CHAPTER 51.

AN ACT

[H. B. 108.]

To amend Section 2022, Compiled Laws of Alaska.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That Section 2022, Compiled Laws of Alaska, be amended to read as follows: Sec 2022, Compiled Laws of Alaska, amended.

That if any person shall, without the authority of the United States, sell, barter or give to any Indian any spirituous, malt or vinous liquor or intoxicating extract, or alcoholic liniment, alcoholic patent medicine or alcoholic beverage, such person shall, upon conviction thereof, for the first offense be guilty of a misdemeanor and be fined not less than one hundred and twenty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars or be imprisoned in the federal jail not less than sixty days nor more than two hundred and fifty days, and upon every subsequent conviction of a like offense, if the fact of a previous conviction is pleaded in the indictment, be guilty of misdemeanor and be fined not less than two hundred and forty dollars nor more than one thousand dollars, or imprisonment in the federal jail not less than four months nor more than one year. Penalty. And every Indian who shall wrongfully and wilfully solicit, incite or induce any person to furnish him or her with any spirituous, malt or vinous liquor or intoxicating extract, or alcoholic liniment, alcoholic patent medicine or alcoholic beverage, shall, upon conviction thereof be punished as provided in this section. Penalty for soliciting.
