Greetings:

My name is Dan Squires and I have been a resident of Alaska for 13 years. I may have met some of you several years back when I was lobbying the Amateur Radio Antenna bill Sponsored by Senator Taylor and Representative Kerttula which passed both houses unanimously.

I am writing today because I have had an ongoing battle with Occupational Licensing and the Board of Registration for Architects, Engineers and Surveyors. The sole charge of the enabling law for this board is the protection of the general welfare and safety of the public. I passed the Professional Engineering Examination nearly three years ago and I have over 40 years of experience in the construction industry as a craftsman, supervisor and engineer. I have a Masters Degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Washington. I have done original research and as the result of my research, the Federal Highway Administration is considering one of tests that I developed. I am considered an expert in my field of concrete materials engineering and pavement design. I have asked for a waiver of the Fundamentals of Engineering Examination that is allowed under the rules of the board. This is the preliminary examination given to College Juniors and seniors covering their undergraduate curriculum. It is based on rapid recall of undergraduate stuff. Most engineers have told me that they only use about 5% of the material covered in actual practice and to make matters more difficult, the board is now requiring a Texas Instruments calculator that is totally backward from the HP engineering calculator of my era. I will be 61 year old on April 2 and to pass this examination at my maturity, would require me to re-do the first two years of college. To be quite honest, passing this examination would not make me a better engineer or more qualified in my field of engineering.

At issue is the lack of open government and fair treatment of Alaska Citizens. I truly believe that I would not be spending thousands of dollars to get my engineering license if the Attorney Generals Office had given Occupational Licensing oversight and guidelines. In talking to one of the former Assistant Attorney General (now a retired Judge), I have found that the Architects, Engineers and Surveyors Board has historically been arbitrary and capricious to keep the profession limited. If you're a "Good Ol Boy" you're in, if not, it's a crap shoot.

I am sitting here today with a Brief with the Attorney General Designate's name on it. This Brief argues that it is within the law for the AES Board to meet on my case in secret with an Administrative Law Judge, without my council or myself present, and with no minutes or recordings of that meeting. How can I be assured that my rights as a citizen of Alaska have not been infringed upon? To me, this is the antithesis of "Open Government."

Furthermore, the way the AES Board functions, there are no minutes or recordings of any executive sessions including those evaluating candidates for licensure. I was told by the Executive Administrator of the AES Board that the reason for going into "Executive Session" was done so the members could speak freely. From my understanding of open meeting laws, the purpose of the executive session in these cases is to protect the individual, not the board members. To quote Harry Truman, "If you cant stand the heat, get out of the kitchen."

The second issue in my case is that the AES board gives preference to Canadian engineers over Alaskan engineers. For licensure in Canada, the only requirement is graduation from a university, between 2 and 4 years apprenticeship under a licensed engineer and passing an ethics examination. For these Canadian engineers to achieve licensure in Alaska, the requirement for waiver of the Fundamentals of Engineering examination, is 5 years as a Canadian licensee where as the AES board is requiring me to have 20 years of experience with

absurd verification requirements. The Canadian engineer then has to pass the Professional Engineering Examination, the same technical test that I have passed.

My questions for the Attorney General Designate would be:

1. Are you 100% committed to open government and will you require all state agencies, especially the Occupational Licensing Boards to operate openly not using the Executive Session to hide "Good Ol Boy" politics, and in cases of legitimate Executive Session, require these boards to keep recordings and records of those proceedings?
2. Will you review, with utmost diligence, all administrative law, past and proposed, for compliance with the Constitution of the State of Alaska?

I welcome Governor Palin's commitment to ethics and open government. This is not a Republican or Democratic issue, this is a conviction that we all should strive to achieve.

If you have any questions, I will be glad to discuss them with you or your staff.

**Outsider tapped for top legal post****COLBERG: Palin appoints an attorney general who doesn't run in inner circle of state's lawyers.**By KYLE HOPKINS and TOM KIZZIA

Gov. Sarah Palin on Wednesday chose Talis Colberg, a Palmer lawyer with no obvious experience in oil and gas cases or criminal law, as the state's next attorney general.

Colberg is something of an unknown outside his Valley stomping grounds, which is precisely what Palin likes about him.

The new governor, who won election campaigning on ethics and change, said she tapped Colberg, a former Mat-Su Borough assemblyman, to be the state's top lawyer partly because he doesn't run in the inner circles of state politics.

"I wanted to find someone without an agenda, if you will, but just someone to just provide good, solid, sound legal advice," Palin said.

