Alaska's Coastal Management Program has undergone major modification in the last several years under the previous administration. These changes required the coastal zone management districts throughout the state to completely revise their management plans. Compliance and approval of the new plans by both the state and federal authorities must be achieved before the March 1, 2007 termination date of their existing plans.

Of the 30 coastal management districts, 18 have new plans that have been approved or are near approval. Of the remaining districts, 9 are still being revised or are under review and 3 have requested mediation. They are not likely to make the March 1 deadline. The reasons most often given for the delays are the complexity and extent of information required by the Department of Resources for justification of the plan proposals. This is particularly true for large districts where revisions to resources inventories and analysis required significant effort.

SB 46 accomplishes three things. First, it allows for the Department of Environment Conservation to give notice and opportunity for public comment on a federal activity which otherwise does not require a state permit, certification or authorization and associated public involvement. Secondly, it extends the March 1 deadline for completion and approval of district plans six months to September 1. Finally, it extends the related designation of categorical and generally consistent determinations (the ABC list) six months also.

**I urge you to give favorable consideration of SB 46 and its importance to 70 % of
Alaska's coastal area and the people who call it home.**

 HB 191 (Chapter 24 SLA 2003) required the districts to have plans submitted by 6/30/2005, with the district plan review and approval process completed by 8/30/2006. CS SB 102 (Chapter 31 SLA 2005) extended the district submission deadline to 3/1/2006, 8 months after the deadline established in HB 191. The review and approval process of those plans would not be complete until 3/1/2007.

 Though 28 coastal districts submitted plans by the deadline (3/1/2006), several of the coastal districts have withdrawn or continued to work on their plan, delaying the review and approval process. Implementation of SB 46 extends the review and approval process of those plans to 9/1/2007, 14 months after the deadline established in HB 191. SB 46 will also extend the completion of the ABC List by 6 months, to June 29, 2008. Funding for existing staff to continue the work necessary for the district plan review and approval process will be absorbed in the existing budget.



This memorandum is intended to provide you with a status report of the Alaska Coastal Management Program (ACMP) coastal district plan amendments.

The following coastal district plan revisions have been approved by the DNR Commissioner and the Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM):

- (1) City of Skagway
- (2) City of Hoonah
- (3) City of Pelican
- (4) Bristol Bay Borough
- (5) Aleutians West CRSA
- (6) City of Bethel
- (7) City of Craig
- (8) City of Nome
- (9) City of Valdez
- (10) City of Whittier
- (11) Haines Borough
- (12) City and Borough of Yakutat
- (13) Matanuska-Susitna Borough
- (14) City of Thorne Bay

The City of Craig and Aleutians West CRSA coastal district plan revisions were submitted to the Lt. Governor's Office last week. As soon as the Lt. Governor signs and files the plan revisions, a public notice will be issued and the plans will go into effect 30 days from the Lt. Governor's filing date.

The remaining coastal districts listed above should be in the process of obtaining the necessary resolution/ordinance from the district's governing body, as appropriate, and in accordance with 11 AAC 114.360. In order to ensure the coastal district plan revisions go into effect in advance of the March 1, 2007 sunset date for the existing plans, coastal districts should plan to submit the required resolution/ordinance to OPMP by 12:00 noon Friday, January 26. This will allow OPMP the opportunity to prepare the necessary filing and associated paperwork to ensure a timely submittal to the Lt. Governor's Office for filing. Hello Sharon, I know this is the eleventh hour but since I can't participate in the testimony directly today I wanted to at least get my thoughts to you in writing. There is going to be testimony today from some districts that will emphasize a number of things. I have looked at the concerns of other districts and concur with those concerns. Mostly, my concerns relate to time and resources. Since I am a newcomer here in Cordova, I was not involved with the update process from the beginning, indeed I inherited the project when I arrived a year ago from the lower 48. Cordova was without a planning department for 4 months before my arrival and before that there was staffing issues. Needless to say I faced many challenges when I arrived, one of which was completing the plan update. As it turned out I was basically just trying to get up to speed with the help of the consultant and the state OPMP and DCCED while trying to meet the deadlines. So I really haven't been involved with any real substantive policy discussion or development, I have left that up to our consultant with her working knowledge. I have been basically administering contracts to get the job done. I concur with my fellow districts concerns related to request for additional information and mapping changes. When I read the RFAI my jaw nearly dropped thinking how can I even begin to expect to get these things resolved in a timely manner. If I had been involved from the beginning and had a working knowledge of plan update and the plan for that matter, maybe I could have assisted, but this was not the case for Cordova. Having said this, it is my intention to assist in completing our plan as quickly as possible, noting that it is basically in the hands of our consultant to submit the final plan amendment. It is clear to me that we will not meet the March 1st deadline and it makes sense to grant an extension for the reasons I have stated. After all, what is the alternative going to be? I will continue to review projects under our current plan and the state statutes as required and unless the state plans on taking some legal action, I don't see why an extension cannot be granted for those districts that do not have plans completed and adopted yet. Thanks for the opportunity to express my written testimony in my absence.

