



RE: Executive Order No. 103

The President has referred Executive Order No. 103 (transferring the long-term maintenance of certified copies of regulations and orders of repeal from the office of the lieutenant governor to the state archivist) to your committee.

Section 23, Article III of the Constitution states:

The governor may make changes in the organization of the executive branch or in the assignment of functions among its units which he considers necessary for efficient administration. Where those changes require the force of law, they shall be set forth in executive orders. The legislature shall have sixty days of a regular session, or a full session if of shorter duration, to disapprove these executive orders. Unless disapproved by resolution concurred in by a majority of the members in joint session, these orders become effective at a date thereafter to be designated by the governor.

Executive Orders are treated differently than bills. If you wish to report any recommendations to the body, please do so with a memo or in accordance with Section 23, Article III of the Constitution within the sixty day limit.






Honorable Senators and Representative:

This evidence was submitted to the Attorney General's Office by one of Koniag's directors previously and after review the Office of Special Prosecutions declined prosecution. I strongly feel that the decision was political as several private attorneys have reviewed the evidence and have found it conclusive. I have re-submitted the evidence attached to Attorney General Bruce Botelho in hopes that he will review it personally and act in the interest of justice.

It is my understanding that Mr. Godfrey, having been appointed as the Commissioner of Public Safety by Governor Knowles, will be subject to confirmation hearings in the Legislature. I respectfully request that Mr. Godfrey be placed under oath and be required to explain why what is so carefully documented here is, in fact, not perjury. The position to which Mr. Godfrey has been appointed is an office of the highest integrity and honor. I believe that neither you, the honorable Senators and Representatives of this State or the citizens of this State want a person occupying that office who has made repeated false and contradictory false statements under oath. That surely would be a disgrace.

Dear Senator Halford:

Congratulations on your re-election to the Alaska Senate and to the office of Senate President. I feel confident that the Alaska Senate and the Legislature, for that matter, is in good hands.

To give you information as to my background, I convey the following information: I am an Alaska Native of Koniag-Sugpiaq descent and am a shareholder and Director with Koniag, Inc. I have served as the *Past President* of the Kodiak Area Native Association; am the *founder* of the Kodiak Area Community Development Corporation; *Co-Founder* of the Kodiak Island Housing Authority; served as *Assistant Director* of the Rural Alaska Community Action Program, Inc.; *Assistant Director* of the Alaska Federation of Natives, Inc. Health Affairs Division; served as *President* of the Native Village of Larsen Bay, *Manager* of the Native Village of Old Harbor; served as *Assemblyman* on the Kodiak Island Borough; served as *Councilman* with the City of Larsen Bay and was a recipient of a *fellowship award* with the National Urban Fellows program, which took me to Yale University and Congressman Nicholas J. Begich's office in Washington, D. C., as Special Assistant. I have also previously served as a Director with Koniag, Inc. in the early 1980's.

I am writing you about the documented perjurus acts committed by three Koniag, Inc. directors and one officer, including Koniag Board Chairman and Alaska Public Safety Commissioner-Designate Glenn Godfrey. I uncovered these crimes in my review of the litigation files in the courts and in four of ten (10) boxes of litigation files in the Koniag's Counsel's office, including video-taped depositions, which I brought to the attention of the State Attorney General and your office over a year ago. I am in receipt of the recent correspondence sent to you and other legislators concerning the same perjurious matters from former Koniag President *Frank Pagano*, who has resubmitted the information for reconsideration to the Alaska Attorney General.

I am aware of the seriousness of perjury as a felony crime under Alaska Statutes. I am concerned that such acts committed by Mr. Godfrey who was not only Koniag's Board Chairman, but was also the Director of the Alaska State Troopers and that these criminal acts are and have been sanctioned by both Koniag, Inc. and the State of Alaska. Whether or not Mr. Godfrey is confirmed as Commissioner of Public Safety, I request that this information be reviewed, considered and entered into the record in the confirmation process for the public's interest and safety!

As you may know, Frank Pagano and five other Native shareholders were sued first with the Alaska Securities Division. And, before the securities complaint could be adjudicated, these same shareholders were sued in the Alaska Superior Court for alleged false and misleading statements made to shareholders. I believe that the primary reason for Koniag suing these shareholders was because in their bid for election to the Koniag Board of Directors in 1997, these defendants proposed having an investigative audit performed on Koniag's financial books and records. The details of these vicious lawsuits against Native shareholders are the best-kept secrets in Alaska, not only to the public, but also with our Native shareholders.

In the lawsuit against Pagano and Meidinger, et al, Koniag, Inc., under the leadership of board members Chairman Glenn Godfrey, President Dennis Metrokin and former Acting President Charles Pemberton, alleged one-hundred and four (104) allegations of false and misleading statements by the defendants, of which only four of the charges were litigated and adverse summary judgments issued against Pagano, et al, by Superior Court Judge Brian Shortell. Former Vice President, Finance, Kurt Martens supported the perjurus acts by the three directors by himself signing an affidavit regarding a meeting in which Koniag purportedly authorized the purchase of a real estate interest, which Board Meeting never took place. This litigation is on appeal with the Alaska Supreme Court by defendant shareholder Judy Meidinger.

