions, please don't hesitate to advise me.

On behalf of the administration, the department is pleased to confirm our support for HB 46 as amended by the Senate Resources Committee on March 20, 1997.

The amendment to incorporate HB 173 by Representative Foster is especially pleasing since that bill has significant streamlining implications for the mining industry and the department. This is important since we received a +300% increase in the number of applications over 1996 (106 vs 33) for double the total amount of credits (\$26.6 million vs \$13.3 million)

We have no objection to the proposed designation of the Petersville Recreational Mining Areas. It is the department's understanding that designation of the two areas previously closed to mineral entry under MCO 674 will not limit the ability of the department to determine the extent of commercial recreational enterprise on these two tracts that is in the best public interest.

ALASKA STATUTE TITLES 27, 38 and 41.**

NOTE: New wording underlined, deleted wording [bracketed].

*Sec. 1. - AS 27.21.120 is amended to read:

Sec. 27.21.120 SMALL OPERATOR ASSISTANCE.

If the commissioner finds that the probable total annual production of all of the surface coal mining operations of an applicant, or if the applicant is a subsidiary of another corporation, of the applicant's parent corporation and its subsidiaries, will not exceed [100,000] 300,000 tons, the commissioner shall, at the written request of the applicant, engage at no cost to the applicant [A LABORATORY TO PREPARE A DETERMINATION OF PROBABLE HYDROLOGIC CONSEQUENCES OF THE APPLICANT'S PROPOSED OPERATION AND A STATEMENT OF TEST BORING OR CORE SAMPLINGS IF THESE ARE REQUIRED BY REGULATIONS ADOPTED UNDER AS 27.21.110.]for the following items:

(a). To the extent possible with available funds, a qualified laboratory to make the determination and statement referenced in (c) of this section for eligible operators who request assistance.

(b). The commissioner shall determine the data needed for each applicant or group of applicants. Data collected and the results provided to the department shall be sufficient to satisfy the requirements for:

(1) The determination of probable hydrologic consequences of the surface mining and reclamation operations in the proposed permit area and adjacent areas, including necessary engineering analyses and designs;

(2) The drilling and statement of the results of test borings or core samplings for the proposed permit area;

(3) The development of cross-section maps and plans if required;

(4) The collection of archaeological and historic information and related plans required by the State Historic Preservation Officer for Alaska;

(5) Required pre-blast surveys;

(6) Required collection of site-specific resources information, the production of protection and enhancement plans for fish and wildlife habitats and

for subsistence uses of the permit area and adjacent areas, and information and plans for any other environmental values; and

(c). Data collected and analyses may proceed concurrently with the development of mining and reclamation plans by the operator.

(d). Data collected under this program shall be made publicly available in accord with Section 27.21.100.

Justification: This is a housekeeping amendment to make the Alaska statute compatible with an federal amendment published in the May 31, 1994 Federal Register that expanded the former federal program as outlined in italic above. The corresponding State authorization for this part of the coal program is in Statute, therefore, the only way that the state can take advantage of the more liberal federal program is to revise the basic statute. Alaska Power and Telephone (the holder of a state coal lease at Jarvis Creek immediately south of Delta Jct.) has requested the state to provide financial assistance in their quest to develop that coal field for power production at Tok. Without this amendment, AP&T will be limited in its use of federal funds.

***Sec. 2. - AS 27.30.020 is amended to read:**

Sec. 27.30.020. PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING AND TAKING THE CREDIT.

To obtain the credit authorized by this chapter,

(1) a person shall submit a request for the credit as follows:

(A) the person may [SHALL] submit a request and a statement of expenditures

(i) whenever the amount of credit certified in the request totals at least \$250,000 and the period covered is at least one year; or

(ii) when the person is ready to take the entire balance of the credit, regardless of the total amount of the credit

[FOR THE PREVIOUS CALENDAR YEAR NOT LATER THAN 60 DAYS AFTER THE CLOSE OF THAT CALENDAR YEAR];

(B) the request must be on a form provided by the department and

(i) describe the work accomplished during each year of the period covered by the request [PREVIOUS YEAR], the number of employees, and the names and number of consultants; [AND]

(ii) provide a detailed list or ledger of expenditures of the accomplishments described in (I) of this subparagraph and a list of exploration activity data that [IN THE FUTURE] will be [MADE AVAILABLE] provided to the [COMMISSIONER UNDER (2)(A) OF THIS SECTION] department; and

