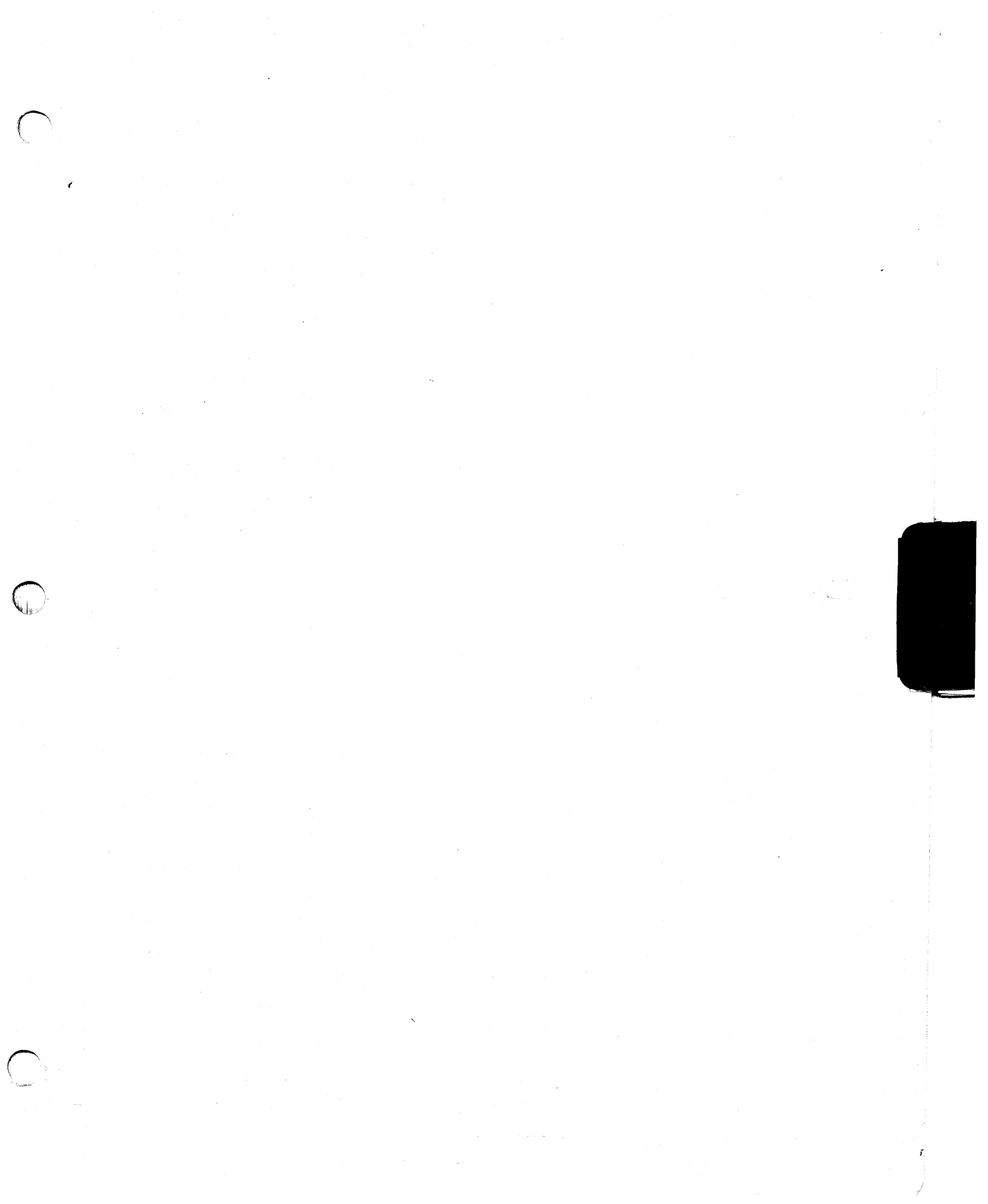

HB 599 Classification of game.

Representative Carney, Chairman Special Committee on Agriculture which sponsored HB 599, testified in favor of HB 599 and moved to amend the bill with two changes. One, he suggested, adding reindeer to line eleven and changing "buffalo" to "bison" in lines six and eleven. These animals are now under the jurisdiction of Fish and Game. This would help correct some problems presented when raising them as domestic herds. He stated that the intent of the bill was to make domestic categories of these animals and not to remove them totally from the jurisdiction of Fish and Game.