Governor Palin Signs Two Bills into Law

February 20, 2007, Juneau, Alaska – Governor Sarah Palin today signed **Senate Bill 46** and **House Bill 69**. The Governor was joined by Senator Donny Olson and Representative Ralph Samue's at the bill signing.

Senate Bill 46 extends the deadline for coastal communities to revise their plans for environmental oversight and development. By signing **SB 46**, coastal districts will have until **September 1, 2007**, to revise their plans. Without this extension, **12** districts that make up **70 percent** of Alaska's coastline are in jeopardy of losing their ability to have local involvement in their coastal areas.

"I thank Senator Olson for sponsoring this bill," said Governor Palin. "I know that these coastal districts have worked hard on their revised plans and by extending the deadline, we can ensure they will not lose local control."

House Bill 69 now makes it mandatory for the governor and the Board of Parole to work together to ensure any decision on clemency is based on a thorough review of the case, and made in deference to victims and their families.

"In a perfect world, this bill wouldn't be necessary," said Governor Palin. "Unfortunately, we all know why such legislation has come through with unanimous support and why I sign this bill without hesitation."

In his final hours in office, Governor Murkowski granted an executive pardon to a company convicted of criminally negligent homicide. Whitewater Engineering Corporation pleaded no contest in 2001 to the charge in connection with the 1999 death of one of its employees. The pardon was granted on November 30, 2006. No one from the Murkowski administration notified the victim's family of the request for clemency or that the pardon was granted.

HB 69 not only ensures that victims of crimes are notified of the governor's intent to grant clemency but also allows them to become part of the process.

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING SB 46 (CS), AN ACT RELATING TO AN EXTENSION OF THE PLAN REVISION DEADLINE FOR COASTAL MANAGEMENT PLANS FROM MARCH 1, 2007 TO SEPTEMBER 1, 2007.

WHEREAS, Senator Donny Olsen has introduced Senate Bill 49 to the Alaska State Legislature extending the Alaska Coastal Management Program (ACMP) district plan revision deadline from March 1, 2007 to September 1, 2007 by amending the effective date of sec. 45, ch. 24, SLA 2003, as amended by sec 21, ch.31, SLA 2005; and

WHEREAS, At least ten (10) coastal district plans will expire on March 1, 2007 without this extension; and

WHEREAS, SB 46 also extends the deadline for revision of the *ABC List* from 25 months (after the Office of Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) approval of the ACMP changes) to 30 months (i.e., from December 29, 2007 to August 29, 2008), which will allow incorporation of the new enforceable policies into the A and B List revisions; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska Coastal District Association (ACDA) represents Alaska's coastal districts with common interests in monitoring and/or regulation of development activities occurring in Alaska's coastal zone; and

WHEREAS, the Alaska coastal districts have repeatedly elected to participate in the State of Alaska Coastal Management Program and have entered into grant agreements with the Alaska Department of Natural Resources (ADNR)-Office of Project Management and Permitting (OPMP) to amend their respective coastal management plans by the March 1, 2007 deadline; and

WHEREAS, OPMP has approved some of the district coastal management plan revisions while other district plans are still in the negotiation process. Once approved by OPMP, each plan must be forwarded to ADNR for signature prior to being sent to OCRM for final approval; and

WHEREAS, once a district plan is reviewed and approved by ADNR and OCRM, each plan must then go through a local public review process before it can be adopted by local governments; and

WHEREAS, several Alaska district coastal management plan revisions will not meet the March 1, 2007 approval deadline.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the ACDA supports passage of SB 46 and strongly encourages House and Administrative approval to extend the ACMP district plan revision deadline from March 1, 2007 to September 1, 2007.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the ACDA member districts remain committed to completing their respective coastal management plan revisions to ensure the citizens of Alaska's coastal districts have due deference in the public review process in coastal management decisions affecting Alaska's coastal zone boundary.
