14 interim committees named to study legislation

Legislative leaders have announced the membership of 14 committees to study problems and prepare legislation for next session.

Senate President Terry Miller, R-Fairbanks, House Speaker Tom Fink, R-Dist. 8, and House Rules Chairman Dick McVeigh, D-Dist. 10, chairman of the Legislative Council, said Thursday the committees in most cases would hold public hearings on proposed legislation.

ALL BUT three of the groups were joint committees. A House Fisheries Committee was named to work separately from a Senate committee chaired by Sen. Bob Palmer, R-Ninilchik, and no senators were named to a committee on school decorum. A Drug Probe Committee was named to work independently of a Senate committee on drug abuse chaired by Sen. Jess Harris, R-Anchorage.

Fink said about 45 of the 60 legislators were named to one of the 14 committees and that they were "bound to give a lot of direction to where the legislature goes.

"One of the big problems we always have is that the public wants to be heard, and they can't be heard in Juneau. If we send committees all over the state during the session, we never get any work done," he said.

"We think that these committees will facilitate the work of the next legislature and perhaps shorten it by doing of the groundwork now," Miller said.

McVeigh said the Legislative Council would meet here May 18 to organize for interim work.
