WORK EXPERIENCE:

After completing his bachelor of science degree in 1970, Jim Strandberg worked for 6 years with R&M Consultants, Inc., one of the prime Alaskan geo-technical/civil consultants on the Trans-Alaska Pipeline. He developed pipeline construction workpad design criteria and wrote criteria documents that were the basis for pipeline design. He worked on the design and assisted in the operation of large scale field tests that validated the design criteria.

He collected applied research data for prototypes of the heat pipes now employed on the Trans-Alaska Pipeline. These studies included the measurement of extremely low air velocities at very cold temperatures, recording of ground temperatures, the recording of interior pile wall temperatures, all for air convection

cooled support piles. At a staff level, he pursued field data collection programs for ground temperatures, and collected and validated data for use by Esso Production Laboratories, developer of the passively refrigerated support pile designs. A number of the field tests were at remote locations along the alignment, with difficult access and very difficult operating conditions.

He participated the design of and field operations of thermal conductivity test probes to compare between field laboratory measurements, and those predicted by Miles Kersten. He also was involved in large scale uni-axial thaw settlement tests on samples from the Copper River Basin and high ice content samples from the North Slope.

During the design phase of the Pipeline project, Strandberg was stationed in Fairbanks and Anchorage, Alaska and in Houston, Texas as a consultant's representative, working on Alyeska Pipeline Service Company's design team.

In 1976, Strandberg joined an Anchorage based design consulting firm, Mark Fryer & Associates. For a period of 4 years, as an Engineering Associate, he designed roadways, site grading and utilities. He also designed central energy systems upgrades, and developed a specialty in the design of buried and above grade energy utilities [steam and hot water]. This involved extensive travel throughout Alaska to rural communities.

In 1980, Strandberg returned to Fairbanks, Alaska with his family and entered into a Masters of Science degree program in Arctic Engineering at the University of Alaska. This program had a tailored curriculum of Engineering Economy and Heat Transfer in northern regions. Strandberg completed a thesis on life cycle cost analysis for northern region institutional buildings. This document was also produced as a research report through the State of Alaska DOT-PF Research Section, and included a thermal standard for Alaskan rural schools. He completed his masters degree in 1983.

Beginning in 1980, Strandberg operated the consulting firm of JS Strandberg Consulting Engineers, Inc., accomplishing mechanical and civil design. The firm designed mechanical systems for major buildings that were constructed in Fairbanks and Alaska-wide from 1980 through 1988.

Strandberg Engineers also accomplished specialized research activities with the State of Alaska DOT-PF research section in building science, and accomplished numerous feasibility studies of large scale engineering projects, achieving a maximum staff of 11 personnel, and maintaining practice in Mechanical and Civil Engineering.

In 1988, Strandberg merged the firm with CMH Consultants of Anchorage, a respected long lived Alaskan Consulting Firm. Strandberg continued with the firm for a 2 year period, serving as Fairbanks Office Manager and stockholder. His work centered around large scale mechanical design projects, and continuing buildings research in the optimization of mechanical systems, again through the University of Alaska Institute of Northern Engineering.

Strandberg joined the University of Alaska, Facilities Planning and Construction, Northern Region as a project manager in 1990, assigned to begin the Poker Flat Research Range Upgrade.

He joined the Geophysical Institute, University of Alaska Fairbanks as the Director of the Poker Flat Research Range (PFRR) on July 1st, 1991, and served in that position until the fall of 1994. As range director, he was responsible for the \$20 Million functional and scientific upgrade of the Research Range, working under the supervision of Institute Director Dr. Syun-Ichi Akasofu.

Strandberg was responsible during this time, for a master plan for facilities and utilities development, and a scientific implementation plan was developed for PFRR by the research range staff and Geophysical Institute Scientific staff. A total of 20,000 GSF of research facilities, and range communications were designed and have been constructed.

In the fall of 1994, he became the External Projects Coordinator for the Geophysical Institute and developed a research business base for the PFRR and for other arms of the Geophysical Institute, until summer of 1995. Also during 1995, Strandberg for a 6 month period assisted the University of Alaska Small Business Development Center to evolve and energize the Alaska Technology Transfer Assistance Center (ATTAC). During this time, ATTAC was instrumental in helping state-wide clientele of small businesses to access and commercialize technologies both in the University of Alaska research sector and in the massive federal laboratory resource. Strandberg worked in close coordination with the State of Alaska Division of Energy and Alaska Science and Technology Foundation and the University of Alaska Fairbanks to foster applied research projects in alternate fuels. Strandberg served as a liason between the University of Alaska School of Engineering and other state entities in alternate fuels research projects.

Strandberg left the University of Alaska in early 1996, and he presently practices in Alaska as J.S. Strandberg Consulting Engineers, Inc. with focus on power plant energy systems analysis and design, project development analysis, and heating, ventilating and air conditioning (HVAC) design and in design of buried heating utilities and related Civil Engineering design. Strandberg is a specialist in the design and operation of cogeneration systems, building mechanical systems, and in building energy conservation. J.S. Strandberg Consulting Engineers, Inc. is computer based and is fully equipped for computer based design, employing AutoDesk ACAD release 14. Strandberg employs an in-house cogeneration performance simulation software, that is based on Visual Basic, to evaluation cogeneration economics.
