



LETTER OF INTENT

According to resolutions adopted by the Alaska Constitutional Convention, KFAR Radio has been engaged to tape record all the Plenary Sessions of the Convention subject to the following terms:

1. The Convention guarantees KFAR Radio a minimum of 150 tape recorded hours at the rate of \$31.20 per hour in addition to an equipment rental fee of \$6.00 per hour - or total of \$37.20 per hour. The Convention will arrange for payment upon receipt of billable original tapes and duplicates. In no event shall a period of 60 days elapse before KFAR delivers the tapes to the Convention and all tapes shall be delivered within 10 days after final adjournment of the Convention.
2. The Convention will also receive a duplicate recording of each Plenary Session tape at the additional rate of \$15.00 per tape recorded hour.
3. Recording of the Alaska Constitutional Convention is to be retroactive to the Plenary Session of Wednesday, November 9th. From that time forward tape recorded hours will be computed by subtracting time in recess or at ease from the total Plenary Session Day. The original tapes for the November 8th proceedings will be supplied free of charges as a public service by KFAR.
4. The Alaska Constitutional Convention understands that because new equipment and new recording tape were not available until on or about November 21st, all recordings and recording tape used prior to that date were subject to the limitations of a temporary installation and used recording tape.
5. The Alaska Constitutional Convention understands that these recordings should be stored at room temperature and be guarded from any electro magnetic fields which would in fact erase the tape recording.
6. The sole responsibility of KFAR Radio is to record fully the Plenary Sessions of the Alaska Constitutional Convention and to provide a copy of the original tapes and duplicates. KFAR Radio cannot accept responsibility for any failure of equipment or personnel unless such failure is due to negligence. KFAR agrees to exercise all precautions in order to ensure a faithful tape recording of the Conventions' Plenary Session proceedings and to facilitate proper preservation of the tapes by furnishing metal containers.

Dear Sirs:

This is a reply to the request of the Alaska Statehood Committee for an estimate of expenses from KFAR radio for the tape recording of the Plenary Sessions of the Alaska Constitutional Convention.

This estimate, which was requested in two parts (installation charge and hourly rate), is hereby submitted:

1. Basic installation of Midnight Sun Broadcasting Company equipment and use thereof for the length of the Alaska Constitutional Convention.....\$2,580.
2. Charge for each hour of recording the Plenary Sessions. This fee includes engineering labor, maintenance of equipment, cans for tape storage, recording tape, and labelling of tapes, storage, and transportation.....\$29.20.