Representative Carney moved his amendments. The amendments passed.

Bob Hinman, Deputy Director of Game, testified that as the bill is written, the animals would be removed from Fish and Game's jurisdiction. He opposed CS HB 599.

Ken Vassar, attorney for Legislative Affairs Agency, testified and stated that the bill would remove the animals from Fish and Game jurisdiction.

Representative Chatterton asked whether the bill could be rewritten to put wild herds under Fish and Game and the domestic under Agriculture. Mr. Vassar stated that yes they could.

Representative Carney stated that was what he wanted the bill to accomplish.

Chairman Osterback appointed a sub-committee of Representatives Carney, (Chairman) Chatterton and Cotten to come up with a committee substitute which would accomplish that intent. There were no objections. The bill was tabled until such a committee substitute is ready for consideration.

HB 590 Removal of herring from the state.

Testimony

Representative Gardiner, prime sponsor, testified on HB 590. He felt that HB 590 would help keep more jobs in Alaska. His concern is to get the maximum benefit out of the resource for Alaska by processing within the state.

Representative Chatterton suggested changing the last line in Section 16.10.172 to read as follows:

"process shall be eliminated."

Representative Chatterton moved his amendment.

Representative Cotten objected stating that more information was needed and that there were no other referrals so the best language must be used. Representative Cotten left the meeting.

There was no vote on the motion.

Steve Pennoyer, Director of Commercial Fisheries, testified and stated that passage of HB 590 would not affect Fish and Game's management of the fishery except when the catch would exceed the processing ability of the state. Now we are able to call in foreign processors if domestic processors cannot handle a particularly large catch. 5AAC 39.198 does prohibit foreigners from taking unprocessed fish out of the state. The intent of the bill may be covered in AS 16.10.173 preventing waste.

Representative Eliason stated in reality this statute does not take care of the problem, it is a charade.

Tom Waterer, President of Salamatof Seafoods in Kenai, testified. He agreed with Representative Eliason's reference to "charade." He also stated that Alaska would benefit from this legislation. He would also urge a detailed definition of what processing is meant to be; frozen, canned, etc., but he favors not classifying light salting as processing. Without this bill much herring does and will be shipped out in tankers to Canadian processors.

Representative Osterback questions whether or not the Alaska processors will be able to handle all the fish.

Mr. Waterer stated that yes the processors will be able to handle the load but, they need some incentive to gear up and invest. At the present time they are unsure that they can compete without this legislation.

Minutes January 31, 1980

Larry Cotter, President International Warehouseman and Longshoreman's Union, stated that he was very pleased with Mr. Waterer's testimony. Also, that the bill has good direction but that it does not do exactly what it should. He stated that the industry is seasonal and an estimate of 50% of cannery workers are from the lower 48. He also advocates an addition to the bill, "unless processed or with roe content of greater than 5%." This would effectively insure that the roe would be extracted and processed here before export. At this time such a low roe content would be uneconomical. This action should not go into effect immediately as Alaskan processors are not yet geared up to handle roe but, it could go into effect over a period of time. Also halibut should be filleted before leaving Alaska and crab should be cooked. This would create more jobs for Alaska.

Representative Chatterton stated that the herring industry as well as others should not waste the product, enough profit must be made to cover the expense of using the carcass. In order to close the meeting he withdrew his motion. There were no objections.

Chairman Osterback asked Mr. Waterer to get together with Representative Gardiner to work on a suggested committee substitute for HB 590 which would meet more of the concerns expressed during the hearing.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:40 p.m.

The Head Tax of 1977 should be repealed. He recommended the tax be put on the tag when the hunter buyes his license.

The Exclusive Use System should be reviewed, but most agree with it.

Action

The Committee unanimously recommended the confirmation of Mr. Sutliff, Mr. Keim, and Mr. Stroecker, to the Guide Board.

