

## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 4.

Whereas, the 13th Legislature of the State of Washington, by House Concurrent Resolution, No. 21, has extended to the First Territorial Legislature of Alaska, the congratulations of the citizens of the sovereign State of Washington, and

Whereas, the commercial and business relations existing between the State of Washington and the Territory of Alaska have been freindly, and of such importance as to require a continuance of the same,

Therefore, be it resolved by the Senate of the Territory of Alaska, the House concurring:

That we extend to the citizens of the State of Washington our acknowledgement of the kind courtesy prompting the 13th Legislature of the State of Washington to extend to us its formal congratulations upon the convening of our First Territorial Legislature, and to emphatically express our thanks for, and concurrence in, the sentiment therein expressed relative to the hope that such convening of our First Legislature is a first step leading to an era of great development and prosperity, which will soon result in the ideal American Government in Alaska, that is, the government of its people by and with the consent of the governed.

Resolved further, that as the Legislature of the State of Washington is no longer in session, that an engrossed copy of this resolution be forwarded, by the Secretary of the Territory, to His Excellency, the Governor of the State of Washington.
