Section 3. That said Act be further amended by adding a new section to be numbered Section 10.

Fee for same.

"Section 10. The judge of the juvenile court shall, at the conclusion of each case tried under this act, transmit to the Secretary of the Board of Children's Guardians for the Division in which his precinct is situate, a complete report of the case, together with a certified copy of the judgment. Such report must be made whether the child be committed or not; and for making each report the Judge of the Juvenile Court shall receive a fee of one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50). A voucher for the said one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50), properly signed by the judge shall accompany the reports sent to the Secretary of the Board of Children's Guardians. The said Secretary shall forthwith transmit said voucher to the Governor of the Territory at Juneau, and it shall be paid out of the Fund for dependent children as other vouchers against said fund are paid. The Secretary of the Board shall transmit the certified copy of said judgment to the Governor of Alaska, with the report required to be made in Section 7, of this Act."

CHAPTER 17.

AN ACT

(H. B. 31)

To provide for the erection of cabins and shelter along traveled roads and trails and the equipment of such cabins, making it a crime to remove such cabin or any portion thereof, or any articles contained therein, prescribing the penalty for such offense and declaring an emergency.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the Territory of Alaska:

Section 1. That the road commissioners provided for by Chapter 27 of the Laws of Alaska, 1915, are hereby authorized to erect and to maintain cabins for the accommodation of travelers and shelter for dog teams and

horses at such places along the traveled roads and trails in their respective road districts as, in their judgment, are necessary for the safety of the traveling public. Each cabin so constructed shall be provided with a suitable stove. They shall also have placed in conspicuous places on roads and trails leading to or from said cabins, sign boards advising travelers direction and distance to cabin.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of the road commissioner in each road district to inspect or cause to be inspected all the cabins erected under the provisions of this act at least once a year.

Cabins to be inspected.

Section 3. There is hereby appropriated from the Territorial Treasury, from monies not otherwise appropriated, the sum of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) to be apportioned by the Governor of the Territory to the Road Districts in such amounts as their needs may require under the provisions of this act. Such expenditures shall be paid in the same manner and under the same regulations as expenses for construction and maintenance of roads are paid under existing laws.

Appropriation to pay cost.

Provided that the road commissioners shall receive as compensation for all services in carrying out the purposes of this act, 5 per cent of all monies expended through their offices for the purposes herein designated.

Compensation for Road Commissioners

Section 4. The cabins, shelter and stoves provided for in this act shall be the property of the Territory of Alaska, and any person who shall wilfully remove or destroy any such cabin or part thereof or any stove contained therein, shall upon conviction thereof be punished by a fine of not less than One Hundred nor more than Five Hundred Dollars, or by imprisonment in the Federal Jail for not less than three months nor more than one year, or by imprisonment in the penitentiary for not less than one nor more than five years.

Section 5. An emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this act shall be in effect from and after its passage and approval.
