Definition of Terms

Mental Health

- *Positive mental functioning* resulting in:
 - > productive activities,
 - > positive relationships and
 - > ability to adapt/cope with adversity.

Mental Health Problem

- *Situational or developmental condition* which causes:
 - > short-term distress and
 - > impaired functioning.

Mental Illness

- Health condition including *alterations in thinking, mood or behavior* which leads to:
 - > more severe, longer-term distress and
 - > impaired functioning.

Mental/Emotional Conditions Impact Everyone



- Everyone falls somewhere in the continuum--often different places on the continuum at different times in life.
- Different points on the continuum call for different interventions.
- Conditions become more disabling the further up the continuum.
- Cost of services increases with increased need.
