

in the State of New York or at such place as may be designated by the Common Council of the Town of Juneau; the place of payment to be mentioned in said bonds: And provided further, that each and every such bond shall have the written signature of the Mayor and Clerk of said Town of Juneau and also bear the seal of said town.

Sec. 5. That no part of the funds arising from sale of said bonds shall be used for any other purpose other than specified in this Act.

Sec. 6. That said bonds shall be sold only in such amounts as the Common Council shall direct, and the proceeds thereof shall be disbursed under the limitations hereinbefore imposed and under the order and direction of said Common Council from time to time as the same may be required for the purposes aforesaid.

SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 11.

To the Honorable, the Secretary of War of the United States:

We, your memorialists, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, do most respectfully and earnestly represent that

Whereas, the development of the mining camp of Ruby, on the Yukon River, is greatly retarded by the lack of transportation facilities from the town to the mines; and

Whereas, an excellently graded road has been surveyed for a distance of twenty-eight miles to Long Creek, which has been of great advantage for transportation of freight in winter; and

Whereas, the character of the land through which this road extends is such that the greater portion of it cannot be made of use in summer by reason of the action

of the sun upon the frozen ground, rendering it difficult to transport wagons over; and

Whereas, the greater portion of this road and particularly the sections that cannot now be used in summer, is located in well timbered country where logs and trees for use of corduroy work are accessible;

Therefore, we respectfully suggest, that, in the opinion of your memorialists the construction of such road is an urgent necessity and that you recommend our opinion to the consideration of the Alaska Road Commission to the end that said commission devote as large a portion as possible of the funds now available for road construction in Alaska to the construction of a passable road from Ruby on the Yukon River to the mines of that district.

And we, your memorialists will ever pray.

SENATE JOINT MEMORIAL NO. 12.

To the Honorable, the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress Assembled:

Your memorialists, the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska, do most respectfully and earnestly represent that

Whereas, the Act of Congress approved March 11, 1908, provides that shore birds and water fowl shall not be killed north of Sixty-two degrees N. L. from September first to March first; and

Whereas, in the more northern latitudes shore birds and water fowl do not arrive in the spring until about the tenth day of May and begin their southern migration early in the month of September; and
