

such notary public, or officer; or any notary public, or other officer authorized to administer an oath in the Territory of Alaska, who shall make a certificate false in any respect, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of six hundred dollars, or by imprisonment in the federal jail for a period of not more than one year nor less than six months; or by such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

CHAPTER 34.

(S. B. NO. 34.)

AN ACT to provide for the service of process in a criminal proceeding against a corporation.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. Corporations charged with crime.—Whenever an indictment or information shall be filed in a district court against a corporation charging it with the commission of a crime, a summons shall be issued by the clerk of such court, signed by the judge thereof, commanding the marshal forthwith to notify the accused thereof, and commanding it to appear before such court at such time as shall be specified in said summons. Such summons and a copy of the indictment or information shall be at once delivered by such clerk to said marshal and by him forthwith served and returned in the manner provided for service of summons upon such corporation in a civil action. Whenever a complaint against a corporation, charging it with the commission of a crime, shall be made before any United States commissioner, acting

as ex-officio justice of the peace, a like summons, signed by United States commissioner, acting as ex-officio justice of the peace, shall be issued, which, together with a copy of said complaint, shall be delivered to the marshal at once and by him forthwith served as herein provided.

Sec. 2. Upon such service being made such corporation shall appear at the time designated, by one of its officers or by counsel; and upon such appearance, and thereafter, the same course shall be pursued, as nearly as may be, as upon the appearance of an individual to indictment, information or complaint and warrant charging him with the same offense. Upon failure of the corporation to make such appearance said court shall cause to be entered a plea of "not guilty", and upon appearance made or plea entered the corporation shall be deemed forthwith continuously present in court until the case shall be finally disposed of.

Sec. 3. If the corporation shall be found guilty and a fine imposed, it shall be entered and docketed by the clerk or United States commissioner, acting as ex-officio justice of the peace, as a judgment against a corporation, and it shall be of the same force and effect and be enforced against such corporation in the same manner as a judgment in a civil action.

CHAPTER 35.

(H. B. NO. 25.)

AN ACT to require the registration of vital statistics in the Territory of Alaska, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That a record shall be made and preserved of all births, deaths, and marriages that shall hereafter