The Supreme Court Justices held their first oral argument hearing on January 8, 2001, which I attended and found very interesting. I have gained a sense of optimism and encouragement in my observations of the oral arguments, that justice may be served when the Supreme Court rules on the Meidinger Appeal.

Additionally, you should know that since having brought up the issue of perjury and other questions of possible wrong-doings to the Koniag Board and management, they have retaliated against me. Although I am a Director, I have been chastised, threatened with lawsuits, censured twice and denied access to corporate records, denied certain Directors Fee compensation, the denial of which I strongly believe is in violation of Alaska Statutes pertaining to ANCSA Corporation Board Member duties and responsibilities. In these instances it is most difficult if not virtually impossible for any Native shareholder to have fair hearings unless they litigate their complaints in a court of law. It is widely known that most Alaska Native shareholders do not have the adequate knowledge of the corporate process, applicable state and federal statutes, nor the personal financial resources with which to seek justice and answers to their questions or complaints from their own organizations and leaders who abuse their authority.

The Alaska Native shareholders are at a distinct disadvantage because of these circumstances and become subject to unrighteous dominion by our so-called Native leaders who hire and use the educated non-Native attorneys, accountants and consultants, with corporate financial resources in which Native shareholders do not have access to nor cannot use in their own defense. Many Native shareholders are intimidated to the point of non-participation in the organizations, for fear of being sued by their own leaders! These situations have exacerbated the relationships of our Native shareholders and their Regional organizations to the point in which I believe that many shareholders, if asked, would rather see these corporate monsters dissolved, than allow the abuses to continue.

Finally, I was apprised of Mr. Godfrey's record while serving as First Sargent and Lieutenant with the Alaska State Troopers in the Bethel area, where, I told that during his tenure there, many Alaska Native people, by policy, were needlessly incarcerated for reasons related to alcoholism, which is an illness and has been classified as a disease over some 25 years ago. While I am not familiar with the facts of his alleged abuse of authority while in the Bethel area, I believe that it would be in the best interests of the public for you to investigate the abuse of authority and the veracity of his character, further, with his peers who were there as well as with those directly affected by imprisonment, before confirming Mr. Godfrey as Commissioner of Public Safety.

Thank you for this opportunity to submit this testimony for the record during the confirmation hearing process on the Governor's appointee's. If there are any questions or needed clarification, I'll be glad to respond.

Commissioner Glenn G. Godfrey

Governor Tony Knowles appointed Glenn G. Godfrey to the position of Commissioner of Public Safety on August 23, 2000. Godfrey, who had served as Director of the Division of Alaska State Troopers since January 1995, is the first Alaska Native to hold this position.

Godfrey was born and raised in Kodiak. He began his law enforcement career by attending the Public Safety Training Academy in Sitka. After completing the Academy in 1970, he served in posts in Anchorage from 1970-1972, followed by four years in Juneau and Northway. While assigned to the post in Northway, Godfrey was responsible for drug enforcement along the Canadian border and for patrols in neighboring villages.

In 1978, while he was assigned to Bethel post, he was promoted to First Sergeant, Lieutenant, and then Detachment Commander in 1981. In Bethel, his "beat" was all of western Alaska. It was during his time Bethel that he was instrumental in the development of the Village Public Safety Officer program, which often provides the first law enforcement response in rural Alaskan villages.

In 1983, Godfrey returned to Anchorage Headquarters, and while in Headquarters, he was put in charge of the VPSO program, search and rescue, and the Special Emergency Reaction Team. He served as chief of Rural Enforcement, Deputy Director, and finally Director of the Alaska State Troopers.

Commissioner Godfrey is a graduate of the Southern Police Institute in Louisville, Kentucky. He is a member of the Alaska Police Officers Association, the Alaska Association of Chiefs of Police, the Fraternal Order of Alaska State Troopers, the International Association of Chiefs of Police, Commonwealth North, and serves as chairman of the Koniag Corporation, the ANCSA Corporation of Kodiak. Last fall, the Alaska Federation of Natives named Godfrey as its "Citizen of the Year."

Jim Duncan was appointed Commissioner of the Department of Administration by Governor Tony Knowles in August of 2000. He served as Deputy Commissioner of Administration from June 2000 until his appointment as Commissioner. From February of 1999 until his appointment as deputy commissioner he served as a special assistant to the Commissioner of Administration in charge of overseeing contract negotiations with public employee unions.

Jim Duncan represented the communities of Juneau and Douglas for 24 years in the Alaska State Legislature. He was first elected to the Alaska House of Representatives in 1974 and served for 12 years. Then elected to the Alaska State Senate in 1986 he served for 12 years until he left office in January of 1999. From 1972 to 1974, he was a member of the City and Borough of Juneau Assembly.

