CONTRACT POLICING FOR CITIES AND BOROUGHES

ALASKA DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY

The legislature appropriates funds for police services outside of incorporated municipalities. Some communities, however, being small and financially incapable of maintaining a full police organization, have entered into contracts with the Department of Public Safety for police services patterned to their particular needs.

A system of police contracts, similar to the services provided provinces and cities in Canada by the Royal Canadian Mounted Police, has evolved through experience in providing such service.

Two types of contracts are presently being offered; the limited or partial contract, and the full contract. Limited contracts are now in force with the cities of Douglas, Kotzebue, Barrow, Soldotna, Delta Junction, Fort Yukon, Homer and Nenana. Full contracts are being satisfactorily performed in Kenai, Cordova, Palmer, and Bethel.

Under the terms of the full contract, the local government unit bears the entire cost, as public safety is one of its obligations to the citizens of that local government area. Under a full contract, trained and qualified State Police troopers become the local policing authority. The trooper, or troopers, are supervised and assisted by the State Police District Commander (Captain), Deputy District Commander (Staff Sergeant), a competent criminal investigator when necessary, and continued inspections.

All services provided by the Department of Public Safety are available to the local government under the system. These include scientific aids to enforcement such as the Breathalyzer, the polygraph, and traffic radar equipment. Included in the services provided are the facilities of the Records and Identification Section, the Training Section, the Driver License and Safety Responsibility Section, the Alaska Disaster Office, and the Division of Fire Prevention.

The State Police troopers assigned to contract services in a local government area are responsible to their supervisors for the safety, protection and assistance to the people within their assigned areas. The troopers are not speed trap operators or revenue makers. When requested, they

Re: Program Reservations for 200 Units of Turnkey III Subsidized Homeownership Public Housing in eleven (11) Communities in Southeastern Alaska under the President's Indian Housing Program

Dear Mr. Majors:

The Central Council, in cooperation with the Alaska State Housing Authority, has been working to advance the development of Turnkey III Subsidized Homeownership Public Housing under the President's Indian Housing Program in eleven (11) Southeastern Alaska communities. These communities are Yakutat, Haines, Klukwan, Hoonah, Angoon, Kake, Klawock, Craig, Hydaburg, the Juneau Indian Village and the Sitka Indian Village. Resolutions, Cooperation Agreements and Program Applications for a total of two hundred ninety-eight (298) units have been properly submitted to HUD and approved as to form. To date, the problem in advancing the housing program has been our inability to secure the necessary program reservations and preliminary loan planning funds. In late September, 1972, HUD, Region X informed ASHA-T-HCC that authority to issue new program reservations in Alaska under the President's Indian Housing Program had been frozen for the time being. Since then, ASHA-T-HCC appealed to HUD several times, but was given the response that no program reservation authority exists in HUD Region X.

In November, 1973, the Tlingit-Haida Central Council appealed to Senator Stevens - Alaska, for assistance in tying down the necessary program reservations. The Senator worked on the matter and was able to secure a commitment on 200 of the 298 units requested. The Central Council was pleased and has since recognized this as a political/administrative commitment to the program by the federal administration in cooperation with Senator Stevens.