(iii) provide a statement by a certified public accountant that those expenditures for a single mining operation of more than \$40,000 in any calendar year are supported by receipts and are for activities set out in AS 27.30.010(a);

(C) the person submitting the request is not required to transmit copies of receipts with the request, but the statement of expenditures is subject to audit in the discretion of the commissioner;

(D) if the commissioner determines to audit the statement of expenditures, the commissioner may require the person submitting the request to justify claims of expenditures with receipts and other reliable information;

(E) the commissioner shall respond to the request by [SEPTEMBER 30] within six months from the date of the request by certifying or not certifying the person's expenditures; if the commissioner

(1) does not certify all of the expenditures, the commissioner shall state the reasons for denial of certification of those expenditures which the commissioner has not certified and give the person making the request an opportunity to correct any problems or to provide additional information;

(ii) certifies expenditures, the commissioner shall specify the exploration activity data requirements [FOR THAT YEAR] that must be presented to the department at the time of the taking of the credit;

(F) if the commissioner neither certifies nor denies certification of expenditures [BY SEPTEMBER 30] within six months of submission of all documents required under this subsection or requested by the commissioner, the expenditures are certified as submitted;

(2) the person whose expenditures have been certified under (1) of this subsection may thereafter request the taking of the credit for the certified expenditures as follows:

*** Sec. 3. - AS 27.30 is amended by adding a new section to read;**

Sec. 27.30.025. PROCEDURE FOR REQUESTING CONDITIONAL CERTIFICATION.

(a) A person may submit a request for conditional certification for the credit when:

(1) the person has utilized or intends to utilize a novel approach technique;

(2) there exists a substantial question regarding the nature of the exploration data which will be delivered to the department; or

(3) the person contemplates assigning any right to a credit under AS 27.30.060 and there exists a substantial question regarding whether the expenditures will be certified;

(b) A person shall submit a request for conditional certification on a form provided by the department.

(c) The commissioner shall respond to the request within six months from the date of the request by issuing a letter stating that:

(1) under the specific facts and circumstances proposed by the person, the proposed expenditures and data appear eligible for a credit;

(2) there is not adequate information to determine whether the proposed expenditures and data appear to be eligible for a credit; or

(3) the expenditures and data as presented do not appear to be eligible for a credit.

Sec. 27.30.030. APPLICATION OF THE CREDIT.

(c) The person may not apply the credit under this section if the application [, WHEN ADDED TO THE CREDITS PREVIOUSLY APPLIED UNDER THIS SECTION,] would exceed the total amount of the credits approved under AS 27.30.020(2).

***Sec. 5. - AS 27.30 is amended by adding a new section to read:**

Sec. 27.30.095 FEES.

The commissioner may charge a fee for direct costs incurred by the department and the Department of Revenue for evaluating or auditing an application to certify the credit authorized under AS 27.30.010, including the cost of contractors selected by the commissioner to assist in the evaluation or audit. The fee may not exceed \$500 for each application covering one or more years if the amount claimed in the application is \$1,000,000 or less. The fee may not exceed \$1,000 for each application covering one or more years if the amount claimed is more than \$1,000,000.

***Sec. 6. - AS 27.30.099 is amended to read:**

Sec. 27.30.099 DEFINITIONS.

Justification for Changes to AS 27.30: Re-introduce the changes worked out with the Alaska Miners Association and legislative staff last session. The basic thrust was to reduce the paperwork required by the Department of Natural Resources and a mineral property holder by deleting the mandatory requirement for an annual filing and automatic approval by the

Commissioner if no action was taken and substitute a threshold for an application that: (1) will recover all eligible exploration costs associated with a mineral property that has all of its permits and is ready to start development; (2) or exceeds a certain level of eligible credits in one year, (3) or is dollar driven with a provision for review by the department when properties were changing hands and the amount of likely exploration incentive credit were a significant factor in the transfer of mineral rights. Application fees are included since the original legislation did not provide funding as noted in the fiscal note. The fees were developed in cooperation with the mining industry.

***Sec. 7. - AS 38.05.185(a) is amended to read:**

AS 38.05.185 (a) GENERAL MINING RIGHTS.

