



President & Chief Executive Officer

Carl H. Marrs is President and CEO of CIRI, one of 13 regional corporations established under the terms of the Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act of 1971, which settled the aboriginal land claims of Alaska Natives. A respected business leader in the Alaskan community, Marrs has repeatedly been named as one of the Top 25 Most Powerful Alaskans by the *Alaska Journal of Commerce*.

With 7,100 shareholders, CIRI is one of the most financially successful of the regional corporations. Its principal lines of business include real estate; construction and oilfield services; telecommunications; tourism; and natural resources. The corporation also supports a number of nonprofit organizations designed to promote the social and cultural well being of CIRI shareholders and other Alaska Natives.

Marrs began his career with CIRI in 1973. Since then, he has held a variety of senior-level positions, including president & chief operating officer; vice president of business operations and development; manager of joint venture operations; and land manager. His responsibilities have included identifying, evaluating, and participating in the structuring of ventures and partnerships; developing and implementing business strategies; and coordinating the selection, development, and management of corporate lands. Since assuming the position of president and CEO in 1995, Marrs has been responsible for the general management and overall policy of the corporation. Under his leadership CIRI has experienced significant growth in both new and existing lines of business.

Marrs is extraordinarily committed to the Alaska community. He is the recipient of the Alaska State Chamber of Commerce 2001 William A. Egan Outstanding Alaskan Award, as well as the 2001 Alaska Federation of Natives Citizen of the Year Award. He served as co-chair of the United Way of Anchorage 1999 campaign committee, and currently sits on boards of the Fiscal Policy Council of Alaska, Alaska Railroad Corp., and Alaska Communications Systems Group, Inc. Marrs is the president of the Assoc. of ANCSA Regional Corps. Presidents/CEOs, Inc., a member of the Alaska SeaLife Center board of governors, a trustee of Alaska Pacific University, and a national trustee of Boys & Girls Clubs of America. He is also a member of the Alaska Oil & Gas Association, Alaska Pacific University-Campaign for Quality, Western Alaska Council Boy Scouts of America, and the Alaska Highway Natural Gas Policy Council.

Marrs' past positions include serving as director and executive committee member of the Alaska State Chamber of Commerce; Key Bank of Alaska; Resource Development Council; Prince William Sound Regional Citizens' Advisory Council; Alaska Public Radio Network. He has served on the boards of Alaska Breast Cancer Focus; Governor's Welfare-to-Work WorkStar Steering Committee; Commonwealth North, Enstar Natural Gas Co. advisory board, and the 2001 Special Olympics World Winter Games board.

A CIRI shareholder of Aleut descent, Marrs was born and raised in Seldovia, Alaska. He attended Stanford University's Graduate School of Business for Executives in 1983 and the Amos Tuck School of Business for Executives at Dartmouth College in 1986. In May 2002, he received a Doctor of Public Service, honoris causa, degree from Alaska Pacific University.

Mr. Staser, a fourth generation Alaskan, has served as the Federal Co-Chairman of the Denali Commission since its inception in 1999. A 1972 graduate of West Point, he earned three Masters Degrees: an MBA from San Francisco State University, an MS in Construction Management from Stanford University, and an MA from Webster University. He and his wife, Karen, have also been small business owners in Alaska.

The three-term President of the Alaska Federal Executives' Association, he currently serves as Vice President of Commonwealth North, Secretary of the Anchorage Symphony, and Board Member of the National Science Foundation (NSF) Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research (EPSCoR) in Alaska, the Foraker Group, the UA Advisory Boards for the Schools of Engineering, and Business and Public Policy, and other groups locally and nationally.

Last year, the State Legislature appointed Jeff to help develop a statewide R&D Plan and this year he was appointed to help develop an Information Technology Infrastructure Plan for Alaska.

Jeff culminated his military career as Assistant Director of Civil Works for the Corps of Engineers in Washington D.C. and started with Senator Ted Stevens in 1994 as Legislative Aide for Science & Technology, Small Business, Natural Resources, Rural Utilities, and Economic Development. He also acted as Associate Staff member to the Senate Commerce Committee and Public Works Committee, as well as four committees on appropriations. He has served on the Presidential Commission on Western Water Policy, a Center for Strategic Studies report to Congress on National R&D Priorities and won the national Nick Hoge Award for an essay entitled "From Bureaucracy to Ad-hocracy". He is nationally recognized for his expertise in challenging engineering environments.