Also Wednesday, Palin appointed Emil Notti, the first president of the Alaska Federation of Natives and a state official in the 1980s, as commissioner of the Department of Commerce, Community and Economic Development. She announced Karleen Jackson will remain commissioner of Health and Social Services.

Sharon Leighow, the producer of Dan Fagan's KFQD-AM talk radio show, will be Palin's deputy press secretary. Palin's former campaign manager, Kris Perry, will run Palin's Anchorage office.

As far as appointments go, the attorney general job is big. It's choosing the person who will be the state's chief law enforcement officer, the legal advisor to other departments and the boss of a department with more than 500 employees.

Colberg, who has a small law office in Palmer and focuses on workers' compensation cases, said Palin called to offer him the job Monday, and things have been happening fast.

"I'm a little bewildered by it, but I'm thrilled to have that chance," he said.

His appointment now goes to the Legislature for confirmation.

Colberg is clearly a mystery to many Alaska legal and political officials and insiders. The immediate reaction among many on Wednesday was: Who?

Anchorage Sen. Hollis French, a former state prosecutor, said that before Wednesday, he'd never

heard Colberg's name.

French, a Democrat, said he's approved of many of Palin's early appointments, which he described as "nonideological, competent individuals." He said he wants to learn more about Colberg.

"It would be nice if we could get an A.G. who at least had spent some time as a prosecutor," French said. He said he thinks Palin is right to look for someone who doesn't have political baggage or business ties, although a big part of the job is dealing with complex oil and gas issues.

The first attorney general that former Gov. Frank Murkowski appointed, Gregg Renkes, a former Murkowski U.S. Senate aide and lobbyist, was heaped with criticism for owning stock in a company that could have benefited from his actions. He eventually resigned. Renkes' replacement, David Marquez, was a corporate counsel for oil companies.

Palmer Superior Court Judge Beverly Cutler has presided over cases Colberg has presented and knows him through the state bar association. She called him quiet, intellectual and "a very good lawyer."

"I certainly think in the legal profession in the Valley that he is a person of high integrity," she said.

Cutler didn't think his lack of criminal law experience and managing people would be a problem. "I personally don't have qualms about that knowing Talis and his skills. I guess I would just say in my experience he's a good leader and a very quick learner."

He's also a teacher. Adjunct professor, actually, at the University of Alaska Anchorage Mat-Su campus.

"My Eastern civilization class will take their final exam (tonight)," he said.

Colberg, 48, finished the second of two three-year terms on the Mat-Su Borough Assembly in October. He earned his law degree at Pepperdine University and said he's been practicing law for more than two decades.

He's a registered Republican who said he voted for Palin but didn't donate money to her campaign. Colberg said he and the new governor knew of each other but didn't have extended conversations.

Palin said Colberg's ready for the job. People around the state may not know his name -- which is Latvian and pronounced tall-iss, by the way -- but that she used to be an unknown too.

"The advantages of being an outsider, if you will, far outweigh the disadvantages," Palin said.

Jackson is the second commissioner Palin has kept from the Murkowski administration. The other is Maj. Gen. Craig Campbell, commissioner of the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs.

At the Egan Convention Center on Wednesday, Jackson had just come from a big luncheon downstairs, where she was one of 10 women to receive the Women of Achievement awards from the YWCA. Palin addressed the luncheon briefly and, with the keen sense of political timing that served her through her campaign, announced that she was adding one of their honorees to her cabinet.

Palin's choice to run the Commerce Department, Notti, served under Gov. Bill Sheffield in the 1980s as commissioner of Community and Regional Affairs. He was a key figure in the early years of Native corporation politics in Alaska as the first president of the Alaska Federation of Natives.

At one time, Notti served as a president of Fairbanks-based Doyon Ltd.

But he has not played a leadership role in some time, and more recently has been aligned with reform-minded Native shareholders pressing for greater scrutiny by state securities regulators of the Native-owned corporations. Securities regulation in Alaska comes under the Department of Commerce.

Asked Wednesday whether the state had been making changes to provide greater oversight, Notti said, "Not enough." He said he might want to look at that subject as commissioner.

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**Palin names Valley lawyer as attorney general**

**Anchorage, Alaska** - Gov. Sarah Palin played a wild card today and named a relatively little-known lawyer as the state's next attorney general. It was one of five appointments Team Palin announced this afternoon.

Today's appointments of three cabinet officials and two top staffers in the Palin administration included four familiar names and faces. And then there is Talis Colberg, picked by the governor to be the state's chief lawyer.