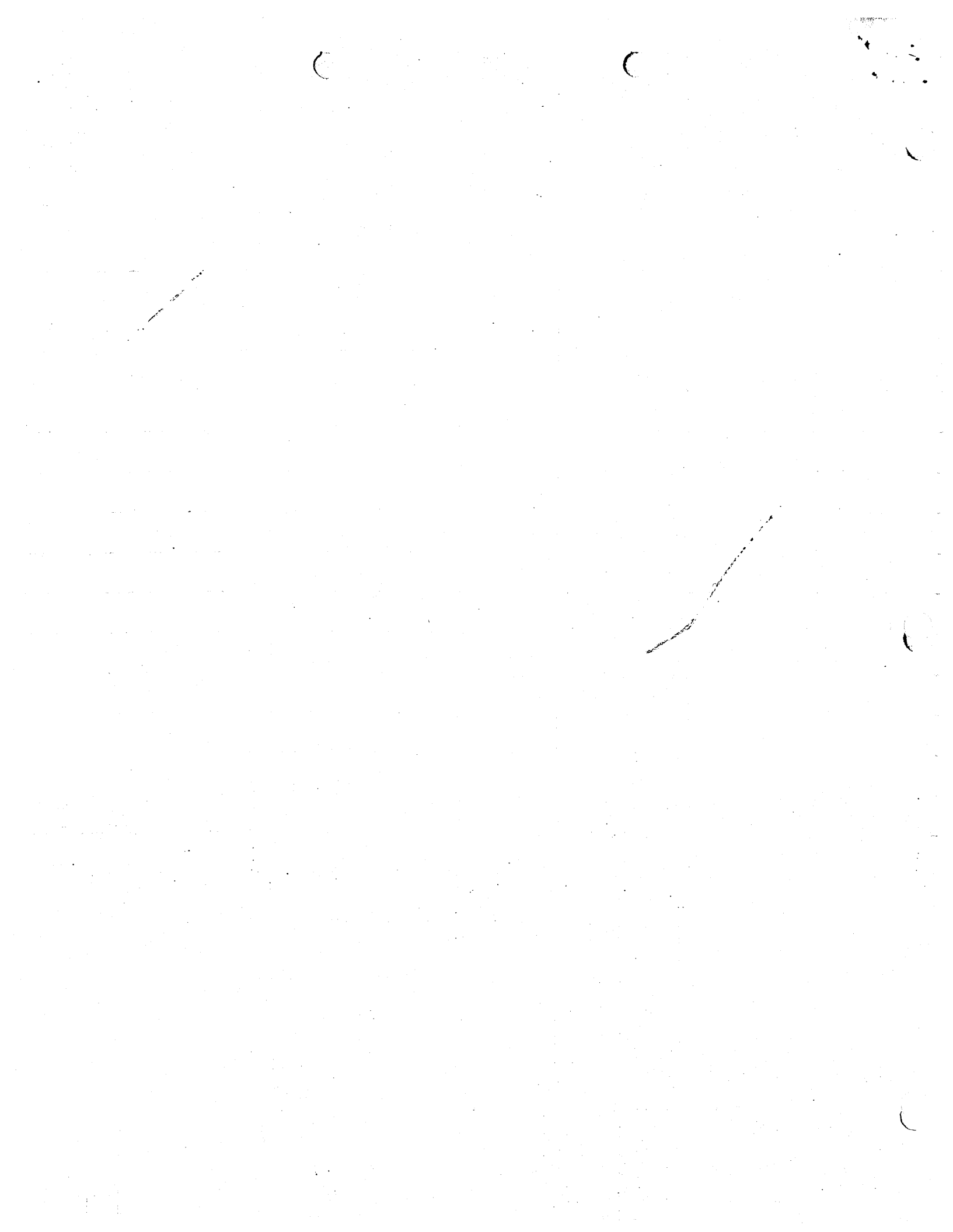

Sgt. Robert Brown, from Fish and Wildlife Protection, testified by teleconference from Anchorage, suggesting that Section 2, AS 16.10.294(c), line 27 be ammended to read license "shall" be permanently revoked.

CSSSHB 516 Relating to Office of Fisheries Development

Rep. Miles introduced an amendment concerning legislative intent of the bill and moved that the language of the amendment be accepted and included in the appropriate place in the bill. There were no objections. The amendment passed.

Charles Weber, Commissioner from the Department of Commerce and Economic Development testified that his department had no objection to the bill and they feel it is in keeping with development of fisheries.

