

CHAPTER 22.

(H. B. NO. 53.)

AN ACT to amend Section One Hundred and Fifty-three of the Code of Civil Procedure of Alaska. (Compiled Laws of Alaska, Sec. 985.)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section One hundred and Fifty-three of Title Two, Chapter Fourteen of the Act of June 6, 1900, entitled "An Act making further provision for a civil government for Alaska and for other purposes," be amended to read as follows:

Sec. 153.—What Order Upon Garnishee Shall Require. —The order provided for in Section One Hundred and Forty-three shall require such person or officer to appear before such court or judge at a time and place therein stated. In the proceedings thereafter upon such order such person or association or corporation shall be known as the garnishee.

CHAPTER 23.

(H. B. NO. 56.)

AN ACT to amend Section One Hundred and Thirty-four of the Penal Code of Alaska. (Compiled Laws of Alaska, Sec. 2014.)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section One Hundred and Thirty-four of Title One, Chapter Seven of the Act of March 3, 1899, entitled "An Act to define and punish crimes in the

District of Alaska and to provide a Code of Criminal Procedure for said District," be amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 134.—Cruelty to Animals.—That if any person shall cruelly beat or torture or otherwise maltreat or neglect any animal, whether belonging to himself or another, such person, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not less than ten nor more than thirty days, or by fine not less than five nor more than fifty dollars.

CHAPTER 24.

(H. B. NO. 57.)

AN ACT to amend Section One Hundred and Sixty-six of the Penal Code of Alaska. (Compiled Laws of Alaska, Sec. 2046.)

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section One Hundred and Sixty-six, Title One, Chapter Eleven, of the Act of March 3, 1899, entitled "An Act to define and punish crimes in the District of Alaska and to provide a Code of Criminal Procedure for said District," be amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 166.—Divulging or Altering Despatch.—That if any officer, agent, operator, clerk or employee of any telegraph company, or any other person shall wilfully divulge to any other person than the party from whom the same was received, or to whom the same was addressed, or his agent or attorney, any message received or sent, or intended to be sent, over any telegraph line or system of radio communication commonly designated as wire-
