HOUSE BILL NO. 112

IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA

FOURTH LEGISLATURE - FIRST SESSION

A BILL

For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the powers and duties
of a borough assembly, the local affairs
agency and the local boundary commission."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

* Section 1. AS 07.15 is amended by adding a new section to
read:

AS 07.15.063. RESTRICTION ON ESTABLISHMENT OF SERVICE
AREAS. (a) A new service area may not be established if the
new service can be provided by an existing service area,
by incorporation as a city, or by annexation to a city.
Whether the new service can be so provided shall be deter-
mined by the assembly under standards prescribed by the
local affairs agency and consistent with the purposes of
art. X of the state constitution.

(b) Before it may establish a service area, the assem-
bly must declare in writing the findings upon which its
determination under (a) of this section is made and mail a
copy of its declaration by certified mail to each city
within the borough and to the local affairs agency. An
interested party may file a written notice of appeal of the
assembly determination with the local boundary commission.

7 water supply and sewerage systems."

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

9 * Section 1. AS 46 is amended by adding a new chapter to read:

10 CHAPTER 20. WATER AND SEWERAGE SYSTEMS

11 Sec. 46.20.010. PURPOSE AND POLICY. (a) The wide-
12 spread use of inadequate individual water supply and sewerage
13 systems and inadequately planned community water supply and
14 sewerage systems in and near urban areas

15 (1) endangers the health and welfare of the
16 citizens of this state by causing or contributing to the
17 pollution of ground and surface waters;

18 (2) causes depletion of ground water without ade-
19 quate provision for a continuing water supply;

20 (3) encourages development of land for residential,
21 industrial and other purposes without adequate provision for
22 community water supply and sewerage systems and unnecessarily
23 increases the cost of providing such systems.

24 (b) The public policy of this state is to eliminate
25 the health hazards of the water supply and sewerage systems

6 For an Act entitled: "An Act relating to the procedure by which
7 second class boroughs may add to their
8 powers."

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:

10 * Section 1. AS 07.15.730 is amended to read:

11 Sec. 07.15.730. ADDITIONAL POWERS FOR SECOND CLASS
12 BOROUGH. The second class borough may add to the powers which
13 it may exercise in the area outside cities by ordinance adopt-
14 ed in the manner provided in AS 07.20.100. Each ordinance
15 must be approved by a majority of the qualified voters re-
16 siding in the borough and voting on the question on a day
17 set by the assembly or, if no day is set, on the day of the
18 next election otherwise occurring in which all the voters
19 of the area outside cities are eligible to vote [ONLY BY
20 FILING A PETITION WITH THE LOCAL AFFAIRS AGENCY].

21 * Sec. 2. AS 07.15.740 - 07.15.790 and 07.15.800(a) are re-
22 pealed.