Action: Representative Zharoff moved to report the bill out. There were no objections. The bill was reported out as CSSSHB 516.

HB 891 Relating to Appropriations for Agriculture Development

Rep. Carney, Chairman, Special Agriculture Committee introduced the bill, explained the amendments, and answered questions.

Dan Karmun, Director, Reindeer Herders Assoc. testified in favor of the bill and the need for the range survey.

Dr. Jack Luik, University of Alaska, Institute of Arctic Biology, testified in favor of HB 891 and answered questions about the size of the reindeer herd and the importance of the continuation of the Cantwell Reindeer Station as an interim research facility to serve until the Seward Research Station can be built.

Ray Shumway, Alaska Dept. of Transportation, supports agricultural access roads and state efforts to develop resources by providing roads to them. Also supports utility lines to delta area. One area of concern is responsibility for roads after construction.

Rep. Fuller proposes amendment to add \$80,000 to appropriation for Seward Peninsula Cooperative range survey in order to see study to completion. No objections. Amendment passed.

Rep. Miles proposes amendment to add \$400,000 for a Delta Barley Grain Transfer Facility and \$150,000 for Delta seedlings. Discussion and questions followed. Rep. Moss testified and felt that any money spent on this bill would benefit the entire Delta Barley Project. The amendment passed with Representatives Chatterton, Halford, and Cotten voting against.

Jay D. McKendrick, Univ. of Ak, Range Scientist testified on the Homer Red Meat Research Center and Grazing land inventory and range management plan.

HB 665 Relating to Late Applications for Limited Entry Permits

Bob Simon and John Williams, Commissioners with the Limited Entry Commission testified and answered questions. They assured the committee that if passed, the people who applied in a timely manner and have applications pending would have their claims handled before others. They noted that they have a large backlog in application processing already.

Rep. Carney proposed an amendment be written to lower points required for point "pooling" when fishing from two areas.

Steve Pennoyer, Director of Commercial Fisheries Division, Fish & Game Dept. answered questions and gave additional backup material for the Commissioners.

Phillip Daniel, representing United Fishermen of Alaska, testified that HB 665 as written would create problems for the fishermen. The major concern was the large numbers of new permits that would possibly be issued if this bill passes. He suggested that amendments could be written to distinguish between people who didn't apply because they were uninformed or lacked understanding, and those who chose not to apply, and to insure that this new application period apply only to the first group.

Rep. Cotten suggested such amendments be reviewed by the Attorney General when drafted. The bill was tabled, no action was taken.

SSHB 350 Relating to Limited Entry Permits For Handtrolling.

Rep. Jim Duncan presented the proposed Committee Substitute and briefly explained the reasons for the changes.

Action: Rep. Eliason moved the Committee Substitute be adopted. No objections, CS was adopted.

Peter Froehlik, Attorney for Juneau Handtrollers Assoc. explained the CS page by page as he was involved in its drafting. The main purpose was to avoid high prices on permits, provide a controllable method of transferring permits, and insure a high turnover rate.

Robert Simon, Director, Limited Entry Commission introduced the fiscal memo, explained and answered questions.

John Williams, Commissioner, Limited Entry Commission, testified, stating that the purpose of the legislation was to take a value off the permits. He recommended asking Dept. of Law for opinion before proceeding.

Chuck Porter, Juneau Handtrollers Assoc. testified in favor of the bill. He felt it was important to preserve handtrolling as a low income, entry-level fishery.

Albert Dick, Hoonah Handtrollers Assoc. testified in favor of non-salable transfer of permits but wanted spouse to get permit in event of death. He

opposed the bill unless it would insure that permits would stay in the communities to preserve the economy. He suggested the lottery for permits be done on the local level rather than one pool for all applicants.

John Morris, Mayor of Hydaburg and representing the Hydaburg Handtrollers Assoc. and the Fishery Advisory Board, testified against the bill. He stated that permits should all be salable or else all limited entry should be ended.

Leo A. Land, Haines, testified against the bill. He was happy, however, that the local fishery boards had been notified of the hearing.

Henry Porter, Yakutat, Local Fish & Game Advisory Board, and the Alaska Native Brotherhood testified against the bill. He felt that permits would be lost out of communities, and this bill should be consistent with other limited entry laws. He also wanted to maintain the new 2 gurdy limit regulation to help keep permit values low.

