PREFACE

In 1965 the staff of the Legislative Council accomplished and distributed The Minutes of the Daily Proceedings of the Alaska Constitutional Convention, 1955-56. The six-part transcription of the debates and related materials was distributed to convention delegates and reference libraries throughout the state.

The 1965 publication lacked a basic index allowing the reader easy access to the committee proposals and ordinances where they were discussed and to the decisions on the final substance and wording of the articles and their sections.

The Legislative Affairs Agency arranged with Katherine D. Nordale, a delegate to the convention, to apply her considerable talents to a probing of the proceedings and supporting materials to identify the sources of all parts of the final document, treatment of subjects not ultimately included in the constitution, identify consultants and guests, and note the arrangements for the organization and administration of the convention itself. We are appreciative of her very successful efforts and offer this index to the explorers of Alaska constitutional history with the hope that it will ease their path.
