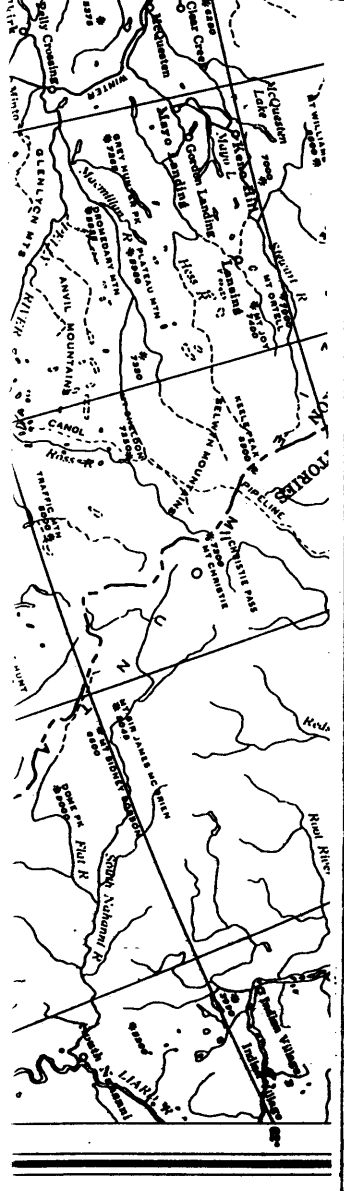
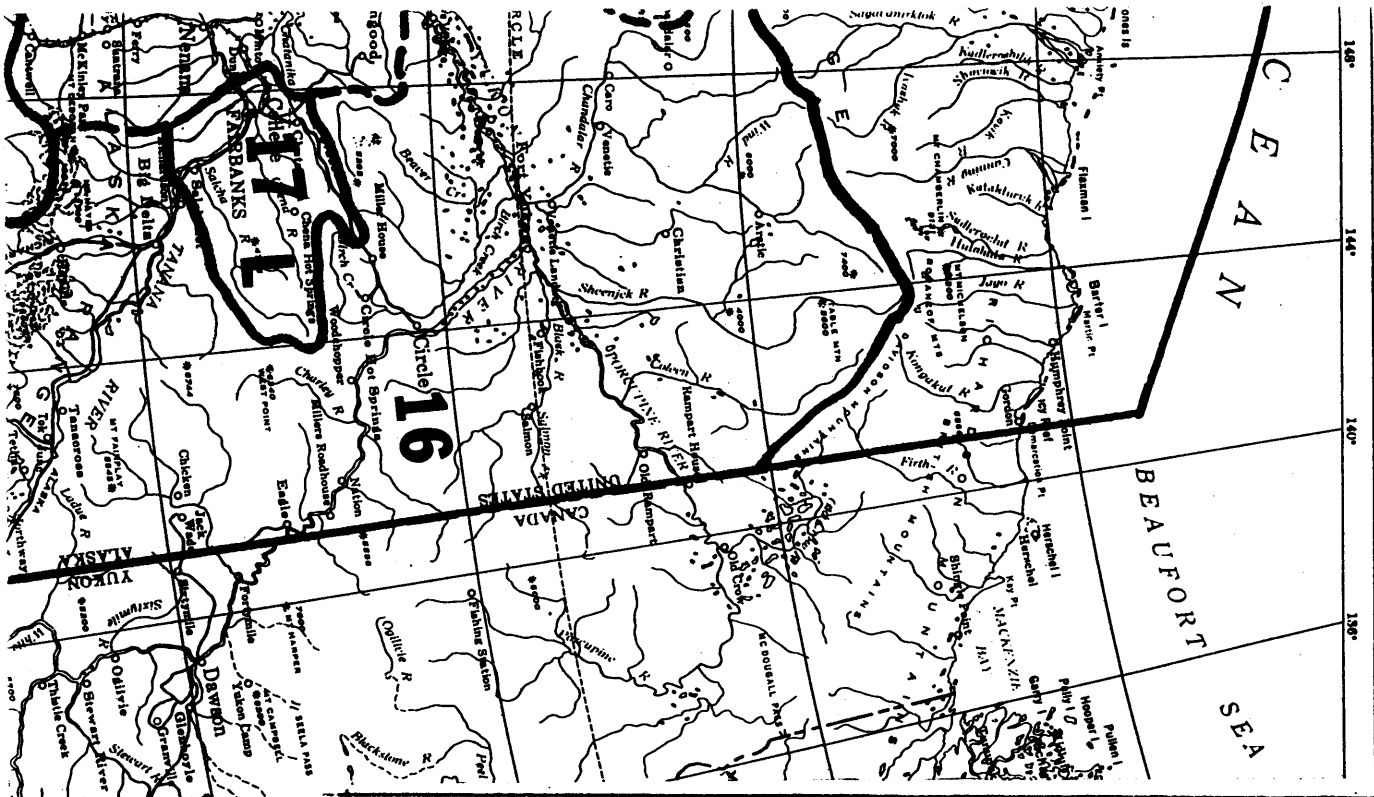

Statement by Governor William A. Egan regarding reapportionment:

"Under this reapportionment, all senators whose current constituencies are altered by the reapportionment, as well as those whose terms expire upon convening of the Legislature following the 1972 election, will face election. As a result, 18 senators will run in 1972. In addition, of course, all House seats will normally be up for election.

"Districts A, B, and C are unaffected by the reapportionment. Accordingly, the incumbent senators from those districts will serve their full terms.

"In order to produce the necessary staggering of terms, 10 of the 18 senators elected in 1972 will serve 4-year terms, and eight will serve 2-year terms.

"The allocation of terms among seats proceeds on an alternating alphabetical basis. This follows the procedure utilized in the reapportionment of 1965.

"In the multi-member senate districts in Anchorage and Fairbanks, candidates will file for a two or four-year seat as they choose."