Charlie Jim, Angoon, testified against the bill, stating that people wouldn't be able to fish when permits were lost and there were no other jobs available for them.

Dennis Eames, Angoon Advisory Board testified against the bill. He favored non-salable permits but felt the village would lose its permits because of the numbers involved.

John Wilcox, Juneau Handtrollers Assoc. testified in favor of the bill.

B.W. Finley, Juneau Handtrollers Assoc. and State Division of Veteran's Employment testified in favor of the bill. He felt there should be a no sale provision for transfer and that veteran's should have some kind of preference.

John Williams responded to a question from Rep. Eliason about the number of permits in different areas. He reported 780 permits in Juneau, 360 in Ketchikan, 200 in Petersburg, 270 in Sitka, 140 in Wrangell, 135 in Hoonah, 80 in Angoon and other small areas and approximately 120 outside Southeast Alaska. These were permits fished not number issued, which was larger.

Dave Cantillon from Fish and Game testified stating a concern with the large amount of regulating and administering the bill would require. He also felt concern for the stocks and disagreed with specifying a minimum number of permits.

No action was taken on CSSHB 350.

Meeting recessed at 5:45 p.m.

Meeting reconvened at 7:11 p.m. Present were Representatives Osterback, Zharoff, Cotten, Halford, and Eliason.

HB 1 Relating to Maximum Length of Salmon Seine Vessels

Action: Rep. Eliason moved to adopt the Committee Substitute for HB 1. No objections. CS was adopted.

Robert Willard, Legislative Affairs Committee for the Alaska Native Brotherhood testified against the bill. He opposed lifting seine vessel size, because it might encourage Puget Sound vessels to move in and it could lead to legalization of drum seiners. He noted that 19 Southeast Alaska communities are opposed to repeal of the 58' length limit.

Discussion followed about northern boundary of Southeastern.

John Morris, Mayor of City of Hydaburg, testified that he wanted to retain the existing law as written.

Wayne Marshall, Kodiak Area Native Assoc, testified stating that he did not want the limit removed from legislative control.

Bruce Wallace, Ketchikan, Southeast Alaska Seine Boat Owners and Operators Assoc., testified in favor of lifting limits in Southeast only.

Phillip Daniel, United Fishermen of Alaska testified in favor of this bill and felt it was a good compromise. They support lifting the limits on vessels in southeastern only.

Sharon Macklin, United Fishermen of Alaska, answered questions from the Committee.

Action: Rep. Zharoff moved to amend the bill to specify Cape Fairweather rather than Cape St. Elias in order to keep the definition of "Southeast Alaska" consistent with that used in regulations. No objections. Amendment adopted.

Rep. Cotten moved that a letter of intent be drafted to specify that it was the intent of the legislature to give the Board of Fisheries the authority to regulate the limits on lengths of seine vessels. This bill does not direct them to take off any limits in regulations but does give them that option in Southeast Alaska. No objections. Letter of intent accepted.

Rep. Halford moved to report bill out of committee. No objections. CSHB 1 reported out of committee.

He felt they wanted to maintain their status as a non profit organization and are willing to let fishermen vote again on the tax. Rep. Terry Gardiner testified in favor of the bill. He reported that alternatives were needed to allow aquaculture programs to continue until the Alaska vs Alex court case is resolved.

John Sund, A.A. to Rep. Gardiner, answered questions on the Alex case which declared mandatory assessment unconstitutional.

Rep. Osterback recommended a grant be given to finance the hatcheries rather than taxing the fishermen.

Derek Poon, Northern S.E. Region Aquaculture Assoc. testified in favor of the bill. He reported that of 1118 questionnaires that were returned in response to survey of fishermen's wishes on voluntary assessment, 1086 were returned with positive responses. Curt Kerns, Prince William Sound Aquaculture Assoc. testified that they had a voluntary program but favored legislation that would support mandatory assessment.

TELECONFERENCE ON HB 969 & HB 970

Ron Wendte from Ketchikan, Southern S.E. Region Aquaculture Assoc. endorsed concept in HB 969 and urged passage of the bill.

Paul McCullum, Bethel, Exec. Director, Lower Yukon Kuskokwim Aquaculture Assoc. urged committee to pass HB 969 so all associations could acquire start up procedures that have been limited in the past.