(a) The acquisition and continuance of rights in and to deposits on state land of minerals, which on January 3, 1959, were subject to location under the mining laws of the United States, shall be governed by AS 38.05.185 - 38.05.275. Nothing in AS 38.05.185 - 38.05.275 affects the law pertaining to the acquisition of rights to mineral deposits owned by any other person or government. The director, with the approval of the commissioner, shall determine that land from which mineral deposits may be mined only under lease, and, subject to the limitations of AS 38.05.300, that land that shall be closed to location under AS 38.05.185 - 38.05.275 [MINING]. State land may not be closed to [MINING OR MINERAL] location under AS 38.05.185 - 38.05.275 except as provided in AS 38.05.300 and unless the commissioner makes a finding that mining would be incompatible with significant surface uses on the state land. State land may not be restricted to mining under lease unless the commissioner determines that potential use conflicts on the state land require that mining be allowed only under written leases issued under AS 38.05.205 or the commissioner has determined that the land was mineral in character at the time of state selection. The determinations required under this subsection shall be made in compliance with land classification orders and land use plans developed under AS 38.05.300.

Justification: (technical amendment for housekeeping purposes). Re-introduce.

***Sec. 8. - AS 38.05.190 (a) is amended to read:**

AS 38.05.190 (a) QUALIFICATIONS.

(a) The right to acquire exploration and mining rights under AS 38.05.185 - 38.05.275 may be acquired or held only by

- (1) citizens of the United States at least 18 years of age;
- (2) legal guardians or trustees of citizens of the United States under 18 years of

age on behalf of the citizens;

(3) persons at least 18 years of age who have declared their intention to become citizens of the United States;

(4) [ALIENS AT LEAST 18 YEARS OF AGE IF THE LAWS OF THEIR COUNTRY GRANT LIKE PRIVILEGES TO CITIZENS OF THE UNITED STATES;

(5)] corporations organized under the laws of the United States or of any state or territory of the United States and qualified to do business in this state [, EXCEPT THAT IF MORE THAN 50 PERCENT OF THE STOCK OF A CORPORATION IS OWNED OR CONTROLLED BY ALIENS WHO ARE NOT QUALIFIED, THE CORPORATION IS NOT QUALIFIED TO ACQUIRE OR HOLD THE RIGHTS];

Justification: (technical amendment for housekeeping purposes). Re-introduce.

***Sec. 9. AS 38.05.207 is repealed.**

AS 38.05.207 PRODUCTION LICENSE. Repeal

Justification: This law has not been enforced by the department for years. Compliance by the mining industry is also very low. The only purpose the law serves is for adjudication of conflicts between locators. Rather than get a production license, most locators who are concerned about a conflict apply for a upland mining lease under 38.05.205. The production license requirement is also duplicative of the mining license issued under 43.65.010.

***Sec. 10. - AS 38.05.211(d) is repealed and reenacted to read:**

AS 38.05.211 ANNUAL RENTAL.

(d) The rental amount established under this section shall be revised by the commissioner as provided in this section based on changes in the Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers, Anchorage Metropolitan Area (Semi-Annual Average) compiled by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States Department of Labor, as revised, rebased or replaced by that bureau. The reference base index is the index for January - June, 1989, as revised or rebased by that bureau. The rental amount shall be revised by the commissioner if the change between the index for the first six months of the current year and the most recent index used to revise the rental, or the reference base index if the rental amount has never been revised, equals or exceeds \$5. The rental amount shall be increased or decreased, as appropriate, by an amount equal to the

change in the index described in this subsection rounded to the nearest whole \$5 unit. The commissioner shall calculate the change in the index annually and, if the rental amount must be revised, shall adopt a regulation establishing the revised rental amount. A revised rental amount applies to a rental payment if the regulation establishing the revised rental amount took effect at least 90 days before the date the rental payment is due.

Justification: (technical amendment for housekeeping purposes). Re-introduce.

***Sec. 11. - AS 38.05.245 is amended to delete subsection (b) which reads as follows:**

AS 38.05.245 PROSPECTING SITES.

[(b) A PROSPECTING SITE LOCATION MAY NOT INCLUDE WITHIN ITS EXTERIOR BOUNDARIES, NOR SHALL ITS BOUNDARIES BE COINCIDENT WITH MORE THAN ONE BOUNDARY OF ANY MINING CLAIM, MINING LEASEHOLD LOCATION OR LAND UNDER A MINING LEASE, UNLESS THE LOCATOR OF THE PROSPECTING SITE IS ALSO THE OWNER, OPTIONEE OR LESSEE OF SAID MINING PROPERTY. IF SUCH MINING PROPERTY OR AREA IS SO INCLUDED OR BOUNDED, THE PROSPECTING SITE IS VOID.]

Justification: AS 38.05.195 does not prohibit the overlapping of mining claims under different ownership. Since prospecting sites grant a temporary prospecting right and preference right, the law should not prevent a overlapping claim which has a discovery and more title tenure. Furthermore, the division does not adjudicate these overlapping conflicts.

