Sec. 14. Be it further enacted. That all laws or parts of laws contrary to and in conflict with any of the provisions of this act be and the same are hereby repealed.

CHAPTER 84.

(H. B. No. 73.)

AN ACT to regulate the practice of dentistry in the Territory of Alaska and to provide for the examination, regulation, licensing and registration of persons engaged in the practice of dentistry, and for the punishment of offenders against this act.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, who is not at the time of the passage of this act engaged in the practice of dentistry in this Territory, to commence such practice unless he or she shall have obtained a certificate, as hereinafter provided.

Sec. 2. A board of Dental Examiners to consist of five practicing dentists is hereby created whose duty it shall be to carry out the purposes and enforce the provisions of this act.

Meetings

The members of said board shall be appointed by the Governor from the Territory at large.

The term for which the members of said board shall hold their office shall be five years, except that the members of said board first appointed under this act shall hold

their office for the term of one, two, three, four and five years, respectively, and until their successors be duly appointed the tenures of which term shall be determined by lot.

In case of a vacancy in said board, such vacancy shall be filled by the Governor, from the territory at large. Not more than two members of the said board shall be appointed from any one judicial division. Each person appointed as a member of the Board of Dental Examiners shall qualify by taking the oath prescribed by law for the territorial officers.

Sec. 3. Said board shall provide an official seal. The first meeting of said board shall take place at the city of Juneau on the first Tuesday of August, 1913. Said board shall choose one of its members president and one secretary and treasurer thereof, and it shall meet at least once in each year, and as much oftener and at such times and places as it may deem necessary. Two members of said board shall constitute a quorum, and the proceedings thereof shall, at all reasonable times, be open to public inspection.

Sec. 4. Within four months from the time this act takes effect, it shall be the duty of every person who has been engaged in the practice of dentistry in this territory for four years next preceding, or has a certificate permitting him or her to practice their profession which shall have been issued to him or her by a dental examining board of any state of the United States, or a diploma from a reputable dental college, and who at the time of the passage of this act is engaged in the practice of dentistry in the Territory of Alaska, to cause his or her name and residence, or place of business, to be registered with said board of examiners, who shall keep a book for that purpose. The statement of every such person shall be verified under oath before a notary public in such manner as shall be prescribed by the board of examiners. Every person who shall so register with the said board as a