Daniel Horn, Soldotna, Cook Inlet Aquaculture Assoc. was concerned about the money in the general fund not being returned to the local area but felt the bill was the best solution to the problem.

Lottie Edelman, Kenai Fishermen's Assoc, was concerned about areas being able to vote for a tax less than the 3% stated in the bill. Bob Palmer, Special Projects Coordinator, replied that the language of the bill could be amended to allow tax to be assessed if it could be shown that the aquaculture program could be funded with the lower tax.

Bob Palmer, Special Projects Coordinator, Governor's Office, explained that the tax was to be collateral for borrowing funds to build hatcheries, then to pay for operating expenses. As comprehensive plan is developed, it will guide everyone's action. He explained that HB 970 would be based on estimated catches the first year and thereafter, the legislature would review previous years' catches so that the appropriation would cover the amount paid in.

Rep. Eliason requested a memo from the Attorney General stating that this bill is constitutional.

Bob Roys, Director, F.R.E.D., Division of Fish and Game, emphasized that regional planning teams should still be consulted and under the control of Fish & Game.

Phillip Daniel, United Fishermen of Ak, encouraged production of fish and hatcheries development for fishermen as well as the general public. Wants passage of the bill to allow fishermen to invest in the resource. He supports a new vote in each region on voluntary assessment.

Meeting adjourned at 5:40 pm.

Dave Green, Foodland, gave cost factors pertaining to sale of milk. He read a statement from Larry Hanson, Assoc. Grocers, Seattle, that said they could not and would not sell to Alaska if HB 980 passed. He also stated that the cost factor in air freighting the milk and eggs to Alaska in order to meet the 36 hour deadline would be extremely costly. He explained the current ferry transportation system and reported that they had received almost no complaints about spoiled products.

Pat Marland, Cottage Foods, testified against the bill because of the time factor. It is not possible to get milk and eggs into Juneau economically within the three day period, according to her.

Ralph Hunt, Foss Alaska Line, testified against the bill. He said there was no possible way to get milk even from Anchorage to Juneau in three days let alone to some of the outer villages in southeastern.

Karen Kostenko, Wee Cottage, testified against the bill.

Ted Smith, Juneau Dairies, testified against the bill because of the 3 day limit. He said that the products couldn't be shipped economically to Juneau or outlying areas within the three day period.

Rep. Brian Rogers, testified that there had been a problem with eggs in Fairbanks area, retail stores were selling local eggs at standard markup, making the price prohibitive to many customers. Outside dealers were flying in and using older eggs as loss leaders. Larger grocery chains could dump older eggs at lower prices. This bill was meant to encourage milk and egg production in the state. He suggested leaving an out for the Commissioner to exempt areas where local production couldn't meet demand, or where transportation problems and costs would make the price of products prohibitive.

Fred Honsinger, State Vet, Div. of Agriculture, testified that some new regulations are being proposed to address shelf life and time from processing to shelf which would make this bill unnecessary.

George Jefferson, testified against the bill and explained some of the rules and regulations concerning inspection and quality control used by the state. He has worked for several years as a state egg inspector.

Don Magnuson, Alaska Retail Association, testified against the bill stating that the increased costs would be prohibitive.

No action was taken on the bill at this time.

CSSB 332 Relating to hunting in the pipeline corridor

Bob Hinman, Dep. Dir., Div. of Game, testified that the department could not see the need or purpose that would justify putting this type of closure into statute. He reported that action taken by the Board of Game in writing new regulations would allow hunting, with bow and arrow only, in the pipeline corridor.

Meeting recessed for a brief period. Meeting called to order again.

ACTION: Rep. Fuller moved to report bill out. Rep. Chatterton objected for purpose of amending bill. He moved and asked unanimous consent to amend line 10 to include the word "firearms" after "hunting" and before "is". No objections. Amendment adopted. No objections to reporting bill out as amended. HCSCSSB 332 reported out of committee.

SJR 54 Relating to marine sanitation requirement

ACTION: Rep. Chatterton moved to report bill out of committee. Rep. Chatterton reported a conflict of interest because he owns a vessel built before the date stated in the bill. No objections. SJR 54 reported out.

