

SENATE RESOLUTION

Be it resolved by the Senate of the Territory of Alaska, that two hundred and fifty copies of the Senate Journal of the present session be printed and bound, and that the Secretary of the Territory be, and he is hereby, authorized and empowered to mail copies of the same as follows:

One to the Librarian of Congress; one to the Secretary of the Interior; one to each, the Chairman of Committee on Territories of the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States; one to the Attorney-General of the United States; one to the Delegate to Congress from Alaska; one to the Governor of the Territory of Alaska; one to the Secretary of the Territory of Alaska; one to each of their immediate successors; one to the Treasurer of the Territory of Alaska; one to each member of the Senate and House of Representatives of the Territory; one to the President of the Senate; one to the Speaker of the House of Representatives; one to each, the chief clerks, enrolling clerks, engrossing clerks and sergeants-at-arms of the Senate and House of Representatives; one to each Librarian of each State and the District of Columbia, the District Courts of the Territory and one to the Fairbanks public library; and twelve copies each to the Committees on Judiciary and Federal Relations of the House and Senate of the Territory of Alaska.

The remaining copies to the Secretary of the Territory for future distribution, who is hereby empowered to sell them to citizens of the Territory, not to exceed one copy to any person, at a price not to exceed the cost of same.

Provided, that the fund received from the sale of such copies shall be turned over into the general fund of the Territorial Treasury.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 1

Be it resolved by the Senate, the House concurring, of the Territory of Alaska

That the report of the Alaska Railway Commission, recently submitted to the President and the Congress of the United States, be, and the same is, hereby approved;

And be it further resolved, that the Honorable Woodrow Wilson, President, be, and he is, hereby respectfully urged to make the construction of railroads in Alaska and the opening up and development of the resources of Alaska along the lines recommended by said Commission, a prominent feature of his message to the special session of Congress to be convened on or about the 1st day of April, A. D. 1913.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 2.

Whereas, under the form of Democratic Government, changes of administration are frequently brought about;

And whereas, such change in the Government of the United States as to policies will soon be made, with the probability that many of the appointive officers to fill the vacancies throughout Alaska will be made by the Honorable Woodrow Wilson:

Therefore, be it resolved by the Senate, the House concurring, that we respectfully ask His Excellency, the President, to choose such appointees from Governor down from the bona fide resident citizens of Alaska. We consider this but just and reasonable as a part of the home Government regime.
