

## CHAPTER 56.

(S. B. No. 62.)

AN ACT to make uniform any reference to or citation of the compiled laws of the Territory of Alaska.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That it shall be valid and sufficient to make reference to any citation of "The Compiled Laws of the Territory of Alaska 1912, compiled, codified, arranged, and annotated, and published under authority of the Act of Congress of August 24, 1912, by the Joint Committee on Territories of the Senate and House of Representatives" by the following title, to-wit: "Compiled Laws of Alaska."

Approved, April 28, 1913.

## CHAPTER 57.

(S. B. No. 71.)

AN ACT to provide punishment for pimps or macques.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That any male person who may be found loitering around houses of ill fame; or who solicits, incites, induces, encourages, persuades, or prevails upon any other male person to patronize any house of ill fame or any woman commonly reputed to be a prostitute; or who shall be an inmate of any house of ill fame; or who is commonly known to consort with any prostitute; or who wilfully permits a woman to whom he is married to practice prostitution; or who lives upon or receives the

earnings of any prostitute, shall be deemed a pimp or macque, and upon conviction shall be imprisoned in the federal jail not less than thirty days nor more than one year.

Sec. 2. In all prosecutions under this act common fame or reputation shall be competent evidence in support of any indictment, complaint or information; and in prosecutions under the provisions of this act the wife shall be a competent witness against her husband, and may be compelled to testify on behalf of the government against her husband in any proceeding wherein he may be a party defendant under this act.

Sec. 3. All acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflicts.

## CHAPTER 58.

(S. B. No. 56.)

AN ACT to make uniform the law of business corporations in the Territory of Alaska.

*Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:*

Section 1. That three or more natural persons of full <sup>Who may in-</sup>age, two-thirds of whom are bona fide residents of the <sup>corporate</sup>Territory of Alaska, may unite to form a stock corporation for any lawful business purpose or purposes, whose chief business shall be in the Territory of Alaska, ex- <sup>Exceptions</sup>cept for the purpose of banking, insurance, brokerage, or loan, trust and guaranty associations.

Sec. 2. That the articles of incorporation shall be <sup>How incorpora-</sup>made in triplicate, signed by each of the incorporators, <sup>tion effected</sup>acknowledged by at least three of them before any officer
