MINUTES OF MEETING
OF
BOARD OF GOVERNORS
ALASKA BAR ASSOCIATION

The Board of Governors of the Alaska Bar Association was called to order by the President at 11:00 o'clock, A.M., December 13, 1957, in the basement of the Loussac-Boga Library, Anchorage, Alaska.

The President took up as the first order of business the report of the Executive Committee, which was read by Mr. Crasby. The report was approved by the following vote: Mr. Crasby, 1; Mr. Connolly, 1; Mr. Davis, 1; Mr. Lay, 1; Mr. Schagle, 1; Mr. Stump, 1; Mr. Von Der Fort, 1. (Total 7 votes.)

Mr. Crasby then reported on the results of the recent election of the Executive Committee. The results were as follows: Mr. Crasby, 1; Mr. Connolly, 1; Mr. Davis, 1; Mr. Lay, 1; Mr. Schagle, 1; Mr. Stump, 1; Mr. Von Der Fort, 1. (Total 7 votes.)

Mr. Crasby then moved that the Board of Governors be authorized to take such action as may be deemed appropriate in the premises. The motion was carried by the following vote: Mr. Crasby, 1; Mr. Connolly, 1; Mr. Davis, 1; Mr. Lay, 1; Mr. Schagle, 1; Mr. Stump, 1; Mr. Von Der Fort, 1. (Total 7 votes.)

Mr. William Sanders then appeared before the Board on behalf of William L. Paul, and **MINUTES OF MEETING** led out to Mr. Sanders that the Board had no authority of its own to reinstate or refuse to reinstate Mr. Paul as a **BOARD OF GOVERNORS** Bar Association, but only to recommend. He **ALASKA BAR ASSOCIATION** application as noted indicated that the accompanying checks were paid under protest, whereas only the check for the \$100.00 admission fee was paid.

The meeting of the Board of Governors of the Alaska Bar Association was reconvened and called to order by the President at 10:00 o'clock, A.M., December 14, 1957, in the basement of the Loussac-Sogn Library, Anchorage, Alaska.

Present were: **CHARLES J. CLASBY**, **JOHN R. CONNOLLY**, **EDWARD V. DAVIS**, **WENDELL P. KAY**, **M. E. MONAGLE**, **ROBERT A. PARRISH**, **W. C. STUMP**, and **JAMES A. VON DER HEYDT**. Mr. Sanders stated that he was not to be understood as recommending Mr. Paul's reinstatement. Mr. Paul requested that he wish the protests to be turned over to Mr. Sanders. Mr. Sanders then asked Mr. Kay if anything, Mr. Paul's pending suit against the Alaska Bar Association was replied that it was his interpretation of Mr. Paul that the suit would be dismissed. Mr. Sanders then withdrew from the meeting.

The President reviewed the work of the previous day on the Bar Examination, for the benefit of Mr. Parrish, who had not been present.

Mr. Glenn Cassidy appeared briefly before the Board to discuss his eligibility for admission on reciprocity, and consist of local attorneys not by the Board of Governors.

After discussion, it was moved by Mr. Kay, seconded by Mr. Parrish, and unanimously carried, that Mr. McCaskey be recommended for admission to the Bar, subject to oral examination. After which it was moved by Mr. Clasby, seconded by Mr. Parrish, and unanimously carried.

It was moved by Mr. von der Heydt, seconded by Mr. Stump, that Mr. Rice be recommended for admission to the Bar, subject to oral examination. The motion failed, Mr. Davis voting aye, and all others, no.

It was moved by Mr. Kay, seconded by Mr. von der Heydt, that Mr. Dyer be recommended for admission to the Bar, subject to oral examination. The motion failed, Mr. Davis voting aye, and all others, no.

Mr. Stump advised that the Yukon Bar Association was going to invite the entire convention to come to Ketchikan for sessions.

Discussion was then had on the eligibility of Mr. Jay Rabinowitz of Fairbanks to hold the job of City Attorney in that City, and his desire to be admitted to the Bar on reciprocity. It was agreed that, not being a member of the Bar, Mr. Rabinowitz is not eligible for the position of City Attorney. However, it was agreed that if Mr. Rabinowitz submits his application, and things seem to be in order, the matter could be handled by a mail poll of the Board.

It was moved by Mr. Clasby, seconded by Mr. Kay, and unanimously carried, that on receipt of applications from Messrs. Rabinowitz and Cassidy, if the Chairman of the Admissions Committee is out of town, the Secretary's Office should request the necessary character reports.