He was the senior member of the Alaska State Legislature from 1995 through 1999. He served as Senate minority leader from 1993-1999 and Speaker of the Alaska House in 1981. During his tenure with the Legislature he served for sixteen years on the House and Senate Finance Committees, on the operating budget conference committee for ten years, Chairman of the Legislative Budget and Audit Committee, and numerous other legislative committees including the Select Committee on Legislative Ethics.

Jim Duncan has been an advocate for comprehensive health care reform. He chaired a legislative task force on health care reform from 1989-1992, and commissioned reports in 1994 and 1995 on the benefits of a single-payer health care system in Alaska. During his time in the State Legislature he was recognized as a leading advocate for education and the establishment of a constitutionally created education endowment. Recognized as a strong supporter of the working men and women of the state he sponsored many pieces of legislation protecting and strengthening the rights of unions.

He taught Masters level courses in health care reform, public finance and budgeting, and the legislative process at the University of Alaska Southeast in Juneau. His professional career includes teaching at Sheldon Jackson College in Sitka, Juneau-Douglas Community College, Supervisor of Office Operations for the Alaska Department of Revenue's Income Tax Audit Division, and as an accountant for Tlingit-Haida Regional Housing Authority.

Jim Duncan has a Masters of Business Administration Degree from Oregon State University, a Bachelor of Science Degree from Illinois State University, and an Associate of Arts Degree from Sheldon Jackson College in Sitka.

Born in Muscatine, Iowa he has been an Alaska resident since 1961. His wife, Charlotte Marvin Duncan, was born and raised in Southeast Alaska. Jim and Charlotte enjoy eight children and eleven grandchildren.



Dear Senator Therriault:

As you and the rest of the Legislature prepare to consider confirmation of Mr. Jim Duncan as Commissioner of the Department of Administration (DOA), I have been asked to provide our experience with Mr. Duncan in that role.

In July 2000, our non profit organization Make It Alaskan, Inc. filed a protest/appeal regarding a RFP issued by the Department of Community and Economic Development. By August the case was before DOA for determination.

Mr. Duncan first denied our protest/appeal without hearing testimony or accepting formal evidentiary briefs. In that denial, among other things, he dismissed our documented evidence (including a written admission) that DCED had failed to follow the law by exceeding certain statutory notification timetables. He confirmed the lack of importance he placed on this issue by exceeding the 15 day statutory requirement to provide a determination himself. His denial was dated September 25, 2000.

Of greater concern to our organization was the argument put forth by Mr. Duncan for the basis of his denial. It was factually incorrect in several places. We are not referring to topics in dispute or subject to interpretation. No, we mean documented irrefutable evidence that he suggested did not exist or chose to ignore. He went so far as to cite his observations that were totally opposite of the facts and contrary to documentation he was supposed to review.

Once we advised Mr. Duncan of his obvious mistakes he reversed his denial and ordered an evidentiary hearing; which he later attempted to reverse again but was unsuccessful. Pre-hearing legal briefs were submitted (you have a copy on file in your office) and the evidentiary hearing was finally held on February 7, 2001. At the conclusion of that proceeding we were assured by Andrew Hemmenway, who Mr. Duncan assigned to hear the case, that a decision from Mr. Duncan would be issued within a week to 10 days "so both parties could respond as needed". As of today, April 25, 2001 we have yet to hear a word from Mr. Duncan's office. 11 weeks- almost three months- have passed since the hearing and this case is still unresolved. We are fully prepared to continue proceedings in District Court should it be necessary. In fact, it was the Court system that had to order Mr. Duncan to hold the hearing after he tried to reverse his reversal! The evidence that supports our case is very strong. We cannot proceed until Mr. Duncan provides a ruling. Furthermore, should Mr. Duncan grant our protest/appeal (as we obviously feel he should) and direct DCED to re-issue the RFP (which is the primary relief we seek), his lengthy delay will have placed an unnecessary burden on DCED to fast track that process. A burden that DCED staff warned of during their hearing testimony. Our experience suggests that neither the state nor Make It Alaskan, Inc, are getting responsible administration in this issue.

We feel that we have been denied due process by the errors of Mr. Duncan and delays by DOA. Our organization has suffered considerable financial harm from these errors and delays. As we have written previously, we are concerned not only for the fair treatment of our non profit corporation but also for others that may have issues pending before Mr. Duncan. If he can so easily overlook basic facts that totally discredit the argument and basis for a decision he puts forth, it would be legitimate to wonder what kind of look and consideration will he give to more complex and fiscally sensitive cases.

Jim Duncan

We offer no opinion as to the qualifications Mr. Duncan might possess that may be a help or hindrance in the Commissioner's job. We simply provide our case history to assist in your confirmation deliberations.