***Sec. 12. - AS 38.05.255 is amended to read:**

Sec. 38.05.255. SURFACE USE OF LAND OR WATER.

(a) Surface uses of land or water included within mining properties by owners of those properties shall be limited to those necessary for the prospecting for, extraction of, or basic processing of mineral deposits and shall be subject to reasonable concurrent uses. Leases [PERMITS] for millsites and tailings disposal may be issued [GRANTED] by the director. The leases [PERMITS] shall be conditioned upon payment of a reasonable annual rent [CHARGE] for the lease [USE] and restriction to [CONTINUANCE OF] the limited use. Timber from land open to mining without lease, except timberland, may be used by a mining claimant or prospecting site locator for the mining or development of the location or adjacent claims under common ownership. On other land, timber may be acquired as provided in this chapter. Use of water shall be made in accordance with AS 46.15.

***Sec. 13. - AS 38.05.255 is amended by adding a new subsection (b) to read:**

(b) A lease issued under this section is exempt from the provisions of AS 38.05.070 - 38.05.105. The commissioner, by regulation, shall establish appropriate leasing procedures and annual rent amounts for leases under this section.

Justification: (technical amendment for housekeeping purposes). Re-introduce.

***Sec. 15. - AS 38.05.275 is amended to add a new subsection (d) to read as follows:**

AS 38.05.275 RECOGNITION OF LOCATIONS.

(d) If a mineral location is made in a disputed navigable waterway such as a river bottom where there is likely to be litigation between the state and federal government over ownership, the mineral location shall be treated as located on "state selected land", and will not become a mining claim until such time as the dispute is resolved or court decision rendered granting the state title to the river bed area.

Justification: Will treat mining claims located in certain disputed navigable waters where there was there is likely to be litigation between the state and federal government over ownership and the claim holder will not be able to mine as a direct result of this dispute. The proposed solution is treat these disputed state mining claims in the same manner as claims located on land selected by the state. (The mining claim is valid only at such time as the state gets TA from BLM, or in this case, there are sufficient factual data about the physical characteristics of the water body in question or litigation has been resolved.) Recent history suggests that where factual data is insufficient that a period of 5 to 10 years of data collection may be required; litigation can often take 5 to 10 years. Under existing law and regulation, the claim holder must pay annual rental and do annual labor (or pay \$100 per claim) just to maintain a future right that is subject to the whims of the federal courts at an uncertain future date.

HB 46 is housekeeping in nature. Amendments to the bill in Committee deleted the requirement to develop new regulations. The change in the requirements for adjusting annual rental for state-owned mineral property is better in that adjustments are to the nearest whole \$5. Change in the cost of administration or to mineral property holders are speculative since there will be bookkeeping and billing savings. For example if this had been the tenth year under the existing law, the rental for a 40 acre mineral property would be \$25.59 if claim is less than 5 years old, \$51.19 if between 5 and 10 years old, and \$127.96 if more than 10 years old. Under the amended version these would be \$25, \$50, and \$130 respectively. The booking/billing savings are considered to be a wash for the purposes of estimating administrative costs and revenue to the state treasury.

Amendment to the exploration incentive credit program will require authority to receive an estimated \$7,500 in application fees annually. During the initial year of the program, administrative costs for processing 33 applications were \$20K from other funds since the exploration incentive credit program was unfunded. This expenditure was necessary since the legislation provided for automatic approval of more than \$13,300K in these applications if the commissioner took no action.

The existing statutory deadline for requesting certification of exploration credits during calendar year 1996 was March 3, 1997. The revisions do not require the development of regulations. It does require future submissions to be on a form developed by the department. The existing form has been in use for two years and was developed by the department, in close cooperation with the Department of Revenue and the mining industry. This existing form may require some minor revisions, but no substantive work is expected. The estimated annual work is projected to total about 2 work months as a result of 5 applications under \$1,000, and 5 over that amount: hence, the request to receive the \$7.5K to cover direct administrative costs. The \$7.5K will provide the capability to contract a substantial part of the review of the new applications that will already have a CPA statement for any year where the credit exceeds \$40K for a single mineral property.

There are no known costs to the department from designation of the two tracts at Petersville as Recreational Mining Areas. An existing Mineral Closing Order (674) requires that detailed consideration be given to the best way to manage the two tracts in the public interest. Once the plan is completed, there may be additional costs required to manage the two areas.