Colberg, an attorney who has specialized in workers compensation cases, recently finished his second term on the Mat-Su Borough Assembly, but he is virtually unknown at the state level.

Incoming Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Hollis French, D-Anchorage, said he had never heard of Colberg before today. Palin said that's the point.

"In my search for Alaska's attorney general, I've really focused on 'new,' in terms of the fresh start that we need here in the state, to address the challenging issues we have in front of us, beginning with ethics reform that is so needed in state government.

"I wanted to find someone without an agenda, if you will, but someone to just provide good, solid, sound legal advice that the state of Alaska needs," Palin said.

French said that elevating an unknown attorney to the executive branch is admirable but also a double-edged sword.

"At one level, you need to give the legal community and the community at-large some confidence that you picked the right person, and so when you pick outside the box, you've got to establish those credentials.

"On the other hand, folks could easily say that he's not attached to the oil industry, he's not attached to a big plaintiffs firm or a defense firm, and therefore he does bring the ability to make hard decisions without having any attachments to some of the bigger interest groups," French said.

Colberg remained low-key today and said his elevation to attorney general is an improbable event that he nevertheless welcomes. He also responded to the suggestion that he has unusual credentials for the job.

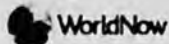
"I've practiced law for 22 years. I'm a lifelong Alaskan. I've been a member and the chairman of the Alaska Humanities Forum. I've been on the Alaska State Fair as the president. I've been in this state in different places throughout my life," Colberg said.

Sen. French said Colberg's chances of being confirmed by the Legislature were good. French said that Palin was entitled to her choices as state agency heads barring any controversial revelations about the unknown attorney.

But French also said the confirmation hearings in the judiciary committees would provide an opportunity for Colberg to introduce himself to Alaskans and share his approach to the law.

Palin also named long-time native leader Emil Notti as commissioner of the Department of Commerce, Community & Economic Development. Karleen Jackson, a holdover from the Murkowski administration, will stay on as commissioner of the Department of Health & Social Services.

Palin named her campaign manager, Kris Perry, as director of the governor's Anchorage office, and radio personality Sharon Leighow, who is the program director for KFQD, was named deputy communications director.



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**Governor unable to remove Hayes****IT'S IN THE CONSTITUTION: Legal opinion says there must be "cause."**

**FAIRBANKS -- Gov. Sarah Palin lacks the authority to remove University of Alaska regent Jim Hayes from office, according to Alaska Attorney General Talis Colberg.**

The legal opinion released Friday is opposite an opinion by a legislative attorney regarding Hayes, a former Fairbanks mayor under indictment on fraud and money laundering charges.

Colberg has issued an opinion that the governor is unable to remove a regent from the university "without cause."

"Unless the members of the Board of Regents commit acts of malfeasance, misfeasance, or nonfeasance sufficient to constitute cause for their removal, the governor possesses no check upon them and no power to direct their activities," Colberg's statement said.

The issue arose after the federal indictment charging Hayes and his wife, Chris, each on 92 counts of fraud, theft, money laundering and misappropriating government funds in connection with the nonprofit LOVE Social Services run by Chris Hayes. The charges are unrelated to Jim Hayes' role as a member of the university Board of Regents.

Palin a week ago asked Hayes to resign, but he declined, according to the governor's office. On Friday, Palin sent a letter to Hayes again asking him to resign.

Last week a lawyer with the Legislative Affairs Office said the regents serve at the pleasure of the governor and can be removed at any time. Colberg disagreed with that assessment.

"This interpretation is at odds with the express intention of the Constitutional Convention that the university be insulated from politics," he said in his opinion.

Transcripts of the discussions by the framers of the constitution indicate they didn't intend the Board of Regents to be included in the same category as other executive branch boards, Colberg said.

"Thus, while the regents are appointed by and are responsible to the governor, they do not serve at his pleasure but rather for fixed terms, and they may, therefore, be removed from office solely for cause," Colberg wrote.

Jim Hayes said Sunday he was unaware of Colberg's legal opinion. He said his attorneys have advised him to not comment on his case, but added he had no plans to resign as a regent.

"My appointment is until 2011, and I intend to serve my full term," he said. "I'm not guilty of anything."

