On March 11-12th, your committee held hearings regarding EO 107. The testimony was overwhelmingly in favor of disapproving the EO. On that same day HSCR 1 was introduced to disapprove EO 107. Since that time, no action has occurred to move the bill through. As chairman of House State Affairs Committee, it is within your power to waive the bill through, move it on the next committee, or recommend it to be heard by a joint session. I am requesting that you take one of these actions very soon.

The legislature has only until April 14<sup>th</sup> to act to disapprove this EO. I feel it is imperative to have a joint session to vote on accepting HSCR 1. Such a significant change in state government must be considered by the full legislature.

Stalling the bill in committee is unacceptable to me. Along with the majority of testifiers in your committee, I feel that transferring habitat protection authority to ADNR is a mistake.

We must maintain the existing executive branch checks and balances. Under ADNR, habitat protection would become subordinate to natural resource development interests. This will result in the degrading of Alaska's fish habitat and will take its toll on our fisheries.

Only a few weeks are remaining in which the legislature must act. Please fulfil your legislative responsibility to move this bill out of committee and help to get it on the floor of the entire legislature.

Hello. My name is Ruth Bauman. I have lived in Alaska practically all my life. My husband and I own a home here in Anchorage, and a remote parcel of land in the Interior. We enjoy Alaska's pristine outdoors and would like to see the state remain this way now and for future generations.

I am not speaking for any former or present employer. I am speaking on my own behalf.

I would like to share with you some of my direct experience on the issue of Executive Order 107.

I was staff to the Alaska Board of Forestry for 6 years during the 1990's. The Board includes representatives from *all* of the interest groups (commercial fisheries, and organizations in the environmental, mining, and recreational, and the forest industry, natives, a fish or wildlife biologist, and a professional forester). These professionals took unpaid time off from their regular jobs to travel to meetings to address the issues covered under the Forest Resources and Practices Act. Naturally, agency employees were paid and their travel costs were covered by the state. The primary agenda items included discussions of issues concerning sound forest management and established land use planning procedures.

During that period of time, the Habitat & Restoration Division, among others, presented their perspectives on proposed timber harvests on private, federal and state land. Habitat issued a report that caused an uproar in the media because they claimed FRPA wasn't working. Consequently, the board was required to hold public forums much more often than usually considered under FRPA. It added more to the process of planned timber sales. (I have a sense of déjà vu here in this meeting. It seems these discussions have not gone anywhere productive.) By the time timber sales were finally through that process, it often resulted in the state offering smaller timber sales; and, many of the salvage sale trees were beyond economic value because of the ravages of the spruce bark beetle epidemic. After two years of consultants and incessant meetings around the state examining so many claims and counter-claims, a working group of state employees and paid consultants decided that the Act had not allowed any significant harm. But when it was all said and done, there *were* no recommendations to substantively change FRPA, even from Fish & Game. In the meantime, the Division of Forestry's productivity dropped, the Forest Practices Act got a black eye because their initial claims made the front page, but the ultimate findings did not. Lots of state employees received plenty of airline miles and lots of consultants got paid. So process replaced productivity and the Habitat director went on to become even more famous at the Division of Elections. State timber sales went from around 45 million board feet each year up to 1997, down to only 9 million in 2000 and 2001. That's an 80% drop at the same level of state spending. An 80% drop in production at a private sector organization is devastating. I would add that this kind of public display certainly does not reflect very well onto the rest of the hard working state employees who are working behind the scenes to produce positive results.

In working on a lawsuit against the state over DNR's spruce bark beetle salvage timber sales on the Kenai Peninsula, I personally collected, catalogued and Bate-stamped 12 Banker's Boxes full of material. Eventually the state won that lawsuit on all counts but – again - the delays caused some of those sales to become uneconomic.

If you visit any of the now completed state salvage sales that were the issue in that lawsuit you will see that DNR planted, or had the loggers plant, seedlings in all those sales as good forest stewards. Except for a refusal to let DNR yard the dead timber and brush out of the stream buffers under a variation request under AS 41.17.087, the harvested areas have healthy reforestation. I trust that the current DNR employees working alongside Habitat as proposed in EO 107 will work well to keep Alaska's environment well maintained.

So, from what I have seen and experienced, moving the Habitat permitting process under DNR's Commission rather than incessant - and costly - public meetings and litigation between agencies, would be more productive, more streamlined, more efficient and it would save the state money. For these reasons, I support the intent contained in Executive Order 107. I recognize the order is not altogether popular but I appreciate the strong, hard look that EO107 has forced Alaskans to find better ways of doing business.

Thank you for holding this hearing, Mr. Chairman.


Dear Representative Fate,