HB 416 Relating to sale of unpasteurized milk

Rep. Carney explained the bill and answered questions.

ACTION: Rep. Chatterton moved adoption of the Committee Substitute. No objections. CS adopted.

Kelly Fike, A.A. to the Agriculture Committee testified in favor of the bill and answered questions.

Rep. Brian Rogers, co sponsored bill last year and is in favor of this bill so that certified unpasteurized milk can be sold.

Pat Marland, Cottage Foods, testified in favor of the bill. She stressed the importance of stringent standards in inspecting dairies and certifying goat and cow milk.

Dr. Honsinger, Health Dept. testified against the bill on grounds of a hazard to health from unpasteurized milk. Also cost would be very high to provide inspection needed. Health inspectors are against selling unpasteurized milk.

Karen Kostenko, Wee Cottage, testified in favor of the bill, stating that people should be able to buy certified unpasteurized milk from a certified source.

ACTION: Rep. Carney moved to report bill out of committee. No objections. CSHB 416 reported out.

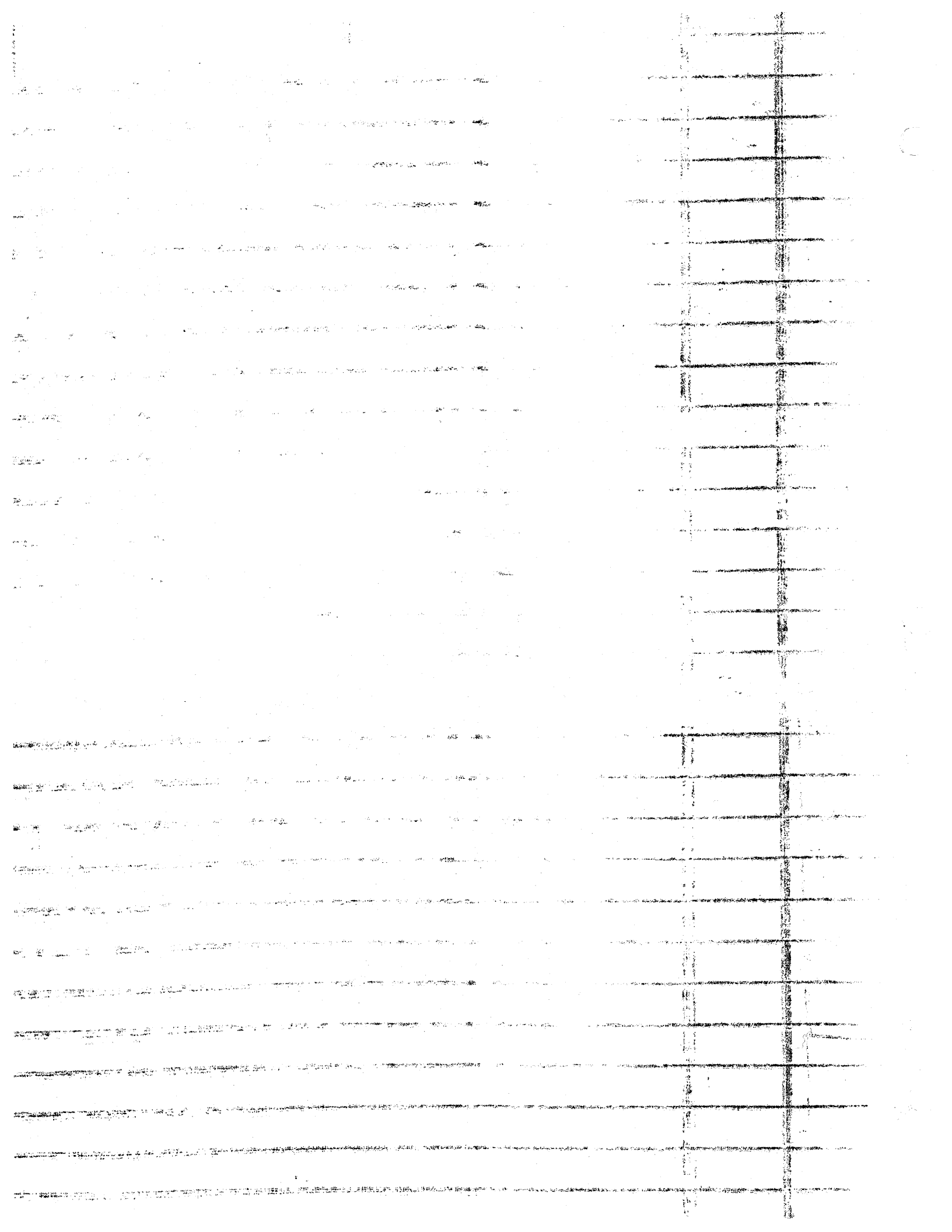

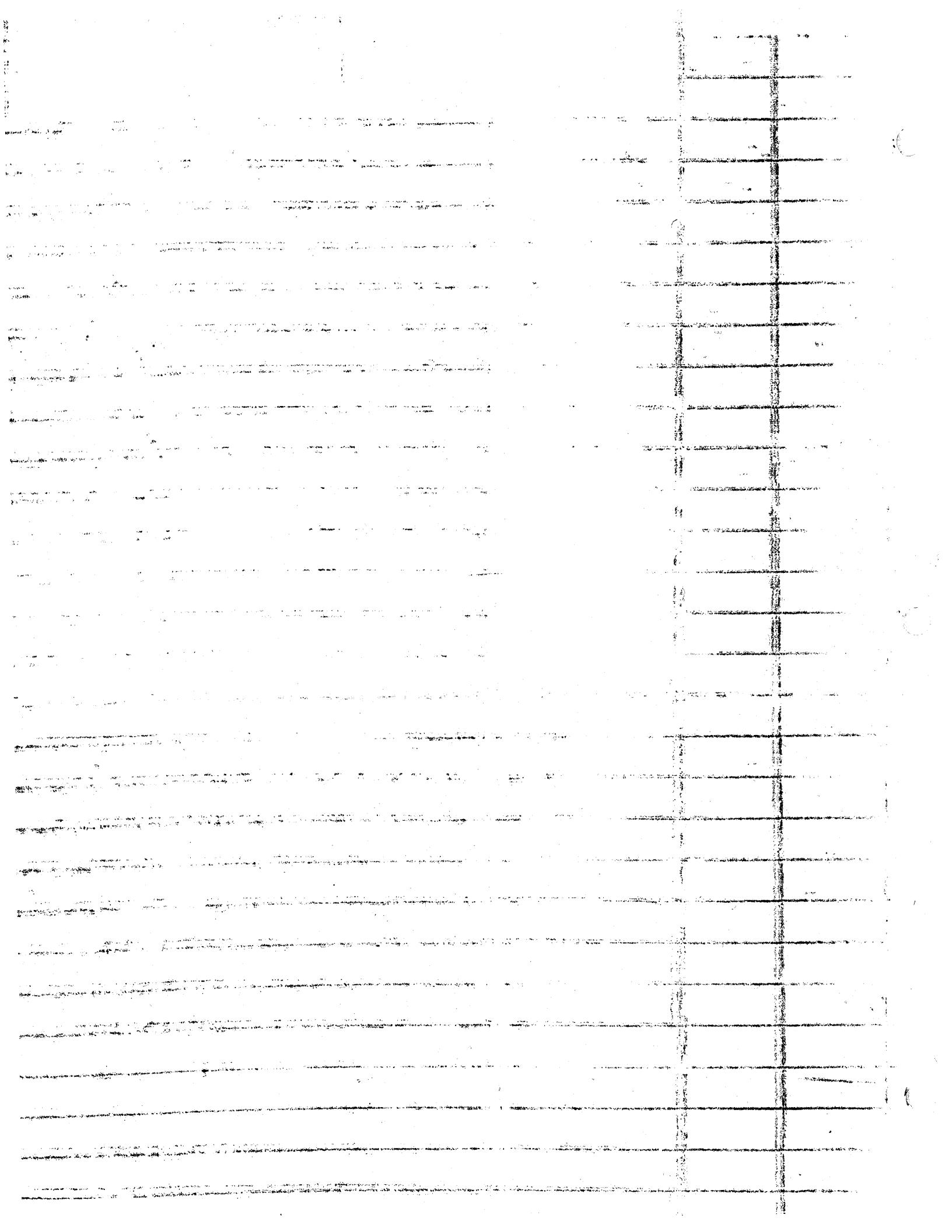