**The Legislature can remove a regent with a two-thirds majority vote in both Houses.**

**"We were hoping for a quicker resolution," Palin said. "It's unfortunate that a cloud is going to remain over the Board of Regents for a longer period of time."**

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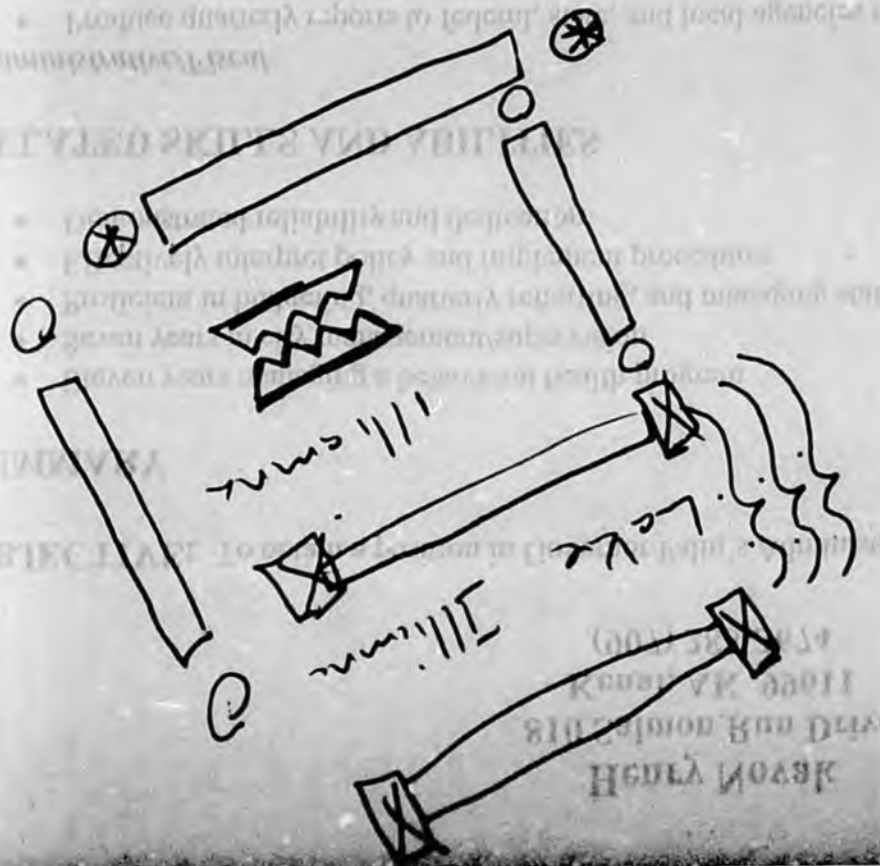

Sec. 08.08 is amended by adding (underlined) new sections to read:

Article 4. Unlawful Acts

Sec. 08.08.210 Who may practice law.

(b)

The practice of law shall be defined in the Alaska Bar Rules with the elimination of Alaska Bar Rules 2.2 (b)(3) and 43.1(c) which exclude applicants who have failed an Alaska Bar Exam.

Under this amendment, Alaska Bar Rules to be eliminated by brackets “[ ]”:

Alaska Bar Rule 2.2(b)(3) reads:

*[An applicant is not eligible for admission under this section if the applicant has taken and failed to pass an Alaska Bar examination, unless this occurred before the applicant engaged in the five years of practice required by (a)(2) of this section]*

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

\* Section 1. AS 23.05 is amended by adding new sections to read:

### ARTICLE 4. RECIPROCAL AGREEMENTS.

#### Sec. 23.05.320. RECIPROCAL AGREEMENTS WITH OTHER

STATES. The commissioner of labor may enter into reciprocal agreements with the labor department or corresponding agency of another state, or with the person, board, officer, or commission authorized to act on behalf of that department or agency for the collection in the other state of claims or judgments for wages based upon claims previously assigned to the commissioner of labor.

#### Sec. 23.05.330. ACTIONS IN COURTS OF OTHER STATES.

The commissioner of labor may, to the extent permitted by a reciprocal agreement with an agency of another state, maintain actions in the courts of that state for the collection of claims or judgments for wages, and may assign claims or

judgments to the labor department or agency of that state for collection.

**Sec. 23.05.340. ACTIONS IN THIS STATE FOR DEMANDS ARISING IN OTHER STATES.** The commissioner of labor may, upon the written request of the labor department or corresponding agency of another state or of a person, board, officer, or commission authorized to act on behalf of that department or agency, maintain actions in the courts of this state upon assigned claims or judgments for wages arising in another state in the same manner and to the same extent that such actions by the commissioner of labor are authorized for claims arising in this state; provided that these actions may be maintained only in the event that the department or agency in the other state provides, by agreement, reciprocal services to the commissioner of labor.

\* **Sec. 2.** This Act takes effect on the day after its passage and approval or on the day it becomes law without such approval.
