

CHAPTER 9.

(S. B. NO. 31.)

AN ACT to prevent employees from being oppressed by reason of an employer compelling them to board at a particular boarding house, or to purchase goods or supplies at a particular store and providing a penalty for violations thereof.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Compelling em-
ployees to board
at designated
place

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or corporation to compel by threats or intimidation, or threats of discharge, or to use any means to compel an employee against his will to board at any particular hotel, boarding house or other place where lodging or board may be provided, or to require an employee to purchase goods and supplies at any particular store.

Penalty

Sec. 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this Act shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine in a sum of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the federal jail not less than ten nor more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Sec. 3. All acts and parts of acts in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
