

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 5.

Be it resolved by the Senate, of the Territory of Alaska the House concurring, that a committee of three be appointed from each house, as a Conference Committee, to consider Senate Bill, No. 7 and House Bill, No. 13, and to report the same back to the two houses.

Adopted by the Senate, April 7, 1913.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 6.

Be it resolved by the Senate of the Territory of Alaska the House of Representatives concurring, that a committee of three from each body be appointed, by the presiding officers thereof, to act as a joint committee on rules for the future guidance of the Legislature.

Adopted by the Senate, April 8, 1913.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 7.

Resolved by the Senate of the Territory of Alaska, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Committees on Engrossment and Enrollment of the two Houses be authorized to correct the Enrolled Bill of the House, Committee Substitute for House Bills, No. 40 and 61, entitled: "An Act to provide for the formation of banking corporations, and to regulate the business of banking in the Territory of Alaska, and securing supervision thereof; for the appointment of a Territorial Banking Board, defining its duties and fixing penalties for the

violation of this act," by striking out Section 35 thereof.

SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 8.

Be it resolved, by the Senate of the Territory of Alaska, the House of Representatives concurring, that the Governor is requested to return to the Senate, Senate Bill No. 1, with reference to an eight-hour law as applied to metalliferous mining, etc., for the reason that there is a difficulty in the draft of the bill which has challenged the attention of the Governor and raises in his mind an objection to the bill, which difficulty can be removed by amendment exactly in accordance with the purpose for which the bill was ordered.
